1. District Profile

Project Description

The Community Facilities District No. 2002-2 (the “CFD No. 2002-2” or the “District”) was formed to provide landscape maintenance services for the area’s medians along Magnolia Avenue, Compton Avenue, East Sixth Street, and the easterly Compton Avenue parkway.

Location

The CFD No. 2002-2 is generally located east of Interstate 15, and spread within the boundaries of Sampson Ave, McKinley St, and Sherborn St. The District comprises over 266 acres and includes a total of 79 parcels.

Bond Profile and Principal Amount of Bonds Outstanding

The CFD No. 2002-2 is a non-bonded district.

2. Special Tax Information

Special Tax

The amount collected each year is determined by the Special Tax formula and can vary from year to year but shall not exceed the maximum authorized (or permitted) Special Tax rates. The amount levied for Fiscal Year 2022 tax year is \$71,779.16. The Maximum Special Tax rates for Fiscal Year 2022 are as follows:

The Maximum Special Tax Rates for Parcels in all Maintenance Categories shall be increased by the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (“CPI-U”) for the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario California Standard Metropolitan Statistical area, or ii) by two percent (2.0%), whichever is greater, on July 1, 2004 for Fiscal Year 2005 and on each subsequent July 1 for the Fiscal Year then commencing. The Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor has discontinued the Los Angeles-Riverside-Orange County, CA Index. The Consumer Price Index rate for Fiscal Year 2022 is 3.56%.

Termination of Special Tax

For each Fiscal Year the City of Corona provides services the Special Tax shall be levied on all Assessor’s Parcels subject to the Special Tax as necessary to satisfy the Special Tax Requirement. The Special Tax shall be in perpetuity as long as the City of Corona provides the services to the District.

3. Payment History

Delinquencies are calculated through July 2021 and may reflect parcels that may already be on a payment plan.

Delinquency Rate for Fiscal Year 2021

As of July 2021, there is no delinquency for Special Tax in CFD No. 2002-2 for Fiscal Year 2021.
