Injuries:

Off. Blum was not injured.

Details:

On 3-14-99 at approx. 0326 hrs., Off. Blum advised dispatch that he would be out on "ped check" at Ninth St. and Merrill St. At approx. 0327 hrs., Off. Blum stated "11-11" via the radio. At 0327 hrs., Off. Blum advised that shots were fired.

Off. Nielsen and I arrived on scene with Off. Blum at 0330 hrs. Off. Blum was standing next the drivers door of his patrol unit as we drove up to the scene. Off. Blum advised there were two suspects involved. Off. Blum advised both suspects fired shots at him. He said he had returned fire at the suspects. One suspect ran N/B from Ninth St. and one ran S/B from Ninth St. in the north south Alley between Merrill St. and Sheridan St. Off. Blum advised both suspects were Hispanic and one suspect was wearing a gray long sleeve shirt with a white short sleeve shirt over it. Off. Blum lost sight of the suspects as they ran through the alley. Off. Blum advised he could identify the suspects if seen again.

A welfare check was conducted of the homes surrounding the scene for any injured parties with no injured parties located.

The above assisting personnel responded and set a perimeter around the location. Sgt. Johnson, Off. M. Bell, Off. Stofila, Off. Nielsen, Off. Blum, and I conducted a search in the alley south of the location for the suspects.

Later a search was conducted north of the location with Sgt. Johnson, Off. Alvarez, Off. J. Samano, Off. Kazsuk, and I.

No suspects were located during the searches. The scene was turned over to the Officer involved shooting team.

**Details:**

On 03-14-99, I responded to the area of Ninth St. and Merrill St. to assist on conducting an investigation of an Officer Involved Shooting that occurred earlier that morning. I was assigned to make contact with the residents in the area to see if they saw or heard anything related to the shooting. The following is a list of residences and people I contacted.

██████ W. Ninth St. appeared to be vacant and I did not receive a response at the door.

██████ S. Sheridan St., spoke with OT01 ██████ who lives at that location with his children, ██████ and ██████ nor his children heard or saw anything out of the ordinary earlier that morning during the time of the incident. They were all home sleeping when the incident occurred.

██████ S. Sheridan St., spoke with OT02 ██████ who lives at the location with his two sons, daughter, and wife. ██████ said that he, nor his family heard or saw anything out of the ordinary earlier that morning during the time of the incident. They were all home sleeping when the incident occurred.

██████ S. Sheridan St., spoke with OT03 ██████ who lives at the location with her mom, ██████ and step-dad, ██████ said that she, nor her family heard or saw anything out of the ordinary that morning during the time of the incident. They were all home sleeping when the incident occurred.

██████ S. Sheridan St., I did not receive a response at the door.

██████ W. Tenth St., spoke with OT04 ██████ who lives at the location with her children, ██████ and husband, ██████ said that she, nor her family heard or saw anything out of the ordinary that morning during the time of the incident. They were all home sleeping when the incident occurred.

██████ S. Merrill St., spoke with OT05 ██████ who lives at the location and she stated that she was awake at approximately 0300 hrs. when she heard gun shots coming from outside. ██████ estimated that she heard more than six shots in rapid succession. ██████ could not tell what direction the shots were coming from, nor did she look outside to see if something was wrong. ██████ could not provide any further information and was home alone when this occurred.

██████ S. Merrill St., spoke with OT06 ██████ who lives at the location and she stated that at approximately 0300 hrs., she heard one gun shot, a short pause and then several more shots. ██████ believed the shots were coming from somewhere behind her residence, however did not look outside. ██████ said her daughter, ██████ and Husband ██████ were also home when this occurred. ██████ asked her husband in Spanish if he heard anything and ██████ said that at approximately 0300 hrs., he heard two gun shots, a pause, and then two more gun shots coming from somewhere behind his residence. ██████ did not look outside. ██████ did not hear or see anything out of the ordinary during the time of the incident.

██████ S. Merrill St., spoke with OT07 ██████ who told me that at approximately 0300 hrs, he heard two gun shots outside, a pause for approximately a second, and then two more gunshots. ██████ looked outside his windows and did not see anything. ██████ called 911 and then went outside and looked in the alley way and front yard, but did not see anyone suspicious and went back inside. ██████ could not provide me any further information.

██████ S. Merrill St., spoke with OT08 ██████ who lives at the location with his mom, ██████ and step-dad, ██████ said that at approximately 0300 hrs., he heard two gun shots

outside, a short pause and then two more shots. [REDACTED] could not tell where they were coming from and did not see anything. [REDACTED] said his parents were home, but did not hear or see anything.

[REDACTED] S. Merrill St., I did not receive a response at the door.

[REDACTED] S. Merrill St., spoke with OT09 [REDACTED] who lives at the location by herself. [REDACTED] said she did not hear nor see anything unusual during the time the incident occurred because she was sleeping.

[REDACTED] S. Merrill St., spoke with OT10 [REDACTED] who lives at the location with his wife, [REDACTED] and three children. They did not hear or see anything unusual during the time of the incident and were all sleeping.

[REDACTED] S. Merrill St., spoke with OT11 [REDACTED] who lives at the location with his wife and children. [REDACTED] said they were all sleeping during the time of the incident and did not hear or see anything unusual.

[REDACTED] S. Sheridan St., I did not receive an response at the door.

[REDACTED] S. Sheridan St., spoke with OT12 [REDACTED] who lives at the location with her husband and kids. [REDACTED] said at approximately 0300 hrs., she heard three gun shots and sirens, but did not look outside to see if anything had occurred. OT13 [REDACTED] said that he had heard two gun shots, a pause for a few seconds, and then two more gun shots. They both could not provide any further information.

[REDACTED] S. Sheridan St. [REDACTED] spoke with OT14 [REDACTED] who lives at the location with her husband [REDACTED] and their infant child. Lopez said they were all sleeping when the incident occurred and did not hear anything.

