Re: Fatal Officer-Involved Shooting involving suspect Jashod Carter on July 29, 2017, by Corona Police Department Officers Robert Montanez No. 1607, Jessica Carbajal No. 3656, Robert Bejines No. 2674, and Daniel Brazeal No. 3224; Riverside Sheriff Department Case No. R172100001

Dear Chief Johnstone:

We have reviewed the investigative reports and other materials submitted on November 28, 2018, by the Riverside County Sheriff's Department, Central Homicide Unit, concerning the fatal officer involved shooting involving suspect Jashod Carter by Corona Police Officers Robert Montanez, Jessica Carbajal, Robert Bejines, and Daniel Brazeal on July 29, 2017. Our office completed its review of this incident on December 17, 2018.

PERSONS INVOLVED

On the date of the incident, subject Jashod Carter was 28 years old and a resident of Perris in Riverside County.

On July 29, 2017, Corona Police Department Officers Robert Montanez, Jessica Carbajal, Robert Bejines, and Daniel Brazeal were assigned to uniform patrol duty in the City of Corona. The officers responded to a call for service at Angels Gentlemen's Club on East Sixth Street that turned into a vehicle pursuit. That pursuit terminated on First Street in the City of Norco, within the jurisdiction of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department.

FACTUAL SUMMARY OF THE INCIDENT

On Saturday, July 29, 2017, at approximately 2:09 a.m., officers from the Corona Police Department received a 911 call (Corona Police Department Case # 17-8528) of an assault with a deadly weapon involving a firearm at the Angels Gentlemen's Club, located at 1650 E. 6th Street in the city of Corona. The reporting party was a patron in the parking lot, who provided a detailed suspect description, as well

as a vehicle description. Officers responded and located the suspect vehicle, described as a Honda Civic, white in color, occupied by two black male adults.

Corona officers attempted to conduct a traffic stop of the subject vehicle, but the driver failed to yield, and a pursuit was initiated. The pursuit continued for several minutes through the city of Corona. The driver showed reckless disregard during the vehicle pursuit by driving at speeds over 105 miles per hour, by driving through multiple red traffic lights, and failing to stop at multiple intersections. The driver ultimately lost control of the Honda Civic near the intersection of First Street and Parkridge Avenue in the city of Norco. The Honda Civic was occupied by two black male adults. The driver exited the vehicle and fled on foot. He was subsequently located hiding in a field a short time later. The driver was later identified as Tyrone Carter. The passenger exited the vehicle, produced a handgun, and fired multiple rounds at the officers. In doing so, he emptied his magazine. Corona Police Officers Montanez, Carbajal, Bejines, and Brazeal each returned fire. The passenger was later identified as Jashod Carter. Jashod Carter matched the suspect description given by the reporting party at the Angels Gentlemen's Club.

No Corona Police Officers or bystanders were injured during the incident. Jashod Carter was shot and killed during the shooting.

During processing of the scene, a Kimber .45-caliber handgun was found on the ground next to the right hand of the deceased, Jashod Carter. A nine (9) millimeter Glock handgun was located inside the Honda Civic. An E-TRACE of the weapons via the Department of Justice website revealed both weapons were purchased and registered to [REDACTED]

THE INVESTIGATION

Charting of Officer Montanez' Weapons

On July 29, 2017, Investigator Pemberton of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department conducted the charting of Officer Montanez at the Corona Police Department. Riverside County Sheriff's Department Forensic Technician Shaver assisted Investigator Pemberton with the charting of Officer Montanez. The processing of Officer Montanez began at 8:01 a.m.

Forensic Technician Shaver photographed Officer Montanez as he appeared during the shooting. Officer Montanez was dressed in a Corona Police Department uniform which is the standard uniform for personnel assigned to patrol. Officer Montanez was wearing a long sleeve navy blue shirt which had two shoulder patches that read "Corona Police," a tactical vest with a cloth nametag bearing the name "Montanez," and a cloth Corona Police Department badge that read "Police Officer Corona Police." Officer Montanez was also wearing navy blue cargo pants and black boots.

During the incident, Officer Montanez was wearing a tactical vest consisting of the following equipment:

- Hand-held radio
- Body worn camera
- Two (2) Glock magazines located in a dual nylon magazine pouch
- Taser X26 (serial number X12002EKR) located in a nylon pocket

During the incident, Officer Montanez was wearing a nylon Sam Brown duty belt consisting of the following equipment from left to right:

- RCB Collapsible baton located in a nylon holder
- Glock model 34 Gen 4, nine (9) millimeter handgun in a black plastic holster
- Key holder with a set of keys

Officer Montanez primary duty weapon was a Glock 34 GEN 4, nine (9) millimeter handgun (serial number BDZC625) with a TLR Stream light attached. It was loaded with a Glock factory magazine, which was loaded to capacity with seventeen (17) live, nine (9) millimeter rounds, plus one (1) live nine (9) millimeter round in the chamber. Officer Montanez had two additional magazines on his Sam Brown duty belt each loaded to capacity with seventeen (17) live nine (9) millimeter rounds.

Forensic Technician Shaver placed butcher paper on the ground to inspect and document Officer Montanez' patrol rifle. Officer Montanez handed his Colt M4 rifle (serial number A0272467) to Forensic Technician Shaver who placed it on the butcher paper. The rifle contained one (1) live .223 caliber round in the chamber, which was collected as evidence. When the magazine was removed from the rifle, it contained thirty (30) live .223 caliber rounds of ammunition, which was collected as evidence. Officer Montanez had one additional magazine located in his right cargo pant pocket. The magazine contained twelve (12) live .223 caliber rounds of ammunition, which was collected as evidence. The rifle was equipped with a scope and a "Surefire" tactical light.

The duty belt of Officer Montanez was placed on the butcher paper and photographed by Forensic Technician Shaver with the pouches opened and closed. Officer Montanez stated he was in possession of a body-worn camera, which was collected and downloaded.

Charting of Officer Carbajal's Weapons

On July 29, 2017, Investigator Dickey of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department conducted the charting of Officer Carbajal at the Corona Police Department. Riverside County Sheriff's Department Forensic Technician Devore assisted Investigator Dickey with the charting of Officer Carbajal. The processing of Officer Carbajal began at 8:33am.

Forensic Technician Devore photographed Officer Carbajal as she appeared during the shooting. Officer Carbajal was dressed in a Corona Police Department uniform which is the standard uniform for personnel assigned to patrol. Officer Carbajal was wearing a long sleeve navy blue shirt which had two shoulder patches that read "Corona Police," a metal nametag bearing the name "Carbajal" and a metal Corona Police Department badge that read "Police Officer Corona Police." Officer Carbajal was also wearing navy blue pants and black boots.

During the incident, Officer Carbajal was wearing a leather "Sam Brown" duty belt consisting of the following equipment from left to right:

- Hand-held radio with microphone attachment
- Two Glock magazines located in a dual black leather magazine pouch
- Taser X26 (serial number X12006FWF) located in a black plastic holder
- RCB Collapsible baton located in a black leather holder
- One pair of handcuffs located in a black leather holder
- One pair of handcuffs located in a black leather holder
- OC pepper spray located in a black leather holder
- Glock model 19, nine (9) millimeter handgun in a black plastic holster
- Digital recorder in a black holder
- Key holder with a set of keys

Officer Carbajal was not carrying a back-up weapon at the time of the incident.

Forensic Technician Devore placed butcher paper on the ground to inspect and document Officer Carbajal's duty weapon. Officer Carbajal removed her duty weapon from her holster and handed it to

Forensic Technician Devore who placed it on the butcher paper. The duty weapon was a black Glock model 19, nine (9) millimeter handgun, serial number TCL327, which was collected at that time as evidence. The handgun contained a Glock brand magazine, which was removed from the handgun and found to contain fifteen (15) live rounds of nine (9) millimeter Winchester ammunition and was collected. The slide of the handgun was locked back and one (1) live round of a nine (9) millimeter Winchester brand ammunition was removed from the barrel and collected. There were two (2) additional Glock magazines located on Officer Carbajal's "Sam Brown" belt. The first magazine was loaded with fifteen (15) live rounds of nine (9) millimeter Winchester brand ammunition. The second magazine was loaded with two (2) live nine (9) millimeter caliber Winchester brand rounds. During the charting, Officer Carbajal stated she conducted a "tactical" re-load placing a fully loaded magazine into her duty weapon and placing the magazine with two rounds remaining into her magazine pouch, which was collected.

The duty belt of Officer Carbajal was placed on the butcher paper and photographed by Forensic Technician Devore with the pouches opened and closed. Officer Carbajal was in possession of a digital recorder, but she stated it was not activated during the incident. Officer Carbajal was wearing a body-worn camera, which was placed into her patrol car and was collected by his supervision and secured, pending the investigation.

Charting of Officer Bejines' Weapon

On July 29, 2017, Investigator Pemberton of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department conducted the charting of Corona Police Officer Bejines at the Corona Police Department. Riverside County Sheriff's Department Forensic Technician Shaver assisted Investigator Pemberton with the charting of Officer Bejines. The processing of Officer Bejines began at 8:43a.m.

Forensic Technician Shaver photographed Officer Bejines as he appeared during the shooting. Officer Bejines was dressed in a Corona Police Department uniform which is the standard uniform for personnel assigned to patrol. Officer Bejines was wearing a short sleeve navy blue shirt which had two shoulder patches that read "Corona Police," a tactical vest with a cloth nametag bearing the name "R. Bejines" and a cloth Corona Police Department badge that read "Police Officer Corona Police." Officer Bejines was also wearing navy blue cargo pants and black boots.

During the incident, Officer Bejines was wearing a tactical vest containing the following equipment:

- Hand-held radio with microphone attachment
- RCB collapsible baton located in a black leather holder
- One (1) pair of handcuffs located in a nylon Velcro holder
- OC pepper spray located in a black leather holder
- Digital recorder in a nylon holder
- Small prybar
- Two (2) Glock magazines located in a dual black leather magazine pouch

During the incident, Officer Bejines was wearing a leather "Sam Brown" duty belt consisting of the following equipment from left to right:

- Two (2) Glock magazines located in a dual black leather magazine pouch
- Baton ring holder
- One (1) pair of handcuffs located in a black nylon holder
- Glock model 21 .45 caliber handgun in a black plastic holster
- Hobble restraint

Officer Bejines was not carrying a back-up weapon at the time of the shooting.

During the charting of Officer Bejines, Forensic Technician Shaver placed butcher paper on the ground and removed the duty weapon of Officer Bejines. The duty weapon was a Glock 21, .45-caliber handgun, serial number LLK674, which was collected. The handgun had a one (1) live round within the chamber of the weapon, which was collected, and a Glock brand magazine within the gun which contained thirteen (13) live rounds of .45-caliber Winchester brand ammunition, which was collected. The handgun had a Surefire brand tactical light attached to it.

Additionally, there were three (3) Glock magazines located on Officer Bejines's Sam Brown belt. The first magazine was empty, and the two other magazines were loaded to capacity with thirteen (13) live rounds of Winchester brand ammunition. Officer Bejines stated he re-loaded his handgun during the incident with a fully loaded magazine and placed his empty magazine into that magazine pouch on his duty belt.

The duty belt of Officer Bejines was placed on the butcher paper and photographed by Forensic Technician Shaver with the pouches opened and closed. Officer Bejines was in possession of a digital recorder, but stated it was not on during the incident. Officer Bejines was wearing a Body Worn Camera, which was placed inside his patrol car and collected by his supervision and secured, pending the investigation.

Charting of Officer Brazeal's Weapons

On July 29, 2017, Investigator Pemberton of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department conducted the charting of Corona Police Officer Brazeal at the Corona Police Department. Riverside County Sheriff's Department Forensic Technician Shaver assisted Investigator Pemberton with the charting of Officer Brazeal. The processing of Officer Brazeal began at 9:15 a.m.

Forensic Technician Shaver photographed Officer Brazeal as he appeared during the shooting. Officer Brazeal was dressed in a Corona Police Department uniform which is the standard uniform for personnel assigned to patrol. Officer Brazeal was wearing a short sleeve navy blue shirt which had two shoulder patches that read "Corona Police," a cloth nametag bearing the name "Brazeal" and a cloth Corona Police Department badge that read "Police Officer Corona Police." Officer Brazeal was also wearing navy blue cargo pants and black boots.

During the incident, Officer Brazeal was wearing a leather "Sam Brown" duty belt consisting of the following equipment from left to right:

- Two (2) Glock magazines located in a dual black leather magazine pouch
- Taser X26 (s/n: X120034E8) located in a black plastic holder
- OC pepper spray located in a black leather holder
- Hand-held radio with microphone attachment
- One (1) pair of handcuffs located in a black leather holder
- One (1) pair of handcuffs located in a black leather holder
- RCB collapsible baton located in a black leather holder
- Glock model 22 .40-caliber handgun in a black leather holster
- Key holder with a set of keys
- Hobble restraint

Officer Brazeal was carrying a back-up weapon at the time of the shooting, which was located in his right cargo pant pocket. The weapon was in a leather holster and was a Smith & Wesson .38 special caliber

revolver (serial number CP27574) loaded to capacity with five (5) .38-caliber rounds. Officer Brazeal did not have any additional rounds of .38 caliber on his person.

Forensic Technician Shaver placed butcher paper on the ground to inspect and document Officer Brazeal's duty weapon. Officer Brazeal removed his duty weapon from his holster and handed it to Forensic Technician Shaver who placed it on the butcher paper. The duty weapon was a black Glock model 22, .40 caliber handgun, serial number KAM553, which was collected. The handgun contained a Glock brand magazine, which was removed from the handgun and found to contain fifteen (15) live rounds of .40-caliber Winchester ammunition. The slide of the handgun was locked back and one (1) live round of .40-caliber Winchester brand ammunition was removed from the barrel and collected.

There was an additional Glock magazine located on Officer Brazeal's "Sam Brown" belt. The magazine was loaded with fifteen (15) live rounds of .40-caliber Winchester brand ammunition. During the charting, Officer Brazeal stated he conducted a tactical reload at the scene and believed that one of his magazines, would be found empty at the scene, which was located and collected as evidence. The duty belt of Officer Brazeal was placed on the butcher paper and photographed by Forensic Technician Shaver with the pouches opened and closed. Officer Brazeal was in possession of a digital recorder, but stated it was not on during the incident. Officer Brazeal was wearing a body-worn camera, which was collected from him by his supervision and secured, pending the investigation.

