NARRATIVE:

On the above listed date and time, I responded to the area of the 91 Freeway and Van Buren Blvd reference an officer involved shooting which had just occurred. Upon my arrival I was instructed to remain on scene to assist with scene security and communication with involved agencies.

At 1649 hours, CPD Sergeant Waldon requested I take photographs of the scene with my UAS. Using the DJI Enterprise Zoom, I took photographs and video of the initial scene where the officer involved shooting occurred (the 91 freeway westbound, just underneath the "Jackson Street" bridge).

Corporal Dopson and Officer Romans later arrived on scene with the Matrice 210 UAS. I took additional photographs and video using the Matrice 210.

At approximately 1820 hours, I was tasked with transporting suspect Juan Perez, who was currently being held at the Riverside PD Magnolia station. Upon my arrival the suspect was placed in the rear of my police unit and CPD Detective Neagu provided me with a brown paper bag containing Perez' clothing and belongings. Brown paper bags were placed over Perez' hands and secured with zip ties, however Perez tore the bags open during transport.

I arrived at the Corona PD jail and brought Perez to the booking area. After finishing a booking search, Perez was secured in cell H-3. Forensics Technician Lynsey Walker arrived at the jail and I gave her all of Perez' clothing and property.

I later uploaded all videos and photographs I took of the scene to DigitalOnQ.

SCENE DESCRIPTION: The traffic collision occurred on the 91 freeway westbound near the Jackson Street bridge that was in the city and county of Riverside. The officer involved shooting occurred on the 91 freeway westbound just east of Van Buren Blvd near the right shoulder. (See Forensic ID Tech P. Delahoya's supplemental report for scene.)

WEAPON: SUSPECT FIREARM

~A black 9mm Taurus model #PT24762C, serial #TFP81992.

The firearm is registered to [REDACTED] that was reported stolen out of Las Vegas in 2013 (Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department Case#LLV130822003194). The firearm was logged into CPD evidence room.

OFFICER E. HARRYMAN'S FIREARM:

~A black 9mm Sig Sauer model #P320 serial #58B128772.

INJURIES:

~Officer E. Harryman sustained complaint of pain to his back from the traffic collision.

~Juan Daniel Perez sustained multiple lacerations to the upper portion of his forehead possibly from the traffic collision. Juan had brown to purple bruising around his left eye and a 1/2 inch cut on his left eye lid. Juan also sustained a 1/2 inch cut on his left cheek.

STOLEN/RECOVERED: Corona Police Department marked unit-79263.

~The vehicle is a black 2015 Ford Explorer 4-door with an Exempt California license plate #1469081. The registered owner is the City of Corona with an address of 400 S. Vicentia Avenue, Corona CA 92882.

TIMELINE OF INCIDENT: I reviewed Watch Guard involving unit 79263. The time was retrieved by the length of the video's time not actual time of day. The following information was revealed:

12:13-Officer E. Harryman is involved in a traffic collision.
13:38-1st gunshot-Officer E. Harryman
13:42-2nd gunshot-suspect
13:43-3rd gunshot-suspect
13:44-Officer E. Harryman appears at front of his unit.
13:47-Officer E. Harryman attempts to fire-no magazine in firearm.
13:49-4th gunshot-suspect
13:51-5th gunshot-suspect
*13:52-Officer E. Harryman moves to the passenger side of vehicle out of view and is inserting magazine in his firearm while on the move.
*13:52-Suspect is at Officer E. Harryman's unit on the driver's side.
13:54-Suspect opens driver side door to Officer E. Harryman's unit.
13:56-Suspect gets inside Officer E. Harryman's unit and closes the driver side door.
13:57-Multiple gunshots approximately 18 rounds were fired.
14:08-Suspect drives off in Officer E. Harryman's unit.
18:26-Suspect exits Officer E. Harryman's unit.

(See dash cam and backseat video for further. Video has been purged protected.)

SEARCH WARRANT: On 01-09-2021 at 2308 hours, the Honorable Judge Jackson Lucky of Riverside Superior Court approved a search warrant (#RI012220215) for the following to be searched; Juan Daniel Perez and vehicle (CA#AC68K08). On 01-09-2021, at 2310 hours, the search warrant was executed and a DNA and buccal sample was collected from Juan Daniel Perez inside the Corona Jail. On 01-12-2021, at 1300 hours, Forensic ID Tech L. Walker and I responded to our Fleet building, bay 22, where the vehicle (Honda/Accord/silver) was processed. (See Forensic ID Tech L. Walkers supplemental report for further.) The following items were photographed with a placard and collected:

~223 bullet-underneath driver seat on floor board of said vehicle
~A silver key located on the ground to the left of the driver seat.
~A black Samsung cellphone located in the center console of vehicle.
~A black tracker box located underneath the hood of the vehicle near the battery.

*Officer E. Harryman's unit was processed as well. Photographs and evidence was taken and logged into CPD evidence room by Forensic ID Tech L. Walker. (See Forensic ID Tech's supplemental report for further.)

*In addition, a vehicle inspection was conducted on both the suspect vehicle and Officer E. Harryman's vehicle by Officer S. Cocke. (See Officer S. Cocke's supplemental report for further.)

