

16	Corona. The store is located on the southeast corner of W. Sixth St. and Paseo
17	Grande. The "Country Store Liquor" is in a commercial building that is divided
18	into three separate businesses. There is only one entry and exit to the store
19	which faces west. The "Country Store Liquor" is located on the north end of the
20	building, a nail shop is located in the middle of the building, and a donut shop is
21	located on the south end of the building. The front door of the "Country Store
22	Liquor" faces west towards Paseo Grande. There is a parking lot to the rear and
23	to the south side of the "Country Store Liquor".

1 **Details:** 2 3 On Friday, June 8, 2007, at approximately 1113 hours, I was dispatched to the 4 area of W. Sixth St. and Paseo Grande, Corona, regarding shots heard. As I 5 responded to the location, dispatch advised that the "Country Store Liquor", 6 located at 1818 W. Sixth St., had just been robbed. 7 8 I heard Officer Mendenhall, via the radio, advising dispatch that he was in the 9 area. Officer Mendenhall relayed information stating that witnesses were 10 reporting a shooting that occurred in the parking lot of 1760 W. Sixth St. (Refer to 11 Officer Mendenhall's supplemental report). 12 13 I arrived on scene and parked my unit on the south side of the 1818 W. Sixth St. 14 building. I told dispatch to call the liquor store (Country Store Liquor) and have 15 the reporting party step outside the store. (VM01) was also walked outside 16 the store and told me he was just robbed. 17 18 I told to describe the suspect and also told him to give me the suspect's 19 last direction of travel. told me the following: 20 21 The suspect was a white male adult, late 30's to early 40's, about 6'2 in height, 22 weighed about 240 lbs, and was wearing a blue button down shirt. The suspect 23 was last seen getting into a vehicle, California plate 5VMC666, possibly a blue 24 Dodge Neon. was unable to give me the vehicle's last direction of travel. 25 26 I relaved the suspect information to dispatch, via the radio, and continued to get 27 a detailed statement from the st 28 29 On today's date, 06-08-07, at approximately 1109 hours. was working at 30 the liquor store, was standing behind the cash register when an unknown 31 male suspect walked up to the register and placed an unknown type of drink on the counter. The male suspect handed two dollars for the drink, and 32 33 was getting the suspect's change from the cash register, the male 34 suspect, using his right hand, grabbed a gun from his waistband and pointed it at 35 . The male suspect told growing, "Give me the money". 36 the suspect would shoot him if he didn't give him the money, complied with his 37 handed the suspect the money from the register, the 38 suspect said "Give me all of it". The suspect then placed the gun back in his front 39 waistband and took the money. 40 41 described the gun as a black semi-automatic handgun with a lot of black 42 plastic on it. said it appeared like a real gun to him. 43 44 The male suspect began walking towards the front door, and as he approached 45 the front door, the suspect looked towards and said something.



1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	I asked if he knew the suspect and he said, "No". I asked would be able to identify the suspect and he said, "I think so". I asked why he followed the suspect with the gun and he said, "I wanted to get his license plate so he could get caught". I asked if he was scared that the suspect was holding a gun and he said, "I didn't think about that". I said this is the second time in the past few months that his store has been robbed. just wanted the suspect to get caught.
9 10 11	I asked how much money he handed the suspect and he said approximately \$400.
12 13 14	I asked showed if his store had video surveillance cameras and he said yes. showed me the video footage and the following is what I saw:
15 16 17 18 19 20 21	At about 1109 hours (camera recorded footage time), I see what appears to be a white male suspect enter the store through the front door. The male suspect was wearing a light blue buttoned down checkered shirt, a light blue shirt under his buttoned down shirt, light colored shorts, white shoes and was wearing a light colored cap. The suspect appeared to have a pony tail and was wearing dark sunglasses.
22 23 24 25 26 27 28	The footage shows the male walk towards the south side of the store and then walk towards the southeast corner of the store. The suspect opened a refrigerator door, located on the south wall of the store, and selected an item from inside the refrigerator. The suspect walked back and forth, in front of the refrigerator, for a few seconds. It appeared the suspect was looking to see who was inside the store.
29 30 31 32 33 34 35	After a few minutes, the suspect walked to the front counter of the store, which is located on the west side of the liquor store. The male suspect placed a bottle on the front counter, next to the register, and handed some dollar bills to opened the register, the male suspect, using his right hand, grabbed an unknown object from the front portion of his waistband and pointed it at the lit appeared to be a black handgun.
36 37 38 39 40 41 42 43	I heard the suspect tell "Give me the money". began handing the suspect money, and as he handed him the money, the suspect said, "Give me all the money". continued to hand the suspect money from the counter, and as he did that, the suspect placed the handgun back in his front waistband and covered it with his shirt. The suspect grabbed the money with his left hand and I was able to see that the suspect had what appeared to be a small tattoo on his left hand, right above his thumb. The suspect put the money in his right pocket, grabbed the bottle he put on the counter, and walked north towards the front door.