Physical Evidence Recovered from Scene at Parkridge and First Street, Norco

During the processing of the scene, fifty-four (54) expended shell casings and one (1) live .40-caliber round, which were identified as relating to the officers' firearms, were located near their marked patrol vehicles, consistent with their positioning and location in the Body Worn Cameras (BWC) camera footage of the incident. Two (2) .223-caliber shell casings were not located during the processing of the scene; however, it should be noted that an armored vehicle was driven in and out of the scene prior to processing of any evidence, for officer safety, based on the outstanding suspect and the possibility of additional suspects within the suspect vehicle.

Additionally, eight (8) expended shell casings which were identified as relating to Jashod Carter's firearm were located near Carter's body and the Honda Civic, which is consistent with the BWC footage of the incident. During the processing of the scene, a Kimber, custom crimson carry, .45 caliber in slide lock, loaded with an empty magazine was located on the ground just west of Jashod Carter's right hand. During the processing of the suspect vehicle (Honda Civic) a Glock .40 caliber handgun, loaded with a magazine which contained five (5) live .40 caliber rounds, was located on the front passenger floorboard, partially under the front passenger seat. A records check revealed that both handguns were registered to the [REDACTED]

Department of Justice (DOJ) and Ballistics

Following an examination by the Department of Justice of the officers' weapons used in the shooting incident, they issued the following findings:

- Officer Carbajal's pistol functioned properly during examination and test firing
- Officer Bejines' pistol functioned properly during examination and test firing
- Officer Brazeal's pistol functioned properly during examination and test firing
- Officer Montanez's rifle functioned properly during examination and test firing

Audio/Video

Audio and video were captured on the body-worn cameras of each officer and on the dash cameras from each patrol unit. A 9-1-1 call, regarding the assault with a firearm, from a patron at Angels Gentlemen's Club was collected.

Autopsy

On August 1, 2017, Investigator Pemberton of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department attended the autopsy of Jashod Carter. During the autopsy it was described that Jashod Carter sustained multiple gunshot wounds to his torso. Additionally, Carter sustained a lacerated right kidney, which resulted in a renal artery being lacerated; a hole in the right lung; a hole in the left lung; and a shattered femur, which would have caused extensive blood loss. The cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds, pending a final coroner's review.

Coroner Review

On February 8, 2018, Investigator Gonzales attended the coroner review for Jashod Carter. The findings were as follows:

- The cause of death was determined to be multiple gunshot wounds
- The manner of death was classified as a homicide
- The mode of death was determined to be shot during a confrontation with law enforcement

Toxicology

Jashod Carter had a blood alcohol level of 0.203% at the time of his death.

Interview with Officer Daniel Brazeal

On August 7, 2017, Investigators Pemberton and Gonzales conducted an audio-recorded interview with Officer Brazeal at the Corona Police Department. Officer Brazeal had approximately seven (7) years of law enforcement experience as a full-time peace officer and has been employed with the Corona Police Department since 2014.

Officer Brazeal was working uniformed patrol in a marked patrol unit. Officer Brazeal was dispatched to a call for service at Angels Gentlemen's Club located at 1650 Sixth Street in the city of Corona.

Officer Brazeal received a vehicle description, which was a white Honda Civic. Officer Brazeal did not initially see the vehicle but located it as he attempted to exit the parking lot of the building. Officer Brazeal activated his overhead lights and siren on his patrol car. The vehicle initially looked like it was going to pull over, however, the Honda Civic made a U-turn, took off at a high rate of speed, and a vehicle pursuit ensued. The vehicle was occupied by a driver and front passenger.

The pursuit continued for several miles. Officers Montanez, Carbajal, and Bejines were also involved in the pursuit due to the white Honda driving in excess of 90 miles per hour during the pursuit. The pursuit ultimately terminated when the suspect lost control of his vehicle near the intersection of Parkridge and First Street in the city of Norco.

Officer Brazeal remembered hearing over the radio that the suspect vehicle had been involved in a traffic collision. Officer Brazeal was 15 to 30 seconds behind the pursuing officers and believed that information was broadcast by either Officer Bejines or Officer Carbajal. When Officer Brazeal arrived at the termination point of the pursuit, he saw the driver of the vehicle running northbound, away from the vehicle. Officer Brazeal yelled commands to "show me your hands," however, the driver ignored the commands, did not look back, and continued to run north away from the suspect vehicle into the darkness.

The passenger was still sitting in the vehicle at this point and Officer Brazeal continued to yell commands to “show me your hands.” The passenger then exited the vehicle, racked the slide on a handgun, and began to fire at Officer Brazeal. Officer Brazeal could see rounds impacting the front of his patrol car near the window and could also hear rounds passing over his head which he described as “whizzing” past his head. Officer Brazeal initially believed he had been struck in the side of his face, because his face felt hot.

Officer Brazeal fired until the subject, later identified as Jashod Carter, went down to the ground. Officer Brazeal was not sure how many rounds he fired, so he went to the rear of his patrol car and re-loaded his magazine with a fully-loaded magazine. Officer Brazeal then took up a position on the passenger side of his patrol car and continued to access and scan the area, being cognizant of the outstanding driver who had run from the vehicle.

A plan was developed to use a BearCat vehicle to approach the subject, due to the unknown whereabouts of the outstanding driver and to search the vehicle for any additional subjects that might be involved. Officer Brazeal approached using the BearCat as cover and checked the vehicle and broadcast the vehicle was clear, at which point he attempted to render medical aid. Officer Brazeal checked (Jashod Carter) for a pulse and could not locate a pulse. Officer Brazeal then asked Corona Police Department Sergeant Voorhees to double-check for a pulse. Sergeant Voorhees confirmed Carter did not have a pulse and was deceased. Officer Brazeal then moved back and took up a position near his patrol car until he was cleared from the scene.

Investigator Gonzales summarized the interview with Officer Brazeal by asking him why he started firing his duty weapon and why he stopped. Officer Brazeal stated that he started firing because he was being shot at by Carter and feared for his life and the life of his partners. Officer Brazeal stopped firing his duty weapon after the subject went to the ground.

Interview with Officer Jessica Carbajal

On August 7, 2017, Investigators Gonzales and Dickey conducted an audio-recorded interview with Officer Carbajal at the Corona Police Department. Officer Carbajal had approximately 10 years of law enforcement experience as a full-time peace officer and has been employed with the Corona Police Department since 2014.

On July 29, 2017, Officer Carbajal was working uniformed patrol in a marked patrol unit. Officer Carbajal was in the report writing room at the Corona Police Department when she heard the call for service, which was a man with a gun at the Angels Gentlemen’s Club located at 1650 Sixth Street.

Officer Carbajal drove in the direction of the call and heard Officer Brazeal broadcast over the radio that he was in pursuit of a white four-door sedan. Officer Carbajal saw the vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed northbound on Sixth Street in the city of Corona. Officer Brazeal broadcast that he was a good distance behind the vehicle, so she pulled in behind the suspect vehicle and took over as primary of the pursuit, and the pursuit continued for several miles. She was not sure the exact surface streets the pursuit traveled, and she remembered another unit in the pursuit broadcast agreed they would be calling out the pursuit.

The suspect vehicle lost control, spun around 180-degrees, and came to rest facing Officer Carbajal’s unit. Officer Carbajal stopped her vehicle, jumped out, and she could see both the driver and front passenger seated in the vehicle. The occupants remained in the vehicle for several seconds and appeared to be having a conversation. After several more seconds passed, the driver of the vehicle exited the vehicle and

ran north, away from the vehicle. Officer Carbajal broadcast a general description of the driver and then re-focused on the vehicle.

Several more seconds passed, and then the passenger exited the vehicle. The passenger pointed what Officer Carbajal recognized as a gun in her direction and fired. Officer Carbajal could hear the unmistakable sound of rounds whizzing past her head. Her initial reaction was to take cover. She then took a few steps towards the trunk of her patrol car. She then took up a position behind her open driver's door and began to return fire. Officer Carbajal remembered the suspect was holding the gun in his right hand and recalled a muzzle flash coming from the subject's gun. The gun was a silver handgun.

Officer Carbajal was not sure exactly how many units were with her at that time. She fired an initial volley of shots, while the subject was standing and firing. The subject fell to the ground face down and with his arms out to his sides. Officer Carbajal remembered a deliberate movement by the subject to reach for his gun at least twice while he was lying on the ground. When she saw the subject reaching for the gun, she fired a second volley of shots. Officer Carbajal could not say exactly how many rounds she fired during the first or second volley of shots. Officer Carbajal had initially reported firing eight (8) shots when she provided a public safety statement to her supervision.

Officer Carbajal took over radio communications and requested medical aid, as a plan was being developed to safely approach the suspect and vehicle, and she maintained her position near her vehicle.

Investigator Gonzales summarized the interview with Officer Carbajal by asking her why she started firing her duty weapon and why she stopped. Officer Carbajal started firing because she was being shot at by Carter, and she feared for her life and the life of her partners. Officer Carbajal stopped firing her duty weapon after the subject went to the ground and only fired a second volley of shots after he reached for his gun.

Interview with Officer Bejines

On August 7, 2017, Investigators Dickey and Higgins conducted an audio-recorded interview with Officer Bejines at the Corona Police Department. Officer Bejines had approximately 14 and a half years of law enforcement experience as a full-time peace officer and has been employed with the Corona Police Department since 2007. On July 29, 2017, Officer Bejines was working uniformed patrol in a marked patrol unit. He dispatched himself via his patrol unit computer to a call for service at the Angels Gentlemen's Club located at 1650 Sixth Street.

Officer Bejines heard a suspect description via the radio. The suspect was described as a black male, wearing a red hat, red shirt, white pants, and armed with a gun. According to the reporting party, the suspect pulled a gun on somebody and put it to his or her head. The suspect vehicle was described as a white Honda Civic. The reporting party reported the subject got into the passenger seat of the white Honda. Officer Bejines heard a vehicle pursuit initiated and he held his position and heard the pursuit traveling west on Sixth Street in the city of Corona. Officer Bejines heard via the radio that the suspect vehicle was driving at speeds over 100 miles per hour.

Officer Bejines saw the vehicle pursuit approaching and entered the pursuit as the second or third unit. The body-worn camera and dashcam were activated with the overhead lights and siren of his patrol car. The suspect vehicle turned onto a side street as he continued driving his patrol car west on Sixth Street, paralleling the pursuit. Officer Bejines turned right onto Lincoln, the suspect vehicle turned out in front of Officer Bejines, and he then became the second unit in the pursuit and began to narrate the pursuit.

The pursuit ultimately terminated when the driver lost control of his vehicle near the intersection of Parkridge and First Street in the city of Norco. The vehicle spun out and came to rest facing the patrol units. The pursuing units flanked out to set up a felony traffic stop. The lineup of the patrol units were Officer Brazeal to his far left, Officer Carbajal to his immediate left, and his patrol unit and Officer Montanez to the rear. Officer Bejines got out of his unit and tried to get his rifle from his vehicle, however he could not initially remove the rifle out of the holder. The vehicle rolled forward a bit and he noticed the transmission was not in park.

Officer Bejines placed the car in park and noticed the driver (later identified as Tyrone Carter) exit the Honda and run away from the vehicle. Officer Bejines noticed the front passenger exit the vehicle, wearing the clothing from the initial suspect description; red hat, red shirt, and white pants. Officer Bejines immediately saw a muzzle flash coming from the direction of the passenger (later identified as Jashod Carter). This initially caught Officer Bejines off guard, and he remembered thinking, "Oh this guy is shooting at us!" Officer Bejines was scared, and his blood was racing.

Officer Bejines heard return fire and he fired his duty weapon towards the subject. Officer Bejines saw the suspect go down. Officer Bejines initially tried to communicate with his partners to see if everyone was okay. When the suspect went down, he still had the gun in his right hand. Officer Bejines still believed there was a threat so he fired a second volley of shots and then reassessed. Officer Bejines was cognizant of the outstanding driver at that point.

A plan was developed to use a BearCat (armored vehicle) to approach the subject that was down, due to the unknown whereabouts of the outstanding suspect and the necessity to search the vehicle for additional suspects. Officer Bejines remained at his vehicle, providing cover, and watching the surrounding area for the driver, until he was cleared from the scene.

The interview was summarized with Officer Bejines stating he started firing because he believed the subject was shooting at him and his partners. Officer Bejines feared for his life and the life of his partners. Officer Bejines stopped firing his duty weapon after he fired a second volley of shots and the subject was no longer a threat and had been neutralized.

Interview with Officer Robert Montanez

On August 7, 2017, Investigators Gonzalez and Dickey conducted an audio-recorded interview with Officer Montanez at the Corona Police Department. Officer Montanez had approximately 11 years of law enforcement experience as a full-time peace officer and has been employed with the Corona Police Department since 2003. Officer Montanez left law enforcement for approximately three (3) years to attend law school. Officer Montanez returned to active law enforcement in 2016, first as a reserve peace officer with the Santa Ana Police Department and then was re-hired by the Corona Police Department as a full-time peace officer in August of 2016.

On July 29, 2017, Officer Montanez was working uniformed patrol in a marked unit and was assigned to Zone 2 and was at the Zone 2 office, when he heard the call being dispatched. Officer Montanez was dispatched to a call for service at the Angels strip club and bar located near Magnolia and Sixth Street in the city of Corona. Dispatch broadcast that a person in the parking lot was holding a gun to somebody's head. Dispatch further advised that two individuals were seen getting into a newer model, white Honda Civic.

Officer Montanez was not originally dispatched the call because there were units closer to the call that were assigned first. However, he responded because it was in his beat and he wanted to handle the call. Officer Montanez arrived in the area and setup eastbound on Magnolia because cars exiting the club

would drive directly towards his unit. Officer Montanez heard Officer Brazeal put out over the radio that he located the vehicle and was going to attempt a traffic stop. Officer Montanez then heard Officer Brazeal put out "it's going to go." Officer Montanez interpreted that as the suspect vehicle was going to take off and result in a pursuit. As Officer Brazeal was broadcasting this information, Officer Montanez saw the white Honda Civic make a U-turn and head west on Magnolia. Officer Brazeal was already behind the vehicle with his overhead lights activated.