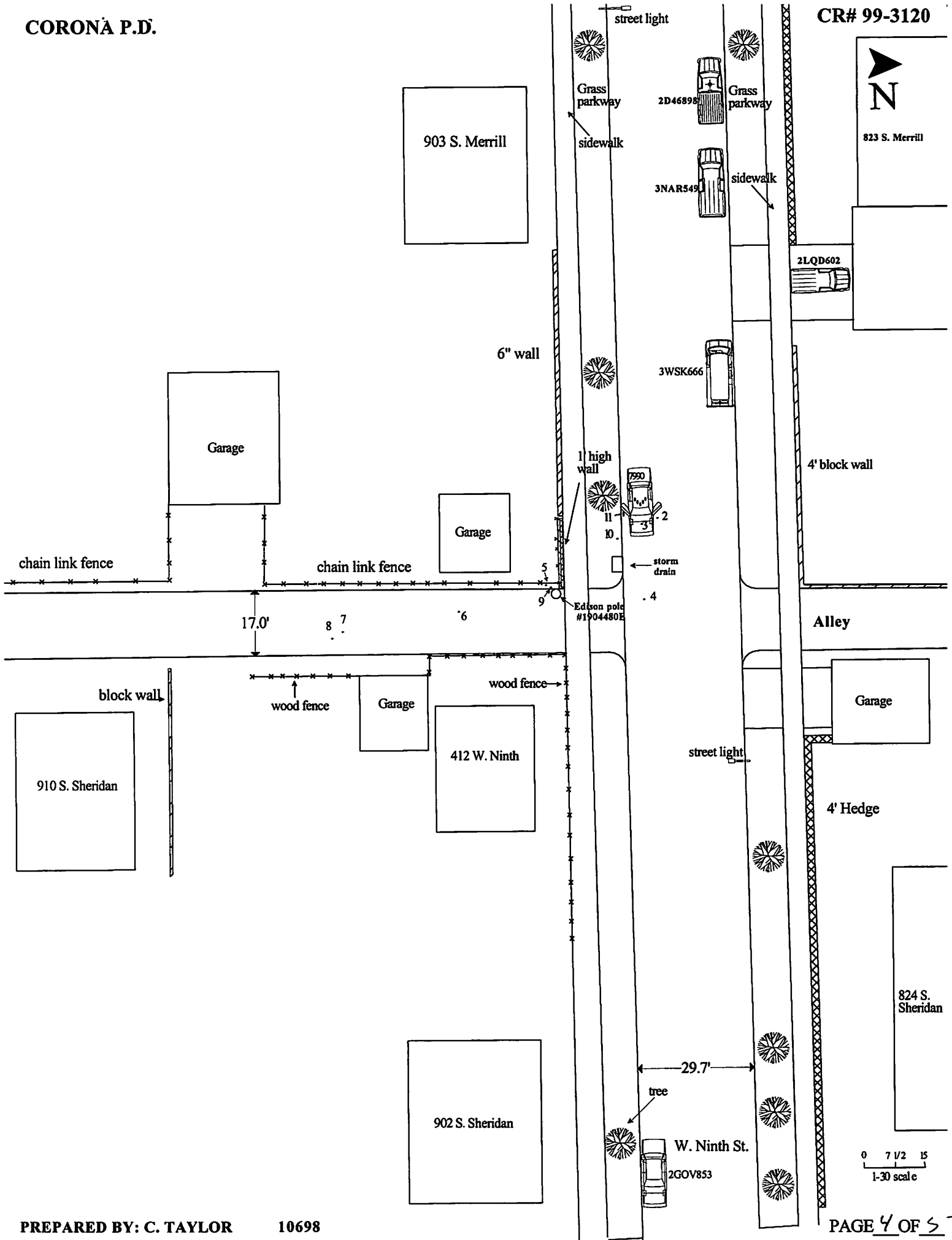

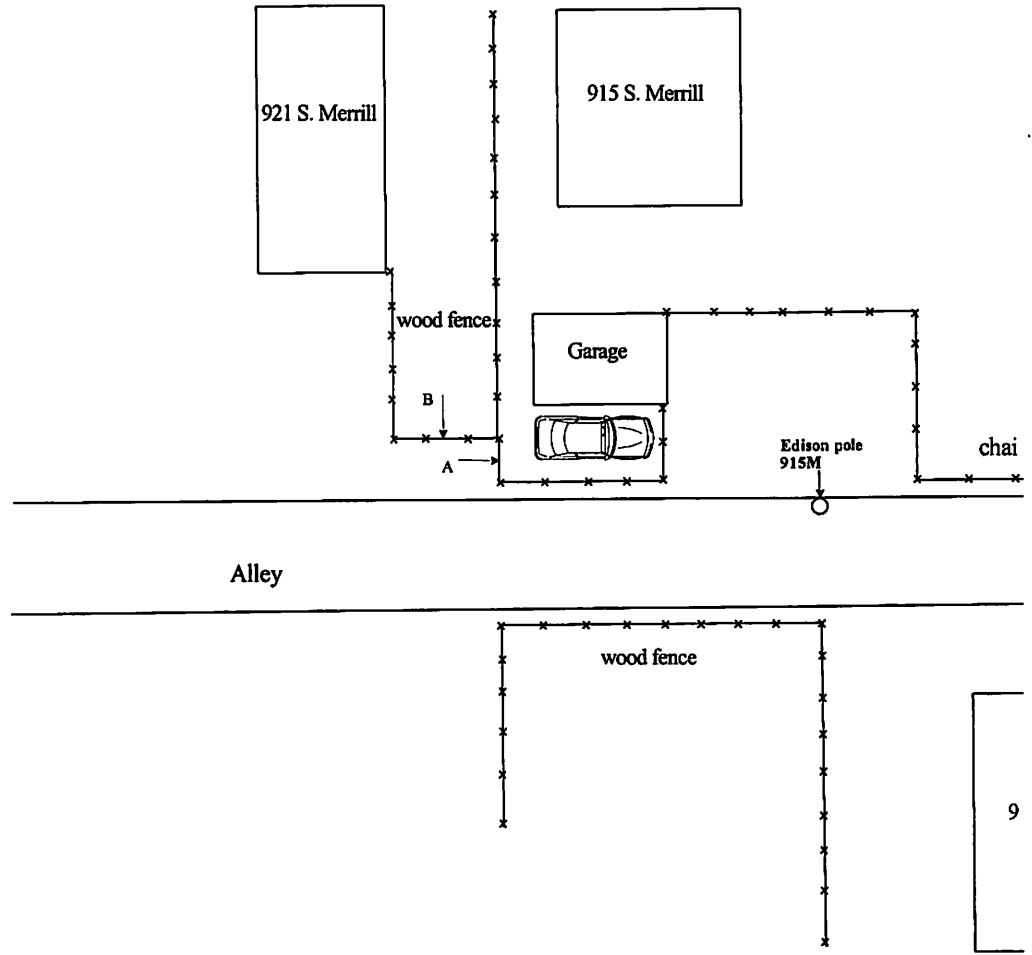

## DETAILS:

On 3-14-99 at approx. 0400 hours, I responded to the 400 block of W. Ninth St., reference an Officer Involved Shooting.

Upon arrival, I was instructed to contact the surrounding residences and obtain statements from potential witnesses. The following statements are from nearby residents who heard the incident:

OT01 through OT20 each told me they were asleep at the time of the incident and they did not hear or see anything.

I contacted [REDACTED] (OT21) at [REDACTED] S. Sheridan St. and she told me the following: [REDACTED] stated between approx. 0200 and 0300 hours, on this date, she was awoken by what sounded like a subject running in the alley east of her residence. [REDACTED] said she looked out the window, but she did not see anyone. [REDACTED] also stated she did not know what direction the subject was running. [REDACTED] told me she did not hear any gunshots prior to the noises in the alley. NFD.

[REDACTED] (OT22) told me the following: [REDACTED] stated, at approx. 0330 – 0400 hours on this date, he was awoken by six rapid gunshots. [REDACTED] told me immediately after the gunshots, he heard a vehicle speed away S/B in the 900 block of Sheridan St. [REDACTED] said he looked out his front window and he did not see a vehicle or its occupants. NFD.

I then spoke with [REDACTED] daughter, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who told me she was awoken by police sirens at an unknown time this morning. [REDACTED] said she did not hear anything else, so she went back to sleep. NFD.

[REDACTED] (OT24) told me, on this date at approx. 0330 hours, he was awoken when he heard four to six rapid gunshots which came N/B from his residence. [REDACTED] stated he did not get out of bed, and he did not hear or see anyone. NFD.

[REDACTED] (OT25) stated between 0300 and 0330 hours on this date, her front door, which faces N/B, was opened slightly. [REDACTED] said at that time, she woke up to three to four rapid gunshots. [REDACTED] told me she had enough time to get out of bed and exit the bedroom, when she heard three more rapid shots fired. [REDACTED] said she closed the front door, then heard several police sirens coming to the area. [REDACTED] did not look out the window, and did not see or hear anyone. NFD.

██████████ (OT26) told me at an unknown time in the early morning hours, she heard four to five gunshots from a small caliber gun. ██████████ said a short time later, she heard another three to four gunshots from a larger caliber gun. ██████████ stated the second round of shots sounded much closer than the first, but she did not look out the window to see anyone. ██████████ told me she did not hear any voices or other noises during the incident. NFD.

██████████ (OT27) was awoken when he heard an unknown number of gunshots coming from the alley east of his residence. ██████████ is 8 years old and did not see any suspects or police. NFD.

NFD.

██████████ (OT31) told me between 0300 and 0330 hours, he was awoken when he heard two "pops," which he thought were gunshots. ██████████ said a few minutes later, he heard two more gunshots. ██████████ could not provide any further details and said he never left his bed. NFD.

I then spoke with ██████████ (OT32) who told me between 0300 and 0330 hours, she heard an unknown number of gunshots. ██████████ said there was a short pause, then she heard two more gunshots. ██████████ said she then heard the dog in the residence just south of her, growling as if someone was close to it. ██████████ said the dog does not growl often, however, she did not look out the window to see if anyone was outside. NFD.

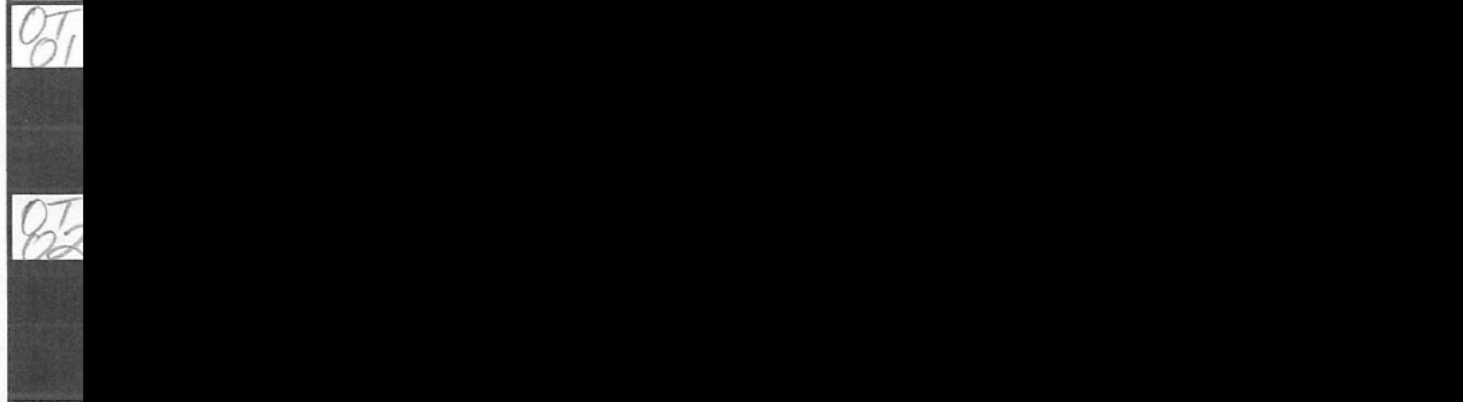

**DETAILS:**

On 03-14-99 at approximately 0400 hours, I was contacted by phone at my residence and requested to respond to Ninth St./Sheridan St. in regards to an Officer Involved Shooting. I was advised that Officer Erik Blum had been involved in an incident where he encountered two armed suspects. I arrived at the scene at approximately 0440 hours. I was advised that both suspects were still outstanding and Patrol Officers were still conducting a search of the area.

