Summary:
 Unknown suspect walked up to the register and handed the victim two dollars to pay for an item. While the cashier is getting the suspect's change from the register, the suspect points a handgun at the cashier and demands the money from the register. The victim, fearing the suspect would shoot him if he didn't comply, handed the suspect money from the register. The suspect took the money from the cashier and ran out of the store. The victim grabbed his handgun and ran after the suspect in an attempt to obtain his license plate number and direction of travel. Once outside the store, the suspect notices that the victim is following him and points a gun at the victim. The victim hears what he thinks is gun shots and believed the suspect was shooting at him. The victim shot an unknown amount of rounds at the suspect and then ran back to his store to press the "Hold up button". The suspect fled the location in a charcoal gray colored Pontiac (Cal plate 5VMC666).

14 Scene:

15 The incident occurred at "Country Store Liquor" located at 1818 W. Sixth St.,
16 Corona. The store is located on the southeast corner of W. Sixth St. and Paseo
17 Grande. The "Country Store Liquor" is in a commercial building that is divided
18 into three separate businesses. There is only one entry and exit to the store
19 which faces west. The "Country Store Liquor" is located on the north end of the
20 building, a nail shop is located in the middle of the building, and a donut shop is
21 located on the south end of the building. The front door of the "Country Store
22 Liquor" faces west towards Paseo Grande. There is a parking lot to the rear and
23 to the south side of the "Country Store Liquor".

1 **Details:**

2
3 On Friday, June 8, 2007, at approximately 1113 hours, I was dispatched to the
4 area of W. Sixth St. and Paseo Grande, Corona, regarding shots heard. As I
5 responded to the location, dispatch advised that the "Country Store Liquor",
6 located at 1818 W. Sixth St., had just been robbed.

7
8 I heard Officer Mendenhall, via the radio, advising dispatch that he was in the
9 area. Officer Mendenhall relayed information stating that witnesses were
10 reporting a shooting that occurred in the parking lot of 1760 W. Sixth St. (Refer to
11 Officer Mendenhall's supplemental report).

12
13 I arrived on scene and parked my unit on the south side of the 1818 W. Sixth St.
14 building. I told dispatch to call the liquor store (Country Store Liquor) and have
15 the reporting party step outside the store. (VM01) [REDACTED] walked outside
16 the store and told me he was just robbed.

17
18 I told [REDACTED] to describe the suspect and also told him to give me the suspect's
19 last direction of travel. [REDACTED] told me the following:

20
21 The suspect was a white male adult, late 30's to early 40's, about 6'2 in height,
22 weighed about 240 lbs, and was wearing a blue button down shirt. The suspect
23 was last seen getting into a vehicle, California plate 5VMC666, possibly a blue
24 Dodge Neon. [REDACTED] was unable to give me the vehicle's last direction of travel.

25
26 I relayed the suspect information to dispatch, via the radio, and continued to get
27 a detailed statement from [REDACTED]. The following is what [REDACTED] told me:

28
29 On today's date, 06-08-07, at approximately 1109 hours, [REDACTED] was working at
30 the liquor store [REDACTED] was standing behind the cash register when an unknown
31 male suspect walked up to the register and placed an unknown type of drink on
32 the counter. The male suspect handed [REDACTED] two dollars for the drink, and
33 while [REDACTED] was getting the suspect's change from the cash register, the male
34 suspect, using his right hand, grabbed a gun from his waistband and pointed it at
35 [REDACTED]. The male suspect told [REDACTED], "Give me the money". [REDACTED] fearing
36 the suspect would shoot him if he didn't give him the money, complied with his
37 demands. As [REDACTED] handed the suspect the money from the register, the
38 suspect said "Give me all of it". The suspect then placed the gun back in his front
39 waistband and took the money.

40
41 [REDACTED] described the gun as a black semi-automatic handgun with a lot of black
42 plastic on it. [REDACTED] said it appeared like a real gun to him.

43
44 The male suspect began walking towards the front door, and as he approached
45 the front door, the suspect looked towards [REDACTED] and said something. [REDACTED]

1 didn't hear what the suspect said so he stared at the suspect. [REDACTED] then heard
2 the suspect tell him to sit down. [REDACTED] said "OK" and began walking backwards
3 away from where the suspect was standing. [REDACTED] kept visual of the suspect as
4 he walked backwards and saw the suspect run out the front door.

5
6 [REDACTED] grabbed his gun, 40 caliber Beretta, from under the cash register counter
7 and ran after the suspect. [REDACTED] said he saw the suspect start to run
8 southbound from the front door of the store. [REDACTED] followed the suspect, with
9 his gun in his hand, in an attempt to obtain a license plate number and direction
10 of travel.

11
12 [REDACTED] saw the male run eastbound from the southwest corner of the building.
13 [REDACTED] lost visual of the suspect for a few seconds, and when [REDACTED] turned the
14 corner of the building, he saw the suspect running in a southeast direction
15 through the parking lot located at 1760 W. Sixth St.

16
17 [REDACTED] saw the suspect get near a truck in the parking lot (unknown make,
18 model, color) and [REDACTED] thought it was the suspect's vehicle. [REDACTED] was
19 standing about 30 feet away from the suspect and was attempting to obtain the
20 license plate from the truck. As [REDACTED] continued to obtain the information from
21 the truck, the male suspect turned around and saw [REDACTED] following him. The
22 male suspect turned around, faced [REDACTED], and started to walk backwards in a
23 southeast direction while pointing a handgun at him.

24
25 [REDACTED] heard what he thought was a gun shot and thought the suspect was
26 shooting at him. The suspect was standing about 50 feet away from [REDACTED] in a
27 southeast direction. [REDACTED] fearing for his safety shot towards the suspect's
28 direction. He is unsure how many rounds he fired. [REDACTED] was aiming over the
29 suspect's head and wasn't trying to shoot him. [REDACTED] wanted to scare the
30 suspect because he thought he was being shot at.

31
32 [REDACTED] saw the suspect hide behind some bushes in front of a building located
33 at 1750 W. Sixth St. The building is located to the rear of [REDACTED] business.
34 [REDACTED] stopped shooting at the suspect and then saw the suspect walk out of
35 the bushes. The suspect started to walk towards [REDACTED] direction, so [REDACTED]
36 ran back to his store fearing the suspect was going to shoot him. Once he ran in
37 his store, he pressed the "Robbery hold up button" to dispatch police.

38
39 [REDACTED] grabbed a second gun, 38 caliber revolver that he had under the cash
40 register counter, and stood next to the front door with both guns. [REDACTED] feared
41 the suspect was going to return to the store and shoot him. As [REDACTED] stood next
42 to the front door, a Toyota salesman (WT03) [REDACTED], walked in the store
43 and told him that the suspect left in a charcoal colored Pontiac (Cal Plate
44 5VMC666). Refer of Officer D. Alvarez's supplemental report for [REDACTED]
45 statements.

1 I asked [REDACTED] if he knew the suspect and he said, "No". I asked [REDACTED] if he
2 would be able to identify the suspect and he said, "I think so". I asked [REDACTED]
3 why he followed the suspect with the gun and he said, "I wanted to get his
4 license plate so he could get caught". I asked [REDACTED] if he was scared that the
5 suspect was holding a gun and he said, "I didn't think about that". [REDACTED] said
6 this is the second time in the past few months that his store has been robbed.
7 [REDACTED] just wanted the suspect to get caught.

8
9 I asked [REDACTED] how much money he handed the suspect and he said
10 approximately \$400.

11
12 I asked [REDACTED] if his store had video surveillance cameras and he said yes.
13 [REDACTED] showed me the video footage and the following is what I saw:

14
15 At about 1109 hours (camera recorded footage time), I see what appears to be a
16 white male suspect enter the store through the front door. The male suspect was
17 wearing a light blue buttoned down checkered shirt, a light blue shirt under his
18 buttoned down shirt, light colored shorts, white shoes and was wearing a light
19 colored cap. The suspect appeared to have a pony tail and was wearing dark
20 sunglasses.

21
22 The footage shows the male walk towards the south side of the store and then
23 walk towards the southeast corner of the store. The suspect opened a
24 refrigerator door, located on the south wall of the store, and selected an item
25 from inside the refrigerator. The suspect walked back and forth, in front of the
26 refrigerator, for a few seconds. It appeared the suspect was looking to see who
27 was inside the store.

28
29 After a few minutes, the suspect walked to the front counter of the store, which is
30 located on the west side of the liquor store. The male suspect placed a bottle on
31 the front counter, next to the register, and handed some dollar bills to [REDACTED]. As
32 [REDACTED] opened the register, the male suspect, using his right hand, grabbed an
33 unknown object from the front portion of his waistband and pointed it at [REDACTED].
34 It appeared to be a black handgun.

35
36 I heard the suspect tell [REDACTED], "Give me the money". [REDACTED] began handing
37 the suspect money, and as he handed him the money, the suspect said, "Give
38 me all the money". [REDACTED] continued to hand the suspect money from the
39 counter, and as he did that, the suspect placed the handgun back in his front
40 waistband and covered it with his shirt. The suspect grabbed the money with his
41 left hand and I was able to see that the suspect had what appeared to be a small
42 tattoo on his left hand, right above his thumb. The suspect put the money in his
43 right pocket, grabbed the bottle he put on the counter, and walked north towards
44 the front door.