Officer Montanez immediately took up the second position in the pursuit and began calling out the pursuit, providing the approximate speed, direction of travel, traffic conditions, and suspect vehicle description. During the pursuit the suspect vehicle was travelling well over 100 miles per hour.

During the pursuit Officer Montanez saw the subject vehicle fishtailing, so he broadcast that the subject vehicle had crashed. Officer Brazeal broadcast that the vehicle had not crashed and the pursuit was continuing. Due to the speed of the pursuit, another unit entered the pursuit and Officer Montanez eventually ended up paralleling the pursuit. At some point the vehicle ended up travelling west on Vincent. Officer Montanez then became number four (4) in the pursuit.

During the pursuit, Officer Montanez was thinking to himself that there had been two shootings in the past couple of years at that nightclub. Knowing that history of the club and the driving actions of the driver, Officer Montanez believed there was a good chance the assault with a deadly weapon call was legitimate.

The pursuit continued to the area of Parkridge and River in the city of Norco. Officer Montanez remembered there were a couple of serious dips in that area so there was a chance the suspect vehicle was going to crash. Officer Montanez heard Officer Brazeal broadcast that the subject vehicle had crashed. Officer Montanez pulled onto Parkridge and was the number four (4) patrol unit, with three units in front of him, one to the left, one in the center of the street, and one to right of him. The units were configured to conduct a felony stop of the subject vehicle. The vehicle had spun out and come to rest facing the patrol units. The driver (later identified as Tyrone Carter) exited the vehicle and ran away from the vehicle.

Officer Montanez stopped his patrol unit, removed his patrol rifle from its rack and charged the rifle (chambered a cartridge). He made his way to the center patrol unit. Officer Montanez saw the passenger (later identified as Jashod Carter) exit the vehicle. Officer Montanez then saw the passenger's hands swinging around in an arc-like direction. Officer Montanez saw a muzzle flash and the passenger started shooting at him and his partners. The passenger was a black male, wearing a red shirt and white pants. Officer Montanez said it, "scared the shit out of me." He had never been shot at before and he believed he could die.

At some point the passenger fell to the ground and Officer Montanez moved up another five feet or so to the passenger door of the middle unit. The passenger fell to the ground with his head facing the front of the suspect vehicle where Officer Montanez could see the right side of the passenger's body. While the passenger was lying on the ground he lifted his head, looked at the officers and reached for his gun again, which Officer Montanez described as being six (6) to eight (8) inches away from the passenger. Officer Montanez believed the passenger was trying to get the gun and kill him and his partners. Officer Montanez fired a few more times until the passenger stopped moving towards the gun. The passenger did have slight body movements that he described as muscle twitches, but nothing as definitive as the first grab towards the gun after the gun had fallen to the ground.

Because of the unknown whereabouts of the driver, and not knowing if the driver was armed and the fact the passenger had just shot at them, it was unreasonable for the officers to walk up to the vehicle. A plan

was developed to use a BearCat to approach the subject that was down, due to the unknown whereabouts of the driver and the necessity to search the vehicle for additional occupants. Officer Montanez was part of the group that approached to try to render medical aid to the subject and to check the vehicle for additional individuals. After a short time, the Orange County Sheriff's Department helicopter arrived and assisted with locating the driver who was hiding on a nearby property. Officer Montanez assisted with taking the driver into custody.

The interview was summarized with Officer Montanez who stated he started firing because he believed the subject was shooting at Officer Montanez and his partners. Officer Montanez feared for his life and the life of his partners. Officer Montanez stopped firing his duty weapon after he fired a second volley of shots and the subject was no longer a threat and was not making any further movements towards the gun.

Other Civilian Interviews

██████ was the reporting party on the 9-1-1 call from the Angels strip club. She saw a black male, whom she later positively identified as Jashod Carter in a photo lineup, put a handgun to the head of another male and threaten to shoot him. A second black male adult intervened and they drove away.

██████ lives on First Street in Norco and was asleep in bed when she was awakened by the sound of a vehicle crashing and then hearing sirens. She thought she heard a male voice yelling to put something down, maybe a gun. Then she heard three loud pops, followed by a ten-second delay, and then a "ton" of shooting. She did not see anything.

██████ lives with his grandmother, ██████. He was asleep when he heard a vehicle crash. He went outside and heard the police saying "Put your hands up." As he went back into his home he heard gunshots.

APPLICABLE LEGAL STANDARDS

Under California law, a peace officer who has reasonable cause to believe that a person to be arrested has committed a public offense may use reasonable force to make the arrest, prevent escape, and overcome resistance. The officer need not retreat or end his efforts to make the arrest because of the person's resistance. (Pen. Code, § 835a.) Penal Code section 834a requires that if a person has either actual or constructive knowledge that he is being arrested by a peace officer, the person must refrain from using force or any weapon to resist such arrest. In addition, peace officers, in the course of their duties, may use deadly force to protect themselves or others from the threat of death or great bodily harm. As provided in CALCRIM No. 2670 (Lawful Performance: Peace Officer), "Special rules control the use of force. A peace officer may use reasonable force to arrest or detain someone, to prevent escape, to overcome resistance, or in self-defense."

Peace officers, in the course of their duties, may use deadly force to protect themselves or others from the threat of death or great bodily harm. In addition to the laws specifically applicable to the use of deadly force by peace officers in the performance of their duties, the laws of self-defense and defense of another are available to any person, including peace officers. A person acts in lawful self-defense/defense of another if: (1) the person reasonably believed that he or someone else was in imminent danger of being killed or suffering great bodily injury; (2) the person reasonably believed that the immediate use of deadly force was necessary to defend against the danger; and (3) the person used no more force than was reasonably necessary to defend against that danger. (See CALCRIM No. 3470.)

In deciding whether a person's beliefs were reasonable, all the circumstances as they were known to and appeared to that person should be considered as well as what a reasonable person in a similar situation with similar knowledge would have believed. If the person's beliefs were reasonable, the danger does not

need to have actually existed. Additionally, the person is not required to retreat. He or she is entitled to stand his or her ground and defend him or herself and, if reasonably necessary, to pursue an assailant until the danger of death or great bodily injury has passed. This is so even if safety could have been achieved by retreating. (CALCRIM No. 505.)

The United States Supreme Court held in *Graham v. Connor* (1989) 490 U.S. 386, that an officer's use of force is to be analyzed under the Fourth Amendment's objective reasonableness standard, and "[t]he calculus of reasonableness must embody allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second judgments – in circumstances that are tense, uncertain, and rapidly evolving – about the amount of force that is necessary in a particular situation." (*Id.* at pp. 396-397.) Further, the High Court directed, "[t]he reasonableness of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, rather than with the 20/20 vision of hindsight," and the totality of the circumstances must be taken into account. (*Id.* at p. 396.) "[I]ts proper application requires careful attention to the facts and circumstances of each particular case, including the severity of the crime at issue, whether the suspect poses an immediate threat to the safety of the officers or others, and whether he is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight." (*Ibid.*)

CONCLUSIONS

At the time of the shooting, Corona Police Officers Montanez, Carbajal, Bejines, and Brazeal were peace officers lawfully engaged in the performance of their duties. As they responded to a call regarding an assault with a firearm, a vehicle pursuit occurred. The vehicle was driven with extreme recklessness and at speeds above 100 miles per hour. After the subject vehicle crashed, the officers attempted to conduct a felony stop. While staging, they were fired upon by the passenger in the Honda. Jashod Carter exited the vehicle and, with his right arm extended, walked towards the officers while shooting at them. As bullets whizzed by their heads and struck their vehicles, the officers returned fire and stopped the threat.

The evidence gathered as part of the investigation supports the conclusion that Officers Montanez, Carbajal, Bejines, and Brazeal's actions were a direct result of the force used by Jashod Carter and that these officers each acted in reasonable self-defense and defense of others. Officers Montanez, Carbajal, Bejines, and Brazeal therefore bear no criminal liability for their actions.

1 **Scene:** The pursuit terminated and the officer involved shooting occurred on First
2 St., in the city of Norco, approximately 100 yards east of Parkridge Ave. At this
3 point, First St. is a two-lane asphalt roadway that travels in an E/W direction.
4 There are no street lights that illuminate the roadway. There are homes and/or
5 properties on both the north and south side of First St.
6

13 **Details:** On 7-29-17 at approximately 0210 hours, I was at the main police
14 station securing my unit and equipment for the end of the shift. I had logged off
15 from the Watchguard video system in unit #79265. My body worn camera (BWC)
16 was also docked in the sergeant's office.
17

18 At about this same time, I heard CPD dispatch broadcast a possible 245 PC with
19 a handgun at Angels Bar, located at 1650 E. Sixth St., Corona CA. Moments
20 later, I heard responding officers indicate that they were pursuing a possible
21 suspect vehicle related to that crime.
22

23 I returned to my police unit # 79265, however due to the seriousness of the crime
24 and time related in doing so, I did not log onto the Watchguard system, nor did I
25 retrieve my BWC from the sergeant's office. My involvement in the pursuit as a
26 supervisor was video recorded since I had activated my emergency lighting
27 which automatically triggers the Watchguard to activate.
28

29 **Note:** On 7-29-17 I reviewed the video associated with the incident. The
30 following is a summary of the incident and my involvement. The Watchguard
31 shows an activation time of 2:16:31. The time stamp shows a minute/second
32 counter which is reflected as: Example 2:00 or 3:30, which is actually the
33 minutes/seconds following 2:16:31.
34

35 Upon leaving the station, I activated my emergency lighting and turned S/B on
36 Cota St. and then W/B on Railroad St., I heard the pursuit was traveling N/B on
37 Lincoln approaching Railroad St. At that intersection, I observed 4-5 units in
38 pursuit of the suspect vehicle. I informed dispatch that I was involved and
39 positioned myself to the rear of the pursuing vehicles.
40

41 **1:58** I advised that sufficient units were involved. I followed the pursuit N/B
42 Lincoln Ave as it passed Rincon St., Harrington Ave, and crossed over River Rd.,

1 and Parkridge Ave. Officers radioed that the vehicle may have TC'd (crashed) on
2 First St. east of Parkridge Ave.

3
4 **2:56** I stopped behind the vehicles that were now positioned on First St, east of
5 Parkridge Ave. As I exited my vehicle I heard 5-6 gunshots, but was unable to
6 see if Corona officers or suspect(s) were firing. I approached the officers and
7 police units and could now see that a suspect was lying face down on the asphalt
8 near the passenger side door of the suspect vehicle that was now facing W/B
9 toward the officers. I could also see what appeared to be a black/gray handgun
10 near his outstretched right hand.

11
12 **4:20** Officer's stated that there was an outstanding suspect (driver) that had fled
13 the scene, and medical personnel were requested to stage. I learned that the
14 suspect had fled N/B from the scene into a large field. On the southern edge of
15 the field near our location, were large trees and shrubs that prevented me from
16 seeing. This position offered excellent cover and concealment for the suspect.

17
18 **5:42** Officers indicated that one suspect was down and that officers were Code4.

19
20 Based on the following circumstances, I determined not to approach the downed
21 suspect to render medical care. I did not see any movement of the suspect at this
22 time as he lay on the ground.

- 23 • Suspect involved in 245 PC
- 24 • Involved in pursuit
- 25 • Suspect engaged in gunfight with officers
- 26 • Fleeing suspect possibly armed and hiding in the bushes
- 27 • Potential ambush situation
- 28 • Police unit does not provide adequate ballistic protection for advancing
29 officers.
- 30 • Unknown occupants inside suspect vehicle.

31
32 I determined that all involved officers were okay and they remained on scene and
33 kept their guns drawn on the downed suspect as well as providing protection to
34 our left side tree line.

35
36 **6:14** Sgt Griffiths assumed control of the perimeter in an attempt to locate the
37 fleeing suspect.

38
39 **14:53** A determination was made for the Bearcat Armored vehicle to be deployed
40 to the scene.

41
42 **23:10** Dispatch advised no air unit available to assist with perimeter search.

5 **28:18** A Team was assembled to approach the suspect and vehicle. Ofcr Fien
6 drove the Bearcat between the tree line and suspect to provide protection for the
7 officers as they cleared the vehicle for any additional occupants and/or suspects.
8 I then checked the suspect and was unable to locate a carotid pulse and his
9 pupils were fixed and dilated and unresponsive to light. I pronounced his death
10 at 0249 hours.
11
12 **31:18** Duke One on scene.
13
14 **33:56** Duke One has visual of the outstanding suspect.
15
16 Our position was held until the suspect who was later identified as Tyrone Carter,
17 DOB: 3-22-86 was apprehended. *Refer to Sgt. Griffiths' supplemental report for*
18 *details regarding the apprehension.*
19
20 Carter was taken for an OK to book at Corona Regional Medical Center and later
21 transported to Corona PD jail by Ofcr A. Gutierrez. *Refer to his supplemental*
22 *report for further details.* Carter was later released per 849(b) PC.
23
24 A crime scene log was started by Ofcr Rael once Carter had been taken into
25 custody. *Refer to his supplemental report for further details.*
26
27 The crime scene was later released to the Riverside Sheriff's Office (RSO). Refer
28 to RSO report #RI72100001.
29
30 I had no further involvement in this incident.