As part of the Corona Police Department's Officer Involved Incident Team, the following people were notified and requested to respond to the scene to assist in this investigation. Myself and Sr. Detective Dennis Wensel were assigned to conduct the criminal investigation into this incident, along with Det. Scott Musgraves and Sr. Det. John Marshall. Sgt. Marmolejo and Sr. Det. Mike Anderson were assigned to conduct the administrative investigation and Sgt. Garcia was assigned to the civil aspects. Corporal Serrato, Officer Carey, Officer Beach, Officer Taylor, Officer Avila, Officer Newman and Officer Mazzarini responded to assist in witness statements, refer to their supplemental reports for details.

I noted that Ninth St. was closed off to vehicular and pedestrian traffic between Belle St. and Merrill St. as well as the N/S alleyway between Eighth St., Tenth St., Belle St. and Sheridan St.

When I arrived on scene I observed Officer Blum standing with Officer Newman in the 300 Blk. of W. Ninth St. Officer Blum's marked black and white police unit #7990 Ca. License #E283526 was parked along the south curblin in the 400 Blk. of W. Ninth St. west of the N/S alleyway. The unit was facing E/B, both the front drivers door as well as the front passenger door was open and the parking lights were on. Visible on the scene were several spent casings in the alleyway as well as unspent casings by Officer Blum's unit. (Refer to supplemental reports for exact locations).

I was informed that Officer Blum was the only Officer involved in the shooting and that there were two outstanding suspects. I immediately had Officer Blum removed from the scene and transported to the Corona Police Department by Officer VanderKallen.

Representatives from the Riverside County District Attorney's Office were contacted. Deputy DA Bill Mitchell was contacted by phone by Det. Musgraves. He was advised of the circumstances of the Officer Involved Shooting however did not respond to the scene.

At approximately 0545 hours, Det. Wensel and I responded to the Corona Police Department to contact Officer Blum. ID Tech Morales took photographs of Officer Blum in his uniform as well as collected GSR exemplars from both hands. Officer Blum was represented by Attorney Corey Glave. Refer to Det. Musgraves report for Officer Blum's statement in regards to his involvement in this shooting incident.

**DETAILS CON'T:**

To eliminate any future issues that might arise, I asked Officer Blum to provide a voluntary blood sample. He agreed to do so and American Forensic Nurses was contacted and requested to respond to the station. In addition, Officer Blum's weapon and remaining ammunition and magazines were collected as evidence and inspected. (Refer to Det. Wensels supplemental).

At approximately 0855 hours, American Forensic Nurse, Michelle Chebahtah, arrived at the station to obtain blood. Officer Blum had a blood sample taken from his left arm at about 0905 hours. I witnessed the blood draw and the sample was retained by American Forensic Nurses.

Officer Blum has been employed by the Corona Police Department for approximately five months as a Police Officer within the patrol division. He was employed as a Reserve Police Officer for the Corona Police Department for approximately four months prior to being hired full time. Officer Blum works graveyard from 2145 hours to 0745 hours. He was working his normal shift on the date and time this shooting incident occurred and began work at 2145 hours on March 13<sup>th</sup>, 1999.

Based upon a review of the statements of witnesses and the review of the physical evidence and circumstances surrounding this shooting, the status of this case will remain open as an Attempt Homicide of a Police Officer.

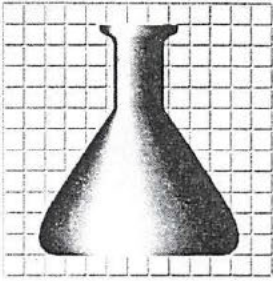

*I, the undersigned, if called as a witness, would testify that I: (1) am employed by the State of California Department of Justice, (2) conducted an examination of, and (3) formed conclusions as stated in this report. I, the undersigned, declare this information is true and correct under penalty of perjury.*

SUMMARY:

All of the submitted expended caliber 9mm Luger cartridge cases were fired by the submitted SIG SAUER pistol.

The submitted bullet (Item RM14) was possibly discharged by the submitted pistol.

EVIDENCE:

The following evidence was submitted to the Laboratory by Wenzel of the Corona Police Department on March 17, 1999:

The following evidence was submitted to the Laboratory by Kelly Anderson of the Corona Police Department on March 26, 1999:

Item RM14 One expended bullet

EXAMINATION:

The submitted pistol (Item 4) was identified as a SIG SAUER model P226 caliber 9mm Luger semi-auto pistol, S.N. U578546. Examination and test firing of this pistol showed that it was functioning properly. The pistol was test-fired with Laboratory stock caliber 9mm Luger ammunition.

Three loaded magazines (Items 1 - 3) designed for the submitted pistol were also submitted. Item 1 consisted of a 10-round capacity SIG SAUER magazine loaded with 10 rounds of unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridges. A loose unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridge was also included with this item. Item 2 consisted of a 15-round capacity MEC-GAR magazine loaded with 9 rounds of unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridges. Item 3 consisted of a 10-round capacity SIG SAUER magazine loaded with 9 rounds of unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridges. All of the unfired cartridges have the same headstamp (Winchester) and were of the same style (brass case, brass primer and copper jacketed hollow-point bullet).

Items RM2, RM3 and RM4 each consisted of an unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridge with headstamp and cartridge style similar to the other unfired cartridges. Superficial damages were found on each of these 3 unfired cartridges.

Items RM5, RM6, RM7, RM8 and RM9 were determined to be expended caliber 9mm Luger cartridge cases with Winchester headstamp. RM6 was loaded with a nickel-finished primer and each of the other cartridge cases was loaded with a brass-finished primer. RM6 was also damaged and appeared to be a reload. RM5 to RM9 were microscopically compared to the test-fired cartridge cases. They were all determined to have been discharged by the submitted SIG SAUER pistol.


Item RM10 was determined to be an expended caliber .40 S&W cartridge case. It was not discharged by the submitted pistol. The impression on the cartridge case was entered into the NIBIN (formerly DRUGFIRE) database and the current database was searched. No linked cases were identified.

RM14 was determined to be a damaged .38 caliber jacketed hollow-point bullet, possibly 9mm Luger. It was microscopically compared to the bullets test-fired from the submitted SIG SAUER pistol. RM14 was possibly fired by the submitted pistol. A more definitive conclusion could not be reached due to the damages on this bullet, the lack of sufficient amounts of striations (individual characteristics) and the absence of sufficient agreement of the available striations on this bullet with the striations on the test-fired bullets.

DISPOSITION:

All items will be retained in the Laboratory pending return to the submitting agency. The test-fired bullets and cartridge cases will be retained in the Laboratory.

**DETAILS:**

On 031499 I responded to the 400 Blk. of W. Ninth St. to assist the detectives with an officer involved shooting. My assignment was to measure and document the scene and evidence placement. Those measurements were transferred into my report.

After reviewing that report an error was located. The "Z" measurement for evidence items A & B were transposed. The correct "Z" measurement for A is 3.75. The correct "Z" measurement for B is 4.42.

**DETAILS:**

- 2 On 3/14/99 at approx. 0415 hours, I responded to investigate a shooting which involved Corona  
P.D. Officer Blum in the 400 block of W. Ninth Street, Corona. When I arrived at approx. 0430  
4 hours, the crime scene area that was controlled by patrol officers included the 400 block of W.  
Ninth Street, the 900 block of the N/S alleyway between Sheridan and Merrill Streets, and the  
6 800 block of the N/S alleyway between Sheridan and Merrill Streets.
- 8 When I arrived, I saw that Ofcr. Blum was dressed in his Corona Police uniform.
- 10 I was briefed by Sgt. Rasso and advised that Ofcr. Blum had attempted to contact two subjects  
who were on the S/side of the 400 block W. Ninth Street near the N/S alleyway. Upon contact  
12 with the subjects, one of them was on a short block wall and the other was just inside the  
alleyway. Sgt. Rasso told me that the subject in the alleyway began firing a gun at Ofcr. Blum.  
14 At some point, the subject near the wall also began firing a gun at Ofcr. Blum. Ofcr. Blum  
returned fire and at some point, his gun jammed. Ofcr. Blum cleared his weapon and returned  
16 fire.
- 18 After daylight, the area and residence yards surrounding the crime scene were believed to have  
been cleared of any suspects. At that point, myself, Det. Marshall, I.D. Tech Verdugo, and I.D.  
20 Tech Morales began checking the crime scene for evidence.
- 22 While we processed the crime scene, other officers contacted residents in the area looking for  
possible witnesses or suspects.

- Ofcr. Blum's marked police vehicle, unit #7990, was parked facing E/B on the S/side of the 400  
26 block W. Ninth Street, Corona. The vehicle's parking lights were on and both the driver's door  
and the front passenger door of the vehicle were open. Ofcr. Blum's flashlight was in the  
28 charging unit inside the police car.