*Detective D. Neagu will be writing a search warrant to access the Samsung cellphone that was located inside the suspect vehicle.

CORONA JAIL PHONE CALLS: I reviewed all 10 Corona jail calls that were made by Juan Daniel Perez.

1st call: 01-09-2021, at 2006 hours, Juan called the bail bondsman.
2nd call: 01-09-2021, at 2011 hours, Juan spoke with a female and stated that he needed a favor. He asked her to get a hold of his sister so she could put up the house to get him out of jail. Juan was adamant that he needed to get out of jail.
3rd call: 01-09-2021, at 2025 hours, Juan called another bail bondsman.
4th call: 01-09-2021, at 2035 hours, Juan is speaking with the same female in the #2 call. He is curious what his charges are.

5th call: 01-09-2021, at 2134 hours, Juan is speaking with his girlfriend (possible name of [REDACTED]) Juan is upset that [REDACTED] didn't come pick him up. She told him that she was going to but was at lunch with her aunt.

6th call: 01-09-2021, at 2149 hours, A males voice (possibly [REDACTED]) Juan wants to know what the press is saying. [REDACTED] tells him that he is arrested for carjacking a police car.

7th call: 01-09-2021, at 2300 hours, Juan is talking to his girlfriend, [REDACTED] and is asking her who is the person the attempt murder is on.

8th call: 01-10-2021, at 0040 hours, Juan is talking to his girlfriend.

9th call: 01-10-2021, at 0043 hours, Juan is talking with a bail bondsman.

10th call: 01-10-2021, at 0121 hours, Juan is talking with a bail bondsman.

*On 01-22-2021, a request was made to RPDC for Juan Daniel Perez' jail phone calls.

DETAILS:

On 01-09-2021, at approximately 1415 hours, I received a phone call of an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) that occurred. I contacted Lieutenant J. Edwards who advised Officer E. Harryman was involved in an OIS while on his way into work. I was also informed the suspect, who was later identified as Juan Daniel Perez, had taken Officer E. Harryman's police unit and fled the scene. Juan was subsequently located at the Sierra Woods Apartments located at 4655 Minnier Avenue apartment [REDACTED] in the city and county of Riverside and had been taken into custody by the Riverside Police Department. The police unit was also located at the One Stop Food Store which is located at 4585 La Sierra Avenue, Riverside, which is adjacent to the Sierra Woods Apartments. Officer J. Kelly responded to the location and completed a report for a stolen/recovered vehicle. (See Officer J. Kelly's 180 form for further.) (Detective's responded to the listed address to search the apartment for the suspect's firearm. Consent to search was obtained and the firearm was located. See Detective A. Mendenhall and Detective R. Gonzalez' supplemental reports for further.)

Due to Juan's injuries he was transported to Riverside Community Hospital for an okay to book. Sergeant D. Dunnigan advised me and Detective D. Neagu to respond to the hospital to get a status update on the suspect. Upon arrival, I spoke with Riverside Police Officer R. Estrada who stated he received the okay to book and was transporting him to the Riverside Police Department Magnolia Station that is located at 10540 Magnolia Avenue in the city of Riverside. (See attachment for further for Juan's medical forms.)

Detective D. Neagu and I responded to the Magnolia Police Station and I made contact with Juan Daniel Perez. Juan was handcuffed in the detention room of the police department. I advised Juan of his Miranda Admonishment and he chose not to speak with me. (See attached Miranda Admonishment form and recording for further.) Officer K. Nabi responded to the magnolia station and transported Juan to the Corona Police Department. I instructed Officer K. Nabi to bag Juan's hands prior to transport. It should be noted that the brown bags were torn during transport. (See Officer K. Nabi's supplemental report for further. Officer K. Nabi's vehicle's camera has been purged protected.)

On 01-13-2021, at approximately 1700 hours, an interview was conducted with Officer E. Harryman at the Corona Police Department. Officer E. Harryman provided a voluntary statement. Present during the interview was DDA M. Kersse, DA investigator A. Deharo, Detective L. Larios and Attorney R. Perry. Refer to DA Investigator A. Deharo's report of Officer E. Harryman's statement.

Upon reviewing Watch Guard of the officer involved shooting I observed a white Toyota Camry that was stopped behind Officer E. Harryman's unit. The California license plate was [REDACTED]. A computer check on the vehicle revealed [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] I used a law enforcement based website and [REDACTED]. On 01-12-2021, I left a message on her phone urging her to call me. Due to not receiving a call back I responded to the mentioned address to make contact.

On 01-14-2021, at 1134 hours, Detective J. Garcia and I responded to [REDACTED] in the city and county of Riverside to make contact with the registered owner [REDACTED] of vehicle (Toyota/Camry/white) that was present during the shooting that occurred on the 91 freeway near Van Buren Blvd. Upon arrival, I noticed the the Toyota Camry [REDACTED] was parked in the driveway. (Detective J. Garcia later took photographs of the vehicle to confirm the vehicle did not sustained any damage in reference to the shooting. (See attached photos for further.) I made contact with [REDACTED] husband to [REDACTED] at the front door to the residence. [REDACTED] invited myself and Detective J. Garcia inside. This is a summary of [REDACTED] digital audio recorded statement.