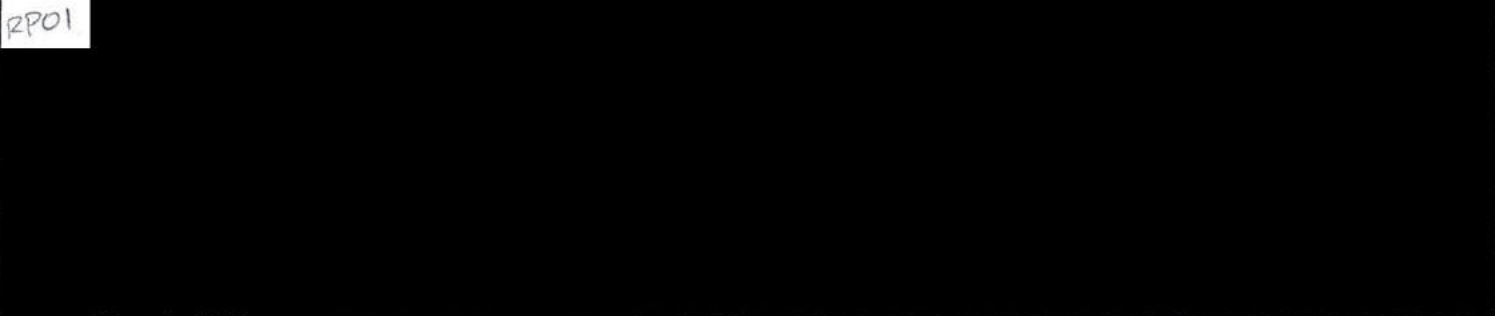

4 On 7/29/17 I contacted RPO1 [REDACTED] at the corner of Mountain
5 and First St, Norco. Melissa advised that she observed the incident that occurred at
6 Angels Topless Bar located at 1650 E Sixth St #1-2, Corona.

7
8 [REDACTED] said that the club had closed at 2am and all patrons and employees/dancers were
9 in the parking lot. As [REDACTED] walked to the parking lot, she noticed SUO1 described as a
10 black male adult, 20-25 years old, 509, 160-170 lbs, wearing a red shirt, red hat, and
11 white pants talking loudly. SUO1 appeared to be intoxicated as he continued talking
12 loudly to a male Hispanic later identified as VMO1 described as a Hispanic male adult,
13 25-30yrs, 508, 220lbs, wearing a red hat, jeans, and white shoes.

14
15 [REDACTED] could overhear SUO1 asking VMO1 if he wanted some "pussy" as he then
16 attempted to flirt with a female dancer in the parking lot. SUO1 continued to become
17 obnoxious at which time VMO1 put his hand towards SUO1's chest while telling him to
18 relax. SUO1 took the gesture offensively at which time he reached into his shirt pocket
19 located on the front of his shirt and pulled out a black semi-auto handgun.

20
21 SUO1 pointed the gun at VMO1's head and closed the distance to the point where he
22 placed the barrel of the gun on the right side of VMO1's head. [REDACTED] could not hear any
23 statements made by SUO1 at that point. Another female dancer from Angels began to tell
24 SUO1 to calm down and put the gun down at which point SUO1 put the gun back into his
25 pocket.

26
27 VMO1's ride (blue Chevrolet Avalanche) drove up and another male Hispanic not
28 involved told VMO1 to get into the vehicle at which time VMO1 got into the passenger
29 seat and drove away.

30
31 SUO1 then walked to the passenger side of a white Honda (Lic#7BYF424) driven by
32 SUO2 described as a black male adult with jeans. As SUO1 got into the vehicle, he began
33 to become verbally confrontational with the people in the parking lot.

34
35 As Officer Brazeal drove through the parking lot, SUO1 noticed the police car at which
36 time he got into the passenger seat. SUO2 then exited the parking lot at which time the
37 pursuit began.

1 **Details:**

2 On 07-29-17 at 0209 hours, I responded to the area of the 2500 Block of First St
3 Norco, Ca reference an officer involved shooting that had just occurred at the
4 termination of a pursuit. I arrived on scene as officers were forming a plan to
5 approach the downed suspect and suspect vehicle. I was then instructed by
6 Sergeant Voorhees to respond to the station to retrieve the armored bearcat. I
7 then arrived at the station and retrieved the armored bearcat and drove it back
8 out to the scene. I then drove the armored bearcat to the left of the downed
9 suspect and suspect vehicle and provided cover for the approaching officers due
10 to an outstanding suspect that had fled the scene and still possibly in the area.
11 Once officers cleared the suspect vehicle and checked on the downed suspect, I
12 then drove the armored bearcat in reverse back to the other patrol units and
13 exited the armored bearcat. I then remained at the scene by the patrol units until
14 we were notified that the outstanding suspect was taking into custody.

15
16 Once the scene was deemed safe, I then instructed Officer Rael to start the
17 crime scene log and I assisted with putting up some crime scene tape. Officer
18 Wood and I then checked the addresses of 2441, 2320 and 2503 First St to
19 make sure everyone was okay and no stray rounds had hit anyone. Everyone at
20 those three addresses were unharmed. I later had Officer Quintero check the
21 address at 1378 W. Parkridge Ave. and all the occupants were accounted for and
22 unharmed. I had Officer Quintero inform them their backyard was part of the
23 crime scene and they were to stay out of the backyard during the investigation.

24
25 I later took over the crime scene log from Officer Rael at 0717 hours and
26 maintained it until 0830 hours when Officer M. Rodriguez took over. Nobody
27 entered the crime scene during the time period I maintained it. Once Officer
28 Rodriguez took over the crime scene log, I went to the station and uploaded by
29 body worn camera and completed my shift.

1 Evidence: This incident may or may not have been captured
2 utilizing my unit, 79257, Watch Guard dash camera and my
3 assigned body worn camera.
4

5 It should be noted that at the time this call was received
6 I had already downed my equipment due to my shift ending.
7 My dash camera re-booted and was logged into, however, I
8 didn't notice that my body camera was still shut down until
9 after the shooting had occurred. Once I recognized the
10 camera was off I immediately turned it on and started to
11 record.
12

13 Details: On Saturday, July 29, 2017, at about 0209 hours,
14 this call was received and dispatched. After a vehicle
15 pursuit was initiated, I responded from the station to
16 assist.
17

18 While following the pursuit I heard over the radio that a
19 traffic collision occurred in the area of Parkridge Avenue
20 and First Street, in the City of Norco. I responded to the
21 location and noticed police units lined up in a high risk
22 stop fashion. As I put my vehicle into park I heard several
23 gun shots coming from in front of me. The gunfire continued
24 as I ran up and took a position at the same door with
25 Officer Montanez who was to my left.
26

27 As I took up a position at the door I saw a male adult
28 laying on the ground between the patrol units and a White
29 Honda. Next to the male's right hand was a gray colored
30 semi-automatic handgun which was pointed in the direction
31 of where we were positioned. While on scene I did not fire
32 my weapon.
33

34 At 0238 hours, Sergeant Voorhees, instructed me to respond
35 to Bar 1650, located at 1650 E. Sixth Street, Corona, to
36 investigate the original call and locate any victim's or
37 witnesses.
38

39 I arrived at Bar 1650 at 0242 hours. I knocked on a locked
40 door on the sports bar side of the business (Bar 1650 is
41 divided into two sections: a sports bar on the west side of
42 the building and a topless bar on the east side). A male
43 opened the door and I asked him who had called the police
44 and he gave me a blank look. I then asked if there was an
45 altercation and he told me he believed something happened
46 on the other side of the business. He then told me he was
47 taking out the trash and saw police lights in the parking

1 lot and went to see what it was. He saw a two door car had
2 "took off" after the cops "lit him up." I didn't get this
3 persons information and he directed me to [REDACTED],
4 [REDACTED] who is the general manager of the topless side of

7 The following is a summary of what [REDACTED] told me:

8
9 [REDACTED] said he was only aware that the police had shown up
10 to the business because someone came in and told him they
11 were outside. [REDACTED] said bartender [REDACTED] came in and
12 said the police were outside chasing someone who had a gun.
13 [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] got this information second hand.

14
15 I was told [REDACTED] had already left and [REDACTED] didn't have a
16 phone number for her. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] would be at work
17 Saturday night at 2100 hours.

18
19 I inquired about cameras and was told that [REDACTED] who
20 worked during the day is the only person with access to
21 them. [REDACTED] showed me outside which camera worked and its
22 orientation, which appeared to be pointed towards the exit
23 where the pursuit was initiated.

24
25 When asked about any altercations in the bar he said there
26 was none but they had a large group come into the bar from
27 the sports bar side at about 0030 hours. He said they
28 appeared to be the type of crowd that would start problems
29 but he said nothing occurred inside and wasn't surprised
30 that something happened outside.

31
32 I canvassed the parking lot for a crime scene and was
33 unable to locate one. I then advised dispatch of all the
34 license plates to all the vehicles remaining in the parking
35 lot to the business to have a record of them.

36
37 I contacted Sgt. Voorhees of what I had learned at the
38 business and he told me to return to the scene of the
39 shooting.

40
41 At 0418 hours, I assisted Corporal Fein with contacting
42 residents that were in the potential line of fire of the
43 shooting based on evidence at the scene. We contacted the
44 residences of 2441, 2320 and 2503 First Street. All
45 residence reported they were all safe and no one was in the
46 need of assistance.

3 On 07/29/17 at approximately 0209 hours, officers responded to 1650 E. Sixth St. reference a
4 subject holding a handgun to another person's head. Upon arrival at the location, officers
5 located the vehicle the suspect got into and a traffic stop was attempted. The vehicle fled the
6 location and a pursuit was initiated.

8 I trailed and paralleled the pursuit in case the suspect attempted to flee in a different direction.
9 Officers advised the suspect had been involved in a traffic collision on First St. east of Parkridge
10 Ave. in the City of Norco. I responded to the location and immediately exited my patrol unit. As
11 I was exiting my patrol vehicle I heard an unknown amount of gunshots to the east of my
12 location and took cover behind a patrol vehicle that was parked in front of me. Officer
13 Goodman made his way to my location and also took cover.

15 Officer Goodman and I began making our way towards the incident location. I stood at the
16 passenger side door of Officer Bejenes patrol vehicle and held the location. I observed a black
17 male wearing a red shirt or jacket lying in the street in between a white Honda Civic and Corona
18 PD units. I did not observe any exchange of gun fire that occurred. Other officers at the scene
19 advised there was another suspect that fled from the location north bound. It should be noted
20 that I did not have any physical contact with the suspect.

22 Due to there being plenty of officers at the incident location, I returned to my patrol unit and
23 drove to Second St. in attempt to start a perimeter. I was directed to go to Second St. and
24 Mountain Ave. in the City of Norco and hold the location. Officers located the second suspect
25 on Mountain Ave. in between First St. and Second St. I held my position at Mountain Ave. and
26 Second St. while officers detained the second suspect without incident. It should be noted I was
27 not involved in detaining the second suspect nor did I witness the apprehension.

29 I held my position at Second St. and Mountain Ave. until relieved at approximately 0815 hours
30 by Riverside County Sheriff Volunteers. This concluded my involvement in the incident.

3 On Saturday July 29th, 2017, at approximately 0209 hours, I was in
4 the police station located at 730 public safety way, Corona when I heard
5 dispatch advise officers in the field that there was a man with a gun call at
6 "Angel's Topless Bar". Angels is located at 1650 East Sixth Street, Corona.
7 The text of the call indicated that a BMA (Black Male Adult) wearing a red
8 t-shirt, white pants, black and white tennis shoes was holding a gun to
9 someone's head. The BMA was seen getting into a passenger side of a
10 hatchback vehicle; the car was being driven by another BMA.

11
12 I heard on the radio as officers located the vehicle in the parking lot of
13 Angel's and they attempted to make a traffic stop, which ensued into a
14 pursuit. Officer Matson and I jumped into a marked City of Corona police
15 vehicle and listened to the pursuit on the radio. The pursuit lead up
16 northbound Lincoln and I observed a white vehicle traveling northbound
17 Lincoln passing Railroad and several police vehicles giving chase. Officer
18 Matson and I pulled in behind one of the police vehicles not involved in the
19 pursuit.

20
21 We traveled northbound Lincoln Avenue and passed River road and
22 continued northbound as we were approaching the intersection of Lincoln
23 and Parkridge I heard and officer advise dispatch that the suspect vehicle
24 had crashed. I exited the passenger side of our car and began running
25 northbound towards the termination of the pursuit. As I was nearing the
26 other units I heard several gunshots. Officers advised "shots fired". I
27 arrived next to the units and asked if everyone was ok. All the officers
28 advised they were fine. There was one suspect still outstanding and that
29 suspect was last seen running westbound from the vehicle into a field. Due
30 to the fact that there was a suspect still outstanding and unknown if he was
31 still armed we requested the "Bearcat" armored vehicle. I observed a BMA
32 lying on the ground next to the suspect vehicle. Next to the BMA,
33 approximately 6" away from the BMA's hand was a gun.

34
35 The Bearcat responded to our location, and Officer Montanez and I
36 approached the suspect vehicle with a handheld shield. We used the Bearcat
37 as cover as we approached the suspect vehicle. Officer Montanez and I
38 cleared the suspect vehicle. The vehicle was clear of any suspects. Once the
39 vehicle was clear and it was determined the BMA was deceased we
40 tactically moved back to the other police cars.

1
2 Orange County Sheriff's Department air ship "Duke" responded and
3 assisted officers on the perimeter. Duke while orbiting around our perimeter
4 observed a suspect lying on Mountain north of First Street in Norco. SRT
5 (Special Response Team) were requested to assist with apprehending the 2nd
6 outstanding suspect. I grabbed Officer Bejines' AR-15 patrol rifle and
7 Officer Montanez and I drove the Bearcat to the area of Mountain north of
8 First Street. While in the area of where the 2nd suspect was at we met with
9 Sgt. Brett. Sgt. Brett, Officer's Montanez, Gutierrez, Placencia, Youngquist,
10 and I got in the Bearcat and drove to where the 2nd suspect was hiding.
11

12 As we approached the suspect Sgt. Brett gave announcements to the
13 suspect. The suspect complied with our verbal commands. All the officers
14 mentioned above exited the Bearcat and placed the 2nd suspect into custody.
15 I rendered Officer Bejines AR-15 patrol rifle safe. I removed the magazine
16 from the magazine well and pulled the charging handle back to the rear and
17 ejected the round from the chamber. I placed the round that exited the
18 chamber back into the magazine and it was maintained in my possession
19 until I placed his rifle in the Watch Commanders Office.