2 Several unexpended bullet cartridges were located in the street of the 400 block W. Ninth near  
Ofcr. Blum's vehicle. Several expended cartridges were located in the N/S alleyway between  
4 the 900 blocks on Sheridan and Merrill Streets. These items were marked as evidence by  
placing placards near the items.

Overall crime scene photos were taken by the I.D. Techs.

8  
We began a search of the area around the vehicle and alleyways for additional bullet cartridges,  
10 bullets, bullet strikes or other possible evidence. When items were located, placards were  
placed by them to mark as evidence.

The surrounding residences were also checked for bullet strikes or damage. The residences,  
14 fences, walls, vehicles, and ground were searched for bullet strikes. We were unable to locate  
any fired bullets or bullet strikes in the area at that time. We did not locate any damage to Ofcr.  
16 Blum's vehicle caused by bullet strikes. We did not locate any firearms in the area.

18 Three (3) unspent Winchester 9mm Luger bullet cartridges were located in the street area under  
and around Ofcr. Blum's vehicle.

20  
Five (5) spent Winchester 9mm Luger cartridges were located in the N/S alleyway between the  
22 900 blocks of Sheridan and Merrill Streets.

24 Winchester 9mm Luger ammunition is consistent with Corona P.D. 9mm issued ammunition. I  
received information from Det. Wensel who examined Ofcr. Blum's weapon, that Ofcr. Blum's  
26 weapon is a Sig Sauer 9mm semi-automatic handgun.

28 One (1) spent Winchester .40 caliber Smith and Wesson cartridge was located in the grass



1 parkway area S/of Ofcr. Blum's vehicle. I saw the cartridge when it was collected and it did not  
2 appear to have dirt or debris on it or inside of it.

4 Corona P.D. officers are not authorized to carry .40 caliber weapons.

6 On the wall where one of the suspects was believed to be was graffiti that read, "Gonzalo CVLs  
XIII." Photographs were taken of the graffiti. It is unknown if the graffiti was related to this case.

8  
A 20 ounce plastic bottle of Lipton tea was located in the gutter of the street next to the  
10 passenger side of Ofcr. Blum's vehicle. It is unknown if the bottle had any connection to the  
incident, but was photographed and collected as evidence.

12  
I searched the exterior and interior of Ofcr. Blum's vehicle for any spent or unspent cartridges  
14 including the engine compartment. I did not locate any cartridges in or on his vehicle.

16 Sgt. Kelly Anderson and myself also checked the gutter drain in front of Ofcr. Blum's vehicle for  
any evidence with negative results.

18  
Later that morning, a hand held portable radio scanner was located by residents in the yard of  
20 [REDACTED] S. Merrill, Corona, and given to patrol officers. Through interviews with neighbors in the  
area, the scanner was believed to belong to [REDACTED]. It was found that [REDACTED]  
22 [REDACTED] was currently a parolee who was wanted for a parole violation. It was also found that  
another parolee, [REDACTED] was located at [REDACTED] S. Merrill when patrol officers were making  
24 contact with residents. [REDACTED] girlfriend and [REDACTED] girlfriend are sisters and  
reside within a block of the incident location. At this time, it was unknown if the scanner was  
26 connected with the shooting, but it could have been dropped by a suspect in the yard of [REDACTED] S.  
Merrill while fleeing the scene.

Ofcr. Taylor and Ofcr. Beach assisted by taking measurements of the locations of evidence for  
2 a detailed diagram of the crime scene.

4  
On 3/16/99 in the morning hours, I was contacted by Ofcr. John Samano. Ofcr. Samano told  
6 me that during the night he located a bullet hole in the fence behind 921 S. Merrill, Corona. At  
approx. 0815 hours, I.D. Tech Morales and myself responded with Ofcr. Samano to that area  
8 and he pointed out to us the bullet hole.

10 There were actually two bullet holes at the location through the fence. Based on the damage  
to the fences, the bullet appeared to pass through the fences in a S/B direction. The size of the  
12 hole appeared to be consistent with a medium caliber bullet.

14 There was one hole in the N/fence of 921 S. Merrill. It appeared that the bullet entered the  
N/side of the fence and exited the S/side of the fence in a S/B direction. The hole appeared to  
16 be new damage based on the lighter color of the wood coming out of the exit side of the hole.

18 A large horizontal gouge was located on the E/fence of 921 S. Merrill. The gouge appeared to  
have been caused by the same bullet. The gouge appeared to be new damage based on the  
20 lighter color of the wood. The bullet did not go through the fence, but appeared to have glanced  
off the E/side of the fence and continued in a S/B direction.

22  
The damage to the fences along with the surrounding area was photographed by I.D. Tech  
24 Morales.

26 I then removed wood from the holes to check for any bullet fragments and was unable to locate  
any.

28

Ofcr. Taylor responded to our location to take measurements of the location of the bullet holes  
2 to be included in the detailed diagram. See his report for details.

4 I.D. Tech Morales, Ofcr. Taylor, and myself checked the area south of the bullet damage for any  
further damage, bullets, or bullet fragments with negative results.

6

8 On 3/22/99, Det. R. Anderson located a bullet projectile in the 400 block of W. Tenth. The bullet

2 On 3/14/99, Det. Marshall put out a flyer to patrol officers indicating that we wanted to talk to  
3 [REDACTED] reference this case. On 3/15/99 at approx. 0654 hours, I was contacted by Corona  
4 P.D. dispatch and advised that [REDACTED] was contacted by patrol officers on a traffic stop.  
5 The dispatcher told me that [REDACTED] said that he would come to Corona P.D. voluntarily at  
6 approx. 0800 hours to be interviewed by me reference this case.

8 On 3/15/99 at approx. 0845 hours, I contacted [REDACTED] in the front lobby of Corona P.D.  
9 [REDACTED] agreed to talk to me and came with me to the detective interview room. [REDACTED] was not  
10 in custody at the time of the interview. The interview was audio taped. The following is a  
11 summary of the interview. For the entire interview, refer to the audiotape.

12  
13 [REDACTED] stated that on Saturday, the day prior to the shooting, he had been drinking beer all day.  
14 He stated that he had been drinking with his brother, [REDACTED] and some other guys. [REDACTED]  
15 stated that he went to bed early that night at [REDACTED] S. Merrill because he had been drinking all day.

16  
17 [REDACTED] said that sometime around 3:30 a.m., his wife woke him up and told him that she had  
18 heard gunshots. [REDACTED] said that he didn't hear the shots himself. [REDACTED] said that he didn't get  
19 out of bed at that time, because he had been drinking a lot.

20  
21 [REDACTED] said that sometime later in the morning, he heard officers knocking on his door and he  
22 got up at that time. [REDACTED] said that the officers talked to his girlfriend. [REDACTED] said that not long  
23 after that he left and went to his dad's house.

24  
25 [REDACTED] said that he had no personal knowledge of the scanner that was found in the yard behind  
26 his girlfriend's residence and he doesn't know where it came from. [REDACTED] said that he later  
27 heard that the kids were playing with the scanner.

1 ██████ said that he is familiar with ██████, but he doesn't associate with him. ██████ said  
2 that he last saw ██████ a couple of days ago riding a bicycle around the area of ██████ S.  
Merrill.

4 ██████ said that he doesn't know any information related to the shooting and he wasn't involved.

When asked who from that neighborhood would be involved in the shooting, ██████ said that he  
8 would think of himself as someone who might be involved because he had been arrested for  
carrying a gun in the past. ██████ said that he couldn't think of anyone else who might be  
10 involved and he probably wouldn't tell us if he did. ██████ said that he wasn't involved and he  
doesn't carry guns anymore.

12 ██████ was not arrested and he left Corona P.D. after the interview was concluded.

14  
16 On 3/16/99, ██████ was arrested by patrol officers for ██████

18 On 3/16/99 at approx. 1530 hours, Det. Marshall and I interviewed ██████ in the  
detective Sergeant's office of Corona P.D. The interview was video and audio taped. The  
20 following is a summary of the interview. For the entire interview refer to the tapes.

22 I advised ██████ of his rights per miranda, which he indicated he understood. ██████ signed the  
attached admonishment statement. ██████ indicated that he was willing to talk to us and waived  
24 his rights by making statements about this case.

26 ██████ said that on the Saturday night before the shooting he had been at ██████ house  
located in the area of Fifth Street and Belle from about 5:00 to 6:00 p.m.



He stated he then went to [REDACTED] residence in the Amber Court apartments in the area  
2 of Ramona and Eighth street at about 8:00 to 9:30 p.m.

4 [REDACTED] said that he then went to [REDACTED] house at [REDACTED] W. Eighth Street at about 10:00 or  
10:30 p.m. and didn't leave her house until about 8:00 or 9:00 a.m. the next morning. [REDACTED]  
6 said that the people there with him were [REDACTED] and the children. [REDACTED] said that the children  
there were 1-year-old female [REDACTED], 4-year-old male [REDACTED], 6-year-old male [REDACTED], and 9 or 10-  
8 year-old male [REDACTED]

10 [REDACTED] said that while at [REDACTED] house he had been drinking a beer while laying on  
the livingroom floor. [REDACTED] said that he was laying there dozing off, but was still kind of awake.

