# Lava Lamp: An Experiment

#### What you need:

- An empty water bottle
- Vegetable oil
- Water

- Food coloring of your choice
- A chopstick
- Alka Seltzer tablet(s)

## What to do:

- **Step 1 –** Fill the empty water bottle about 2/3 full of vegetable oil.
- **Step 2 –** Fill the rest of the bottle with water (leaving a bit of space at the top.
- Step 3 Now add food coloring. The food coloring will only mix with the water. Using the chopstick, stir the bottom of the bottle where the water and food coloring are.
- Step 4 Now for the magic...break the Alka Seltzer tablet into 4 pieces and drop one piece into the bottle at a time.
- Step 5 Watch what happens! Why do you think this happened?

### How it works:

When you drop in the Alka Seltzer it sinks to the bottom and starts to dissolve. As it dissolves, it forms a gas which rises to the top and takes a little of the colored water with it. The gas bubble breaks on the surface and the colored water sinks back to the bottom.

### The best part:

Your homemade lava lamp will work over and over again. You can screw on the water bottle cap and break it out later for more fun with more Alka Seltzer tabs.