1 **DETAILS:** On 07/29/2017, I was employed as a Peace Officer for the City of Corona; County of
2 Riverside. I was wearing a full Corona Police K9 uniform consisting of a vest carrier with visible
3 POLICE letters attached to the front right chest area and a cloth badge attached to the left
4 chest. Attached to the back of the carrier is the word POLICE in large white visible letters. I was
5 also driving a marked black and white Corona Police K9 unit #79225. This incident was not
6 captured on my vehicles onboard dash camera.

8 On the above listed date at approximately 0230hrs, I received a phone call from Corona Police
9 dispatch requesting I respond to the area of First Street and Parkridge Ave to assist Corona
10 Police officers in locating an outstanding suspect. Corona dispatch advised the outstanding
11 suspect was involved in a vehicle pursuit resulting in an officer involved shooting. At
12 approximately 0307hrs, I arrived on scene and contacted Sergeant Voorhees in the area of First
13 Street and Parkridge Ave. Sergeant Voorhees told me to contact Sergeant Griffitts who was in
14 the area of Mountain Ave and First Street. When I arrived at Sergeant Griffitts location (1500
15 block of Mountain Ave) he told me Officers had visual observation of a subject matching the
16 outstanding suspect's description. The subject was lying in the prone position underneath a
17 tree approximately 175' away. I was told the outstanding suspects name was **Tyrone Carter**.

18
19 Utilizing binoculars I was able to visually see a black male adult lying in the prone position
20 underneath a low hanging tree on the west side of the street approximately two feet away
21 from a chain link fence. Multiple Corona Police officers, K9 Ziggy and I entered the Corona
22 Rescue Vehicle and approached the subject coming from the south. When the rescue vehicle
23 was approximately 30 feet away from the subject, K9 Ziggy and I exited the rescue vehicle and
24 took a position of Cover behind its front passenger tire and bumper. Officer M. Placencia gave
25 announcements to the subject to exit from under the tree while remaining on his stomach and
26 crawl toward the rescue vehicle. Once the subject was safely positioned in the street in front of
27 the rescue vehicle an arrest team approached and placed him in handcuffs without incident. At
28 no point in time did K9 Ziggy or I have any contact with the subject.

10 On Saturday, July 29, 2017 at approximately 0210 hours, Officer M. Placencia and I
11 responded to assist Officers who were in pursuit of a vehicle involved in a assault with a deadly
12 weapon incident. I was driving and Officer M. Placencia was in the front passenger seat.
13 Officers involved in the pursuit advised over the radio the pursuit had terminated at Parkridge
14 Ave. and First Street, and the suspect vehicle was involved in a collision. Officers on scene
15 advised over the radio an Officer involved shooting occurred.

16
17 Officer M. Placencia and I responded to Mountain Ave. and First St., to block traffic and
18 start establishing a perimeter on the north side where the driver had possibly fled. Once a
19 perimeter was established, Officer Martinez advised he possibly saw the suspect driver that fled
20 from the vehicle on Mountain Ave. between First St. and Second St. Officer M. Placencia and I
21 responded to assist Officer Martinez.

23 Upon arrival, Officer Martinez indicated he saw the suspect along a white fence on the
24 west side of Mountain Ave. With the assistance of a helicopter (DUKE1) we located the suspect
25 lying on the ground on Mountain Ave, midblock between First St. and Second St. We formed an
26 arrest team to attempt to make contact with the suspect. Officer Montanez, K-9 handler
27 Youngquist, Officer Heath, Officer Placencia and I approached the suspect maintaining cover
28 behind an armored vehicle. Officer M. Placencia gave the suspect commands and he complied.
29 Officer M. Placencia ultimately placed handcuffs on the suspect who was identified as Tyron
30 Carter. Tyron was identified as the driver from the pursuit. Officer M. Placencia and I never
31 responded the scene where the Officer involved shooting occurred.

33 Officer M. Placencia and I then transported Carter to the Corona Regional Hospital for
34 an ok to book because he complained of pain to his left ankle from jumping a fence. Once clear
35 from Corona Regional Hospital, Officer M. Placencia and I transported Carter to the Corona
36 Police Department for booking.

Details:

On 07/29/17, I was on uniformed patrol with Officer A. Gutierrez in a marked black and white police vehicle in the City of Corona, County of Riverside. At about 0210 hours, we responded from the Corona Police Department to assist officers who were in pursuit of a vehicle involved in an assault with a deadly weapon. Officer Gutierrez drove while I sat in the passenger seat.

We trailed the pursuit and backed off as Sgt. Vorhees advised there were sufficient officers in the pursuit. The pursuit terminated in the area of First Street and Parkridge Ave. Shortly after, officers advised there was an officer involved shooting. One suspect (The driver of the vehicle being pursued) was outstanding and a description was given via mobile radio. A photograph of the outstanding suspect (Tyrone Carter) was also later sent out via work email.

Officer Gutierrez and I responded to the area of Mountain Ave and First Street. We blocked traffic and set up a perimeter position. While on perimeter, Officer Martinez advised he had visual observation of the suspect north of our location. We flagged down a CHP Officer (Unknown name) who took our perimeter spot and we responded to Officer Martinez. Upon arrival, Officer Gutierrez and I gained visual observation of Tyrone who was lying down in-between trees. Orange County Sheriff Air Support (Duke 1) also arrived on scene and obtained visual observation.

Sgt. Brett, K9 Officer Youngquist, Officer Heath, Officer Montanez, Officer Gutierrez and I set up a contact team and approached the suspect in an armored vehicle (Bear Cat). I gave verbal commands which Tyrone followed; he was taken into custody without incident. I handcuffed Tyrone; double checking for tightness. Tyrone immediately stated his left ankle was hurt during the incident and requested medical attention. We (Officer Gutierrez and I) placed Tyrone into the back seat of our patrol vehicle (Unit 79266) and transported him to Corona Regional Medical Center for medical clearance prior to booking. We arrived at approximately 0359 hours on 07/29/17.

Officer Gutierrez and I remained arrived at CRMC while Tyrone received medical treatment. At the direction of supervision, I placed paper bags over both of Tyrone's hands to potentially preserve evidence. Tyrone was medically cleared (Ankle sprain) from CRMC at about 0502 hours. We placed him back into our patrol vehicle and transported him to the Corona Police Department Jail. We did not ask Tyrone questions about the incident; nor did he speak about the incident.

While on scene, I was asked by Riverside Sheriff supervision and Corona Police supervision to write a search warrant for the surveillance system at Angel's Sports Bar. I was told Corona Police Senior Detective John Alvarez had obtained the surveillance system by consent and currently was with it at his office. I spoke with Senior Detective Alvarez and he confirmed it.

On 07-29-2017 at 0909 hours, I authored the search warrant and Judge Craig Riemer telephonically approved it. I provided a copy of the search warrant to Senior Detective Alvarez who in turn handed it to Riverside County Sheriff personnel. Riverside County Sheriff personnel searched the surveillance system.

On 07-31-2017 at about 1000 hours, I drove to Riverside Superior Court and had the clerical staff process the search warrant (**SW#RI0731201721**). I emailed a copy of the search warrant to Riverside Sheriff Investigator Gonzalez, from the SIB-West Central Homicide Unit, who told me their CATCH Team searched the surveillance system and the person to contact was Investigator Paul Grotefend ID# 4618.

1 On 08-02-2017 at 0946 hours, I received an email from Investigator Grotefend.
2 Investigator Grotefend stated the GW brand surveillance system was downloaded and he

5 returned to Corona Police Senior Detective John Alvarez that same day. Senior Detective
6 Alvarez returned the DVR to its owner.

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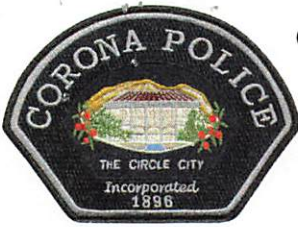

Summary:

This supplemental report covers my assistance with the portion of the investigation that occurred on 7/29/2017:

- I collected a surveillance system NVR as evidence. The NVR was turned over to the Riverside Sheriff's Department CATCH Team for examination.
- I moved a patrol car from the crime scene to the sally port at the Corona Police Department.
- I followed a tow truck with the suspect vehicle to the Riverside Sheriff's Department forensics garage/storage at the Perris station.

At no time did I enter the actual crime scene.

1 **Evidence**

2 I took 22 photographs of the exterior cameras and the surveillance system at Bar 1650 and
3 saved these photographs to compact disc. I logged this disc as evidence on 7/29/2017, about
4 0813 hours.

5

6 **Narrative**

7 On 7/29/2017, about 0450 hours, I responded to Bar 1650 (1650 E. Sixth Street, Corona, CA
8 92879) and photographed the exterior surveillance cameras that I could see on the building. I
9 started photographing on the east side of the building, then to south side (rear of building), the
10 west side and then finally the north side (front of building).

11

12 The owner of the business, [REDACTED] arrived and allowed me access to the surveillance
13 system NVR (network video recorder) that was in the manager's office. I photographed the
14 current system date and time, which showed to be 01/31/2000 12:40:08 PM. My department
15 cell phone showed the date and time 7/29/2017 05:41:14 hours. I asked [REDACTED] if I could take
16 the NVR to the Corona Police Department because of the amount of footage that needed to be
17 exported and he gave verbal consent.

18

19 I provided [REDACTED] with a receipt for the NVR and took possession of the NVR in the manager's
20 office at 0555 hours. I stood-by in the parking lot until Sergeant Sears finished speaking with
21 [REDACTED] I then transported the NVR to the Corona Police Department and secured it in the
22 computer laboratory about 0618 hours.

23

24 I did not power on or manipulate the NVR in any way before I was contacted by Detective
25 Mario Hernandez and was advised the Riverside Sheriff's Department was going to handle
26 exporting video. Investigator Paul Grotefend ID# 4618 with the Riverside Sheriff's Department
27 CATCH Team arrived at the Corona Police computer laboratory and took possession of the
28 surveillance system on 7/29/2017 about 0825 hours. Investigator Grotefend returned the
29 surveillance system to the computer laboratory that same day at 1237 hours.

1 I next responded to the scene of the officer involved shooting, but I did not enter the crime
2 scene. I drove Corona Police unit number 79245 from the scene about 1432 hours and arrived
3 at the Corona Police sally port about 1440 hours. *(The Corona Police sally port is located within*
4 *the police secured/fenced parking lot. The sally port is used for access to the jail and has*
5 *additional fencing around it with video surveillance.)*

6

7 I responded back out to Bar 1650 about 1640 hours to return the NVR. I turned over the NVR to
8 the manager on-duty, [REDACTED] who signed the property receipt.

9

10 I responded back to the Corona Police Department and was asked to complete photo lineups
11 (AKA six pack) of the suspects. I then created the attached lineups and gave them to Riverside
12 Sheriff's Investigators.

13

14 I went back out to the crime scene, but not within the crime scene itself, so I could follow a tow
15 truck to the Riverside Sheriff's Forensics Division at the Perris station (137 N Perris Blvd, Perris,
16 CA 92570). The tow truck drove out of the east side of the crime scene and I followed it from
17 the scene about 1704 hours. We arrived at the Perris station about 1743 hours and a Riverside
18 Sheriff's Forensics Investigator allowed us access. The tow truck unloaded the suspect vehicle
19 into a storage bay and into the Riverside Sheriff's custody. I left the scene about 1802 hours and
20 that completed my involvement with the portion of the investigation on 7/29/2017.

1 **DETAILS:**

2 On 07-29-17 at 0209 hours, I responded to assist Corona Police Personnel with
3 a perimeter in the area of Mountain Ave. and 1st St., Norco. The perimeter was
4 established after a vehicle pursuit had ended in the area which led to an Officer
5 Involved Shooting. During the incident the driver of the suspect vehicle had fled
6 northwest from the pursuit vehicle into the 1300 block of Mountain Ave., Norco.
7 Upon arrival, I took a perimeter spot on Mountain Ave. between 1st St. and 2nd St.
8 of Norco, CA.

9

10 I had parked my marked Corona Police vehicle facing northbound with my traffic
11 lights activated. I noticed on the south side of Mountain Ave. there was a barbed
12 wire fence. On the other side of the fence was a field and a single story building
13 that appeared to be either vacant or under construction. While holding the
14 perimeter, a passerby drove by my location and asked if I wanted to use his
15 portable thermal vision scope. I took the scope and pointed it toward the
16 possible vacant building which was approx. 70 ft. southwest of my location where
17 I was standing along the fence line.

18

19 I saw a heat silhouette of a male adult with a shaved head crouched down near
20 the building. The male (later identified as the driver of the pursuit vehicle) began
21 to crawl on the ground toward the fence line just west of my location. I then
22 heard the fence begin to shake and I moved my vehicle's spotlights in the area of
23 the noise. Along the fence line approx. 60 ft. west of my police vehicle, I could
24 see the suspect lying on the ground behind a tall thin bush. The suspect did not
25 move from that location.

27 Police Personnel coordinated and was able to place the suspect under arrest
28 without any resistance from the suspect. Refer to the initial report and other
29 supplemental reports regarding the investigation and taking the driver into
30 custody.

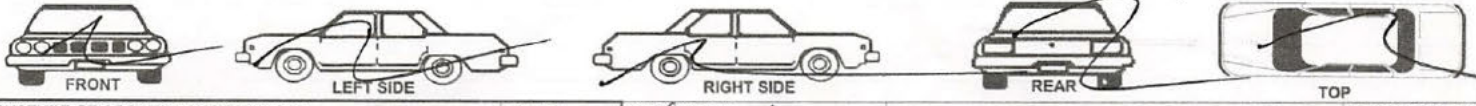

DISPATCH SUMMARY:

On Saturday, July 29, 2017, at about 0209 hours, Dispatcher Briana Escobedo was working in the Corona Police Department Communications Center when she received a wireless 9-1-1 call from 1650 East Sixth Street. The caller, [REDACTED] employee at 1650 East Sixth Street, reported that a black male adult wearing a red shirt, white pants, black and white shoes, had a gun to someone's head. The caller advised the male subject was getting into the passenger's seat of a vehicle being driven by a black male adult. The phone call disconnected at 0211 hours.

Sergeant Gary Griffiths (Designator "S14" / Morning Watch), Officer Daniel Brazeal (Designator "331" / Morning Watch), Officer Robert Bejines (Designator "313" / Morning Watch), Officer Robert Newell (Designator "312" / Morning Watch) and Officer Dana Walker (Designator "332" / Morning Watch) were dispatched to this call.