1	The suspect reached the front door, and before he stepped out, he looked
2	towards and told him to sit down. It appears that didn't hear the
3	suspect so the suspect told him a second time to sit down.
4	hands in front of him and began walking backwards towards the south end of the
5	store (still behind the register). The suspect walked out of the store and
6	ran behind him holding what appears to be a gun.
7	
8	A different camera angle, camera located at the outside of the store, shows the
9	suspect running southbound from the store.
10	
11	Detective M. Anderson and Detective Dunnigan arrived on scene and took over
12	the investigation, refer to the supplemental reports.







Believing Shannon's physical description matched the suspect's description, along with the fact that he resided at the same address where the suspect's vehicle was rented to, I compiled a photo line-up with Shannon's booking photo randomly placed in position six.

I then announced a broadcast to the officers responding to McNeil Cir that I located a male subject with similar characteristics as the suspect who lived at that address. I did not advise:

Shannon's name over the radio.

As I was responding to the location of the robbery, 1818 W. Sixth St, to provide the photo line-up to the officers at the scene, I heard Sgt Marshall advise that there was an officer involved shooting at 2237 McNeil Cir. I arrived at 1818 W. Sixth St and gave the line-up to Sgt Dredla, at which time I drove to McNeil Cir to provide assistance.

As I was driving to that location, Sgt Austin advised on the radio that the Special Response Team (SRT) may be needed to clear the suspect's vehicle and residence. I arrived on scene and changed into my SRT uniform.

While at the scene, Lt Coleman told me to organize a team to search the interior of the residence at 2237 McNeil Cir in an attempt to locate any potential victims or outstanding suspects. I was told that no one else was supposed to be inside the residence at this time, but it was not for certain. The following officers searched the interior of the residence with me: Sgt Barron, Detective R.Avila, Detective Mercado, Officer Waldon, Officer Vega, Officer D.Avila, and Officer Ribeiro. We approached the residence on the Corona Police Armored Car. The armored car drove north on McNeil Cir, and turned into the driveway of the residence. It was later learned that the armored car had run over one of the shotgun casings lying in the street to the rear of the suspect's Chevy Tahoe.

The front door of the residence was closed but unlocked, so we made entry into the house through that door. The residence and backyard were secured and no subjects were found. All of

1	the team members then left the house without searching for any items of evidence pending the
2	approval of a search warrant. No force was used inside the house and no damage was caused.

4	After the house was secured, Lt Anderson asked me to photograph the scene before the

EVIDENCE: One compact disc containing witness statements

<u>DETAILS:</u> On 6-8-07 at approx. 1230 hours, I was called to assist in an officer involved shooting investigation which occurred in the 2200 block of McNeil Circle. I arrived and was directed by Sgt. Roulston to speak with Sgt. Austin and Cpl. Viefhaus and obtain their statements.

While at the scene I spoke with Sgt. Austin who told me the following. Sgt. Austin said at about 1100 hours, he and Sgt. Pawluczenko had left the station and were on their way to lunch when he heard dispatch put out a call of an armed robbery. The robbery occurred at Country Store Liquor which is located at 1818 West Sixth Street.