[REDACTED] advised he was driving the Toyota Camry at the time of the incident and his wife [REDACTED] was sitting in the front passenger seat next to him. He stated he was travelling on

the 91 Freeway westbound in the number 3 lane. He heard commotion coming from behind him and noticed when he looked in the rearview mirror he could see "car parts exploding" from the traffic collision. He noticed the unmarked police car and described it as a black SUV pulling over to the right shoulder on the freeway. ██████ said he is in the medical field and thought maybe he could help someone who was involved in the accident. He pulled over to the right shoulder behind the unmarked unit. He noticed the officer got out of the unmarked unit and started walking towards the front of his ██████ car.

██████ said he looked up at the officer and noticed his gun was out. ██████ described the officer in a shooting stance with both hands on his firearm and pointing in the direction of where the collision occurred. ██████ said he looked in his left rearview mirror to see who the officer was pointing his firearm at. ██████ said he noticed a Hispanic male adult described as heavy set "flailing his arms" in the air over his head. ██████ said it appeared he was trying to flag down the officer. ██████ said he heard the officer yell approximately three times, "Get on the ground! Get on the ground! Get on the ground!" (██████ advised that his windows were up when he heard the commands.) ██████ said he noticed the Hispanic male was attempting to go to the ground with his hands out in front of him however, he noticed the Hispanic male reached down near his ankle and pulled out a gun. (██████ advised he was not sure which ankle the Hispanic male pulled the gun from.) ██████ stated the distance between the officer and the Hispanic male with the gun was approximately 1 1/2 car lengths.

██████ said he heard the shooting and started to pull away from the right shoulder and continued to travel westbound on the 91 freeway. He said he didn't know who was shooting he just heard multiple gunshots (approximately 10 to 15) as he drove away. He said he then saw a police car with lights on traveling westbound on the 91 freeway shortly afterwards. He said he didn't know if that was the Hispanic male who got into the officer's car or if it was another police car.

I asked ██████ if he remembered hearing anything else and he said no. I asked him if he remembered if they yelled at the officer or anyone else did and he said no. ██████ said the officer did exactly what he was supposed to do.

██████ described the suspect to be a Hispanic male adult, approximately in his 30's., 508, bald, chunky (250-275), mustache beige pants, unknown colored t-shirt (possibly white) and unknown tattoos. ██████ advised he would not be able to identify the suspect if seen again.

I asked ██████ what social media he watched prior to this interview. ██████ stated he saw video of people travelling eastbound on the 91-freeway saying the suspect had a gun. ██████ said he saw a photo of the suspect on a gurney. I asked ██████ if the suspect that was laying on the gurney was the same guy that he saw in his rearview mirror and he said he wasn't sure. He said he was aware the suspect took the unmarked car but didn't know how that happened. (See recording for further.)

I then interviewed ██████ after I spoke with ██████ in the living room of their residence. This is a summary of her digital audio recording. She said they were westbound on the 91-freeway approaching the Van Buren Blvd exit. She said she heard screeching of brakes and sounds of metal hitting together. She looked in her right rearview mirror and saw vehicle's wrecked. She then saw a police car (unmarked) with flashing red and blue lights come across the freeway from left to right and stopped on the right shoulder of the freeway. She said her husband ██████ followed the officer and parked directly behind him.

██████ said she noticed ██████ was looking in his left rearview mirror. She said she was looking ahead at the officer who got out of his unit and noticed he was radioing something over his radio mic. She said suddenly the officer took his gun out and yelled approximately two times, "Get down on the ground! Get down on the ground!" (██████ advised the officer was standing near their windshield when he gave this command.) She said when the officer did

that, she looked in her rearview mirror and noticed a Hispanic male waving his arms around above his head and he was running towards the officer. She said she noticed the subject going down on the ground. [REDACTED] said that's when her attention was diverted back to the officer and she heard approximately 3 rounds of gunfire. She said she noticed the officer was shooting and walking back towards the rear of their vehicle. She said she looked back in her rearview mirror and noticed the suspect had a gun in his right hand near his ankle.

[REDACTED] said she noticed there was a car behind them, and the suspect came from the back portion of the vehicle by the right side of the car. She said that car was approximately 3 to 4 car lengths back from where they were parked. [REDACTED] said she was bent over in her seat and was afraid she was going to get hit by gunfire. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] eventually pulled away (westbound on the 91 freeway) and she continued to hear the gunshots as they left. [REDACTED] estimated there were several gunshots being fired and was unable to estimate how many. [REDACTED] said they exited Van Buren Blvd exit, While stopped for the red light on the off ramp, she noticed the police car leaving westbound on the 91 freeway west of Van Buren Blvd.

[REDACTED] described the suspect to be a Hispanic male adult, 30's or 40's, unknown height, unknown weight, light beige pants, and unknown shirt. [REDACTED] advised she isn't good with descriptions. If seen again she could not identify the suspect.

