¹From 1911 to 1962, construction was regulated by the State housing Act. A copy of this Act, which was modified during this period, is available in the State Library.

Senate Bill 1221, which was enacted in 1911, regulated construction until 1914. From 1914 to 1916, the State Commission of Immigration and Housing regulated construction. The State of California did not begin making amendments to the Building Codes until 1979. The State Building Standards Commission was created in 1984.