Sgt. Austin said he responded to the scene to assist in the investigation. After he arrived, one of the officers on scene told him that witnesses saw the suspect flee in a gray or silver Pontiac. The vehicle was later determined to be registered to a rental car company. While still at the scene of the robbery, Sgt. Austin heard over the police radio that the last person to rent the suspect vehicle lived at in Corona. Sgt. Austin heard that Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach had responded to the address and located the suspect vehicle in the driveway of the home.

Sgt. Austin began driving towards the address, but by the time he arrived in the area, the suspect vehicle had been driven from the home. Other responding officers located the vehicle and stopped it at the intersection of McNeil Cir. and Ontario Avenue. The officers on scene were in the process of having the occupants exit the vehicle when he arrived on scene. He said the occupants in the vehicle consisted of a female driver and two children. Lt. Coleman who was on scene told Sgt. Austin there appeared to be blood in the vehicle. Sgt. Austin asked the female driver if anyone was still at her home. She told him that her brother and girlfriend were still inside when she left. Sgt. Austin asked what her brother was wearing. The female said he was wearing some type of shorts and a button up shirt, which he said matched the clothing worn by the suspect in the robbery.

Sgt. Austin began driving down McNeil Cir. to locate Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach. Sgt. Austin said as he drove down the street he heard over the radio Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach say, "Shots fired". Sgt. Austin said he never heard any gun shots because his windows were up and his air conditioner was on. Sgt. Austin stopped his vehicle in front of 2237 McNeil Circle which was just south of a blue Chevrolet Tahoe. Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach both had shotguns in their hands and were standing behind the Chevrolet Tahoe. Officer Ricaud had arrived and stopped his patrol unit next to Sgt. Austin's vehicle. At that time Sgt. Austin had Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach back up to his vehicle for cover.

While standing behind cover, Sgt. Austin obtained a brief public safety statement from Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach. Both officers told him that a couple had come out of the house (2237 McNeil Circle) and entered the blue Chevrolet Tahoe. The female who was in the driver's seat was ordered out of the vehicle, which she complied. The Officers said the male subject pointed a gun at Ofc. Beach which resulted in both officers firing at least two rounds. The female driver was handcuffed and removed from the scene by Officer Ricaud.

Sgt. Austin said Officer Ricaud and Cpl. Viefhaus returned to the scene to help provide cover for the other officers. He had Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach leave the scene to prevent any further involvement. He requested the department's armored car and a ballistic shield respond to the scene. The armored car drove up to the passenger side of the vehicle and the officers inside saw that the suspect was not moving. Sgt. Austin, Cpl. Jurado and Ofc. Bourgault approached the vehicle. Ofc. Bourgault checked the suspect for a pulse and was unable to feel one. Sgt. Austin said based on the suspect's injuries and lack of having a pulse, the suspect was pronounced dead at the scene. Sgt. Austin provided no further information.

I spoke with Cpl. Viefhaus who was at the scene and told me the following. Cpl. Viefhaus responded to McNeil Cir. and Ontario Ave. to assist officers in locating a suspect from the robbery at Country Store Liquor. After Cpl. Viefhaus' arrival, Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach began walking down the street to get a visual on the front of 2237 McNeil Cir. and prevent any possible suspects from leaving the residence. Between 1 to 5 minutes later, Cpl. Viefhaus heard what he thought were gunshots. He said the gunshots sounded "deeper" and believed they were fired from a shotgun. Cpl. Viefhaus ran towards the gunshots to assist. When he arrived, he saw a female lying prone in the grass median west of the Tahoe and a second subject in the backseat of the Tahoe with his feet hanging out of the door. He said Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach were standing directly behind the blue Tahoe holding shotguns. The female who was lying in the center median was handcuffed and removed from the scene. He provided no further information.

Both Officers stated they did not shoot their weapons during the incident. The Officer's weapons were not visibly checked.

Details:

On 06-08-07 at 1113 hours, I was dispatched to the 2200 block of McNeil Cir. to assist on an officer involved shooting. As I arrived on scene, Cpl. Viefhaus instructed me to start the crime scene log. The crime scene tape was already put up prior to me starting the crime scene log.

