PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council of the City of Corona, California, will conduct a public hearing in the Council Chamber, at City Hall, 400 South Vicentia Avenue, in said City of Corona, Wednesday, June 3, 2020 at 6:30 p.m., or thereafter, to consider the draft 2019-2020 Action Plan and draft Citizen Participation Plan amendments to facilitate the use of \$734,885 of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV) funds appropriated under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act of 2020. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires the City to prepare these documents before the City may access CDBG-CV funds.

Amending the 2019-2020 Action Plan is the fastest way to establish the allocation priorities and program activities that will use CDBG-CV funds to assist Corona residents experiencing adverse impacts as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and associated economic disruption caused by “Shelter in Place” orders.

The draft 2019-2020 Action Plan Amendment establishes the projects to be undertaken using CDBG-CV funds from March 1, 2020 to September 30, 2022, including Emergency Housing Needs Assistance to Low/Mod Households and a Citywide Public Service activity under the Urgent Need National Objective of the CDBG program to provide necessary supplies and equipment for the City of Corona to prepare for, respond to, and prevent COVID-19 on behalf of all residents during this Presidentially-Declared National Disaster. The draft Citizen Participation Plan Amendment modifies existing City of Corona policies concerning citizen review and comment on Disaster Recovery and Supplemental Appropriations plans, projects and activities consistent with HUD guidance.

A copy of the draft documents will be available for public review on the City website at www.CoronaCA.gov/cdbg starting Friday, May 29, 2020. If and when the Shelter in Place order is lifted, the documents will also be available during business hours starting Friday, May 29, 2020 at the City’s Community Development Department and the City Clerk’s Office located at 400 S. Vicentia Avenue, Corona. The draft documents may also be reviewed at the Corona Public Library, Reference Desk, located at 650 S. Main Street, Corona. Hours and accessibility to these facilities is subject to change based on restrictions imposed because of COVID-19. All written comments concerning these

documents must be received by the end of the public review and comment period on Wednesday, June 3, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. Written comments should be submitted to the City Clerk at the address below.

The public is invited to attend the public hearing and comment on the draft documents. Please check the meeting agenda for June 3, 2020 for any important updates concerning how to participate in the public hearing. 