Officer Brazeal arrived on-scene first, at 0212 hours, followed by Officer Dana Walker (Designator "332") and Officer Robert Montanez (Designator/ "321"). A few minutes after his arrival, Officer Brazeal radioed that he was unable to locate the suspect vehicle. Several seconds later, Officer Brazeal radioed that he was attempting a traffic stop to the front of the business and the vehicle was not stopping. Officer Montanez radioed that the vehicle was westbound on Sixth Street at 90 MPH. Dispatcher Nakia Reese broadcast on the radio "10-33" Emergency air. Officer Montanez advised that it was a white Honda Civic and that there was no other traffic on the roadway. Officer Montanez then updated that the vehicle was traveling 115 MPH westbound Sixth Street passing Radio Road. The vehicle approached and passed Rimpau Avenue at 100MPH. Officer Montanez lost sight of the vehicle near East Grand Boulevard and thought the driver had possibly lost control and crashed. Officer Brazeal then advised the vehicle was still westbound Sixth Street.

Officer Jessica Carbajal indicated that she was behind the vehicle northbound on Vicentia Avenue and it was turning left onto Second Street. She advised the vehicle was traveling at 50 MPH and was passing Buena Vista Avenue. The vehicle continued to gain speed and was approaching Lincoln Avenue at 70 MPH. Officer Carbajal advised the vehicle was now northbound on Lincoln Avenue at 40MPH with no traffic. Officer Bejines began calling out the pursuit at Second Street and Lincoln

Avenue. As the vehicle continued northbound Lincoln Avenue, Sergeant Bradly Voorhees (Designator "S12"/ Cover Watch) entered the pursuit. Sergeant Voorhees advised that there were enough units involved in the pursuit. The vehicle continued northbound on Lincoln Avenue passing Parkridge Avenue where it possibly crashed on First Street in the City of Norco. Shortly after the vehicle came to a stop, officers on scene advised an officer-involved shooting occurred and asked for paramedic assistance.

Sergeant Adam Roulston (Designator "S10"/ Relief Watch Commander for Morning Watch) acknowledged the officer-involved shooting broadcast. Officers advised dispatch that the driver was fleeing the scene northbound and it was unknown where he was and if he was armed. They further advised that they had one suspect down near the suspect vehicle. Sergeant Voorhees requested the Corona Police Departments armored vehicle (BEAR CAT). Once the vehicle arrived, Sergeant Voorhees assembled a team of officers to approach the down subject to check for vitals and render medical aid. Officer Brazeal and Sergeant Voorhees both checked the down subject for vitals. Upon not finding a pulse, Sergeant Voorhees pronounced him deceased.

The driver was eventually located and taken into custody with the assistance of Duke1 (Orange County Sheriff helicopter). The remainder of information related to Dispatch involves routine assignments of crime scene security and requests for other resources related to an officer-involved shooting call-out. Riverside County Sheriff's Department Central Homicide Unit completed the scene processing and criminal investigation. All Corona Police Department personnel left the area of First Street and Parkridge Avenue at about 1800 hours on June 29, 2017.

FACTS OF THE INCIDENT:

On Saturday, June 29, 2017, at about 0209 hours, Officer Daniel Brazeal was working his regular-duty shift, Morning Watch, when he was dispatched to this assault with a deadly weapon call at 1650 East Sixth Street. He was driving unit #79237. Officer Brazeal arrived on scene at 0212 hours. Initially, Officer Brazeal was unable to locate the subject or the vehicle described in the call. As he pulled into the parking lot of 1650 East Sixth Street (northwest corner) he noticed a man standing in front of the building. He stopped and asked the man if he had seen anyone with a gun. The man informed him "no". Officer Brazeal continued eastbound through the northern parking lot of 1650 East Sixth Street. When he neared the east side of the business, he stopped and advised on the radio that he was unable to locate the suspect vehicle. Several patrons of the establishment were getting in their vehicles and leaving. After several seconds, Officer Brazeal observed a vehicle matching the description in the call, exiting 1650 East Sixth Street and going eastbound on East Sixth Street. Officer Brazeal maneuvered behind the vehicle and attempted to conduct a traffic stop on it.

The vehicle initially began to yield to Officer Brazeal by slowing to the right side of the road just east of 1650 East Sixth Street, however, failed to come to a complete stop and rapidly accelerated. The vehicle then fled eastbound on Sixth Street. When the vehicle reached South Temescal Street, it made a left turn, crossing over the center median of East Sixth Street. The vehicle then made another quick left turn back onto East Sixth Street going westbound, with Officer Brazeal following.

Officer Montanez was at the Zone 2 office (577 N. McKinley St. #103, Corona) when this call was being broadcasted. He left the Zone 2 office and proceeded southbound on McKinley Street to

Magnolia Avenue. At Magnolia Avenue, he made a right turn (westbound) and proceeded towards 1650 East Sixth Street. When he neared the location, he observed and heard Officer Brazeal indicate that the vehicle was not stopping. Officer Montanez was stopped westbound East Sixth Street at South Temescal Street. As the suspect vehicle and Officer Brazeal passed, Officer Montanez followed (secondary in the pursuit) and began calling out the pursuit. Officer Montanez broadcast on the radio the vehicle speeds, direction of travel, and roadway conditions. The suspect vehicle continued westbound on East Sixth Street and Officer Montanez estimated the vehicle to be traveling over 100 MPH. As the suspect vehicle neared the intersection with East Grand Boulevard, Officer Montanez noticed the taillights fishtailing. Officer Montanez thought the suspect vehicle may have crashed, however, Officer Brazeal advised the vehicle was still westbound on East Sixth Street.

Officer Bejines was responding to the original call and was nearing the intersection of El Sobrante Road and East Sixth Street when Officer Montanez advised they were in pursuit of the vehicle. Officer Bejines was eastbound on Sixth Street and came to a stop at El Sobrante Road. As the pursuit passed westbound on East Sixth Street, Officer Bejines made a U-turn and began to trail the pursuit.

Officer Carbajal was at the Corona Police Department when she heard the initial call at 1650 East Sixth Street being broadcast on the radio. Officer Carbajal left the police department and headed towards the intersection of Sixth Street and Main Street. As she was arriving at the intersection, she observed the suspect vehicle westbound West Sixth Street, passing the intersection with Main Street. Due to the distance between the suspect vehicle and Officer Brazeal's vehicle, Officer Carbajal began pursuing the vehicle. Officer Carbajal advised that the suspect vehicle made a right turn onto northbound Vicentia Avenue from Sixth Street.

Officers Carbajal and Brazeal followed the suspect vehicle northbound on Second Street while Officers Montanez and Bejines began to parallel it on Sixth Street. Officers Carbajal and Brazeal continued pursuing the vehicle northbound on Vicentia Avenue to Second Street where it made a left turn onto Second Street. The suspect vehicle continued westbound on Second Street, passing Buena Vista Avenue and passing the onramp for eastbound 91-freeway. As the vehicle neared Lincoln Avenue, it made a right turn onto northbound Lincoln Avenue. Officer Carbajal continued behind the vehicle and was then advised by Officer Bejines that he had taken second position in the pursuit and would be calling it out on the radio.

As Officers Carbajal and Brazeal followed the suspect vehicle northbound on Vicentia Avenue, Officer Bejines continued westbound on Sixth Street to Lincoln Avenue. Officer Bejines made a right turn onto northbound Lincoln Avenue and assumed the secondary position in the pursuit at Second Street. Officer Montanez also continued westbound on Sixth Street after the suspect vehicle turned northbound onto Vicentia Avenue. Officer Montanez continued westbound Sixth Street until Buena Vista Avenue. At Buena Vista Avenue, Officer Montanez turned right and proceeded northbound on Buena Vista Avenue. Officer Montanez nearly came to a complete stop at the intersection of Buena Vista Avenue and Second Street. This was to allow the suspect vehicle, Officer Carbajal, and Officer Brazeal to continue westbound. After those vehicles passed, Officer Montanez fell in behind them.

As the pursuit continued northbound on Lincoln Avenue, Officer Carbajal was primary, Officer Bejines was secondary, with Officer Brazeal and Officer Montanez following. Officer Bejines continually gave updates on the pursuit, which included speeds and direction of travel. As the

pursuit passed Railroad Street, Sergeant Voorhees joined it, advising there were enough units involved.

The pursuit continued northbound Lincoln Avenue, crossing through the signalized intersections with River Road and Parkridge Avenue. As the vehicle crossed the intersection with River Road, Officer Bejines advised dispatch to notify Norco of the pursuit. After crossing Parkridge Avenue, the driver of the suspect vehicle lost control and the vehicle began to spin. The suspect vehicle entered the southbound lanes of Parkridge Avenue. (There was a vehicle southbound Parkridge Avenue at the same time. The vehicle veered away from and the suspect vehicle but was struck by the vehicle. Attempts to locate this vehicle were made with negative results.) As the suspect vehicle came to a stop in the southbound lanes, it was facing in a southeasterly direction. Officer Carbajal immediately stopped in the northbound lane of the street and began to get out of her police unit. As she was getting out of the vehicle, she pulled her duty weapon out of her holster and pointed it towards the suspect vehicle. Officer Carbajal then stood next to her police vehicle with the driver's door open. As she is watching the suspect vehicle, the driver gets out and flees in a northerly direction, away from officers.

Officer Bejines (secondary in the pursuit) pulls to the right of Officer Carbajal's vehicle. He tries to remove his AR15 rifle from the gun rack between the two front seats. As he is trying to remove the rifle, he notices his vehicle is slowly moving forward. He applies the brakes and puts it into park. He observes the driver of the suspect vehicle, exit the vehicle and flee in a northerly direction (away from police units). Officer Carbajal gives the driver description and direction of travel over the police radio.

Officer Brazeal, who is third in the pursuit, pulls to the left of Officer Carbajal's vehicle as the suspect vehicle is coming to a stop. Remembering the initial call involved the suspect having a gun, Officer Brazeal gets on the radio and advised the officers to remember that the suspects had a gun. He immediately gets out and pulls his duty weapon from his holster and points it towards the suspect vehicle. He observed the driver get out of the suspect vehicle and flee in a northerly direction (away from police units). As the driver is running away from the vehicle, Officer Brazeal begins giving him commands, "Let me see your hands". The driver continues to run, not complying with Officer Brazeal's commands.

Officer Montanez, who is fourth in the pursuit, stops behind Officer Carbajal's and Brazeal's police vehicles. He immediately removes his AR15 rifle from the gun rack between the driver and passenger seats. As he exits his vehicle, he goes around the front of his police unit and begins to approach the passenger's side of Officer Carbajal's police vehicle.

Officer Brazeal begins to give the passenger (Jashod Carter) in the suspect vehicle commands at which time he exits the vehicle, points a handgun towards the officers and begins to shoot. One bullet from Jashod Carter's weapon struck the passenger side left window of Officers Brazeal's unit (#79237). Rounds from Jashod Carter also impacted Officer Carbajal's police unit (#79231). One round struck the driver's side spot light, one round struck the passenger's side spotlight, and one round struck the passenger side mirror. Officers Brazeal, Carbajal, and Bejines immediately fire back at Jashod Carter with their handguns. Officer Montanez fires back at Jashod Carter with his assigned AR15 rifle.

Once Jashod was down on the ground, all involved officers verify with each other that they are okay. As they are asking if everyone is okay, Jashod Carter reached for the handgun that he had dropped (to the ground) to his right side. Officers Carbajal, Bejines, and Montanez shoot at Jashod Carter and cease when he no longer reaches for the handgun. Officer Carbajal immediately request medical aid stage for the suspect. No other persons were struck by gunfire. Due to the driver (Tyrone Carter) fleeing the scene northbound, it was unknown where he was and if he was armed. Sergeant Voorhees requested the Police Departments armored vehicle (BEARCAT). Once the vehicle arrived, Sergeant Voorhees assembled a team of officers to approach Jashod Carter to check for vitals and render medical aid. As the team approached Jashod Carter, they used the armored vehicle for cover, while other members covered the field where the driver was last seen running into. Officer Brazeal and Sergeant Voorhees both checked Jashod Carter for vitals. Upon not finding a pulse, Sergeant Voorhees pronounced him deceased at 0249 hours. Other members of the team ensured the vehicle was not occupied by any other subjects.

Perimeter units along with the assistance of Duke1 locate Tyrone Carter hiding in a field north of the location he was last seen fleeing to. Commands were given to Tyrone Carter, who eventually complied and was taken into custody. Due to an ankle injury sustained when fleeing police, Tyrone Carter was taken to Corona Regional Hospital for an OK to Book. After obtaining the OK to Book, Tyrone Carter was later transported and booked at RPDC. A handgun was recovered by RSO investigative team next to Jashod Carter (Kimber .45 caliber). The slide was locked back and a total of 7 expended .45 caliber shell casings were on the ground surrounding the decedent. The handgun was registered to Tyrone Carter.

During a search of the suspect's vehicle on July 30, 2017, RSO Investigators located a Glock .40 (TFP8621) caliber handgun on the front passenger floor board, partially under the passenger's seat. The handgun was made safe by removing one round from the chamber. RSO Investigators removed the magazine which was loaded with 5 rounds in a 12-round capacity magazine. The handgun was registered to Tyrone Carter.

Between Officers Carbajal, Bejines, Brazeal, and Montanez, a total of 59 rounds were fired. Officer Carbajal fired 13 rounds, Officer Bejines fired 13 rounds, Officer Brazeal fired 15 rounds, and Officer Montanez fired 18 rounds. 58 casings were recovered at the scene. (Due to foot traffic from officers attempting to render aid to Jashod Carter, as well as the use of the BEARCAT, it is unknown if the unaccounted casing was lodged into shoe or tire tread and unknowingly removed from the scene.)

SUSPECT'S TOXICOLOGICAL & CRIMINAL CASE INFORMATION

During the autopsy, urine from Jashod Carter was analyzed and showed to have a Blood Alcohol Content of .265 (Bio-Tox). Blood was also taken from his femur area as well as Vitreous. The Femur showed a Blood Alcohol Content of .203 (Bio-Tox) and the Vitreous showed a Blood Alcohol Content of .181 (Bio-Tox).