12  
[REDACTED] said that sometime around 3:30 or 4:30 a.m., he heard gunshots. [REDACTED] said that he  
14 heard about three shots in a row, there was a pause, and he then heard about two shots in a  
row. [REDACTED] said that he drank some of his beer, then got up to get another beer. [REDACTED] said  
16 that he turned on his scanner and heard the radio traffic.

18 [REDACTED] said that his scanner is a hand held scanner that had "Corona" or "Cora" on the bottom  
of it. [REDACTED] said that a guy gave him the scanner a few months ago.

20  
[REDACTED] gave a detailed account of the radio traffic he heard while listening to the scanner.  
22 [REDACTED] said that he heard the officer say that one suspect was running north and one suspect  
was running south. The officer said that he was at Tenth and Ninth Streets and Merrill in the  
24 alley. The officer said that they shot at him. They asked the officer if he was hit and he told  
them, "No." They asked the officer if he was in pursuit and the officer said, "No. They have  
26 guns."

28 [REDACTED] said that the officer described one suspect as wearing a white shirt and a gray long

1 sleeve shirt, clean shaven, with bald or short hair. [REDACTED] said that the officer said that there was  
2 no description on the second suspect.

4 [REDACTED] said that he heard that officers were searching here and there and that the Sheriff's were  
sent to assist them. [REDACTED] said that he heard that the officers were searching alleys and some  
6 areas where they heard dogs barking.

8 [REDACTED] also heard that the officers were setting up a perimeter.

10 [REDACTED] said that he listened for awhile and then turned off his scanner and put it on the floor  
about half way under the couch at about 5:15 or 5:45 a.m. [REDACTED] said that he then dozed off  
12 on the livingroom floor.

14 [REDACTED] said that when he woke up in the morning at around 8:00 or 9:00 a.m., his scanner was  
missing. [REDACTED] believes that his son, [REDACTED], must have been playing with his scanner and took  
16 it out of the house.

18 When asked how the scanner got to Merrill Street, [REDACTED] said he later heard that [REDACTED] took it  
there and was playing with it. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] had taken his scanner out of the house  
20 before in the past.

22 [REDACTED] said that he hasn't been in possession of a gun or handled a gun in years, but would not  
specify how long. [REDACTED] said that he doesn't own a gun now.

24 [REDACTED] said that he knows [REDACTED], but he doesn't go to his house. [REDACTED] said that he did  
26 not take the scanner to Merrill Street and he was not in that area when the shooting occurred.  
[REDACTED] said that he does frequent that area and knows the people in the neighborhood. [REDACTED]  
28 said that he often collects cans in that area.

2 ██████ said that he has not been back to ██████ house since the shooting because he heard  
we were looking for him. ██████ said that ██████ and ██████ told him that we were  
4 looking for him.

6 ██████ said that when he was arrested today, he was on his way to ██████ house.

8 ██████ said that his prints will not be on any guns or any bullets that were found at the crime  
scene because he wasn't involved. ██████ said that his prints will be found on his scanner.

10  
When asked about his parole violation, ██████ stated that he has been a PAL (parolee at large)  
12 since last November for absconding. ██████ said that he didn't get along very well with his  
parole officer and every time he went to the parole office to check in, his P.O. wasn't there.  
14 ██████ said that he knew he was wanted and expects to get about 7 months for his violation.  
██████ said that he would not get involved in shooting at a cop for a 7-month violation.

16  
██████ said that he doesn't go out on the streets during the middle of the night because he is  
18 originally from Santa Ana. ██████ said that he had been stabbed by a Corona gang member,  
██████ in the past because he was from Santa Ana. ██████ said that other Corona gang  
20 members have attacked him in the past. ██████ said that he was attacked by two Corona gang  
members in Home Gardens on one occasion and he stabbed one of the guys to defend himself.  
22 ██████ said that he was tried in that case and found innocent because they attacked him. ██████  
said that he has not been involved in any Corona gangs and has kept to himself because of  
24 those problems.

26 ██████ said that he doesn't know who was involved in the shooting and hasn't heard anything  
about who may have been involved.

DETAILS:

2 On 3/17/99 at approx. 0815 hours, I met with Ofcr. Erik Blum in my office at Corona P.D. for the  
purpose of getting a detailed suspect description of the subjects involved in shooting at him.  
4  
Ofcr. Blum described the suspect #1, the subject he was going to contact, as a fair skinned  
6 Hispanic male, about 22-26 years, 5'06" to 6'00" tall, 150 to 180 lbs.

8 Ofcr. Blum described the suspect's hair as dark colored very short hair, cut at an even length.  
Ofcr. Blum described the length of the hair as similar to what it would look like if it was cut with  
10 a #1 clipper. The suspect was not wearing a hat.

12 Ofcr. Blum stated that the suspect was wearing a light colored (possibly white or tan) short  
sleeve collared shirt with buttons all the way up the front. Under that shirt, the suspect was also  
14 wearing a dark colored long sleeve shirt, possibly a sweatshirt. Both shirts were untucked.

16 Ofcr. Blum stated that the suspect was wearing dark colored baggy pants, possibly dark blue  
or black.  
18  
Ofcr. Blum described the suspect's clothing as gang type looking clothing.  
20  
Ofcr. Blum did not notice any facial hair on the suspect.  
22  
Ofcr. Blum believes that the suspect was armed with a handgun by the way he was shooting  
24 over his left shoulder. Ofcr. Blum believes that the suspect may be right handed, also because  
of the manner in which the suspect fired at him.  
26  
Ofcr. Blum stated that he could possibly identify the suspect and he saw him mainly from a  
28 profile view. Ofcr. Blum stated he did not recognize the suspect as anyone he has met from

prior contacts.

2

Ofcr. Blum described the second suspect as an unknown race male wearing a light colored  
4 sweatshirt, possibly gray. Ofcr. Blum stated that he did not see what kind of weapon this  
suspect fired at him, but he believes that he would have noticed if the suspect was carrying a  
6 rifle. Ofcr. Blum could not recall anymore details about this suspect and does not believe that  
he could identify him.

8

10 Ofcr. Blum and I.D. Tech Danny Verdugo attempted to compile an accurate composite of  
suspect #1. After compiling a composite, Ofcr. Blum did not feel that the composite was an  
12 accurate depiction of the suspect. He rated the composite's likeness to the suspect as about  
a 1 on a scale of 1 to 10. Based on that information, the composite will not be used to help  
14 identify the suspect.

16 I made the attached information flyer and distributed it to patrol officers.

18

On 3/23/99 at approx. 0410 hours, I met with Ofcr. Blum in the 400 block of W. Ninth Street,  
20 Corona, for his statement reference the shooting incident and a walk-thru of the location. Sgt.  
Delacruz, Det. R. Anderson, and Ofcr. Blum's attorney, Chuck Goldwasser, was also present.  
22 I asked Ofcr. Blum if he was willing to describe to me what happened during the shooting  
incident and he said that he was.

24

Ofcr. Blum said that prior to the incident he was driving his marked police unit S/B on Merrill  
26 Street. When he reached the intersection of Merrill and W. Ninth Street, he noticed suspect #1  
(previously described) walking E/B on Ninth Street on the S/sidewalk. Ofcr. Blum stated that he  
28 turned left on Ninth Street and drove towards suspect #1 in order to contact him. Ofcr. Blum

2 wanted to contact the subject because the subject was out walking the streets at such an early  
hour of the morning and because of the way the subject was dressed. Ofcr. Blum said that his  
intention was to have a consensual encounter with the subject. Ofcr. Blum stated that he called  
4 out a "ped check" on the radio and stopped his vehicle on the S/side of the street facing E/B.  
Ofcr. Blum stated that he was parked 6' or so W/of the entrance to the N/S alleyway between  
6 Merrill and Sheridan. Ofcr. Blum said that as he was getting out of his vehicle, suspect #1  
turned right, walking S/B in the alleyway without looking back at him.

8

Ofcr. Blum said that he got out of his vehicle and walked into the alleyway on the W/side of it.  
10 Ofcr. Blum said that he had his flashlight in his left hand at that time, but didn't turn it on. Ofcr.  
Blum entered the alley near the telephone pole and was walking just S/of the telephone pole.  
12 Ofcr. Blum stated that suspect #1 was continuing to walk S/B on the W/side of the alleyway and  
was in the area of a pothole. Ofcr. Blum said that he stated to suspect #1, "Hey, come here. I  
14 want to talk to you for a second," or something to that affect.

16 Ofcr. Blum stated that at that time, the suspect turned to his left and was looking over his left  
shoulder in Ofcr. Blum's direction. Ofcr. Blum saw the muzzle flash of a weapon being fired at  
18 him. Ofcr. Blum stated that the suspect did not say anything to him, but fired (1) one round at  
him in a N/B direction. Ofcr. Blum stated that there was no doubt that suspect #1 was firing at  
20 him and he saw that the muzzle flash of the gun was directed at him.

