LEARN TO SWIM PROGRAMS

Please read aquatic registration procedures carefully.

Swim classes will be offered for ages six (6) months to adult. Classes are scheduled for four (4) two-week sessions, Monday-Thursday (NO FRIDAY CLASSES, except for the week of July 4) for 30 minutes a day at City Park and Centennial High School Pools. Proof of residency (driver's license or utility bill) must match adult address and accompany registration form. No refunds after the second day of class. Please refer to the swim lesson schedule for class registration numbers. Call (951) 736-2241 for information.

\$40 for resident; \$60 non-resident for Learn to Swim lesson. Semi Private swim lessons: \$80 for resident; \$120 for non-resident. All swim lessons are Mon-Thur for two-week sessions.

First Priority: Mail-In Registration for Corona residents begins Monday, May 14 and continues throughout the Summer (cannot be postmarked before Friday, May 11) as space allows. Registration must be received one week prior to session start date.

Second Priority: Walk-In and Online Registration for residents and non-residents begins Tuesday, May 29 and continues throughout the Summer (provided there is space available) at the Recreation Services office, Circle City Center, and Corona Public Library during normal business hours. Registration must be received one week prior to session start date.

Third Priority: On-Site Pool Registration begins on Tuesday, June 12 at the pools. Registration will be accepted on the first Tuesday of each session, provided there is space available.

There is a refund processing fee of \$5 per activity for all requested refunds or cancellations. No refunds after the second day of class.

SWIM LESSONS

ADAPTIVE SWIM LESSONS, 3+YRS (BASED ON HEIGHT)

Adaptive I: 4'5" and shorter Adaptive 2: 4'6" and taller

Designed to provide a safe, enjoyable recreation experience for individuals who have physical disabilities, impairments or are developmentally disabled. Classes include introduction to the water and water adjustment activities. Where appropriate, participants may be required to have a parent or aide in the water to assist with activities.

PARENT & ME – 6 MOS TO 3 YRS

Strictly a water orientation class, parent participation in the water is required. Parent will be taught how to instruct child in basic water safety and self-help skills. Skills include water adjustment and entry, bubble blowing, underwater exploration, buoyancy on the front and back position, front kick, arm movement, submerging in a rhythmic pattern, rolling over, and age appropriate safety topics.

LEVEL I – WATER EXPLORATION, 3+YRS

Skill prerequisites: Minimal comfort with water

Designed for a young child's first exposure to water without their parent. Children will learn basic water safety and self-help skills in I-3 feet of water. Skills will include bubble blowing, kicking, holding of breath, bobbing, and other fun and creative activities. This class is NOT designed to teach your child to swim.

LEVEL 2 – PRIMARY SKILLS, 3+ YRS

Skill prerequisites: Very comfortable with water

Designed to be your child's introduction to swim instruction. Fundamentals include tummy and back glides, flutter kick, and front and back strokes. Swimmer WILL NOT be able to touch the bottom of the pool and should be comfortable with holding on to the side of the pool.

LEVEL 3 – STROKE DEVELOPMENT, 3+YRS

Skill prerequisites: Swimmer must be able to swim 5 yards freestyle and backstroke, unassisted.

Skills learned include coordinated freestyle, back crawl, elementary backstroke, and side breathing.

LEVEL 4 – STROKE IMPROVEMENT, 3+YRS

Skill prerequisites: Swimmer must be able to swim 10 yards freestyle and backstroke, unassisted.

Skills learned include alternate breathing with front crawl, sidestroke, treading water, breaststroke, and a higher level of water safety.

LEVEL 5 – STROKE REFINEMENT. 3+ YRS

Skill prerequisites: Swimmer must be able to swim 25 yards freestyle, backstroke, and breaststroke unassisted.

Skills learned include refinement of breaststroke, elementary backstroke and front and back crawl, advanced water safety, diving, butterfly, flip turn, and pike surface dive.

SEMI-PRIVATE SWIM LESSONS

Certified and dedicated staff is committed to helping your child reach his/her swim goals. Whether your child is just getting started or eager to improve, these focused and specialized swim lessons are catered to your child's swim needs. This 30 minute class has a 1:3 staff/student ration for more personalized training.

\$80 for resident and \$120 for non-resident for each session.

BEGINNING ADULT – 18+ YRS

This class is designed to be the first swim lesson experience for adults. Skills include basic water adjustment and beginning swim strokes.

ANIMAL SHELTER SERVICES

The Police Department's Animal Services & Enforcement section provides quality service and protection to our community by promoting a safe, healthy and caring environment for lost, stray or homeless animals. Each year, the Animal Shelter cares for thousands of animals in need of new

homes and encourages the adoption of shelter animals by responsible persons. All adoption fees include the cost of surgical sterilization, as well as the first basic vaccinations (excluding rabies). GARAGE & YARD SALE REQUIREMENTS

Did you know a permit is required in order to conduct a garage or yard sale in Corona? The City allows only three (3) sales per



year per applicant or location. Display of sale items should not block the sidewalk, parkway, or any area within the public right-of-way, as this could be a health and safety hazard. No more than two signs are allowed on the sale premises, and no more than two additional signs off premises. Be sure to get permission from the property owners where signs are placed. Do not place signs on utility poles, light poles, utility boxes, stop signs, or mail boxes, and don't forget to remove your signs after. Failure to do so may result in a citation. When applying for a permit, be sure to list the personal items that you will be selling and post your permit on the premises of the sale while in progress. CORONA MILITARY BANNER PROGRAM

HAVE YOU HEARD ABOUT THE VIAL OF LIFE?

The Vial of Life is an emergency preparedness program that allows citizens to compile personal information and have it readily available for 9-1-1 responders in the event of an emergency. The Vial looks like a prescription pill bottle, but contains an individual's health information including the name and contact information of

a primary medical provider, existing health conditions, allergies, and medications the individual might take. Once completed, the sheet is placed in the Vial and stored on the top shelf of your refrigerator door. A magnet, provided with the Vial, is placed on the upper right corner of the refrigerator to alert emergency personnel that the household participates in the program.

The Vial of Life program is now augmented with **Quick Response** (**QR**) code stickers. These QR codes are scannable with any smartphone and can give firefighters instant access to your medical profile. To take advantage of this helpful program, pick up your personal QR code sticker packs and Vial of Life at any Corona Fire Station or Corona Fire Headquarters. Each kit comes with 4 vinyl stickers, all with the same ID and PIN to be used to access one profile. Then, go to www.GetMyID.com and click on Sign Up to create a MyID profile, an online medical profile that can be accessed anywhere. Many use it to manage personal medical information and clearly communicate important information to health care providers. MyID profiles are free, and you can add as many profiles as you want. Make an account for yourself, your senior parents, and/ or your children. Finally, use the ID and PIN found on your stickers to link your personal stickers to your MyID profile.

Here are some ideas as to where to put your personal QR stickers:

- Place them on your bike, skateboard, or skates
- Stick them on your child's helmet, or car seat
- Post it on your wallet, phone, or your fridge
- Stick them to your parent's watch or key chain