4 On 06-08-07 at 1113 hours I was parked behind (7-11) 1698 W Sixth St. I heard
5 five-six possible gun shots being fired in the area. As I began to call out what I
6 had heard, a subject later identified as [REDACTED] drove up to me and reported
7 gun shots in the area of Via Santiago and Paseo Grande.
8

9 I drove over from (S/B) Via Bernardo to (W/B) Via Santiago and (N/B) on Paseo
10 Grande. When I reached the parking lot area of 1760 W Sixth St along west side
11 of the parking lot (along Paseo Grande) I was flagged down by several citizens
12 who stated they had just witnessed a shooting in the parking lot.

14 Officer Castaneda, Officer Alvarez and Officer Siemer arrived at the scene to
15 assist me. We collectively discovered a robbery had just taken place at the
16 Country Store Liquor located on the N/W corner of the parking lot. Officer
17 Castaneda, Siemer and Alvarez contacted the store clerk and secured the store.
18 I placed crime scene tape around the parking lot and located three bullet casings
19 approximately 100' south of the store.

21 I secured the parking lot with the assistance of Officer Siemer and Alvarez.
22 Officer Castaneda remained at the store with the store clerk. I was able to
23 interview two witnesses while watching the parking lot.

25 The two witnesses were together when the incident occurred. They were
26 identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and were the subjects who had initially
27 report the shooting to me.

29 [REDACTED] stated she had pulled into the parking lot at 1760 W Sixth St S/E from
30 Country Store Liquor. [REDACTED] was driving while [REDACTED] was in the passenger seat.
31 [REDACTED] stated they were both making calls from their cell phones when she saw a
32 subject described as a white male wearing a baseball cap and red shirt running
33 in a S/E direction of the parking lot.

36 [REDACTED] told me she saw another subject running behind him wearing a brown shirt.
37 The subject in the brown shirt was holding a silver metal semi-automatic
38 handgun in his right hand firing the gun at the subject in the red shirt. [REDACTED] stated
39 she last saw the subject in the red shirt running toward the S/E corner of the lot.
40 [REDACTED] stated she became extremely frightened, made a u-turn and drove away
41 from the area as quickly as she could. [REDACTED] stated she did not get a "real good"
42 look at the subject and does not think she could identify either subject through a

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I asked [REDACTED] if she saw the subject wearing the red shirt holding a firearm or if he had turned around in the direction of the subject with the brown shirt. [REDACTED] said she did not notice because she had only seen a few seconds of the incident before she decided to leave the area for her safety.

I spoke with [REDACTED]. He stated he was looking down at the floor board as he was talking on the phone and heard gun shots coming from an unknown location near their vehicle. [REDACTED] told me his wife put the car into gear and sped away from the area before he knew what was happening. [REDACTED] stated he did not see anyone involved in the incident.

CPD officers later located a suspect possibly involved in this incident. There is a second scene associated with this case. For details see the attached supplemental reports.

I was relieved from the crime scene (1881 W Sixth St) by Officer Edwards at 1650 hours.

1 **DETAILS:** On 06-08-07 at approximately 1113 hours, I was dispatched to 1818

8 The first witness I spoke to was WT-04 [REDACTED]. The following is a
9 summary of the statement he gave. [REDACTED] stated he was at the Mobil Gas
10 station in the 1900 block of W. Sixth St at pump #6 getting gas. [REDACTED] stated he
11 decided to go in the Mobil Mart store so he started to walk southbound towards
12 the store. [REDACTED] stated as he was walking, he heard several shots to the east.
13 [REDACTED] stated he could not remember how many shots he heard but he heard
14 several. [REDACTED] stated after he heard the shots, he looked to the east where the
15 shots came from and he saw some one (Who he later found out was the store
16 owner) waking northbound in the parking lot carrying a silver Simi-auto hand gun
17 in his hand.

18
19 [REDACTED] stated he did not see the suspect nor did he see the shooting happen.
20 [REDACTED] stated after he heard the shooting and he saw the man with a gun, he
21 called 911. [REDACTED] stated he then watched the male walk into the Country Store
22 Liquor. [REDACTED] stated he would not be able to identify the suspect or the suspect
23 vehicle because he did not see them during the incident.

25 I then spoke to WT-05 [REDACTED] and the following is a summary of the
26 statement she gave. [REDACTED] stated she was in her vehicle when she saw the
27 incident. [REDACTED] stated she had just pulled her vehicle into the parking lot behind
28 the Country Store Liquor store from Sixth St. and she was driving southbound in
29 the empty parking lot. [REDACTED] stated as she was driving southbound, she saw a
30 white male with a pony tail (SU-01) running in a south east direction from the
31 liquor store. [REDACTED] stated SU-01 was running very fast and she did not see
32 anything in his hand.

34 [REDACTED] stated she then saw a male (Later identified as Vm-01) come running from
35 behind the building with a gun. [REDACTED] stated she then heard loud gun shots and
36 she stopped her car because she did not know what was going on. [REDACTED] stated
37 as she heard the loud gunshot, she looked over and saw VM-01 walking and
38 shooting at SU-01. [REDACTED] stated VM-01 shot several shots and SU-01 continued
39 to run towards the dentist office. [REDACTED] stated after VM-01 shot his gun, he put
40 his gun down to his side and he started to run back towards the liquor store.
41 [REDACTED] stated she did not see anything in SU-01's hand as it looked like he was
42 trying to get away from VM-01.

44 [REDACTED] stated after VM-01 ran back towards the liquor store, SU-01 started to run
45 northbound from the dentist office and he got in a dark colored vehicle which was

1 parked on the south side of the liquor store along the tree line in the parking lot.
2 ██████ stated SU-01 then drove off northbound behind the liquor store and he
3 went eastbound on Sixth St. ██████ stated she then lost sight of the suspect.
4 ██████ stated she did not see anyone else in the vehicle when SU-01 drove off.
5

6 I then asked ██████ if she could describe SU-01. ██████ stated she could and she
7 described him as a white male, 6' Foot tall, brown hair, white base ball hat,
8 mustache , pony tail, with a white shirt and plaid shorts. I then asked ██████ if
9 she could identify SU-01 if she saw him again and she stated she thought she
10 could.

12 I then spoke to WT-06 ██████. The following is a summary of the statement

14 salon just south of the liquor store (Facing southbound) in the 1800 block of W.

20 SU-01 with a gun. ██████ stated he then saw SU-01 get in a car which was
21 parked on the south side of the liquor store and he drove off. ██████ stated it
22 appeared SU-01 was just trying to get away from VM-01. ██████ stated he never
23 saw SU-01 take any aggressive action to VM-01 during the incident.

25 ██████ stated after the shooting he found out the shooter was the owner of the
26 liquor store and he thought he was just trying to get his money back. ██████
27 described SU-01 as a white male, 6 foot tall, 200 pounds, dark hat, unknown
28 color shorts and shirt and shoulder length curly hair. ██████ stated SU-01 was
29 probably in his 30's. ██████ stated SU-01 was last seen getting in a dark color
30 small vehicle. ██████ stated he would not be able to identify the suspect or
31 suspect vehicle if he saw them again.

DETAILS

On 06-08-07, at about 1113 hrs., I responded to 1818 W. Sixth St. (Country Store Liquor) to assist Officer Mendenhall on a robbery with a gun call. Upon arrival, I spoke to a witness, (WT03) [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is a car salesman for Quality Toyota, which is across the parking lot, east of 1818 W. Sixth St. 1818 W. Sixth St. has multiple businesses. Country Store Liquor is located on the north end of the building. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement.

On 06-08-07, at about 1100 hrs., [REDACTED] arrived at 1818 W. Sixth St. and parked his Ford truck in the parking lot south of 1818 W. Sixth Street, approximately 20 yards from the building. [REDACTED] entered the donut store which is located on the south end of the building.

[REDACTED] made his purchase and exited the store. [REDACTED] saw a male who he recognized as the owner of Country Store Liquor, (VM01) [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was holding a handgun and running from the south parking lot towards the Country Store Liquor (North). [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] what happened and [REDACTED] said, "be careful, he has a gun". [REDACTED] continued to run towards the liquor store. [REDACTED] walked towards his vehicle, which was located in the parking lot south of the business.

[REDACTED] saw a white male (see unknown suspect sheet for description) running north through the south parking lot. The male was holding a brown paper bag with both hands. The male ran to a charcoal gray Pontiac, which was parked in a parking stall about 15 feet south of the 1818 W. Sixth St. building. [REDACTED] asked the male what happened and the male said "nothing". The male got into the Pontiac and drove northbound towards W. Sixth St. [REDACTED] memorized the vehicle's license plate which is 5VMC666.

[REDACTED] said he can identify the male in a photo line-up. [REDACTED] said he did not see the male holding a hand gun and he did not hear gun shots when he was in the donut store. [REDACTED] saw a black duffle bag in the front passenger seat of the Pontiac. The male was the only person inside the vehicle.

At about 1821 hrs., Sgt. Roulston requested that I drive [REDACTED] to Ontario and McNeil in Corona to identify a Pontiac that matched the description and plate given by [REDACTED]. I drove [REDACTED] to the location and [REDACTED] confirmed that it was the same vehicle he had seen at the scene of the robbery. The vehicle had the same license plate number that [REDACTED] had given me in his initial statement.

6 **Details:** On 060807, I responded to assist in a robbery that
7 had just occurred at 1818 W. Sixth St., County Liquor.
8 Upon my arrival, I learned that the clerk [REDACTED] in
9 the store had run outside after the suspect had robbed him
10 to get vehicle information and during that shot at the
11 suspect. See Officer Castenada's report for details
12 reference the clerk's statement about the shooting.