I asked [REDACTED] if she had seen this incident on social media prior to today and she said she did. She said on her phone for Riverside local news she read that the suspect got into an unmarked police car. She said the police car was found at an apartment complex near La Sierra Avenue. I asked [REDACTED] if she had seen any pictures of the suspect and she said no.

I asked [REDACTED] if I could look at her vehicle to see if there was any damage as a result of the shooting and she said I could. She stated she didn't think there was any damage because they would have heard it at the time of the incident. She advised the damage to the rear of the bumper was old collision damage. Detective J. Garcia took photographs. (See attachments and recordings for further.)

On 01-15-2021, at 1000 hours, I scheduled an appointment to me speak with [REDACTED] and his brother [REDACTED] at the Corona Police Department reference to the purchasing of the suspect's vehicle. I contacted [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] in the front lobby conference room. This is a summary of their digital audio and video recorded statements. It should be noted that due to COVID-19, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and I were wearing facemasks during the interview.

[REDACTED] provided me copies of the sale of the vehicle (Honda/Accord/silver), credit check and in addition a photo of Juan Daniel Perez by the vehicle he purchased. I reviewed the photo and noticed the neck tattoo was the same as Juan's tattoo in a booking photo. (See attached photo for further.)

[REDACTED] is employed at Zacatlan Motors, which is located at 1328 W. Holt Blvd, Ontario, CA. He stated on 01-07-2021, he was the one that spoke with Juan and was present when he signed the paperwork for the sale of the vehicle. Juan provided a copy of his driver's license that was photocopied and attached to the paperwork. [REDACTED] advised that Juan came into the dealership with an older woman that he assumed was Juan's mother. (It should be noted that according to the jail phone calls, Juan's mother had passed away.)

I asked [REDACTED] how Juan's behavior was during the transaction and he said that he was appreciative that someone was helping him get a vehicle. [REDACTED] didn't advise of any unusual behavior that Juan was displaying at the time of purchasing the vehicle.

[REDACTED] advised there was a car (BMW/3 series/dark blue or black (~1998-2002) parked outside with two Hispanic males inside. He said he believed they were with Juan and the female (The female was described as a Hispanic female adult, approximately 50 years of age, 504, 180-190lbs with shoulder length curly hair.) [REDACTED] stated the males remained in the

vehicle. [REDACTED] said he decided to put a tracker on the vehicle because they seemed suspicious. ([REDACTED] provided me with the GPS tracker information. See attached document for further.) He said the older female was extremely thankful for selling the vehicle to Juan. (See attached documents of transaction and recording for further.)

On 01-15-2021, at 1340 hours, I called [REDACTED] owner of the stolen firearm (Taurus) that was recovered in the shooting. [REDACTED] related the following to me in his digital audio recorded statement. I explained to [REDACTED] the reason for the phone call was regarding a firearm he reported stolen in 2013. (It should be noted I requested a copy of the report from the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (LLV130822003194). I reviewed the report that was labeled grand larceny of a firearm. See attached copy of report for further.)

[REDACTED] advised he had returned home Thursday, on 08-22-2013, at 0200 hours, from a club/bar called Stoney's Rockin' Country located at 6611 S. Las Vegas Blvd #160, in the city of Las Vegas, Nevada. He stated he was living with his parents at the time on [REDACTED] in Las Vegas. [REDACTED] advised at the time the incident occurred they did not have cameras at the residence.

[REDACTED] stated he parked his vehicle (Mitsubishi/Lancer/dark blue) in front of the mentioned residence. He stated his firearm (Taurus) was either underneath the driver seat or placed in the center console. The report indicated that on 08-22-2013, at 0330 hours, he noticed his firearm was missing.

I asked [REDACTED] if he remembered having any issues at the bar the night his firearm was stolen and he stated no. I asked [REDACTED] if he knew anybody by the name of Juan Perez and he stated he didn't think so. I asked [REDACTED] if he had any ties in Riverside or Corona, California and he said no. [REDACTED] advised he is originally from New Jersey and he came out to Las Vegas in 2005. [REDACTED] stated no one had permission to have his firearm. (See recording for further.)

On 01-21-2021, at 1303 hours, I spoke with witness, [REDACTED] over the phone reference to the incident that occurred on the freeway. [REDACTED] had called the Riverside Police Department reference to observing the suspect, Juan Daniel Perez, exit the police unit at the liquor store. This is a summary of [REDACTED] digital audio recorded statement.

[REDACTED] said he was parked on the north side of the building at One Stop Food Store that is located at 4585 La Sierra Avenue in the city of Riverside. He said he was in the parking stall that was all the way to the right in front of the store, which is located on the north side of the building. ([REDACTED] advised his vehicle was a black Ford Edge.) As he was getting into his vehicle he noticed the unmarked police car parked pull into a parking space on the north side of the business. He said he was approximately 3 or 4 parking spaces to the right of the police car. He noticed the vehicle came into the parking lot with the red and blue lights on and parked. He said he noticed the windows in the back right side of the police vehicle were blown out. He said that appeared to be suspicious to him and his attention was directed even more so towards the vehicle. He noticed a Hispanic male adult exited the driver side of the vehicle.