22 Ofcr. Blum stated that he drew his weapon from his holster with his right hand and fired about  
(2) two rounds at suspect #1 in a S/B direction. At that time, suspect #2 ran from the area of the  
24 W/side of the alley S/of Ofcr. Blum's location towards Ofcr. Blum in a N/E direction. Suspect #2  
ran past Ofcr. Blum to his left. Suspect #2 ran past Ofcr. Blum's left side on the E/side of the  
26 alleyway. Ofcr. Blum did not get a good look at suspect #2 because his attention was focused  
on suspect #1.

28



At about the same time, suspect #1 began running S/B in the alleyway. Ofcr. Blum began running after suspect #1 in a S/B direction. At that time, Ofcr. Blum heard one shot fired from behind him on his left side. Ofcr. Blum believes that the shot was fired by suspect #2.

Ofcr. Blum continued running S/B and fired about (2) two more rounds at suspect #1 who was still running in a S/B direction. Ofcr. Blum stated that he fired again because he still considered suspect #1 a threat to him or anyone who might be in the area and the suspect was still armed. Ofcr. Blum stated that he tried to fire again at suspect #1, but thought there was a malfunction with his gun. Ofcr. Blum is not certain that his weapon malfunctioned, but stated that something about his gun didn't feel right. Ofcr. Blum is unsure whether or not his gun actually fired at this point during the incident.

Ofcr. Blum stated that he then turned around and ran N/B towards his vehicle trying to clear his weapon by racking the slide as he ran.

Ofcr. Blum stated that when he got back to his vehicle, he remembers racking his gun to clear a round. He remembers pulling the magazine out and racking his gun again to clear it and completely empty it. Ofcr. Blum said that he then put a fresh magazine in his gun and racked in a round. Ofcr. Blum placed the partially used magazine in his magazine pouch. Ofcr. Blum said that it is possible that he didn't have all of his magazines completely filled with bullets because he had qualified at the gun range a couple of days prior to the incident and may not have fully reloaded them.

Ofcr. Blum stated that during the incident the headlights to his vehicle were turned on.

Ofcr. Blum stated that he had his flashlight with him during the incident, but he didn't turn it on. After the incident, Ofcr. Blum placed his flashlight back in the flashlight charger in his vehicle.

Ofcr. Blum stated that every shot he fired was directed at suspect #1 in a S/B direction. Ofcr. Blum pointed out some trees and a trash dumpster in the alleyway in the area behind 921 S. Merrill where he believed his bullets would have gone when fired. (This is consistent with the area where the bullet hole was located in the fence behind 921 S. Merrill.)

Ofcr. Blum last saw suspect #1 running S/B about halfway up the alleyway, before losing sight of him, apparently when he believed his gun had malfunctioned. Ofcr. Blum never saw suspect #2 again after he ran past Ofcr. Blum in a N/B direction.

Ofcr. Blum stated that the entire incident happened very quickly. He estimated that from the time he got out of his vehicle until the time ran back to his vehicle after the shooting was only about 15 to 30 seconds.

Myself and Ofcr. Blum then walked the scene again concentrating on the areas of the scene where he believed he or the suspects were located at various stages of the incident. Ofcr. Blum did not recall the exact locations, but showed me a range of the area where he believed the locations to be. I marked the areas on the asphalt so I could take approximate N/S measurements of where the parties were throughout the incident in order to determine distances between Ofcr. Blum and the suspects.

Ofcr. Blum pointed out to me the area where he was located when suspect #1 fired a round at him, which was the same area where Ofcr. Blum was located when he returned fire at the suspect the first time. Ofcr. Blum pointed out to me the area where suspect #1 was when he fired at Ofcr. Blum.

Ofcr. Blum pointed out to me the general area where he first noticed suspect #2 to be running from. This was in the general area of about 70' S/of the S/curbline of Ninth Street. Ofcr. Blum pointed out to me the area where he was located when suspect #2 fired a round at him.

2 Ofcr. Blum pointed out to me the area where he was located when he fired at suspect #1 the  
second time.

4  
Ofcr. Blum then left the area.

6  
I then measured the distances in the alleyway with a cloth measuring tape. I later completed the  
8 attached diagram showing the relative distances.

10 While it was still dark, I saw the locations of the lighting in the area. There was a lit street light  
on the N/side of the 400 block of W. Ninth Street that was east of the alleyway. There was a lit  
12 light on the N/side of the detached garage of 915 S. Merrill that was near the alleyway. There  
were two lit lights on the west side and one lit light on the north side of the two story apartment  
14 building located at 910 S. Sheridan on the alleyway. There were also several lit lights on the  
south side of that building.

16  
According to the measurements I took:

- 18 1. Suspect #1 fired one round at Ofcr. Blum from a distance of about 25.5' to 61.5'.  
2. Ofcr. Blum fired about two rounds at suspect #1 from about the same distance.  
20 3. I could not determine how far suspect #2 was from Ofcr. Blum when the suspect fired at him.  
4. I could not determine how far Ofcr. Blum was from suspect #1 when he fired about two  
22 rounds at the suspect for the second time.

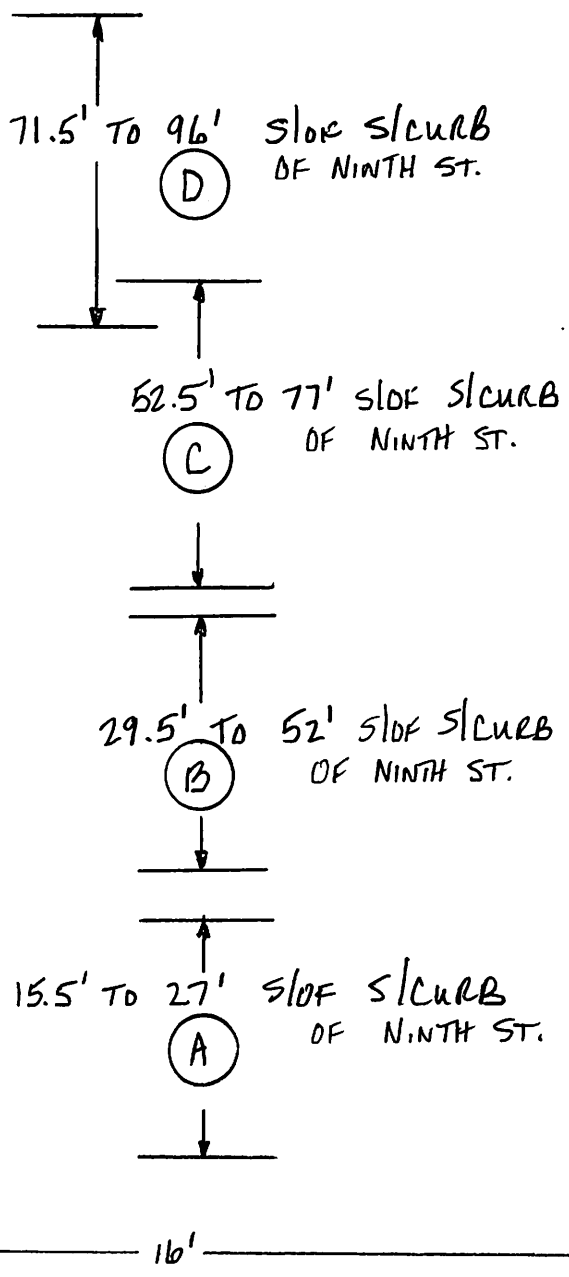

**DETAILS**

On 3/14/99 at approx. 0500 hrs. I was contacted and requested to respond to the area of Ninth and Sheridan regarding assisting Det. Scott MUSGRAVES in the criminal investigation of an officer involved shooting. DET. MUSGRAVES and I were primarily responsible for processing the crime scene with the assistance of the ID technicians MORALES and VEDUGO.

The neighborhood was canvassed for witnesses by members of the officer involved shooting team. See their reports for statements given by subjects who resided near the scene of the incident.

While at the scene, Det. MUSGRAVES and I were contacted by OFFICER SERRATO (CPD), who advised that he had information that a police scanner was found in the backyard of [REDACTED] S. Merrill St. and that the scanner is believed to be the property of [REDACTED], who is currently a parolee at large, who resides in the area at [REDACTED] Corona.

On 3/14/99 at 1230 hrs. I responded to [REDACTED] Corona at which time I spoke to a female subject who identified herself as [REDACTED]. I asked [REDACTED] where [REDACTED] was and she advised he is living in [REDACTED] California, near [REDACTED]. I asked her when was the last time she saw him and she advised approximately one month ago. I asked her about the mentioned scanner and she advised she has never seen a scanner at her residence, nor has she seen her son, [REDACTED], with the scanner in his possession.

I then asked [REDACTED] where [REDACTED] was at this time and she advised that he was with her sister, [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Corona.