13

14 The clerk explained and showed us his actions and pointed
15 out that he shot in a south/east direction at the suspect
16 and pointed out the suspect's actions and directions of
17 travel. He further pointed out where the suspect hid for a
18 moment in some bushes in the south/east corner of the
19 parking lot next to a vacant building.

20

21 The entire parking lot was secured with crime scene tape
22 and a search was started for evidence. The 1818 building
23 is located on the North West corner of the parking lot.
24 There is a building that runs east/west the entire length
25 of ^{the} parking lot on the south side. There is a planter that
26 separates the 1818 building that starts from Paseo Grande
27 into the parking lot and turns north towards Sixth Street
28 to the rear of the 1818 building. This planter separates
29 the parking lot and allows parking on either side of the
30 planter.

1 There were six .40 caliber shell casings located in the
2 parking lot just south of the east/west part of the
3 planter.

4
5 The south/east corner of the parking lot building is a
6 closed and vacant fitness center building. Attached to the
7 corner of the building is an enclosed area, enclosed by a
8 block wall. In the enclosed area is an empty pool. The
9 clerk stated that the suspect hid in some bush area that is
10 next to the block wall planter.

11
12 I checked all of the vehicles in the parking lot and did
13 not find any that were damaged. I checked the vacant
14 building in the corner that the clerk shot towards. A
15 strike mark was found on the building in the enclosed pool
16 area and one round was found on the ground in the enclosed
17 pool area. This entire area was searched for further
18 rounds but nothing was found.

19
20 In the bush area where the clerk said the suspect tried to
21 hide, there was green marks on the wall as if someone
22 stepped in the green bushes and tried to jump over the wall
23 but did not make it. There was also one branch of a small
24 bush freshly broken.

26 Id Tech Verdugo collected samples of the green markings on
27 the wall for possible comparison to the suspect's shoes.

1 During the crime scene investigation, a line up was brought
2 to me that was put together by Det. Newman. I contacted
3 [REDACTED] and read him the photo line up admonishment. He said
4 he understood and signed the form. He was shown the line
5 up and stated that none of them looked familiar and stated
6 that it would be hard because the suspect had on sunglasses
7 and a hat.

8

9 Under the counter inside the store was a Beretta 40 caliber
10 model 96 handgun silver with black grips. Next to it was a
11 Smith and Wesson Airweight 38 caliber revolver model 442-2,
12 black in color. The Beretta serial number is "BER293498"
13 and the Smith & Wesson's serial number is "DAP3232."

14

15 Inside the revolver were five unspent shell casings.
16 Inside the Beretta there was a round chambered and three
17 rounds in the magazine.

18

19 The Beretta was taken as evidence and I left a receipt with
20 [REDACTED]. Both guns are currently registered to [REDACTED]. The
21 revolver did not appear to have been fired and was left
22 with [REDACTED].

24 I made contact with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] who live in
25 the apartment attached to the top of the 1818 building.
26 [REDACTED] stated he was not home during the shooting.
27 [REDACTED] stated she was in the bathroom and said she heard
28 some noise outside but did not know what it was. She
29 looked outside and saw the police but did not know what

1 After the evidence was collected the scene was broken down.

2

3 Sr. Det. Mike Anderson had viewed the video surveillance of
4 the robbery. Based on that and the evidence found at
5 Miller's residence, it is believed that Miller committed
6 this robbery.

7

8 In reviewing recent robbery reports, Miller may have been
9 responsible for the following robberies with similar
10 suspect description, gun description, and clothing
11 similarities.

12

13 It is believed that Miller is responsible for the robberies
14 at Valero Gas (07-1981) at 1610 W. Sixth Street on 020807;
15 Sally's Beauty Supply (07-7698) at 577 N. McKinley Street
16 #110 on 060507; and at Auto Zone (07-5677) at 1014 W. Sixth
17 Street on 042507.

18

19 In the Valero Gas station the suspect is wearing a hat
20 pulled down and sunglasses. The suspect walks in gets a
21 soda from the cooler, walks to the counter, brandishes a
22 handgun and demands money from the clerk. The video
23 surveillance shows a suspect who has a similar size and
24 facial features like Miller. The victim was shown a line
25 up; however he was not able to positively identify Miller
26 as the suspect.

28 In the Sally Beauty robbery, the suspect walks in toe store
29 and takes a tube of Chapstick to the counter. When the
30 clerk opens the register, the suspect brandishes a gun and

1 sunglasses and a red pony tail, similar to the Country
2 Liquor. There is no video surveillance available for
3 Sally's Beauty. Line ups were shown by Officer Lisa
4 Larios; however no one was able to positively identify
5 Miller.

6

7 In the Auto Zone robbery, the suspect entered the store,
8 looked around and took a quart of oil to the counter. The
9 suspect had on a hat and sunglasses. He brandished a gun
10 and demanded money. When the suspect refused, he pulled
11 the hammer back and the clerk still refused believing the
12 gun was not real. The suspect then left after paying for
13 his oil. The video for this location is not available, see
14 supplemental. Miller was placed in a line up for the
15 clerk; however he was not identified as being the suspect.

16

17 It is believed that Miller is responsible for all three of
18 these listed robberies.

20 Further investigation to follow.

1 Believing Shannon's physical description matched the suspect's description, along with the
2 fact that he resided at the same address where the suspect's vehicle was rented to, I compiled a
3 photo line-up with Shannon's booking photo randomly placed in position six.
4

5 I then announced a broadcast to the officers responding to McNeil Cir that I located a male
6 subject with similar characteristics as the suspect who lived at that address. I did not advise :
7 Shannon's name over the radio.
8

9 As I was responding to the location of the robbery, 1818 W. Sixth St, to provide the photo
10 line-up to the officers at the scene, I heard Sgt Marshall advise that there was an officer involved
11 shooting at 2237 McNeil Cir. I arrived at 1818 W. Sixth St and gave the line-up to Sgt Dredla, at
12 which time I drove to McNeil Cir to provide assistance.
13

14 As I was driving to that location, Sgt Austin advised on the radio that the Special Response
15 Team (SRT) may be needed to clear the suspect's vehicle and residence. I arrived on scene and
16 changed into my SRT uniform.
17

18 While at the scene, Lt Coleman told me to organize a team to search the interior of the
19 residence at 2237 McNeil Cir in an attempt to locate any potential victims or outstanding suspects.
20 I was told that no one else was supposed to be inside the residence at this time, but it was not for
21 certain. The following officers searched the interior of the residence with me: Sgt Barron, Detective
22 R.Avila, Detective Mercado, Officer Waldon, Officer Vega, Officer D.Avila, and Officer Ribeiro. We
23 approached the residence on the Corona Police Armored Car. The armored car drove north on
24 McNeil Cir, and turned into the driveway of the residence. It was later learned that the armored car
25 had run over one of the shotgun casings lying in the street to the rear of the suspect's Chevy
26 Tahoe.

EVIDENCE: One compact disc containing witness statements

DETAILS: On 6-8-07 at approx. 1230 hours, I was called to assist in an officer involved shooting investigation which occurred in the 2200 block of McNeil Circle. I arrived and was directed by Sgt. Roulston to speak with Sgt. Austin and Cpl. Viefhaus and obtain their statements.

While at the scene I spoke with Sgt. Austin who told me the following. Sgt. Austin said at about 1100 hours, he and Sgt. Pawluczenko had left the station and were on their way to lunch when he heard dispatch put out a call of an armed robbery. The robbery occurred at Country Store Liquor which is located at 1818 West Sixth Street.

Sgt. Austin said he responded to the scene to assist in the investigation. After he arrived, one of the officers on scene told him that witnesses saw the suspect flee in a gray or silver Pontiac. The vehicle was later determined to be registered to a rental car company. While still at the scene of the robbery, Sgt. Austin heard over the police radio that the last person to rent the suspect vehicle lived at [REDACTED] in Corona. Sgt. Austin heard that Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach had responded to the address and located the suspect vehicle in the driveway of the home.

Sgt. Austin began driving towards the [REDACTED] address, but by the time he arrived in the area, the suspect vehicle had been driven from the home. Other responding officers located the vehicle and stopped it at the intersection of McNeil Cir. and Ontario Avenue. The officers on scene were in the process of having the occupants exit the vehicle when he arrived on scene. He said the occupants in the vehicle consisted of a female driver and two children. Lt. Coleman who was on scene told Sgt. Austin there appeared to be blood in the vehicle. Sgt. Austin asked the female driver if anyone was still at her home. She told him that her brother and girlfriend were still inside when she left. Sgt. Austin asked what her brother was wearing. The female said he was wearing some type of shorts and a button up shirt, which he said matched the clothing worn by the suspect in the robbery.

Sgt. Austin began driving down McNeil Cir. to locate Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach. Sgt. Austin said as he drove down the street he heard over the radio Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach say, "Shots fired". Sgt. Austin said he never heard any gun shots because his windows were up and his air conditioner was on. Sgt. Austin stopped his vehicle in front of 2237 McNeil Circle which was just south of a blue Chevrolet Tahoe. Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach both had shotguns in their hands and were standing behind the Chevrolet Tahoe. Officer Ricaud had arrived and stopped his patrol unit next to Sgt. Austin's vehicle. At that time Sgt. Austin had Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach back up to his vehicle for cover.

While standing behind cover, Sgt. Austin obtained a brief public safety statement from Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach. Both officers told him that a couple had come out of the house (2237 McNeil Circle) and entered the blue Chevrolet Tahoe. The female who was in the driver's seat was ordered out of the vehicle, which she complied. The Officers said the male subject pointed a gun at Ofc. Beach which resulted in both officers firing at least two rounds. The female driver was handcuffed and removed from the scene by Officer Ricaud.