[REDACTED] said it didn't look right and he was concerned for his safety and decided to get inside his vehicle to leave. He said he back out of the parking spot and was waiting to pull out onto the roadway. He continued to watch the Hispanic male in his rearview mirror. He said he noticed he walked to the right side of the trash can that was to left of the unmarked police car. He said it appeared he was going to jump over the block wall into the apartment complex but noticed he came back around to the dumpster. He said he ultimately jumped over the wall and into the apartment complex. He stated he called 9-1-1 and told them what he saw.

██████ described the male to be Hispanic possibly blood or tattoos on his head. ██████ said he was last seen wearing either a black or gray sweater. He was uncertain of the clothing. He stated at the time if seen again he would not have been able to identify the suspect. ██████ confided that since the incident he looked at social media on Facebook and saw pictures of the suspect. (See recording for further.)

Based upon statements and physical evidence, Juan Daniel Perez, was in violation of the following crimes:

- ~664/187PC Attempt Murder
- ~215(a)PC Carjacking
- ~29800(a)(1)PC Felon possession of firearm
- ~496(a)PC Possession of stolen firearm
- ~20001(a)VC Injury hit and run

Please forward to the DA's office for prosecution.

NOTE: At the time of this incident, I was working as the Corona Police Department FLEX Team Sergeant. The FLEX Team is a violent crime suppression unit assigned to Field Services Division, with the goal of conducting crime suppression operations and assisting other entities of the Corona Police Department with investigations, warrant services, and resolving quality of life issues. I was wearing a department authorized uniform consisting of a black shirt with City of Corona Police Department patches on the shoulders, dark blue BDU uniform pants, and a black load bearing vest with a police badge on the upper left chest, and the words "POLICE" in white lettering on the front and back. I was equipped with a body worn camera.

DETAILS: On 01-09-2021, shortly after 1400hrs, I began responding to a report of an officer involved shooting that occurred on the westbound SR-91, east of Van Buren Blvd in the City of Riverside, County of Riverside, CA. Officer E. Harryman (FLEX Team) advised he had been involved in a traffic collision and an officer involved shooting. He also advised that his unmarked police unit had been stolen by the suspect from the incident. I initially responded to the scene of the shooting, however, there were sufficient police personnel at that location and I received instructions to respond to the command post at La Sierra Avenue and Minnier Avenue, where the stolen police vehicle had been located.

Upon my arrival at that location I was working with RSO-Emergency Services Team supervisors and Riverside Police Department patrol supervisors regarding coordinating additional resources to safely take the outstanding suspect into custody. A short time later SU-Juan Daniel Perez was seen leaving apartment [REDACTED], and was taken into custody a short distance away by Riverside Police Department personnel. A perimeter had been established at the location and apartment [REDACTED] was secured with crime scene tape. Riverside Police Department

personnel had detained other occupants from the apartment, and transported them to one of their facilities for interviews and further investigation.

As the perimeter was cleared several Riverside Police units remained at the location and I worked with coordinating the investigation of what occurred where Perez was hiding and taken into custody. Corona Police Department Detectives were notified and responding to handle the investigation with members of the Riverside County District Attorney's Office.

As I was on scene I briefly overheard a resident ask one of the Riverside Officers if "Juan" was arrested. The resident, later identified as OT-██████████ stated she saw a video of "Juan" on Facebook, and she knew he was the one who was taken into custody. ██████████ added that "Juan" had a girlfriend who lived nearby in apartment ██████████ and the apartment door was open, a women's purse was hanging on a doorknob, and the television was on and it appeared that no one was home. ██████████ began to walk away before I could ask her any questions, and she walked off into the complex with a male who was later identified as her husband, OT-██████████ ██████████

A few moments later all Riverside Police personnel left the scene and I saw ██████████ and ██████████ walking through the complex. I walked over to them and contacted them, and the following is a summary of my conversation with them (recorded on my body worn camera).

██████████ and ██████████ saw a video of "Juan" on Facebook and knew he was arrested for the incident that occurred at the apartment complex and the freeway. They identified "Juan" because of his face and the tattoos on his head. ██████████ told me that she used to live below "Juan" and his girlfriend, who she called ██████████ in apartment ██████████ and that is why she knows it was "Juan" on the video.

██████████ told me that it was unusual for ██████████ to leave her apartment door open, and not be home. She said there was a television on in the apartment, and she could see ██████████ purse hanging on a doorknob in the hallway. ██████████ told me that ██████████ was very good friends with the tenant from apartment ██████████ where SU-Juan Perez was hiding and fled from prior to being taken into custody. ██████████ and ██████████ could not provide any further information other than adding that ██████████ possibly works for a school district in Riverside.

This information was passed along to Corona Police Department Detectives.

On 01/09/2021, I was working as a Police Officer for the City of Corona in the County of Riverside. I was wearing a full Police uniform and driving a marked black and white Police vehicle, unit #79291.

I responded to assist Officer Harryman who was involved in a traffic collision with shots fired on the 91 freeway westbound near Van Buren Blvd.

Upon my arrival I noticed several CHP units on scene and I stood by with Officer Harryman until additional units arrived and I was relieved.