I then asked [REDACTED] if we (Det. Musgraves and I) could have consent to search her residence at which time she advised that we could. At that time I located two subjects in a south/west bedroom who were identified as [REDACTED] (dob: [REDACTED]) and [REDACTED] (dob: [REDACTED]), who both resided at [REDACTED] Corona.

[REDACTED] or any other evidence related to this incident was not found at this residence.

On 3/14/99 at 1315 hrs. I responded to [REDACTED] S. Merrill St. to get a statement from [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] at which time there was no answer at the door.

On 3/14/99 1320 hrs. while still in the area, I was contacted by [REDACTED] who identified herself as [REDACTED] cousin. [REDACTED] was with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] advised that the last time he saw his father was approximately one month ago. He also advised he found the scanner three months ago at a "junky house" in the neighborhood. [REDACTED] was crying and appeared to be reluctant about giving a statement.

It should be noted that [REDACTED] spoke to Officer DAN SERRATO earlier and gave him a complete statement without fear or apprehension. See SERRATO'S report for those statements.

On 3/14/99 at 1330 hrs. I then responded to the residence of [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED] S. Merrill St. regarding him possibly having information about the scanner. [REDACTED] advised that the mentioned scanner belonged to a subject he knows as [REDACTED]. He described [REDACTED] as being a Hispanic male, 30 years old, 5'11, 150 lbs.

clean shaven and a person who always wears baseball caps. He advised the last time he saw [REDACTED] was approximately 2 days ago between 0700-0900 hrs. riding his bike northbound through the alley way to the rear of [REDACTED] S. Merrill. He described the mountain bike as being blue in color and in a "beat up condition".

He advised he's known [REDACTED] for approximately 4-6 months from being in the neighborhood. He advised that [REDACTED] told him that [REDACTED] is his father. He advised he told him this approximately 3 months ago.

On 3/14/99 at 1415 hrs. I responded back to [REDACTED] S. Merrill St. where I made contact with [REDACTED]. I requested consent to search her residence for [REDACTED] since the scanner was found in his backyard and he is also a parolee with a prior gun charge. [REDACTED] gave me consent to search the residence at which time DET. MUSGRAVES and OFFICER SERRATO and I proceeded to search the residence. [REDACTED] was not found at that location nor was any other evidence related to this incident.

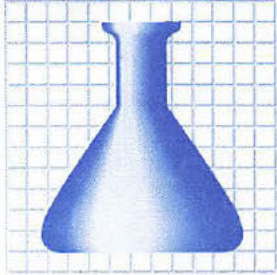

### **DETAILS**

On 3/14/99 at approx. 0438 hrs. I received a telephone call at my residence from Sgt. BRAD TOWNSEND. TOWNSEND advised me that the Corona Police Department was currently investigating an officer involved shooting involving Officer ERIC BLUM. SGT. TOWNSEND informed me that my presence was being requested at the command post.

At 0525 hrs. I arrived at the command post and contacted SGT. KELLY ANDERSON, who was assigned as my partner to work the criminal investigation section of this officer involved shooting incident.

SGT. ANDERSON conducted a briefing for myself, along with the other team members of the officer involved shooting team. Through this briefing I learned that at approx. 0326 hrs. Officer BLUM was operating a marked Corona Police Department vehicle, in full uniform. OFFICER BLUM was eastbound in the 400 block of W. Ninth St. when he spotted a subject standing along the fence line along the south sidewalk in the 400 block of W. Ninth St.

I learned that officer BLUM stopped his marked police unit along the south curb line of Ninth St. in an eastbound direction and exited the vehicle. Officer BLUM was doing this for the purpose of contacting the subject to ascertain his presence in the area.

As officer BLUM approached the subject, the subject, who's identify remained unknown, suddenly began firing some shots at Officer BLUM from a handgun. Officer BLUM drew his semi-automatic pistol in order to return gunfire. As Officer BLUM began to fire his weapon, he managed to fire 3-4 rounds before his firearm jammed.

At this time Officer BLUM then encountered a second suspect who appeared from the north/south alley way, south of Ninth Street and began firing at Officer BLUM also.

Immediately after the second volley of rounds stopped, which were fired at Officer BLUM, both suspects fled the scene on foot. One suspect ran northbound through the alley way, while the other suspect ran southbound through the alley way.

After the briefing, I observed the crime scene from a distance of approximately ½ block

In doing so, I noted that Officer BLUM'S vehicle was parked in an east bound direction, along the south curb line in the 400 block of W. Ninth St. I noticed that both the passenger front door and the drivers side door of the vehicle was standing open and that the parking lights were on.

After viewing the scene where the shooting took place, Sgt. ANDERSON and myself returned to the Corona Police Department in order to contact OFFICER BLUM and continue with our portion of the follow up investigation.

At approx. 0800 hrs. on 3/14/99, Sgt. ANDERSON and I contacted Officer BLUM who was being represented by legal defense attorney, COREY GLAVE. In speaking with OFFICER BLUM, I informed him that it was the policy of the Corona Police Department any time an officer is involved in an on-duty shooting, that he be relieved of his service weapon for an examination that was to be conducted by the Department of Justice.

I also informed Officer BLUM that within the department policy, we would be issuing him a loner weapon for him to use until such time that we returned his weapon to him.

Officer BLUM first handed me his weapon that was in his holster, and upon examining

the weapon, I noticed that he was carrying a Sig Sauer 9mm Luger pistol, Serial #U578546. I asked Officer BLUM how many rounds of ammunition he customarily carried in his ammo clip and in his weapon when going on duty and he informed me that he routinely carried 16 rounds, 15 of them in the ammo clip and one round in the chamber.

After receiving the firearm from Officer BLUM, I removed one clip from the weapon itself. I then slid the action back and ejected one live Winchester 9mm Luger round from the firing chamber. I then removed 10 factory Winchester 9mm Luger rounds from the clip. After the inspection of the rounds from the clip and the live round ejected from the weapon, I placed the pistol into an evidence envelope and sealed it. I also enclosed in an envelope the 11 total rounds removed from the clip and pistol.

After sealing both envelopes, I directed my attention to the second ammo clip that Officer BLUM had given me. Officer BLUM related that the second clip was originally in his firearm when he went on-duty on 3/13/99. According to Officer BLUM, during his course of fire, he ejected the clip he originally had in his weapon and replaced it with another clip containing 15 rounds of live ammunition. Upon examining the second clip, I discovered that there were 9 live Winchester 9mm Luger rounds in the clip.

The third ammunition clip that was handed over to me from Officer BLUM was a 10 round ammunition clip with only 9 factory Winchester 9mm Luger rounds contained inside. When I brought this fact to Officer BLUM'S attention, he related that he had just recently qualified at the range, and after qualifying may of only loaded 9 rounds back into his third clip and not the standard 10 that he normally carries. Officer BLUM told me that he was not aware of this oversight until I brought it to his attention.

Officer BLUM told me that he was sure that he only changed his clip one time during the exchange of gun fire with the two suspects.

After receiving Officer BLUM'S weapon, I issued him a loner weapon, which was a Glock 9mm semi-automatic handgun, Serial #ZM690. I also issued him two ammunition clips.

On 3/17/99 at approx. 0800 hrs. I transported the listed evidence to the Department Of Justice Forensic Services and left the evidence in the care of custody of Criminalist JIM HALL.

*I, the undersigned, if called as a witness, would testify that I: (1) am employed by the State of California Department of Justice, (2) conducted an examination of, and (3) formed conclusions as stated in this report. I, the undersigned, declare this information is true and correct under penalty of perjury.*

SUMMARY:

All of the submitted expended caliber 9mm Luger cartridge cases were fired by the submitted SIG SAUER pistol.

The submitted bullet (Item RM14) was possibly discharged by the submitted pistol.

EVIDENCE:

The following evidence was submitted to the Laboratory by Wenzel of the Corona Police Department on March 17, 1999:

The following evidence was submitted to the Laboratory by Kelly Anderson of the Corona Police Department on March 26, 1999:

Item RM14 One expended bullet

EXAMINATION:

The submitted pistol (Item 4) was identified as a SIG SAUER model P226 caliber 9mm Luger semi-auto pistol, S.N. U578546. Examination and test firing of this pistol showed that it was functioning properly. The pistol was test-fired with Laboratory stock caliber 9mm Luger ammunition.

Three loaded magazines (Items 1 - 3) designed for the submitted pistol were also submitted. Item 1 consisted of a 10-round capacity SIG SAUER magazine loaded with 10 rounds of unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridges. A loose unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridge was also included with this item. Item 2 consisted of a 15-round capacity MEC-GAR magazine loaded with 9 rounds of unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridges. Item 3 consisted of a 10-round capacity SIG SAUER magazine loaded with 9 rounds of unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridges. All of the unfired cartridges have the same headstamp (Winchester) and were of the same style (brass case, brass primer and copper jacketed hollow-point bullet).

Items RM2, RM3 and RM4 each consisted of an unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridge with headstamp and cartridge style similar to the other unfired cartridges. Superficial damages were found on each of these 3 unfired cartridges.