Sgt. Austin said Officer Ricaud and Cpl. Viefhaus returned to the scene to help provide cover for the other officers. He had Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach leave the scene to prevent any further involvement. He requested the department's armored car and a ballistic shield respond to the scene. The armored car drove up to the passenger side of the vehicle and the officers inside saw that the suspect was not moving. Sgt. Austin, Cpl. Jurado and Ofc. Bourgault approached the vehicle. Ofc. Bourgault checked the suspect for a pulse and was unable to feel one. Sgt. Austin said based on the suspect's injuries and lack of having a pulse, the suspect was pronounced dead at the scene. Sgt. Austin provided no further information.

I spoke with Cpl. Viefhaus who was at the scene and told me the following. Cpl. Viefhaus responded to McNeil Cir. and Ontario Ave. to assist officers in locating a suspect from the robbery at Country ~~STORE~~ Liquor. After Cpl. Viefhaus' arrival, Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach began walking down the street to get a visual on the front of 2237 McNeil Cir. and prevent any possible suspects from leaving the residence. Between 1 to 5 minutes later, Cpl. Viefhaus heard what he thought were gunshots. He said the gunshots sounded "deeper" and believed they were fired from a shotgun. Cpl. Viefhaus ran towards the gunshots to assist. When he arrived, he saw a female lying prone in the grass median west of the Tahoe and a second subject in the backseat of the Tahoe with his feet hanging out of the door. He said Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach were standing directly behind the blue Tahoe holding shotguns. The female who was lying in the center median was handcuffed and removed from the scene. He provided no further information.

Both Officers stated they did not shoot their weapons during the incident. The Officer's weapons were not visibly checked.

11 On 060807 at about 1200 hours, I responded to the area of Ontario Ave. and
12 McNeil St. reference an officer involved shooting that occurred. Detective M.
13 Anderson said a robbery with a handgun occurred at 1818 W. Sixth St. Refer to
14 the initial report for details. Detective M. Anderson briefed me with the
15 description of the suspect involved in the robbery. He was described as a White
16 male, wearing a baseball cap with a red wig pulled back in a ponytail.

17

18 Listening to the description, I noticed it matched the description of a prior robbery
19 that occurred on 060507 at Sally's Beauty Supply (CR #07-7698). Refer to the
20 attached report for details. During the Sally's robbery, the suspect was described
21 as a White male adult, 30-40 years old, 6'03", stocky build, wearing a baseball
22 cap with a red wig pulled back in a ponytail. He was wearing a red and black
23 checkered flannel shirt and blue jeans. The suspect showed the victim a black
24 handgun in his waistband and left the business with \$189.00.

26 Due to the similarity of the handgun, red wig and baseball cap, I responded to the
27 Corona Police Department and located the robbery report (07-7689). I received
28 a photo lineup from Detective Dunnigan with the suspect involved in the robbery

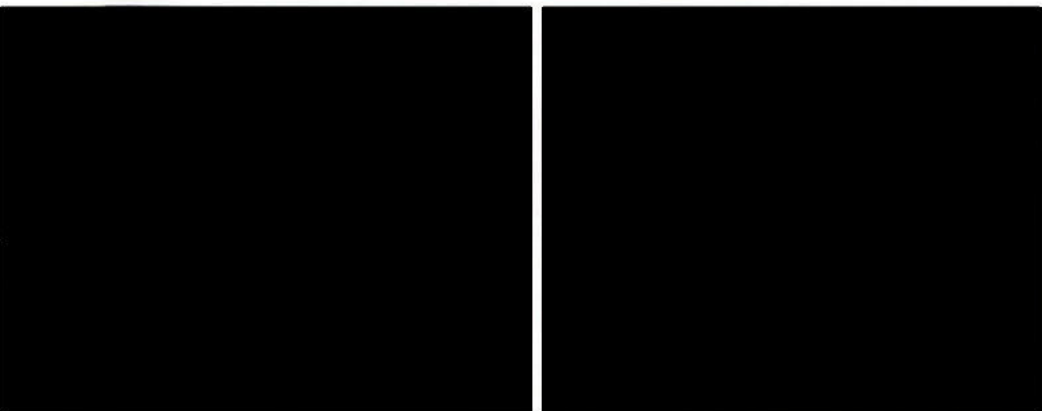
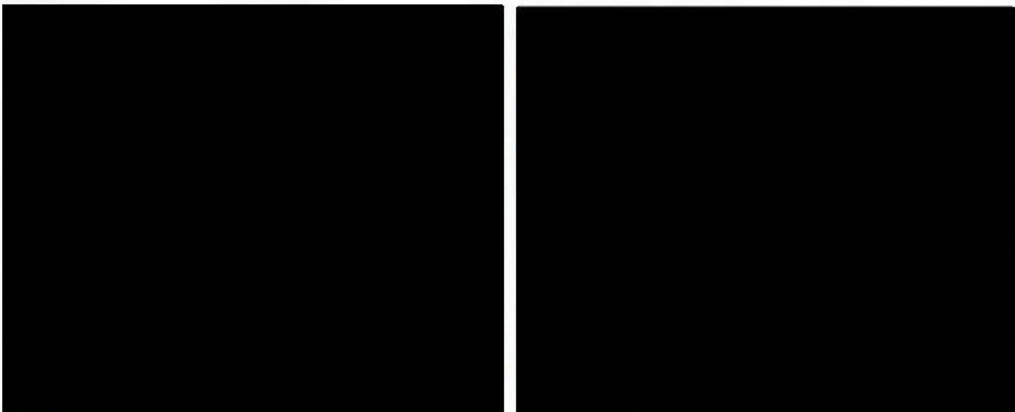
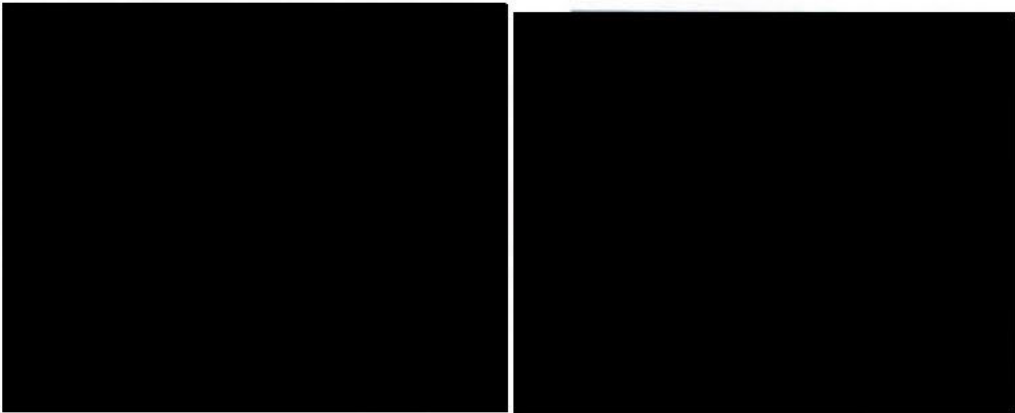

1 **EVIDENCE:** Computer disc of taped interview with (Wt-09) [REDACTED] The
2 disc was logged into evidence by me at the main station on 06-11-07 at about
3 1030 Hrs.

4
5 **ASSISTING PERSONNEL:** Det. James Avila - Corona P.D. (Interview)
6 Officer M. Alvarado - Corona P.D. (Transport)

7
8 **DETAILS:** On 06-08-07, at about 1226 Hrs., I received a call to respond to an
9 Officer Involved Shooting (O.I.S.) call out. The command post was located at
10 Ontario Blvd. and McNeil St. Upon my arrival, the team was briefed about the
11 incident, by Sr. Detective Mike Anderson.

12
13 A few witnesses needed to be interviewed, so Det. Avila and I were requested to
14 talk to a female identifying herself as [REDACTED]. She stated she was the
15 current girlfriend of the male involved named (Su-01) Shannon Miller. [REDACTED]
16 was still handcuffed when I spoke to her at the scene. She was sitting in the
17 back of a Police unit, when I contacted her. I explained to [REDACTED] we did not
18 know her involvement of the incident, so she would be taken to the station for
19 questioning there. She was visibly shaken, but cooperative of the procedure.

20
21 Officer Alvarado transported her to the station for questioning. Myself and Det.
22 Avila interviewed [REDACTED] in a private room at the Police station. Det. Avila read
23 the Miranda form and [REDACTED] agreed to tell us her side of the story. (See
24 attached Miranda form for her signature). The interview was taped in its entirety
25 and the following is a summary of her statements. (See attached disc for further
26 details).

27
28 [REDACTED] lives at [REDACTED] with her grandmother named [REDACTED]
29 [REDACTED]. She has a two year old daughter and she's been dating Shannon Miller for
30 approximately 1 month. She knew him from grade school when they were
31 approximately 13 -14 years old, but lost contact with him years many years ago.
32 She recently became reacquainted with him via a dating website on-line and
33 remembered him from years past. She owns a blue S.U.V. with her grandmother
34 and drives that on a regular basis. [REDACTED] said Shannon lives at 2237 McNeil St.,
35 Corona. Shannon's sister [REDACTED], along with her 3 year old twin girls also live at the
36 residence. [REDACTED] has recently been driving a rental vehicle (grey Pontiac).

37
38 [REDACTED] awoke at about 0600 hrs., and got herself ready for work. [REDACTED] then
39 awoke her daughter and got her ready for daycare. She left for work and
40 dropped the baby off at a private residence and went to work. She arrived at
41 work at about 0750 hrs.