The outer crime scene tape was put up in the area of McNeil Cir. and Ontario Ave. The inner crime scene tape was put up in the area of 2257 McNeil Cir. The crime scene tape went all the way across the street to the area of 2258 and blocked off the cul-de-sac. I stood in the area of 2257 McNeil Cir. next to a patrol unit and guarded the entry and exit of the crime scene.

I started the crime scene log at approximately 1300 hours and maintained the log until approximately 1830 hours. At 1830 hours, CSO Wood replaced me at the scene and took over the crime scene log.





During the investigation both Sergeant Marshall and Officer Beach conducted a voluntary interview at the Corona Police Department with Sr. Detective M. Anderson and I, along with their Attorney John Pearson being present. I digitally recorded the officers' interviews and downloaded the interviews on to a CD which was logged into evidence. (See attached evidence/property sheet)

On 06-20-07, at approx. 1045 hrs., while at the Corona Police Department's detective bureau Sr. Detective M. Anderson handed me a single sheet of note pad paper that had writing on it. Detective Anderson said Officer Beach had handed him the piece of pad paper, on 062007 at about 0945 hrs, which contained the suspect's address, vehicle description and license plate number. Officer Beach had mentioned that he had written down the suspect's address and vehicle description prior to his contact with the suspect on 06-08-07. I took possession of the note pad paper and logged it into evidence at the Corona Police Department. (See attached copy and evidence/property report)





<u>Details:</u>

On 06-08-07 at approx. 1215 hours, Detective R. Avila and I responded to the area of 2237 McNeil Cir. Corona, reference an officer requesting emergency assistance. While responding to the scene I could hear officers broadcasting that sho+s were fired and one person was down and not moving.

Upon arrival, I met with Lt. K. Anderson, Sgt. Marshall, and Ofcr. Beach, as I walked down (mid block) towards the residence located at 2237 McNeil Cir. Lt. Anderson told me Sgt. Marshall and Ofcr. Beach was involved in the shooting.

Both Sgt. Marshall and Ofcr. Beach had department issued shotguns in their hands. They both told me they each fired their shotgun. First, I took possession of Ofcr. Beach's shotgun and noticed the slide handle pulled back and the ejection port/ chamber open. The chamber contained one live shotgun slug round in the chamber. For safety purposes, I removed the live slug round from the chamber.

Sgt. Marshall told me he was involved in the shooting. Sgt. Marshall stated he shot his shotgun. At this time, I told Sgt. Marshall to put the shotgun on safe. I also took possession of Sgt. Marshall's shotgun. I walked Ofcr. Beach and Sgt. Marshall to the staging area (Ontario & McNeil Cir.).

When I arrived at the staging area (coroner of Ontario & McNeil Cir) I met with Sr. Detective M. Anderson who was standing by his assigned unit. I told Det. Anderson that Sgt. Marshall and Ofcr. Beach were the officers involved in the shooting. I asked Det. Anderson if I could secure the shotguns in his unit. Det. Anderson opened the trunk of the car at which time I secured Sgt. Marshall's shotgun in the trunk. I opened the back driver's side door and secured Ofcr. Beach's shotgun (slug round included) on the back seat of Det. Anderson's assigned unit. After the shotguns were secured in the unit, Det. Anderson locked his vehicle using his keyless remote / alarm system.

After the weapons were secured Sgt. Marshall and Ofcr. Beach was released to Det. Anderson.

I returned to the residence and assisted SRT members with clearing the location at 2237 McNeil Cir. Corona.

EVIDENCE:

Recorded statements from witnesses and others from the scene.

DETAILS:

On 06-08-07 at approximately 1215 hours Corporal Jurado and I, who are assigned to the Corona Police Department FLEX Team, were working a two man unit in an unmarked gray Corona Police Department vehicle (79151) responded to a shots fired call in which Corona Police Officers requested an 11-11 (Emergency code 3 response) in the area of 2200 McNeil Circle in Corona.