I was then tasked with responding to the area of La Sierra Ave and Minnier Ave (CITY OF RIVERSIDE) where Officer Harryman's vehicle was later located. When I arrived, Riverside Police Department had previously secured the area with caution tape. I then conducted crime scene security on the south/east corner of La Sierra Ave and Minnier Ave.

At approximately 1930 hours, I was tasked with retrieving video surveillance from "One Stop Food Store" which is a convenience store located at 4585 La Sierra Ave.

I spoke to the owner of the convenience store who gave consent for me to enter a locked room in the rear of the store. Inside that room I located a computer monitor with live video footage that was constantly recording. I observed the time of the live footage to match that of actual time.

I was able to download 10 files to a USB drive. The USB drive was booked into CPD Evidence (ITEM # JK1) and the files were later uploaded onto Digital On Q (ITEM # JK2)

The incident occurred on the 91 westbound freeway between the Van Buren and Adam Street on/off ramps. Refer to Detective Sailer's report for scene description.

Evidence:

Listed evidence consists of one copy of Officer Harryman's body worn camera capturing an OIS incident that occurred on 010921. A recording of this incident was burned onto a CD and provided to the Riverside District Attorney's Office for review.

Further evidence will be logged in at a later time pending supplemental reports.

Details:

On January 9th, 2021 at approximately 1402 hours, Corona Police Officer E. Harryman was in an unmarked Corona Police, black Ford Explorer, California Exempt plate #1469081, unit #79263 travelling westbound on the 91-freeway approaching Van Buren Blvd. (City of Riverside, County of Riverside). Officer E. Harryman was on his way to work to the Corona Police Department while wearing a police uniform when a vehicle, silver 2007 Honda Accord 4dr with a temporary California license plate of AC68K08 collided into the rear of his vehicle. A computer check of the California license plate of AC68K08 is [REDACTED]

Officer E. Harryman advised over the radio that the suspect, who was later identified as Juan Daniel Perez, was coming at him with a gun and shooting at him. (It should be noted Officer E. Harryman conducted an in-person line-up and was able to identify Juan Daniel Perez as the person who collided into his vehicle, shoot at him, and take his police unit.) Officer E. Harryman advised over the radio that he was involved in an officer involved shooting and Juan Daniel Perez got into the driver seat of his vehicle (unit#79263) and fled the scene travelling westbound on the 91-freeway.

Detective J. Garcia who spoke with a witness, [REDACTED] to the collision. [REDACTED] advised he was westbound on the 91-freeway while passing Adams exit when he observed Officer E. Harryman passing him on the driver side. [REDACTED] noticed the suspect vehicle (silver Honda) travel westbound on the 91-freeway passing him on his passenger side of his vehicle. [REDACTED] stated the gray vehicle cut in front of him and deliberately struck Officer E. Harryman's black Ford Explorer in the right rear corner panel causing Officer E. Harryman's vehicle to crash into another vehicle. [REDACTED] advised he noticed Officer E. Harryman's vehicle pull towards the right shoulder of the freeway. [REDACTED] observed the suspect get out of the silver Honda and reached

down towards his right ankle and started walking in the direction of the officer. [REDACTED] was unable to see what the suspect grabbed. [REDACTED] heard approximately 14 to 16 shots/rounds being fired.

Detective B. Palaoro who spoke with a witness, [REDACTED] to the collision. [REDACTED] advised she observed the suspect vehicle (Honda/Accord/silver) crash into a red vehicle. [REDACTED] then observed the suspect walking towards Officer E. Harryman as he reached down to his ankle and pulled out a black gun. [REDACTED] stated the suspect started running towards the officer and began shooting.

I, Detective Larios spoke with a witness, [REDACTED] to the collision. [REDACTED] said he was traveling in the #2 lane, westbound on the 91 freeway near Van Buren when he saw a silver sedan, possibly a Honda pass him in the carpool lane at a high rate of speed. He believed the silver sedan was traveling at 90 plus miles per hour, due to him traveling at about 65/70 miles per hour. He said the vehicle was driving recklessly as he was changing from lane to lane. He noticed traffic began to slow down. He looked ahead and saw a maroon Subaru fishtail and possibly spin out. He saw the Subaru and the silver sedan that was diving recklessly stopped in the lanes near the shoulder. [REDACTED] said he pulled over into the shoulder and called 911 to report the traffic collision. He saw a Tesla, a white vehicle and a police car about 100-200 yards west (ahead of him) of his vehicle parked along the shoulder. He knew it was a police car because he saw the red and blue lights on. As he was looking down at his phone calling 911, he heard something hit his windshield. [REDACTED] looked up and saw a police officer (wearing a uniform) and another male. He described the male as bald and looked like a "Cholo". He said the male looked confused. He saw the male get into the driver side of the police car and the police officer shooting into the passenger side of the police unit. At this point, he ducked down for cover and did not see anything else. He said he could not identify the male because the sun was in his eyes and he was unable to see the male clearly.