Items RM5, RM6, RM7, RM8 and RM9 were determined to be expended caliber 9mm Luger cartridge cases with Winchester headstamp. RM6 was loaded with a nickel-finished primer and each of the other cartridge cases was loaded with a brass-finished primer. RM6 was also damaged and appeared to be a reload. RM5 to RM9 were microscopically compared to the test-fired cartridge cases. They were all determined to have been discharged by the submitted SIG SAUER pistol.

Item RM10 was determined to be an expended caliber .40 S&W cartridge case. It was not discharged by the submitted pistol. The impression on the cartridge case was entered into the NIBIN (formerly DRUGFIRE) database and the current database was searched. No linked cases were identified.

RM14 was determined to be a damaged .38 caliber jacketed hollow-point bullet, possibly 9mm Luger. It was microscopically compared to the bullets test-fired from the submitted SIG SAUER pistol. RM14 was possibly fired by the submitted pistol. A more definitive conclusion could not be reached due to the damages on this bullet, the lack of sufficient amounts of striations (individual characteristics) and the absence of sufficient agreement of the available striations on this bullet with the striations on the test-fired bullets.

DISPOSITION:

All items will be retained in the Laboratory pending return to the submitting agency. The test-fired bullets and cartridge cases will be retained in the Laboratory.

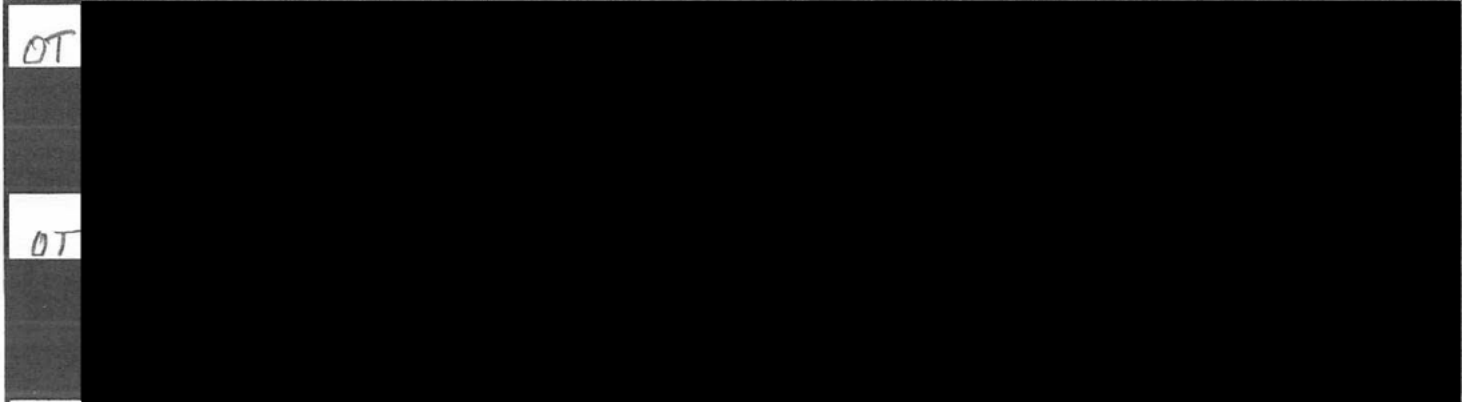

On 3-22-99 at 1603 hours, I went to the 400 block of W. tenth St. to assist Det. R. Anderson with evidence collection. I collected one yellow and grey metal projectile found on the south side of the street east of the alleyway listed as item #RM14.

I, the undersigned, declare this information is true and correct under penalty of perjury.*

All of the submitted expended caliber 9mm Luger cartridge cases were fired by the submitted SIG SAUER pistol.

The submitted bullet (Item RM14) was possibly discharged by the submitted pistol.

EXAMINATION:

The submitted pistol (Item 4) was identified as a SIG SAUER model P226 caliber 9mm Luger semi-auto pistol, S.N. U578546. Examination and test firing of this pistol showed that it was functioning properly. The pistol was test-fired with Laboratory stock caliber 9mm Luger ammunition.

Three loaded magazines (Items 1 - 3) designed for the submitted pistol were also submitted. Item 1 consisted of a 10-round capacity SIG SAUER magazine loaded with 10 rounds of unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridges. A loose unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridge was also included with this item. Item 2 consisted of a 15-round capacity MEC-GAR magazine loaded with 9 rounds of unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridges. Item 3 consisted of a 10-round capacity SIG SAUER magazine loaded with 9 rounds of unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridges. All of the unfired cartridges have the same headstamp (Winchester) and were of the same style (brass case, brass primer and copper jacketed hollow-point bullet).

Items RM2, RM3 and RM4 each consisted of an unfired caliber 9mm Luger cartridge with headstamp and cartridge style similar to the other unfired cartridges. Superficial damages were found on each of these 3 unfired cartridges.


Items RM5, RM6, RM7, RM8 and RM9 were determined to be expended caliber 9mm Luger cartridge cases with Winchester headstamp. RM6 was loaded with a nickel-finished primer and each of the other cartridge cases was loaded with a brass-finished primer. RM6 was also damaged and appeared to be a reload. RM5 to RM9 were microscopically compared to the test-fired cartridge cases. They were all determined to have been discharged by the submitted SIG SAUER pistol.

Item RM10 was determined to be an expended caliber .40 S&W cartridge case. It was not discharged by the submitted pistol. The impression on the cartridge case was entered into the NIBIN (formerly DRUGFIRE) database and the current database was searched. No linked cases were identified.


RM14 was determined to be a damaged .38 caliber jacketed hollow-point bullet, possibly 9mm Luger. It was microscopically compared to the bullets test-fired from the submitted SIG SAUER pistol. RM14 was possibly fired by the submitted pistol. A more definitive conclusion could not be reached due to the damages on this bullet, the lack of sufficient amounts of striations (individual characteristics) and the absence of sufficient agreement of the available striations on this bullet with the striations on the test-fired bullets.


DISPOSITION:

All items will be retained in the Laboratory pending return to the submitting agency. The test-fired bullets and cartridge cases will be retained in the Laboratory.

## Administrative Investigation Report

**Officer:** Erik Blum #11467

**Summary:** On March 14, 1999, at about 0326 hours, Officer Erik Blum was driving a marked Corona Police unit southbound in the 800 block of South Merrill Street. As he approached the intersection of South Merrill and West Ninth Street he observed suspect #1 walking along the south side of West Ninth Street (400 block). Officer Blum described suspect #1 as a Latin male adult approximately 22 to 26 years of age, 5'6" to 6" tall, 150 to 180 lbs., short dark hair. The suspect was wearing dark colored baggy pants, possibly dark blue or black, a light colored short sleeve collared shirt with buttons all the way up the front. Under that he was wearing a long sleeved dark colored shirt. Officer Blum described the clothing as that which is consistent with what local gang members might wear.

At the intersection Officer Blum turned and proceeded eastbound on West Ninth Street. He parked his patrol unit and exited to make a consensual contact with the suspect. As Officer Blum exited his unit, suspect #1 continued walking eastbound on the sidewalk and upon reaching the north / south alley between Ninth and Tenth Streets, and Merrill and Sheridan Streets, he began walking southbound through the alley. As Officer Blum walked up to the entrance of the alley, suspect #1 was approximately 15 to 20 feet ahead of him. As Officer Blum walked approximately 8 feet into the alley, he stated to suspect #1, "hey, stop I want to talk to you ". Suspect #1 suddenly looked over his right shoulder and Officer Blum observed a muzzle flash but heard no gun shot. Officer Blum drew his duty weapon and fired two rounds back at the suspect. As Officer Blum fired at suspect #1, from the westside of the alley next to a chainlink fence approximately 10 feet ahead of him, a male suspect (suspect #2 ) ran in front of him, northbound in the alley towards West Ninth Street. Officer Blum did not chase suspect #2 because he was focusing his attention on suspect #1 who had fired at him. He suddenly heard a gun shot from the rear of his position, he was not sure who fired the weapon behind him. Officer Blum ran approximately 60 feet southbound through the alley and fired his weapon again at suspect #1. He advised his gun jammed on him in the alley so he cleared his weapon allowing a live round to eject, he then ran back to his unit where he cleared his weapon at least three additional times. Officer Blum waited at this location for assisting Officers as he picked up one of his clips, which he had ejected from his weapon. As Officer Blum stood by his unit waiting for assisting personnel he fired no further shots. Officer Blum advised he had fired his weapon at suspect #1 as he was in fear for his life and the public safety.

Assisting personnel from the Officer Involved Shooting Team (OIS Team ) located independent witnesses in the area who advised they had heard two different loud banging sounds from a gun, which would indicate two weapons were fired. Some of the shots heard were louder than the others. OIS personnel also located a forty caliber expended round casing at the scene of the shooting to the rear side of Officer Blum's location where he fired at suspect #1. It appears at this time, the forty caliber expended round was probably from suspect #2's weapon.