We arrived on scene and noticed that Sgt. Austin was pointing his gun at a blue Chevy Tahoe, which he was directly behind. Sgt. Austin was standing behind the door of a white Ford explorer with a California plate of 5ASU959. Sgt. Austin, Corporal Jurado and I walked up to the blue Chevy Tahoe to check on the status of a suspect that was lying on his back in the back seat. The rear passenger door was open and the suspect had his right leg hanging out, with no movement seen. Sergeant Austin, Corporal Jurado and I approached the vehicle and observed the suspect lying on his back with a large hole in the right side of his neck.

At 1245 hours, Sergeant Austin asked me to check for a pulse on the suspect. I walked around to the driver side of the vehicle and opened the rear passenger door. I reached in over the suspect and grabbed his right arm. I was cautious for any evidence that could be in or around the vehicle and made sure not to touch or move anything besides the suspect's right arm. I began checking for a pulse and was unable to locate one. Due to the gun shot to the neck and no pulse located, I determined the suspect was deceased. We returned back to the Ford explorer and waited for the SRT team to clear the residence. After the area was cleared, Sergeant Barron instructed me to contact residence in the area to attempt to locate witnesses.








On 06-08-07, at approximately 1212hrs., I responded to the area of McNeil Circ., and Ontario Ave., reference a 211P.C.- armed robbery investigation that resulted in an officer involved shooting.

Upon arrival at the scene, I was directed by Lt. Kelly Anderson to contact and interview the resident of W. Ontario Ave., in the city of Corona. This home is located on the north-west corner of Ontario Ave., and McNeil Circ., and it was believed that the resident at this location witnessed this officer involved shooting incident.

At the aforementioned address, I contacted the homeowner who identified himself as advised me that he did, in fact, witness this shooting incident, and that he had been watching the uniformed officers since before they approached the suspect's residence. advised me of the following:

advised me that initially, he arrived home and observed two (2)
uniformed Corona Police motorcycle officers standing by on McNeil Circ., next to his home. advised that in addition to these uniformed officers, a plain clothes police officer was also present with them. advised that he approached and spoke with the uniformed officers for several minutes- not knowing what they were at the location for. advised that as he spoke with the motorcycle officers about speeding vehicles in his neighborhood, they observed a woman get into a vehicle at the north end (cul-de-sac) of McNeil Circ. advised that he overheard the officers talking about the vehicle being a robbery suspect vehicle, and that they stopped the vehicle as it approached Ontario Ave.

advised that shortly after stopping this vehicle and detaining a woman and two (2) children who were in it, the motorcycle officers walked approximately half way towards the believed suspect's home (2237 McNeil Circle), and stood by in some bushes in the front yard of another home. advised that as he stood in his back yard, he had a clear and unobstructed view of the officers, and a parked vehicle that the suspect eventually entered. advised that he watched as the motorcycle officers observed a heavy-set woman enter what he believed was a van. As I stood at vantage point, the suspect vehicle, although a Chev. Tahoe, could be mistaken as a van due to its parked position. said that when the officers observed the woman approach the vehicle, they hurried towards it "low key" on foot. black officer (Sgt. John Marshall) approached the vehicle from behind and across (west side) the street, and the white officer (Officer Richard Beach) approached the vehicle from behind on its passenger side. advised that he heard Officer Beach yell for the female driver to exit the vehicle, which she did, then heard one of the officers direct her onto a center grass median near Sgt. Marshall's location. officers then yelled additional commands towards the vehicle, but that he was unable to determine what these commands were. advised that several seconds after the officers gave these additional commands, he heard and observed them to fire their weapons towards the vehicle. advised that after the gunshots occurred, the plain clothes officer that was standing by with the detained female adjacent his home, immediately responded to the shooting scene. He said that, that officer then walked the female removed from the suspect vehicle, up to the intersection of McNeil Circle, and Ontario Ave.