1 It was a normal day at work until she received a phone call from her boyfriend
2 Shannon. Shannon told her he was "hit and needed some gauze". She wasn't
3 sure what he meant by "hit", so she asked him and he didn't explain to her what
4 happened. He just needed her to come to his house and bring him some medical
5 supplies and he sounded "like he was out of breath". [REDACTED] left work
6 immediately and drove to the C.V.S. Pharmacy, which is approximately ¼ mile
7 away, and purchased some gauze, benedine and bandages. She paid for the
8 items with her credit card and quickly went to his house on McNeil St.

9
10 On the way to there, [REDACTED] called Shannon's house and his sister [REDACTED]
11 answered the phone. She said he was at the house and waiting for her to get
12 there. [REDACTED] did not tell her anything about Shannon's injuries or what happened
13 to him.

14
15 [REDACTED] arrived at the house a few minutes later and [REDACTED] answered the door,
16 upset and crying. She told [REDACTED] Shannon was in the garage which was not
17 uncommon, because that's where he spends a lot of time. [REDACTED] located
18 Shannon in the garage and saw him lying on the "concrete" floor bleeding. She
19 looked closer and saw that it looked like he'd been shot, so she asked him what
20 happened. Shannon said, "I robbed someone and they shot me". [REDACTED] began
21 to administer first aid to the wounds. She described to us that he was shot in the
22 back of his left shoulder and the exit wound possibly came through his left bicep.
23 There was another wound that she described using herself as an example.
24 [REDACTED] pointed to the right side of her waist and a possible exit wound through
25 his right upper thigh area. I asked her what she thought when she was faced
26 with this and she said, "I thought, what am I doing with this guy".

27
28 [REDACTED] stated that she wiped the blood off Shannon and placed bandages over
29 his wounds. Shannon said to her that he needed to be taken "somewhere". He
30 did not elaborate where, so she decided to take him to the hospital, without
31 telling him. While this was taking place, [REDACTED] came into the garage and said she
32 was leaving to take the kids to school. [REDACTED] said she never saw the kids when
33 she was at the house.

34
35 Immediately after [REDACTED] left, [REDACTED] and Shannon walked out to her vehicle,
36 where she folded the back seats down, so Shannon could lie down, because he
37 was hurt. He climbed into the vehicle's back seat and lay down on his back.
38 [REDACTED] climbed into the driver's seat and turned the car on. She placed the
39 vehicle in the drive position and looked in the side mirror. At that point she saw a
40 Police Officer walking towards the car. She said to Shannon, "there's the Police
41 Shannon". She described the Officer as wearing a "Police" uniform with a
42 motorcycle helmet holding a "rifle type" gun in his hand. [REDACTED] said she saw
43 his mouth moving and "assumed" the Officer was talking to them. She
44 "assumed" he was coming to her vehicle, because Shannon just robbed someone

1 and he was shot. Simultaneously, she heard a knock on the back window and
2 "assumed" it was another Police Officer, although she did could not see that
3 person.

4
5 [REDACTED] immediately, placed the car in park position, turned it off and took the
6 keys out of the ignition. She opened the car door and got out as she was exiting
7 the vehicle, she heard Shannon say "sorry". [REDACTED] stated that as she was
8 exiting the vehicle, she looked through the back driver's side window at Shannon
9 and saw him pulling out a gun from his waist band. When she was telling us this,
10 [REDACTED] simulated with her right hand a gun coming out from her waist area.
11 [REDACTED] stated that was the first time she knew anything about a gun. She could
12 not remember which hand Shannon used to grab the gun from his waist. She
13 described the weapon as a handgun, but could not tell us what it looked like. As
14 she described this I wanted to visualize what happened, so I asked her to draw a
15 sketch of the scene and explain where everyone was positioned. (See attached
16 copy of sketch and original logged into evidence by me on 06-12-07 at 1500
17 hrs.)

18
19 [REDACTED] was told to move away from the car, towards the grass median and get
20 down. As she started running towards the median, she heard the Police say,
21 "put your hands where I can see them". Then [REDACTED] heard someone yell "gun"
22 and shots were fired seconds after that, but she couldn't remember how many
23 shots were fired. [REDACTED] reached the grass median and did as she was told. She
24 did not see if anyone was shot, because her back was facing the vehicle as she
25 was running away from it.

26
27 Almost immediately, an Officer came over to her, handcuffed and took her up
28 the street away from the vehicle. She was placed in the back of a Police vehicle.

29
30 [REDACTED] was extremely upset and crying during this interview and asked us if
31 Shannon was dead. Det. Avila asked [REDACTED] is she believed Shannon did not
32 hear the Police. She said she didn't believe there was any way Shannon could
33 not have heard what the Police were yelling. The interview concluded
34 approximately 36 minutes later and Det. Avila stayed with her until further
35 notice.

36
37 She was later released per 849(b)(1) P.C. (Insufficient grounds for arrest) after
38 reviewing her statements with the O.I.S. Team and the Riverside D.D.A. on
39 scene.

40
41 **DISPOSITION:** Refer to remainder of reports for further details involving
42 O.I.S. incident.