I reviewed Officer Harryman's body worn camera and saw the following: Note: there is no audio of the actual incident. Officer Harryman is outside the vehicle standing along the shoulder and #1 lane of westbound 91 freeway. His firearm is drawn and facing eastbound. There is a male (later identified as suspect Juan Daniel Perez) seen running in the shoulder toward Officer Harryman in a westbound direction. Officer Harryman retreats and uses his police unit for cover. Officer Harryman is seen loading a magazine into his firearm, shooting at the police unit and the police unit drives away westbound on the freeway out of view.

Officer E. Harryman notified the dispatch center and the information reference the shooting was relayed to other surrounding agencies. Officer E. Harryman's vehicle was located near the Sierra Woods Apartment complex. Information was received by Riverside Police Officer Gerardo Rodriguez that the suspect was at 4655 Minnier Avenue apartment [REDACTED] in the city of Riverside and he was bleeding. Riverside Police Officer's responded to the location to take suspect, Juan Daniel Perez into custody.

Juan Daniel Perez was transported to Riverside Community Hospital for an okay to book. Dr. Gregory Guldner made notations on the okay to book for medical clearance, the patient was offered but declined IV fluids and that he endorses recent methamphetamine use. Perez was later transported to the Corona Police Department where he was booked and charged with the following: PC 664/187(a) attempted murder on a police officer and PC 215(a), carjacking. Detective Gottfried and Detective Neagu attempted to speak with Perez, however he invoked and did not want to provide a statement. He was later taken to Riverside County jail for booking.

Detective Mendenhall and Detective Kazsuk spoke with the resident who resides at 4655 Minnier Avenue apartment [REDACTED] Riverside. Perez was seen fleeing from this apartment prior to being taken into custody by the Riverside Police Department. The resident consented for

detectives to search her apartment. Detective Gonzalez and Detective Avila searched the apartment and located a firearm. The firearm was reported stolen out of Las Vegas.

On 011021, I received an email stating they had located a "TikTok" (social media app) video of the aforementioned incident. I reviewed the video and saw Officer Harryman's black Ford Explorer, police unit parked along the shoulder. The emergency lights were activated and the vehicle clearly appeared to be a police vehicle. I saw a Hispanic male adult, later positively identified as SU Juan Daniel Perez standing at the driver side of Officer Harryman's unit. Perez is wearing a black shirt, light colored pants and white shoes. The suspect is holding an object in his right hand and pointing it at Officer Harryman. Officer Harryman is seen ducking at the front, passenger side fender of the police unit. Perez then gets into the driver side of the police unit as Officer Harryman is seen running away (eastbound) from the police unit. I saw that Officer Harryman was wearing a police uniform with a vest that said "POLICE" on the back in large white letters.

I request this report be forwarded to the Riverside District Attorney's Office for review pending further follow up//reports.

EVIDENCE:

*My Body Worn Camera (BWC) was activated during the below described interview.

DESCRIPTIONS:

██████████ described the suspect as a Hispanic male in his late 20's, medium build, bald, wearing a black hoody type sweatshirt, khaki shorts, and white socks.

██████████ described the officer as a white male in his late 20's, wearing a "Class B" uniform, black shirt, and vest.

DETAILS:

On 01/09/2021, at about 1745 hours, I was off-duty when I was contacted by Corona PD Sgt. Griffiths and asked to respond to the Corona Police station to assist with an ongoing investigation into an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) that occurred several hours prior. Upon my arrival, Sgt. Dunnigan assigned me to assist with obtaining witness statements. I contacted (WT) ██████████ in the front lobby of CPD. She had been driven to the station from the scene by CHP officers following the incident. ██████████ was alone and sitting apart from the other witnesses in the lobby when I first saw her. Our subsequent interview took place inside a private interview room located within the lobby.

The following is a summary of ██████████ recorded statements made to me; refer to BWC footage for complete details:

On 01/09/2021, at about 1400 hours, ██████████ was driving to work on the westbound 91-Freeway, towards Van Buren Ave, in the City of Riverside. ██████████ was alone in her vehicle (silver Kia Forte, ██████████ in the far right hand lane of traffic, when she saw a collision occur up ahead of her. A silver Honda sedan was driving westbound in the #2 lane of travel at about 70mph when it side swiped a four-door red SUV next to it in the #3 lane of travel, causing the red SUV to spin out of control. Following the collision, the vehicles pulled over on the right shoulder of the freeway, still up ahead of ██████████. The silver Honda stopped behind the red SUV and a third vehicle (possibly a dark gray sedan) also stopped next to the red SUV. ██████████ believes this third vehicle was related to the red SUV because a female exited and helped three children get out of the red SUV and into her vehicle. As this occurred, the driver of the red SUV (a female) got out of her vehicle, as did the male driver of the silver Honda. The two "exchanged some words."

██████████ could also see an unmarked black Ford Explorer police unit stopped about 100ft ahead of the collision scene on the right shoulder, with its emergency lights on. ██████████ didn't know if the police unit was also involved in the collision or if it had just pulled over to assist. ██████████ did not witness a vehicle collide into the police unit. Referring to the police unit, I asked ██████████ if it was "pretty obvious its a cop?" She replied, "yea" and specifically referred to the "exempt" rear license plate.

