

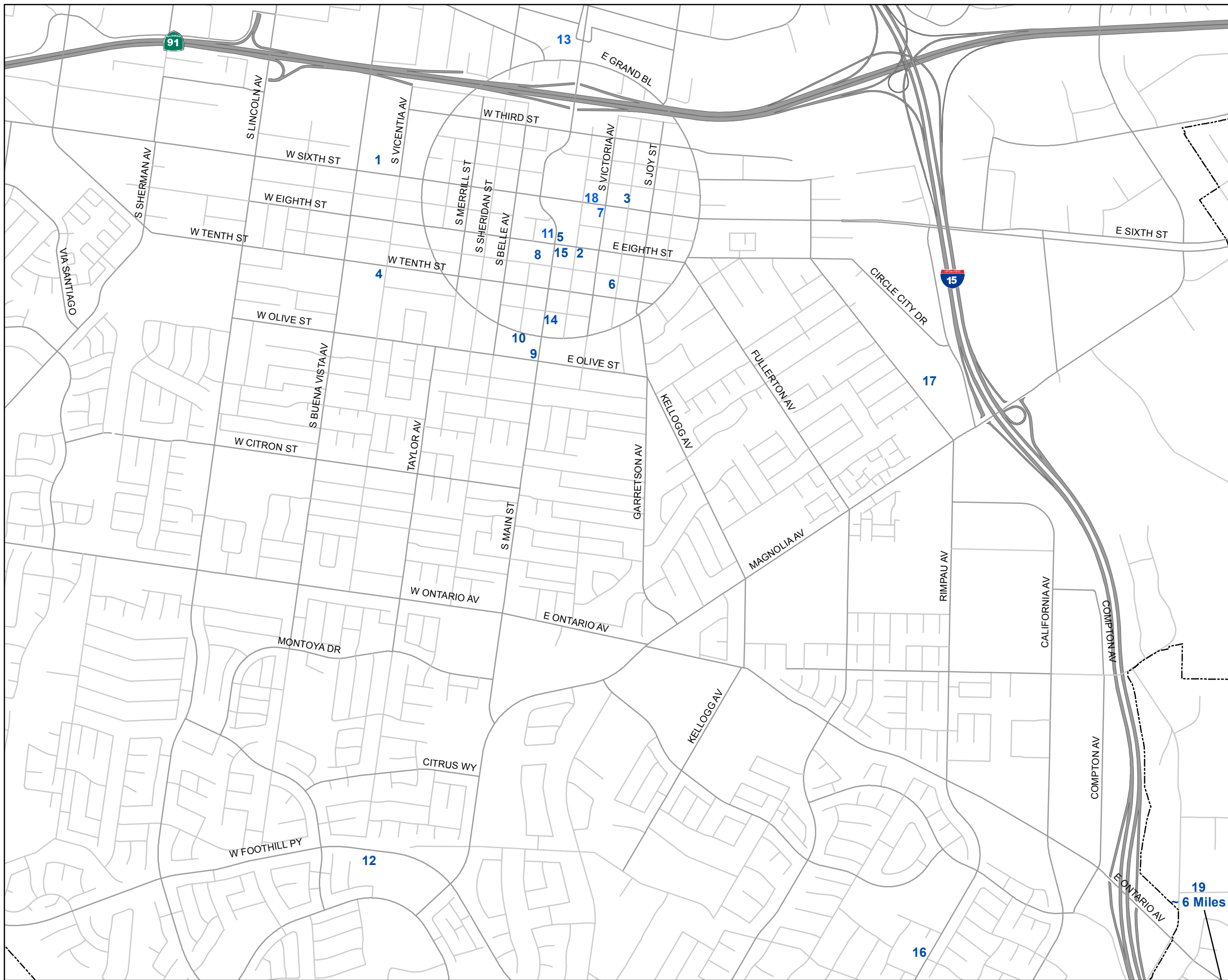
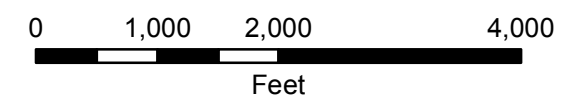
# City of Corona Historic Marker Sites

Corona Historic Preservation Society has had a formal Historic Marker Program since 1996. Nineteen historically significant sites have been recognized by a bronze or granite plaque placed on the wall or the building or by a monument bearing the plaque. All but five of the markers have been placed by Boy Scouts as part of their requirements to attain the rank of Eagle Scout.

The collaboration between local Boy Scouts and the Corona Historic Preservation Society has been a very productive one over the past eighteen years.