Tyrone Carter (driver) had blood analyzed for Methamphetamine, Amphetamine, Benzodiazepines, Cannabinoids, Cocaine and/or Metabolites, Opiates (Morphine and/or Codeine), and Phencyclidine. Bio-Tox blood results showed none detected.

Tyrone Carter was prosecuted by the Riverside County District Attorney's Office for the following charges: 2800.2 VC and 32 PC. This case is still pending as of July 14, 2018.

INTERVIEW OF Officer Jessica Carbajal:

Officer Jessica Carbajal, accompanied by Attorney Russell Perry, provided a voluntary statement to Investigator Ted Gonzalez #2688 and Investigator James Dickey #4204(Riverside Sheriff Department, Central Homicide Unit # R172100001) in the Corona Police Department Detective Conference room on August 3, 2017, at about 1030 hours.

Officer Carbajal said she was working the "graveyard" shift, from 1800 hours-0630 hours, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, when this incident occurred. She had been a police officer in the State of California for ten years, nine years with Cathedral City Police Department and six months with the Corona Police department. She completed her field training program with Corona Police Department and had been working patrol since. She was working her regular duty shift on the day of the incident.

Officer Carbajal was at the Corona Police Department (730 Public Safety Way, Corona) when she heard the call of a 245PC being broadcasted. She decided to head that way to assist based on the nature of the call. As she was driving towards 1650 East Sixth Street, she heard Officer Brazeal initiate the pursuit and she realized it was coming towards her direction. Officer Carbajal drove towards Main Street and Sixth Street. As she arrived at the intersection, she observed the suspect vehicle pass through the intersection westbound Sixth Street at a high rate of speed. Noticing that there was a gap between the suspect vehicle and the pursuing police vehicles, she took the primary position in the pursuit and began giving directional and speed updates.

Officer Carbajal followed the suspect vehicle as it continued westbound Sixth Street to Vicentia Avenue. It preceded northbound Vicentia Avenue to Second Street. At Second Street the vehicle made a left turn and proceeded westbound on Second Street to Lincoln Avenue. At Lincoln Avenue, the vehicle made a right turn onto northbound Lincoln Avenue. As she turned onto Lincoln Avenue, she heard another officer advise that he was behind her and would call the pursuit out.

The pursuit continued northbound on Lincoln Avenue and as the suspect vehicle crossed Parkridge Avenue, it lost control and spun out. The vehicle came to a stop, facing pursuing units. Officer Carbajal came to a stop and began to get out of her police vehicle. As she gets out, she noticed the driver and passenger inside the suspect vehicle talking. After a few seconds, the driver exited the vehicle and flees away from officers, towards a field.

As the driver flees, Officer Carbajal broadcast a description of him and the location he was last seen running. She refocused on the passenger who was still sitting in the suspect vehicle. She observes him open the passenger door and start to exit. As he was getting out, he points a gun towards her and starts to fire. She feared for her life and the life of the other officers. Her initial reaction was to seek cover towards the back of her police vehicle. As she was backing up, she rethought it and reengaged the suspect by standing at her open driver's door and began firing back at him. She saw

the muzzle flash from the gun the suspect was holding in his right hand. She also heard the whizzing of the bullets as they blew past her head. She needed to stop the threat.

She was unsure what officers were with her but knew they were there because she could hear them firing at the suspect. As they are firing at the suspect, the suspect goes to the ground and she stops firing at him. As the suspect goes down, he falls face down while letting go of the gun, which is less than a foot away from his right hand. While the suspect is on the ground, she observes him reach for the gun (at least twice) at which time she shoots at him again. The suspect then stopped moving. There was some confusion on who was going to communicate on the radio. Between the officers there, they decided to have Officer Carbajal communicate on the radio. She gave an update to dispatch on the events that occurred and requested to have medical assistance respond and stage. They were assessing what to do because they still had an outstanding suspect. They were taking into account that they did not know where the other suspect was and if he was armed or not. The plan was developed to bring the armor vehicle to approach the down suspect and clear the suspect vehicle. Officer Carbajal remained at the back of her police vehicle until she was taken to the police station. (Full transcript of Officer Carbajal statement is attached to R.S.O. report in Book 1 section 7.)

INTERVIEW OF Officer Robert Bejines:

Officer Robert Bejines, accompanied by Attorney Russell Perry, provided a voluntary statement to Investigator Jennifer Higgins and Investigator James Dickey #4204(Riverside Sheriff Department, Central Homicide Unit # R172100001) in the Corona Police Department Detective Conference room on August 3, 2017, at about 1121 hours.

Officer Bejines said he was working the "graveyard" shift, from 1800 hours-0630 hours, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, when this incident occurred. He has been a Police Officer in the State of California for fourteen years, four years with Cypress Police Department and ten years with the Corona Police department. He was recently a member of the PACT (Probation Accountability and Compliance Team) team and had been a Field Training Officer for the last nine years.

Officer Bejines was on the west side of the city when he was dispatched to a 245PC with a handgun at 1650 East Sixth Street in Corona and began heading that way. Dispatch gave out the suspect description along with a vehicle description. Officer Brazeal located a vehicle matching the suspect description and as he attempted to stop it, a pursuit was initiated.

Officer Bejines was eastbound East Sixth Street approaching El Sobrante Road trying to get to 1650 East Sixth Street. The pursuing officers advised they were westbound East Sixth Street approaching his location. Officer Bejines stopped at El Sobrante Road and waited to see where the pursuit was going to go and the possibility of using a spike strip if speeds allowed. He saw the vehicle approach his location and pass him. He joined the pursuit westbound East Sixth Street. He followed the pursuit until the suspect vehicle turned northbound on Vicentia Avenue. Believing that the suspects were going to attempt to get on the freeway, Officer Bejines paralleled the pursuit to Lincoln Avenue. At Lincoln Avenue, Officer Bejines turned northbound and as he neared Second Street, the suspect vehicle turned in front of him, proceeding northbound on Lincoln Avenue. Officer Carbajal proceeded northbound behind the suspect vehicle and Officer Bejines took over secondary in the pursuit. Officer Bejines began giving out vehicle speeds and direction of travel. The pursuit

continued northbound Lincoln Avenue to Parkridge Avenue. As the suspect vehicle crossed over Parkridge Avenue, it lost control and spun out.

Officer Bejines pulled up to the right of Officer Carbajal's police vehicle. As he was stopping the vehicle, he was trying to get his AR rifle out of the rack between the seats but was having trouble. As he was trying to troubleshoot why he could not get his AR out of the rack, his vehicle began to roll forward. Officer Bejines put the unit into park and as he looked over to the suspect vehicle. He sees the driver exit the vehicle and run away from officers into a field.

Officer Bejines did not see the passenger moving and proceeds to try to get his rifle out again. He then notices the passenger exit the vehicle and sees that he matches the description on the suspect given by witnesses at 1650 E. Sixth Street. He then sees muzzle flashes coming from the passenger suspect. Officer Bejines realizes the suspect is shooting at them and immediately fears for his life. He hears the other officers shooting at the suspect. Officer Bejines gets out of his vehicle and begins firing at the suspect. The suspect goes to the ground at which time he stops shooting and tries to communicate with the officers. As he is watching the suspect, he notices he is down on the ground, but the gun is in his hand and it appears he is still in the fight. One of the officer's yells something and they begin to shoot again to end the threat.

Between the officers there, they decided to have Officer Carbajal communicate on the radio. She gives an update to dispatch on the events that occurred and request to have medical assistance respond and stage. They were then assessing on what to do because they still had an outstanding suspect. They were taking into account that they did not know where the other suspect was and if he was armed or not. The plan was developed to bring the armor vehicle to approach the down suspect and clear the suspect vehicle. Officer Bejines remained at the back of his police vehicle until he was taken to the police station. (Full transcript of Officer Bejines' statement is attached to R.S.O. report in Book 1 section 7.)

INTERVIEW OF Officer Daniel Brazeal:

Officer Daniel Brazeal, accompanied by Attorney Russell Perry, provided a voluntary statement to Investigator Ted Gonzalez #2688 and Investigator Casey Pemberton #3403 (Riverside Sheriff Department, Central Homicide Unit # R172100001) in the Corona Police Department Detective Conference room on August 3, 2017, at about 1209 hours.

Officer Brazeal said he was working the "graveyard" shift, from 1800 hours-0630 hours, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, when this incident occurred. He has been a Police Officer in the State of California for seven years, four years with Desert Hot Springs and three years with the Corona Police Department. He completed his field training program with Corona Police Department and has been working patrol since. He was working his regular duty shift when he heard the call at 1650 East Sixth Street, Corona.

Officer Brazeal responded from the area of the Magnolia Avenue and the 15 freeway. Due to his proximity to the location, he responded even though he had not been dispatched. As he arrived at the location, he pulled into the parking lot from the first entrance off eastbound East Sixth Street (west of the location). As he pulled into the parking lot, it was dark, so he turned on all his vehicle

lights in order to light up the area. Several vehicles were leaving, so he used his spotlight to look at the vehicles. He saw a gentleman standing in front of the location and asked him if he saw a man with a gun at which time he replied "no". Officer Brazeal continued through the parking lot, looking for the white Honda Civic that was described in the call. He advised dispatch that he did not see the suspect vehicle, however immediately after that, the suspect vehicle pullout directly in front of him. The vehicle exited the parking lot eastbound on Sixth Street. Officer Brazeal initiated a traffic stop with his lights and siren. The suspect vehicle began to yield but did not come to a complete stop and accelerated eastbound East Sixth Street, making a U-turn at Temescal Street and heading westbound on East Sixth Street.

Officer Montanez was stopped on the north side (westbound) of East Sixth Street at Temescal Street. As the suspect vehicle and he made the U-turn onto westbound Sixth Street, Officer Brazeal initiated his pursuit and the suspect vehicle continued westbound on East Sixth Street. Officer Montanez began calling out the pursuit. The pursuit continued westbound on East Sixth Street through multiple streets and at one point, Officer Brazeal believed the suspect was going to crash. The suspect vehicle hit a dip in the roadway and the driver began to lose control near the intersection of East Grand Boulevard and Sixth Street. The driver recovered and continued westbound on East Sixth Street. The suspect vehicle gained distance between pursuing officers as it traveled westbound on Sixth Street. When the suspect vehicle got to Sixth Street and Main Street, Officer Carbajal was there and took over the primary spot in the pursuit.

As Officer Carbajal took the primary position, Officer Brazeal took secondary and Officer Montanez took third. Officer Brazeal followed Officer Carbajal and the suspect vehicle as it continued westbound on West Sixth Street to Vicentia Avenue. The suspect vehicle went northbound on Vicentia Avenue to Second Street. At Second Street the suspect vehicle went westbound, running the stop sign at Buena Vista Avenue. The suspect vehicle continued westbound on Second Street to Lincoln Avenue. At Lincoln Avenue, the suspect vehicle proceeded northbound. Officer Bejines was northbound on Lincoln Avenue and as the suspect vehicle and Officer Carbajal made the turn onto northbound Lincoln Avenue, Officer Bejines took the secondary position in the pursuit which then put Officer Brazeal to the third spot and Officer Montanez to the fourth spot in the pursuit.

The pursuit continued northbound on Lincoln Avenue when it was broadcasted that the suspect vehicle had been involved in a traffic collision. Officer Brazeal could not recall if it was Officer Carbajal or Bejines who broadcasted that information. As Officer Brazeal was stopping, he broadcast to the other units to remember that the initial call was a 245PC involving a handgun. As Officer Brazeal got out of his vehicle, he saw the driver running northbound towards a dark field. He yelled to the driver, "Let me see your hands". The driver did not acknowledge him and continued to run towards the field, disappearing into the darkness. Officer Brazeal then focused on the passenger who was still sitting in the passenger's seat of the suspect vehicle. Officer Brazeal yelled at him, "Let me see your hands, let me see your hands".

As Officer Brazeal was focused on the passenger, the passenger gets out and it appears to Officer Brazeal that the passenger racks a handgun and points it in Officer Brazeal direction and begins firing. The first couple rounds were so close that Officer Brazeal thought he had been hit, indicating that the side of his face was hot (later, still believing he had been struck by a bullet, he had another officer check on him to make sure he had not been hit). Officer Brazeal, from the driver's side of his

vehicle and fearing for his life and the lives of the other officer's, begins firing back at the suspect. Officer Brazeal kept shooting until the suspect went down to the ground.

Officer Brazeal was still concerned for the driver, who had run into the field and his exact location was unknown. Unsure of how many rounds he had shot, Officer Brazeal moved to the back of his police unit and changed his magazine (Officer Brazeal did not fire anymore rounds after that). He then moved to the passenger's side door of his police vehicle. From the passenger's side of his vehicle, he could see that the passenger suspect was still down on the ground.

All officers wanted to render aid to the down suspect, however, they had concern for the suspect that had run into the field. Due to that threat, as well as the need to render aid to the down suspect, Officer Brazeal put on his active shooter vest (which added protection but also had first aid equipment in it). In developing a plan to safely render aid to the down suspect, it was decided that the Corona Police Departments armored vehicle would be used. Upon the arrival of the armored vehicle, officers on scene used it as cover as they approached the down suspect. Officer Brazeal and Sergeant Voorhees checked the down suspect for vitals in an attempt to render medical aid while several officers were used to cover the field that the driver was last seen running into. Officer Brazeal and Sergeant Voorhees both checked the down subject for vitals. Upon not finding a pulse, Sergeant Voorhees pronounced him deceased and all police personnel and the armored vehicle backed out of the scene. The driver of the suspect vehicle was eventually located and taken into custody. Officer Brazeal remained at the back of his police vehicle until he was taken to the police station. (Full transcript of Officer Brazeal's statement is attached to R.S.O. report in Book 1 section 7.)

INTERVIEW OF Officer Robert Montanez:

Officer Robert Montanez, accompanied by Attorney Russell Perry, provided a voluntary statement to Investigator Dickey and Investigator Gonzalez (Riverside Sheriff Department, Central Homicide Unit # R172100001) in the Corona Police Department Detective Conference room on August 3, 2017, at about 1252 hours.