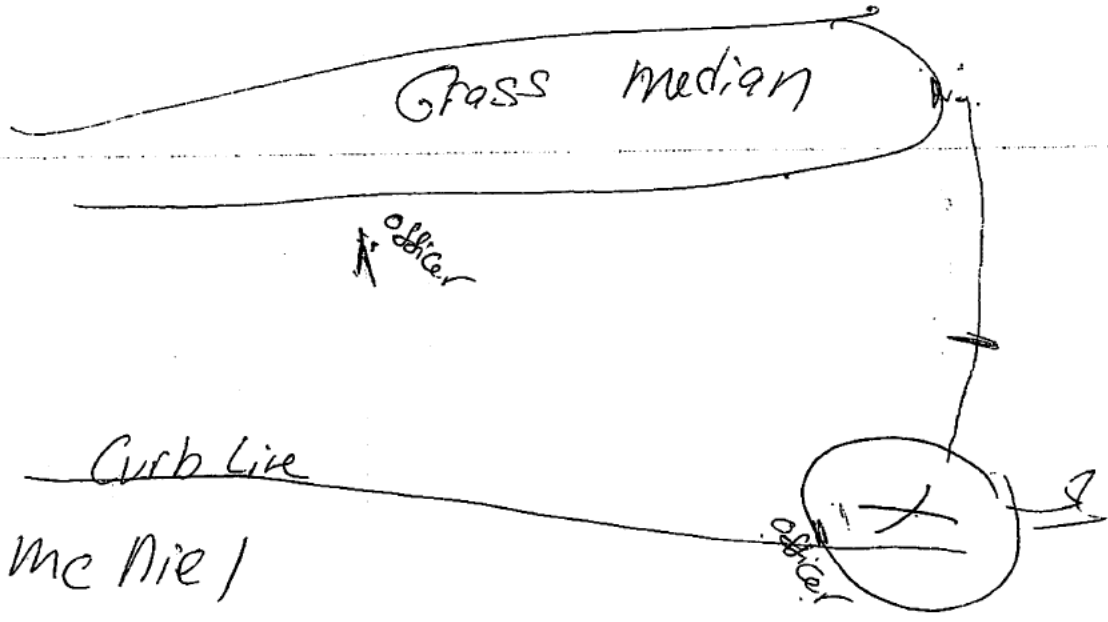

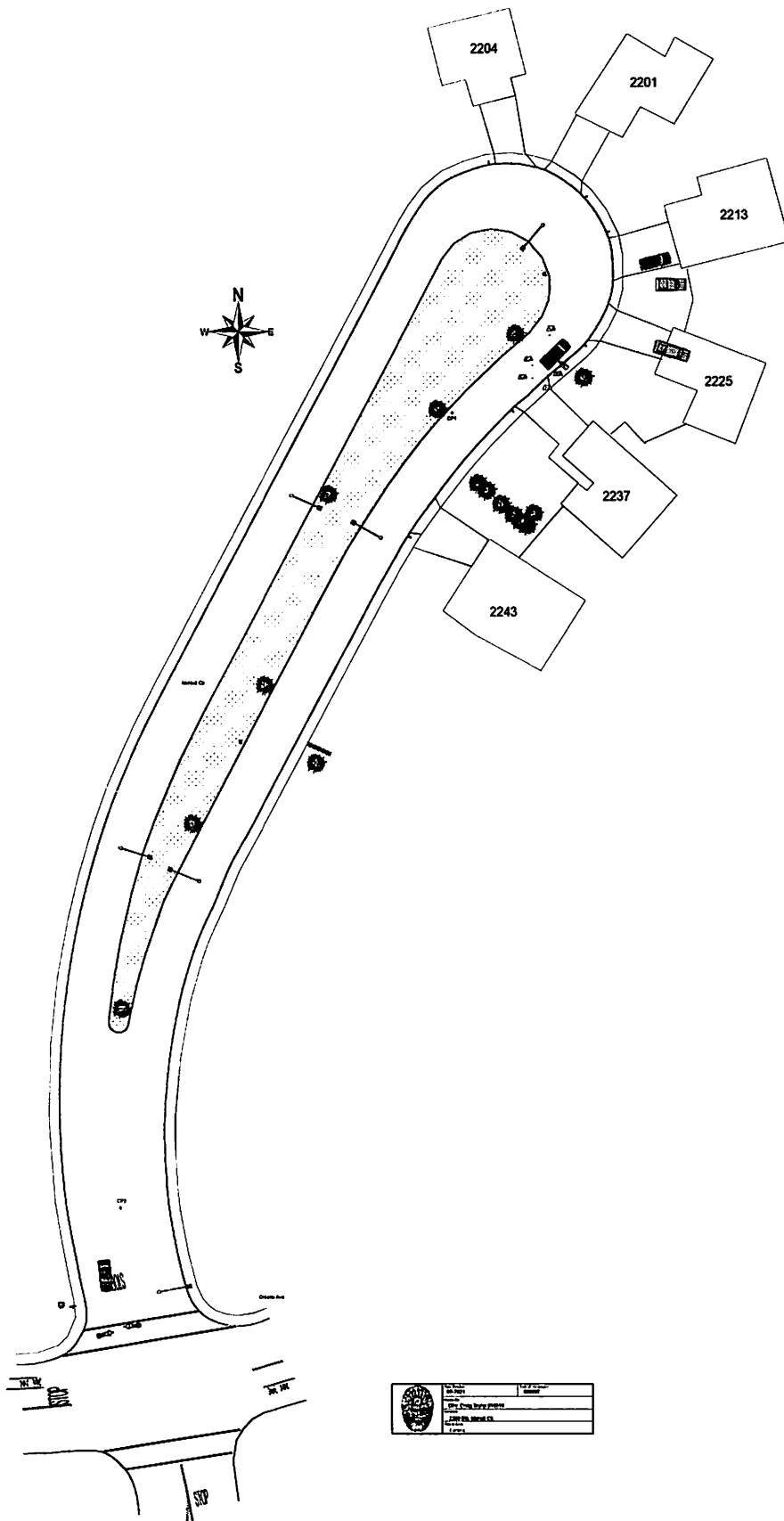

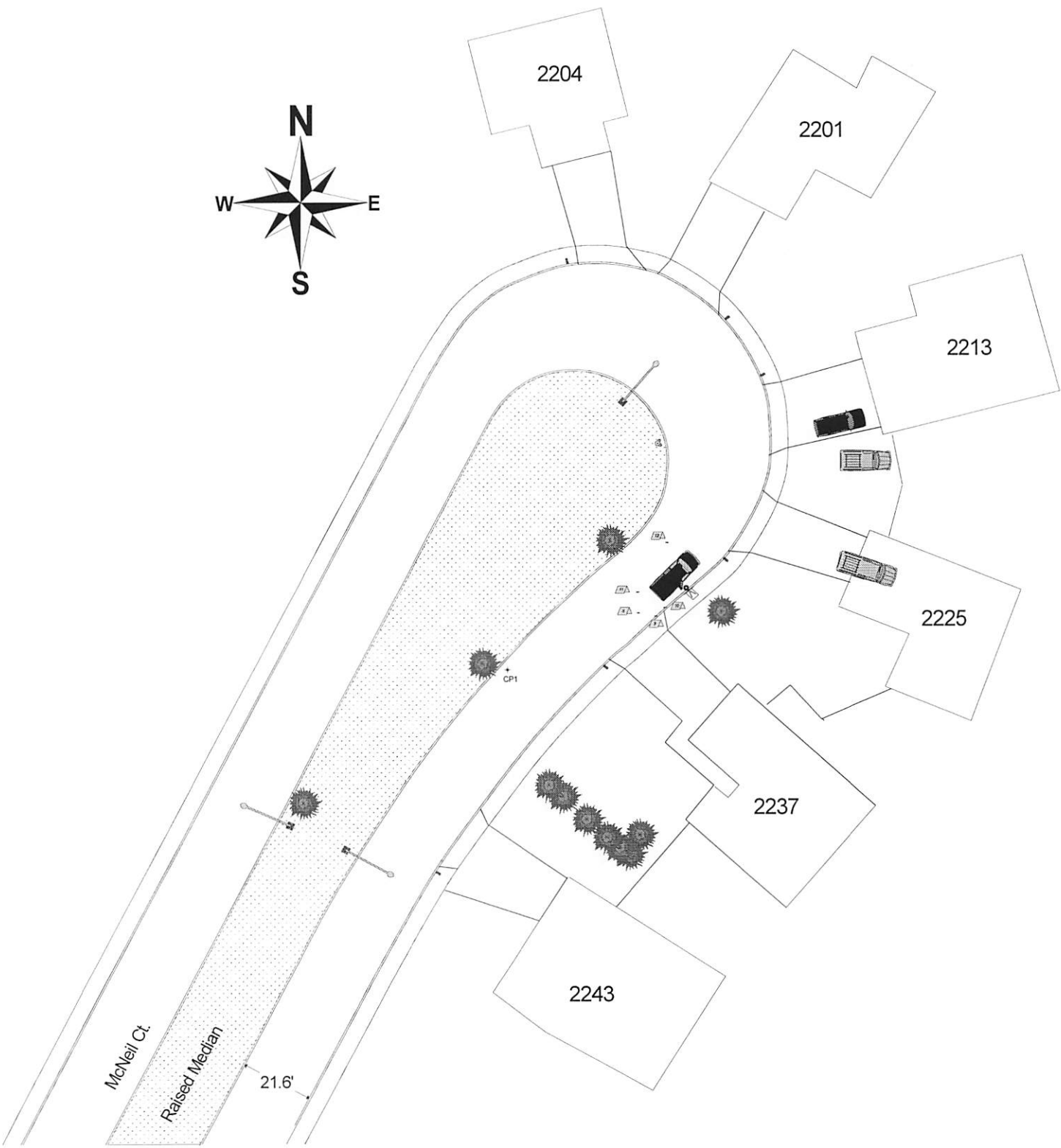

5 On 06-08-07 at approx. 1215 hours, Detective R. Avila and I responded to the
6 area of 2237 McNeil Cir. Corona, reference an officer requesting emergency
7 assistance. While responding to the scene I could hear officers broadcasting that
8 shots were fired and one person was down and not moving.

9
10 Upon arrival, I met with Lt. K. Anderson, Sgt. Marshall, and Ofcr. Beach, as I
11 walked down (mid block) towards the residence located at 2237 McNeil Cir. Lt.
12 Anderson told me Sgt. Marshall and Ofcr. Beach was involved in the shooting.

13
14 Both Sgt. Marshall and Ofcr. Beach had department issued shotguns in their
15 hands. They both told me they each fired their shotgun. First, I took possession
16 of Ofcr. Beach's shotgun and noticed the slide handle pulled back and the
17 ejection port/ chamber open. The chamber contained one live shotgun slug
18 round in the chamber. For safety purposes, I removed the live slug round from
19 the chamber.

20
21 Sgt. Marshall told me he was involved in the shooting. Sgt. Marshall stated he
22 shot his shotgun. At this time, I told Sgt. Marshall to put the shotgun on safe. I
23 also took possession of Sgt. Marshall's shotgun. I walked Ofcr. Beach and Sgt.
24 Marshall to the staging area (Ontario & McNeil Cir.).

25
26 When I arrived at the staging area (coroner of Ontario & McNeil Cir) I met with
27 Sr. Detective M. Anderson who was standing by his assigned unit. I told Det.
28 Anderson that Sgt. Marshall and Ofcr. Beach were the officers involved in the
29 shooting. I asked Det. Anderson if I could secure the shotguns in his unit. Det.
30 Anderson opened the trunk of the car at which time I secured Sgt. Marshall's
31 shotgun in the trunk. I opened the back driver's side door and secured Ofcr.
32 Beach's shotgun (slug round included) on the back seat of Det. Anderson's
33 assigned unit. After the shotguns were secured in the unit, Det. Anderson locked
34 his vehicle using his keyless remote / alarm system.

35
36 After the weapons were secured Sgt. Marshall and Ofcr. Beach was released to
37 Det. Anderson.

38
39 I returned to the residence and assisted SRT members with clearing the location
40 at 2237 McNeil Cir. Corona.

EVIDENCE:

Recorded statements from witnesses and others from the scene.

DETAILS:

On 06-08-07 at approximately 1215 hours Corporal Jurado and I, who are assigned to the Corona Police Department FLEX Team, were working a two man unit in an unmarked gray Corona Police Department vehicle (79151) responded to a shots fired call in which Corona Police Officers requested an 11-11 (Emergency code 3 response) in the area of 2200 McNeil Circle in Corona.

We arrived on scene and noticed that Sgt. Austin was pointing his gun at a blue Chevy Tahoe, which he was directly behind. Sgt. Austin was standing behind the door of a white Ford explorer with a California plate of 5ASU959. Sgt. Austin, Corporal Jurado and I walked up to the blue Chevy Tahoe to check on the status of a suspect that was lying on his back in the back seat. The rear passenger door was open and the suspect had his right leg hanging out, with no movement seen. Sergeant Austin, Corporal Jurado and I approached the vehicle and observed the suspect lying on his back with a large hole in the right side of his neck.

At 1245 hours, Sergeant Austin asked me to check for a pulse on the suspect. I walked around to the driver side of the vehicle and opened the rear passenger door. I reached in over the suspect and grabbed his right arm. I was cautious for any evidence that could be in or around the vehicle and made sure not to touch or move anything besides the suspect's right arm. I began checking for a pulse and was unable to locate one. Due to the gun shot to the neck and no pulse located, I determined the suspect was deceased. We returned back to the Ford explorer and waited for the SRT team to clear the residence. After the area was cleared, Sergeant Barron instructed me to contact residence in the area to attempt to locate witnesses.

I responded to [REDACTED] McNeil Circle and contacted (OT03) [REDACTED], the following is a summary of her statements. [REDACTED] stated she was in the shower when she heard a loud crashing sound. [REDACTED] stated she got out of the shower and saw police officers in the street. [REDACTED] stated she didn't see or hear anything, she said she had seen the Chevy Tahoe yesterday for the first time. [REDACTED] had no further details on the incident.