Marshall and Officer Beach were giving commands towards the suspect's vehicle, it appeared impossible for anyone inside the vehicle to not hear the commands, or not see the uniformed officers. advised that although he could see the actions of both officers, he could not see the movements or actions of anyone inside the vehicle. advised that additional police personnel arrived on the scene, and that Sgt. Marshall and Officer Beach responded back to the intersection of McNeil Circle, and Ontario Ave., where they relinquished their weapons. described the officers' actions as "by the book", in his opinion, and he advised that based on what he observed, he could only assume that the suspect "went for something", which in turn caused the officers to fire. described Officer Beach's location at the time of the shooting as being next to the suspect vehicle's right rear wheel. described Sgt. Marshall's location at the time of the shooting as being on the median curb line adjacent the left rear corner of the suspect vehicle. After interviewing I then assisted Officer Pam Buchanan with the interview of the female removed from the suspect vehicle. EVIDENCE / PROPERTY:

During the investigation, I was instructed by Det. M. Anderson to retrieve Sgt. Marshall's and Ofc. Beach's shotguns, chart them, and then have them inspected by CPD armorer D. Amerman.

I was advised by Det. Mercado that both of the shotguns were located in Det. M. Anderson's police vehicle (71105) that was parked, locked, at the scene. Det. Mercado stated that he placed Sgt. Marshall's shotgun in the trunk and Ofc. Beach's shotgun in the backseat. Refer to Det. Mercado's supplemental report for further details. I obtained the keys to the vehicle and retrieved the shotguns. Det. Meyer assisted by taking photographs of the shotguns.

The shotguns were taken to the police station, where I unloaded them and noted their contents and serial numbers.

The following pertains to the shotgun located in the trunk of Det. M. Anderson's vehicle:

- (one) Remington 870 Police Magnum 12 gauge shotgun / ser# D535839M, with Choate Tool Corp. folding stock.
- (two) Winchester Super X 2 ¾" 1oz. shotgun slugs (one in chamber and one in loading tube)

The following pertains to the shotgun located in the backseat of Det. M. Anderson's vehicle:

- (one) Remington 870 Police Magnum 12 gauge shotgun / ser# D535850M, with Choate Tool Corp. folding stock.
- (one) Winchester Super X 2 ¾" 1oz. shotgun slugs (located in loading tube)

After checking the shotguns, I retrieved Sgt. Marshall's primary handgun and extra magazines from his duty belt and inventoried the items:

- (one) Glock Model 34 9mm Handgun / ser# HPE475
- (three) Glock 17 round magazines (one in handgun)
- (51) Winchester 9mm Luger hollow-point bullets

I then retrieved Ofc. Beach's primary handgun and extra magazines from his duty belt and inventoried the items:

- (one) HK USP .45 cal. Handgun / ser# 25-001547
- (three) HK .45 cal. 10 round magazines (one in handgun)
- (30) .45 cal. Winchester hollow-point bullets

On 6/12/07, I took both shotguns, and all remaining ammunition to CPD armorer D. Amerman where he conducted a post-shooting inspection of the weapons. During the inspection, all of the rounds of ammunition were placed in a training ammunition cache and new rounds were later issued to Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach. D. Amerman then completed inspection paperwork and a memorandum (see attached). The weapons were then cleared to be returned to Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach for duty use.

Both officers advised that they routinely load their shotguns with four slugs (in the magazine tube).

Both officers also advised that they routinely load their handgun magazines to full capacity and carry their firearms with a round loaded in the chamber. Both officers were short one round in the magazine that was in their handguns. Both officers advised that they had recently qualified at the range and found they were missing one round each when they reloaded after qualifying. They had not made arrangements to retrieve another round.

Records showed that Sgt. Marshall had qualified with his handgun on 6/7/07 and Ofc. Beach qualified with his handgun on 6/6/07.

Neither officer carries a back-up firearm with them.

DETAILS:

On 060807 at approx. 1230 hrs., I responded to the intersection of Ontario Ave. and McNeil Cir. to assist in a officer involved shooting investigation.

I arrived at approx. 1330 hrs and contacted Det. M. Anderson at the scene. The suspect had been pronounced deceased at the scene prior to my arrival. The immediate area was contained with yellow police tape and a crime scene log was being maintained by patrol officers. Sgt. Marshall and Ofc. Beach had also already been removed from the scene and transported to the main station.
