Executive Summary

Background

Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act and the President signed it on March 27, 2020 authorizing \$2.2 trillion in a variety of stimulus measures to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. The law included \$5 billion for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) entitlement communities. The City of Corona receives regular formula-based entitlement grants of CDBG funds through the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) each year. Accordingly, the City received a special allocation of CDBG funds under the CARES Act. These funds are commonly referred to as “CDBG-CV funds.”

HUD announced the City of Corona’s first award of \$734,885 of CDBG-CV funds on April 2, 2020 and the City Council allocated those funds to eligible CDBG-CV activities on June 3, 2020 with the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and 2019-2020 Action Plan. Amendment No. 1 allocated funds for the Emergency Housing Needs Assistance program to assist renters who were at risk of losing their housing. The program currently provides up to \$2,000 per month for a period of up to three consecutive months to cover rent and utility costs. Amendment No. 1 also included activities to cover program planning, administration and monitoring, as well as some of the City’s added expenses to prevent, prepare for, or respond to COVID-19 as the City reopened public facilities.

On September 11, 2020, HUD announced that the City of Corona will receive an additional \$935,657 of CDBG-CV funds. On November 18, 2020 the Corona City Council approved Amendment No. 2 to the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and 2019-2020 Action Plan to specify the eligible CDBG-CV activities to be undertaken to prevent, prepare for, or respond to coronavirus using the second allocation of funds. Staff and the CDBG Ad-Hoc Committee identified emergency short-term rent or mortgage and utility assistance, emergency pandemic-related City expenses, and grants for businesses to purchase personal protective equipment as eligible activities under the CDBG-CV program.

Action Plan Amendment No. 3 to the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and 2019-2020 Action Plan recommends reallocating funds between approved CDBG-CV projects. Specifically, Amendment No. 3 cancels the Corona Emergency Related Activities project (\$176,00), reduces the Personal Protective Equipment Grant program by \$100,000, and increases the Emergency Housing Needs Assistance Program (EHNAP) by \$276,000 to provide additional emergency rental assistance to COVID-impacted Corona residents at risk of homelessness or experiencing homelessness.

AP-15 Expected Resources

The CARES Act allocations from HUD include the first allocation of \$734,885 of CDBG-CV funds announced in April 2020 and the second allocation of \$935,657 announced in September 2020. The period of performance for these grants under the law is from March 1, 2020 to August 12, 2026. Table 1 below shows the total CDBG-CV funds allocated to Corona by HUD, including the first allocation and the second allocation.

The draft 2019-2020 Action Plan Amendment No. 3 cancels the Corona Emergency Related Activities project (\$176,00), reduces the Personal Protective Equipment Grant program by \$100,000, and increases the Emergency Housing Needs Assistance Program (EHNAP) by \$276,000 to provide additional emergency rental assistance to COVID-impacted Corona residents at risk of homelessness or experiencing homelessness.