I then responded to [REDACTED] McNeil Circle and contacted (WT16) [REDACTED], the following is a summary of his statements. [REDACTED] stated he was walking in front of his open front door to go into the kitchen. [REDACTED] stated he keeps the front door open for fresh air and he heard someone yelling "He's got a gun." [REDACTED] stated he walked over to the front door and stood approximately 1' outside the threshold. [REDACTED] stated he then heard gun shots and that was it. From [REDACTED] front door to the scene is approx. 150' and he was unable to see anything. [REDACTED] had no further details on the incident.

I next spoke with [REDACTED] wife, (OT04) [REDACTED] who was also at the location when the incident occurred. [REDACTED] stated she was sitting outside on the front porch in a chair. She could see a motorcycle police officer driving up and down the street. [REDACTED] had a very limited view due to there are some hedges surrounding the front patio area. [REDACTED] stated she then heard someone yelling "[REDACTED] get out of the car." [REDACTED] stated she stood up and could see two police officers approaching a blue Chevy Tahoe that was parked in the street. [REDACTED] stated there was no doubt that the two men were police officers and she went inside the residence to get her husband. When she got into the residence, she heard two gun shots. [REDACTED] stated her husband was near the front door and he went to check on what was going on outside as she took the two small children into the rear of the residence. [REDACTED] stated she did not see the shooting and had no further details on the incident.

I then responded to [REDACTED] McNeil Circle where I knocked several times. I also had dispatch call the residence, but nobody was home.

I then responded to [REDACTED] McNeil Circle and contacted (OT05) [REDACTED] the following is a summary of her statements. [REDACTED] stated she was doing some painting in her kitchen when she heard a popping sound like fire crackers. [REDACTED] stated she figured the next door neighbor kids were setting off fire crackers and she walked over to the front glass doors, which is approx. 175' from where the Chevy Tahoe was parked in the street. [REDACTED] stated she saw two police officers standing on the center island where there is some grass, just west of the vehicle. [REDACTED] stated the officers were wearing police uniforms and both were carrying what she believed to be rifles. [REDACTED] stated she never heard or saw anything other than the officers standing on the island. [REDACTED] returned to the kitchen area and had no further details on the incident.

I responded to [REDACTED] McNeil Circle and contacted (OT06) [REDACTED] the following is a summary of her statements. [REDACTED] stated she was sitting in her living room and heard a big explosion. [REDACTED] described the sound as a big accident and she did not get up to check. A few seconds later she stated she heard sirens and people in the street yelling. [REDACTED] was unable to tell me what any of the yelling was about and she stated she never saw anything. [REDACTED] stated she stayed in the residence the entire time and had no further details on the incident.

I then contacted (OT07) [REDACTED] at the same location and the following is a summary of his statements. [REDACTED] stated he was playing x-box in the back bedroom and heard what he believed to be four loud gun shots. [REDACTED] stated he looked in the back yard where it sounded like the shots came from and he didn't see anything. [REDACTED] stated he did not see anything or hear anything else. [REDACTED] had no further details on the incident.

I also contacted there two children at the location, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Both stated they were asleep from a long night up and did not see or hear anything.

I responded to [REDACTED] McNeil Circle and contacted (OT08) [REDACTED] the following is a summary of her statements. [REDACTED] stated she was in her back office, which is located in the back of the residence. [REDACTED] stated she heard six to seven gunshots and went to the front of the residence to see what was going on. [REDACTED] stated she looked out her front window, which is located approx. 120' away from the Chevy Tahoe. [REDACTED] stated she looked outside and saw a heavy set woman standing in the middle of the street approx. 45' in front of the vehicle. [REDACTED] stated she saw two subjects standing in the street behind the vehicle. [REDACTED] stated the two subjects had black helmets on and were carrying what she believed were rifles. [REDACTED] stated she believed the two subjects were police officers and could hear them yelling "Hands on your head." [REDACTED] believes the officers were yelling at the occupants inside the Chevy Tahoe. [REDACTED] stated she heard someone screaming, but unable to advise what they were saying. [REDACTED] stated she went back into her office and locked herself in the room. [REDACTED] had no further details on the incident.

I then responded to [REDACTED] McNeil Circle, where nobody appeared to be home. I attempted to have dispatch locate a landline for the residence, but had negative results.

I then responded to [REDACTED] McNeil Circle and contacted (OT09) [REDACTED] the following is a summary of her statements. [REDACTED] stated she saw a female leaving 2237 McNeil Circle, which she has never seen before. [REDACTED] stated there was a blue Chevy Tahoe in front of the 2237 McNeil Circle, which she has never seen before either. [REDACTED] stated she then got into her vehicle and left her residence. [REDACTED] stated when she was pulling up to the stop sign at Ontario Avenue and McNeil Circle, she saw a traffic stop in front of her. She saw a gray car pulled over and two police officer walking north on McNeil circle. [REDACTED] stated there was an officer next to the gray car and two officers were walking down McNeil Circle. [REDACTED] stated the officers were wearing police uniforms and were clearly police officers. [REDACTED] stated she left the area and never saw any further. [REDACTED] stated when she returned home, the streets were blocked off and she knew something happened. [REDACTED] had no further details on the incident.

8 **DETAILS:** On 06-08-07 at approx. 1330 hours Officer M. Hernandez and I
9 responded to the area of Ontario Ave. and McNeil Cir. in Corona, reference an
10 officer involved shooting that had occurred. As part of the Corona Police
11 Department OIS Team we were assigned to contact residents who may have
12 witnessed the incident.
13

14 One of the residents we contacted was (WT13) [REDACTED] lives
15 at [REDACTED] McNeil Cir. [REDACTED] residence is located just south of the location the
16 incident occurred (in the street in front of 2237 McNeil Circle). The following is a
17 synopsis of [REDACTED] statement.
18

19 [REDACTED] stated she has lived at the listed location for approx. two months and
20 knows her neighbors who live at 2237 Mc Neil Cir. as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED]
21 stated the person who had gotten shot was [REDACTED] brother, later determined to be
22 (SU01) Shannon Miller.
23

24 [REDACTED] said she had taken her child [REDACTED] DOB [REDACTED] on a
25 walk and had just returned home when she saw Miller and an unknown female
26 walk out of the residence located at 2237 McNeil Circle and get into the blue
27 SUV parked in front of the residence. [REDACTED] stated the female was in front of
28 Miller and that Miller appeared to be in a hurry. [REDACTED] had seen police in the
29 neighborhood and was going to ask Miller what was going on when she saw two
30 police officers run north down the street racking the shotguns they were holding.
31 The police officers shouted to [REDACTED] to get inside her house.
32

33 [REDACTED] said she and her child went in the front door of her residence and
34 immediately went into the garage of the residence and continued to watch the
35 incident (the garage door was open). [REDACTED] said she stood and watched from
36 the southwest corner of her garage. [REDACTED] said her son was playing inside
37 the garage and not watching the incident. [REDACTED] son was too young to
38 question.
39

40 [REDACTED] saw a female get into the driver's seat of the blue SUV parked on the
41 street in front of 2237 McNeil Circle, and Miller get into the back passenger's
42 seat. [REDACTED] did not see whether Miller was holding anything. [REDACTED] said
43 her view was obstructed by trees which border the front yard of her residence
44 and 2237 McNeil Circle. [REDACTED] said she could not see the officer's because of

1 her obstructed view, but heard them yell, "Get out of the car." [REDACTED] said she
2 did not see either of the occupants exit the vehicle.

4 [REDACTED] said she feared for her son's safety at this point and decided to go
5 inside her house. Seconds later [REDACTED] said she heard gunshots. [REDACTED]
6 said she did not see what happened next, but called her boyfriend to tell him
7 what had happened. [REDACTED] said she had never spoken to Miller or the female
8 and did not see either of them that day prior to mentioned incident.

9
10 At approx. 1445 hours I went to [REDACTED] McNeil Circle and spoke to (WT14) [REDACTED]
11 [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated she witnessed the shooting. The following is a
12 synopsis of [REDACTED] statement. [REDACTED] said she has lived in the
13 neighborhood for several years and knew Miller.

14
15 [REDACTED] stated she was at her friend's, [REDACTED] house prior to the
16 incident. [REDACTED] lives at [REDACTED] McNeil Circle, the house just north of Miller's.
17 [REDACTED] stated she drove to [REDACTED] house at approx. 1050 hours and past
18 Miller as he drove southbound on McNeil towards Ontario Ave. [REDACTED] stated
19 Miller was driving a gray rental car and identified it as the same vehicle that was
20 still stopped at the intersection of McNeil and Ontario. [REDACTED] stated Miller
21 appeared to be alone in the vehicle. [REDACTED] said she knew the vehicle was a
22 rental car because she had heard Miller had gotten into a collision with his
23 sister's only other vehicle.

24
25 Prior to the shooting [REDACTED] stated she had left [REDACTED] house, alone,
26 driving southbound on McNeil Circle. Prior to leaving [REDACTED] house she saw
27 the female she believed to be Miller's girlfriend sitting in the driver's seat of the
28 blue SUV. As [REDACTED] drove southbound, she saw the street had been blocked
29 at Ontario Avenue. [REDACTED] turned around where the island dividing the street
30 ended to return home. As [REDACTED] continued northbound towards her residence,
31 she saw two Corona Police Department motor officers standing on the south side
32 of the hedge on the south end of her front yard. [REDACTED] looked farther south
33 down McNeil Cir. and saw Miller in the front yard of his residence wrapping a tan
34 or gray shirt around his arm. [REDACTED] was unsure which arm he was wrapping
35 and did not see any other object's in his hands.