Officer Montanez said he was working the "graveyard" shift, from 1800 hours-0630 hours, Friday Saturday, and Sunday, when this incident occurred. He has been a police officer in the State of California for eleven years, quit for three years for law school and returned with the Corona Police Department in August of 2016. He currently works patrol and is a current member of the police department Special Response Team (SRT). Prior to leaving for law school, he was a Defensive Tactics Instructor (DT) and a member of the honor guard. He was working his regular duty shift on the day of the incident.

Officer Montanez was at the Zone 2 office, located at 577 N. McKinley St. #103, Corona, preparing to write reports when dispatch broadcasted a 245PC with a gun at 1650 East Sixth Street in Corona. Dispatch further advised that the suspect was seen holding a gun to someone's head and was last seen getting into a newer model white Honda Civic. Although he was not initially dispatched to the incident, he began to respond to the location because it was in his Zone.

Knowing that if the suspects exited 1650 East Sixth Street, they could only go eastbound because of the large cemented ravine that separates the east and westbound lanes of East Sixth Street. As

Officer Montanez was westbound on East Sixth Street, heading to the location, he was watching traffic traveling eastbound to see if any of the vehicles matched the suspect description. As he was still responding to the location, Officer Brazeal arrived and advised that he was unable to locate the suspect vehicle. As Officer Montanez was nearing Temescal Street (street just east of 1650 East Sixth Street), he heard Officer Brazeal broadcast that he was making a traffic stop to the front of the location on a white Honda Civic. Officer Brazeal then indicated that the vehicle was going to go which Officer Montanez understood was that it was going to be a pursuit. As this information was being broadcasted, Officer Montanez was stopped at Temescal Street and he could see the suspect vehicle coming at him (making a U-turn on Sixth Street using the Temescal Street access). Officer Brazeal was behind it with his lights and siren on. Officer Montanez pulled to the northside of the road to get out of the way of the suspect vehicle. The suspect vehicle and Officer Brazeal passed Officer Montanez and proceed westbound on East Sixth Street in a pursuit.

Officer Montanez took a secondary position in the pursuit and began to broadcast it on the radio. He continually updated dispatch to the direction and speeds of the pursuit. As the suspect vehicle was westbound on East Sixth Street, Officer Montanez estimated it to be going over 100MPH and leaving him behind. As the vehicle neared the intersection of Sixth Street and East Grand Boulevard, Officer Montanez could see the suspect vehicle losing control and it was fishtailing. He broadcast on the radio that he thought the vehicle may have crashed. Officer Brazeal then got on the radio and advised that it had not crashed and was still westbound on East Sixth Street.

Near Main Street and Sixth Street, another police unit took over as primary in the pursuit. The suspect vehicle, primary officer, and Officer Brazeal continued westbound on West Sixth Street to Vicentia Avenue where they turned northbound. Officer Montanez continued westbound on West Sixth Street to Buena Vista Avenue. Officer Montanez proceeded northbound on Buena Vista Avenue to Second Street. At Second Street he saw the suspect vehicle westbound at a high rate of speed. As the suspect vehicle went through the intersection of Second Street and Buena Vista Avenue, Officer Montanez saw sparks fly from the bottom of it as it hit the dips in the roadway.

Officer Montanez followed the pursuit and as it turned northbound on Lincoln Avenue, he became fourth in the pursuit. It was Officer Carbajal as primary, Officer Bejines secondary calling out the pursuit, Officer Brazeal, and then he was in the number four position. As Officer Montanez was in the number four position, he made a mental note about the Corona Police Department policy involving a pursuit. He recalled a pursuit authorizes three officers and a supervisor, however, due to the crime being a 245PC involving a firearm he decided to stay in the pursuit. He further indicated that the driver of the suspect vehicle had no intention of stopping and was trying to get away. Based on the initial call and the way the driver was driving, he knew this was a legitimate call. Indicating to himself that these are the guys we are looking for and they are trying to get away from whatever happened.

As the pursuit crossed River Road and Parkridge Avenue, it became the City of Norco. Being familiar with the area, Officer Montanez was aware of fatal collisions that have occurred in and near the intersection of Lincoln Avenue and Parkridge Avenue. He was also aware that the intersection has several large dips in it and collisions occur there as well. Officer Montanez was not surprised when it was broadcasted that the suspect vehicle had crashed. Officer Montanez did not witness the vehicle crash and was a few seconds behind it. As he came to a stop, Officer Carbajal was stopped in front

of him. As he is stopping his vehicle, he was simultaneously removing his AR rifle from the rack between the two front seats. Based on the circumstances, he was preparing for a felony car stop. As he exited his vehicle, he had his rifle and began to approach the front of his vehicle. He noticed the suspect vehicle was at an angle where it was now somewhat facing him. He noticed the driver get out of the suspect vehicle and run towards the back of it then towards a field north of them. The driver kept looking back at them, which Officer Montanez thought was weird. He had his AR rifle at patrol ready (so he chambered a round and flipped open his optic lens). He then noticed the passenger of the suspect vehicle exiting. He watched the suspect's arms raising up towards them in an arching motion and then there were gunshots. He remembered seeing a muzzle flashing toward them from the suspect.

This scared the shit out of him. His first thought was this guy was shooting at us and we could die. He could hear the rounds go off and knew the rounds were coming towards them. Officer Montanez maneuvered between the two police vehicles in front of him and began firing at the suspect. As suspect went down to the ground, Officer Montanez reached the passenger's side of Officer Carbajal's police unit and opens the door. He takes this opportunity to reset his positioning and to get a better look at what the suspect was doing (he had a good view of the right side of the suspect's body). As he was watching the suspect, he noticed that when the suspect went to the ground, he dropped the gun a couple inches from him. Officer Montanez sees the suspect raise his head and look towards them. He then notices the suspect reaching for the handgun that he had just dropped when he went to the ground. Seeing this, knowing that the suspect has already tried to kill them and fearing that he was going to try to again, Officer Montanez fired a few more shots at him at which time the suspect stopped reaching for the gun. The suspect then turned his head towards the suspect vehicle.

Although the suspect was down, he was still a threat with the gun near him. Officers also had to deal with the driver who was outstanding. It was unknown if the driver had a gun on him and if he was a threat. Taking this into account, they came up with a plan to have the Corona Police Department's armored vehicle respond to assist with medical aid to the suspect that was down. Once the armored vehicle arrived, it was used for cover as they checked the suspect for vital signs as well as cleared the suspect vehicle for any further suspects or threats. After clearing the vehicle and declaring the suspect deceased, officers moved back to their patrol units. Officer Montanez assisted with taking the driver into custody once he was located. Officer Montanez remained at the back of his police vehicle until he was taken to the police station. (Full transcript of Officer Montanez statement is attached to R.S.O. report in Book 1 section 7.)

INQUIRY OF THE OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING:

TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE:

I reviewed all involved officers training records.

Relevant to this incident, Officer Brazeal had completed a two-hour pursuit update class and a nine-hour active shooter training class. Since Officer Brazeal's hire date, his training records reflect successful completion of numerous Use of Force/Force Options training and simulator sessions, building search training, Active Shooter training, Firearms training and simulator sessions, and Arrest and Control training.

Officer Brazeal successfully qualified with his handgun during the second quarter of 2017 range qualifications in May 2017, the most recent qualifications prior to this Officer Involved Shooting. The weapon Officer Brazeal used in this Officer Involved Shooting, a Glock 22, chambered with .40mm, was inspected by Riverside Sheriff Forensic Technician Shaver.

Relevant to this incident, Officer Montanez had completed a two-hour pursuit update class and a nine-hour active shooter training class. Since Officer Montanez' hire date, his training records reflect successful completion of numerous Use of Force/Force Options training and simulator sessions, building search training, Active Shooter training, Firearms training and simulator sessions, SRT classes and training, and Arrest and Control training.

Officer Montanez successfully qualified with his handgun during the second quarter of 2017 range qualifications in May 2017, the most recent qualifications prior to this Officer Involved Shooting. He also qualified with his AR during SRT qualification in July 2017, the most recent qualifications prior to this Officer Involved Shooting. The weapon Officer Montanez used in this Officer Involved Shooting, a Colt M4, chambered with .223, was inspected by Riverside Sheriff Forensic Technician Shaver.

Relevant to this incident, Officer Carbajal had been working for the Corona Police Department for four months and had completed a pursuit policy training attestation. Officer Carbajal's training records (prior agency) reflect successful completion of numerous Use of Force/Force Options training and simulator sessions, building search training, Active Shooter training, Firearms training and simulator sessions, and Arrest Control training.

Officer Carbajal successfully qualified with her handgun during the second quarter of 2017 range qualifications in May 2017, the most recent qualifications prior to this Officer Involved Shooting. The weapon Officer Carbajal used in this Officer Involved Shooting, a Glock 19, chambered with 9mm, was inspected by Riverside Sheriff Forensic Technician Devore.

Relevant to this incident, Officer Bejines had completed a two-hour pursuit update class and a nine-hour active shooter training class. Since Officer Bejines' hire date, his training records reflect successful completion of numerous Use of Force/Force Options training and simulator sessions, building search training, Active Shooter training, Firearms training and simulator sessions, and Arrest and Control training.

Officer Bejines successfully qualified with his handgun during the second quarter of 2017 range qualifications in May 2017, the most recent qualifications prior to this Officer Involved Shooting. The weapon Officer Bejines used in this Officer Involved Shooting, a Glock 21, chambered with .45mm, was inspected by Riverside Sheriff Forensic Technician Shaver.

ANALYSIS:

Officers Brazeal, Montanez, Carbajal, and Bejines were tenured officers at the time of this incident, combined with the information they received from Dispatch while on their way to the call, both suspects actions during and after the pursuit, all appeared to have been factors in their decision-making process as they handled this call. The erratic driving of the driver suspect during the pursuit, the driver suspect fleeing the scene after the crash and the passenger suspect actively engaging the officers in a shooting, all officers perceived a deadly threat and engaged the passenger suspect by shooting back at him to neutralize the active threat. Perceiving a secondary threat when the suspect reached for the gun again, Officers Carbajal, Montanez, and Bejines shoot again to neutralize the threat.

Considerations for any intentional weapon discharge by a police officer include an evaluation of the reasonableness of the officer's perceptions and response, a review of pre-shooting tactics (to determine if the officer played any role in creating the emergency that led to the officer-involved shooting), and whether or not the application of force was an appropriate way to address the threat.

Officers Brazeal, Montanez, Carbajal, and Bejines' actions in this incident did not precipitate the officer-involved shooting since the facts support that the officers were called to, and then reacted to, an emergency that developed in their presence. Tyrone Carter and Jashod Carter's actions at the time of the incident (fleeing the scene, retrieving a handgun and firing at officers) Officer's perceived a threat to themselves and fired their weapons to stop Jashod from harming/killing them. Officer Brazeal yelled at Jashod to "Show me your hands" prior to him shooting at officers, with no apparent effect, at which time Officer's shot at him.

CONCLUSION

The statements provided by Officers Brazeal, Carbajal, Bejines, and Montanez are consistent with the investigation conducted by Riverside Sheriff's Department including statements of all of the involved parties and the physical evidence documented at the scene.

The finding of this Administrative Investigation is that Officers Brazeal, Carbajal, Bejines, and Montanez reasonably perceived a threat of death or serious bodily injury when they saw Jashod Carter exit the passenger side of the suspect vehicle while pointing a gun and firing in their direction, with no regard for anyone's safety.

Officer Daniel Brazeal, Officer Jessica Carbajal, Officer Robert Bejines, and Officer Robert Montanez reacted within the guidelines contained in the Corona Police Department Shooting section 303.2(a):

"It is the policy of this department to resort to the use of a firearm, when it reasonably appears to be necessary, and generally: (a) An officer may use deadly force to protect himself/herself or others from what he/she reasonably believe would be an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury

Officer Daniel Brazeal, Officer Jessica Carbajal, Officer Robert Bejines, and Officer Robert Montanez reacted within the guidelines contained in the Corona Police Department Use of Force Policy section 300.4(b)(1):





"For example, an imminent danger may exist if an officer reasonably believes any of the following: 1. The person has a weapon or is attempting to access one and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to use it against the officer or another."

This administrative inquiry is based on my objective review of the facts and statements contained in the reports and recordings related to this incident. Officer Daniel Brazeal, Officer Jessica Carbajal, Officer Robert Bejines, and Officer Robert Montanez actions while handling this call were within department policy and procedures.

The Riverside Sheriff's Department had the Riverside County District Attorney's Office reviewed this incident. As of July 14, 2018, the Corona Police Department has not received any further information regarding the Riverside County District Attorney's Office review and opinion of this officer involved shooting incident.

DISPOSITION:

Commanding Officers Administrative Insight:

On July 14, 2018, Lieutenant Sergio Banales completed the Administrative Investigation into Officer Involved Shooting 17-8528. The criminal investigation into this incident was conducted by the Riverside County Sheriff's Department Special Investigations Bureau (SIB). The results of the criminal investigation were then forwarded to the Riverside County District Attorney's Office for review.

On December 17, 2018, Riverside County District Attorney Michael A. Hestrin provided Corona Police Chief George Johnstone with his department's findings. The written findings revealed there to be no criminal liability upon Officer's Robert Montanez, Daniel Brazeal, Jessica Carbajal and Robert Bejines in this deadly force encounter.

On January 11, 2019, Lieutenant Robert Newman was assigned to conduct and oversee the Use of Force Review Board regarding this incident. The main purpose for the Use of Force Review Board is to decide if the officer's actions were within or outside the scope of the Corona Police Department Policy regarding deadly force encounters. The Review Board studied and evaluated all of the information available to the officers leading up to and occurring during the incident. This information included the state of mind of the officers as the incident unfolded. It was the determination of the Use of Force Review Board that the actions of the involved officers were within the policies of the Corona Police Department.

I concur with the findings of the Review Board in that the immediate decision to use deadly force by Officer's Montanez, Brazeal, Carbajal and Bejines was the correct decision based on the totality of the facts surrounding this particular incident.

Corrective Action:

None. This use of force has been determined to be within department policy.