37 Miller appeared to be looking north and in a panic. [REDACTED] then saw a
38 passenger's side door close and assumed Miller had gotten into a passenger's
39 seat of the blue SUV. [REDACTED] said by this time she had parked in her driveway,
40 exited her vehicle, and saw the two officers run towards the blue SUV. [REDACTED]
41 stated the officers were "cocking their rifles." [REDACTED] stated the officers stopped
42 to the rear of the vehicle, one in the street and one in the driveway. [REDACTED] said
43 she heard the officers shout at the occupants, "Get out of the car," multiple times.

1 ██████ said she heard the officers call the female by name, possibly ██████
2 ██████ said they told the female to get out of the vehicle and get on the ground.
3 ██████ saw the passenger's door open and Miller turn as if he were going to
4 exit. ██████ said she saw Miller's legs and hands exit the vehicle but was
5 unsure if he was holding anything. As Miller appeared to be exiting she heard
6 one or both of the officer's yell, "He's got a gun," multiple times. Miller said she
7 heard approx. 6-8 shots being fired and saw the female run towards the grass
8 island that divides the street.

9
10 I asked ██████ if she noticed anything different about Miller's appearance prior
11 to the shooting. ██████ said she had not.

12
13 On 06-15-07 at approx. 1745 hours, I contacted ██████ via telephone. I again
14 spoke to ██████ reference the shooting and asked her what she saw after
15 shots were fired. ██████ saw a white Ford Explorer drive down the street with
16 emergency lights on and park to the rear of the officers. One of the involved
17 officers had the female go with another officer that was on the south end of the
18 street. The officer's then "regrouped" next to a van that was parked in the
19 driveway of 2243 McNeil Circle.

20
21 Approx. 20-30 minutes later ██████ saw the Corona Police Department
22 armored vehicle arrive. Officers then used the vehicle to approach Miller in the
23 vehicle. ██████ said she assumed Miller was dead.

DETAILS:

On 06-08-07, at approximately 1212hrs., I responded to the area of McNeil Circ., and Ontario Ave., reference a 211P.C.- armed robbery investigation that resulted in an officer involved shooting.

Upon arrival at the scene, I was directed by Lt. Kelly Anderson to contact and interview the resident of [REDACTED] W. Ontario Ave., in the city of Corona. This home is located on the north-west corner of Ontario Ave., and McNeil Circ., and it was believed that the resident at this location witnessed this officer involved shooting incident.

At the aforementioned address, I contacted the homeowner who identified himself as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised me that he did, in fact, witness this shooting incident, and that he had been watching the uniformed officers since before they approached the suspect's residence. [REDACTED] advised me of the following:

[REDACTED] advised me that initially, he arrived home and observed two (2) uniformed Corona Police motorcycle officers standing by on McNeil Circ., next to his home. [REDACTED] advised that in addition to these uniformed officers, a plain clothes police officer was also present with them. [REDACTED] advised that he approached and spoke with the uniformed officers for several minutes- not knowing what they were at the location for. [REDACTED] advised that as he spoke with the motorcycle officers about speeding vehicles in his neighborhood, they observed a woman get into a vehicle at the north end (cul-de-sac) of McNeil Circ. [REDACTED] advised that he overheard the officers talking about the vehicle being a robbery suspect vehicle, and that they stopped the vehicle as it approached Ontario Ave.

██████████ advised that shortly after stopping this vehicle and detaining a woman and two (2) children who were in it, the motorcycle officers walked approximately half way towards the believed suspect's home (2237 McNeil Circle), and stood by in some bushes in the front yard of another home. ██████████ advised that as he stood in his back yard, he had a clear and unobstructed view of the officers, and a parked vehicle that the suspect eventually entered. ██████████ advised that he watched as the motorcycle officers observed a heavy-set woman enter what he believed was a van. As I stood at ██████████ vantage point, the suspect vehicle, although a Chev. Tahoe, could be mistaken as a van due to its parked position. ██████████ said that when the officers observed the woman approach the vehicle, they hurried towards it "low key" on foot. ██████████ advised that the black officer (Sgt. John Marshall) approached the vehicle from behind and across (west side) the street, and the white officer (Officer Richard Beach) approached the vehicle from behind on its passenger side. ██████████ advised that he heard Officer Beach yell for the female driver to exit the vehicle, which she did, then heard one of the officers direct her onto a center grass median near Sgt. Marshall's location. ██████████ advised that the officers then yelled additional commands towards the vehicle, but that he was unable to determine what these commands were. ██████████ advised that several seconds after the officers gave these additional commands, he heard and observed them to fire their weapons towards the vehicle. ██████████ advised that after the gunshots occurred, the plain clothes officer that was standing by with the detained female adjacent his home, immediately responded to the shooting scene. He said that, that officer then walked the female removed from the suspect vehicle, up to the intersection of McNeil Circle, and Ontario Ave.

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██████████ advised that during the time that Sgt. Marshall and Officer Beach were giving commands towards the suspect's vehicle, it appeared impossible for anyone inside the vehicle to not hear the commands, or not see the uniformed officers. ██████████ advised that although he could see the actions of both officers, he could not see the movements or actions of anyone inside the vehicle. ██████████ advised that additional police personnel arrived on the scene, and that Sgt. Marshall and Officer Beach responded back to the intersection of McNeil Circle, and Ontario Ave., where they relinquished their weapons. ██████████ described the officers' actions as "by the book", in his opinion, and he advised that based on what he observed, he could only assume that the suspect "went for something", which in turn caused the officers to fire. ██████████ described Officer Beach's location at the time of the shooting as being next to the suspect vehicle's right rear wheel. ██████████ described Sgt. Marshall's location at the time of the shooting as being on the median curb line adjacent the left rear corner of the suspect vehicle.

After interviewing ██████████, I then assisted Officer Pam Buchanan with the interview of the female removed from the suspect vehicle. This person was later identified as ██████████. Refer to Officer Buchanan's supplemental report for details regarding ██████████ interview. (NFD)

EVIDENCE / PROPERTY:

During the investigation, I was instructed by Det. M. Anderson to retrieve Sgt. Marshall's and Ofc. Beach's shotguns, chart them, and then have them inspected by CPD armorer D. Amerman.

I was advised by Det. Mercado that both of the shotguns were located in Det. M. Anderson's police vehicle (71105) that was parked, locked, at the scene. Det. Mercado stated that he placed Sgt. Marshall's shotgun in the trunk and Ofc. Beach's shotgun in the backseat. Refer to Det. Mercado's supplemental report for further details. I obtained the keys to the vehicle and retrieved the shotguns. Det. Meyer assisted by taking photographs of the shotguns.

The shotguns were taken to the police station, where I unloaded them and noted their contents and serial numbers.

The following pertains to the shotgun located in the trunk of Det. M. Anderson's vehicle:

- (one) Remington 870 Police Magnum 12 gauge shotgun / ser# D535839M, with Choate Tool Corp. folding stock.
- (two) Winchester Super X - 2 ¾" - 1oz. shotgun slugs (one in chamber and one in loading tube)

The following pertains to the shotgun located in the backseat of Det. M. Anderson's vehicle:

- (one) Remington 870 Police Magnum 12 gauge shotgun / ser# D535850M, with Choate Tool Corp. folding stock.
- (one) Winchester Super X - 2 ¾" - 1oz. shotgun slugs (located in loading tube)

After checking the shotguns, I retrieved Sgt. Marshall's primary handgun and extra magazines from his duty belt and inventoried the items:

- (one) Glock Model 34 9mm Handgun / ser# HPE475
- (three) Glock 17 round magazines (one in handgun)
- (51) Winchester 9mm Luger hollow-point bullets

I then retrieved Ofc. Beach's primary handgun and extra magazines from his duty belt and inventoried the items:

- (one) HK USP .45 cal. Handgun / ser# 25-001547
- (three) HK .45 cal. 10 round magazines (one in handgun)
- (30) .45 cal. Winchester hollow-point bullets

On 6/12/07, I took both shotguns, and all remaining ammunition to CPD armorer D. Amerman where he conducted a post-shooting inspection of the weapons. During the inspection, all of the rounds of ammunition were placed in a training ammunition cache and new rounds were later issued to Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach. D. Amerman then completed inspection paperwork and a memorandum (see attached). The weapons were then cleared to be returned to Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach for duty use.

Both officers advised that they routinely load their shotguns with four slugs (in the magazine tube).

Both officers also advised that they routinely load their handgun magazines to full capacity and carry their firearms with a round loaded in the chamber. Both officers were short one round in the magazine that was in their handguns. Both officers advised that they had recently qualified at the range and found they were missing one round each when they reloaded after qualifying. They had not made arrangements to retrieve another round.

Records showed that Sgt. Marshall had qualified with his handgun on 6/7/07 and Ofc. Beach qualified with his handgun on 6/6/07.

Neither officer carries a back-up firearm with them.

DETAILS:

On 060807 at approx. 1230 hrs., I responded to the intersection of Ontario Ave. and McNeil Cir. to assist in a officer involved shooting investigation.

I arrived at approx. 1330 hrs and contacted Det. M. Anderson at the scene. The suspect had been pronounced deceased at the scene prior to my arrival. The immediate area was contained with yellow police tape and a crime scene log was being maintained by patrol officers. Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach had also already been removed from the scene and transported to the main station.