██████████ then saw the male driver from the Honda reach down towards his sock area and pull out a black handgun (unknown which hand he held it in). She could not tell the make/model/type, but knew it was a gun. The subject, who ██████████ referred to as "the suspect," then began running towards the officer who was standing next to the driver's side of his police unit. ██████████ said, "The suspect started firing at the officer. The officer returned fire." As the suspect continued to advance, the officer moved around the front of his police unit, going

from the driver's side towards the passenger's side while "gunfire back and forth" continued. [REDACTED] said the officer was "obviously trying to take cover." [REDACTED] said, "the suspect gets into the vehicle and takes off westbound," stealing the officer's police unit.

[REDACTED] then drove up to the officer, CPD Ofcr. E. Harryman, to make sure he was okay. She said Ofcr. Harryman told her he was okay and asked if there were any other police officers in the area (she said there were not). [REDACTED] confirmed she didn't see any type of pursuit or incident occurring that the suspect had been fleeing from. Ofcr. Harryman checked with [REDACTED] to make sure she was uninjured and then ran towards the collision scene to check on the safety of the other people in the vicinity.

[REDACTED] estimated she was stopped in her vehicle about 100ft back from where the incident began (where the involved collision vehicles had stopped). She said there was a white truck to the left of her vehicle (driver's side), but that no other traffic was in front of her and her view was unobstructed.

[REDACTED] estimated that the suspect began firing at the officer approximately 50ft ahead of where his silver Honda was stopped and was shooting while running at the officer. By her estimated distances, this would place [REDACTED] about 150ft away when the suspect first began firing at the officer.

[REDACTED] could not recall if the driver's door to the police unit was already open when the suspect got into the vehicle, or if he had to open the door himself. She couldn't tell how many rounds were fired from either the suspect or the officer individually, but estimated hearing about 15 shots in total. When the shooting began, the dark sedan that picked up the children sped off and the female driver of the red SUV sought cover behind a white truck stopped nearby.

[REDACTED] said she didn't see the suspect's face and would not be able to recognize or identify him in a photo lineup. Due to the distance, she didn't see any tattoos or other distinct characteristics that would be identifiable to her. [REDACTED] was later picked up from CPD by a family member and her vehicle was released back to her after the scene was processed.

It should also be noted that I spoke to [REDACTED] who is the ten-year-old sister to witness [REDACTED] (interviewed by Det. L. Larios) and was present inside [REDACTED] vehicle during this incident. [REDACTED] said she was asleep, was awakened to her family telling her to duck, and she put her blanket over her head. She heard her family talking about the incident, but didn't actually witness anything herself.

Refer to Det. L. Larios' report for further details regarding this incident.

DETAILS:

On 01-09-20 at approximately 1500 hours, I responded to the Corona Police Department in regards to a Critical Incident Team activation. I was tasked by Sgt. Dunnigan to obtain witness statements from witnesses that were waiting in the front lobby of the police department.

At approximately 1830 hours, I contacted (WT) [REDACTED] and (WT) [REDACTED] in the front lobby. I brought [REDACTED] to an interview room in the lobby. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement which was recorded on my BWC.

[REDACTED] said he was driving his white Tesla Model Y west on the SR 91 freeway with his wife sitting in the front passenger seat. [REDACTED] said he was driving in the carpool lane just past the Adams exit. [REDACTED] said he was slowing down for traffic slowing ahead of them when he noticed a black Explorer SUV coming up from behind. [REDACTED] said the black SUV collided with the passenger side of his vehicle, which caused his vehicle to collide with the wall of the center median. [REDACTED] said the black SUV then went out of control and skidded across the lanes of traffic. [REDACTED] said the driver of the black SUV was able to gain control and stop. [REDACTED] said the black SUV's blue emergency lights came on. [REDACTED] said the SUV appeared to be a police car. [REDACTED] said the driver of the black SUV then pulled to the right shoulder of the freeway. [REDACTED] said he then pulled to the right shoulder and stopped approximately 50-70 yards behind the black SUV.

[REDACTED] said he saw a silver or champagne colored four door Honda stopped behind him on the freeway. [REDACTED] said he assumed SU exited the Honda, but did not see him exit the car. [REDACTED] said he saw the driver's door of the Honda open and on one else inside the vehicle. [REDACTED] said he also heard other people on the freeway say that SU exited the Honda.

[REDACTED] said he saw the officer exit the black SUV. [REDACTED] said the officer was dressed like a police officer, but not wearing a traditional uniform. [REDACTED] said the officer was facing east, towards him. [REDACTED] said his wife, (WT) [REDACTED] told him that the officer had his gun out. [REDACTED] said he then saw the police officer had his gun out. [REDACTED] said he then noticed (SU) a Hispanic male approximately 5'10" tall, medium build, with a shaved head, possibly wearing a white shirt and brown shorts and had blood running coming from his forehead approximately 20 yards west, in front of him.

[REDACTED] said SU reached down to his right sock and pulled out a semi-automatic black pistol. [REDACTED] said he saw SU walking towards the officer. [REDACTED] said SU was walking close to the wall to the right of the shoulder. [REDACTED] said he could not understand why SU was walking towards the officer and not another direction. [REDACTED] then commented, "he must have had a death wish or something." [REDACTED] said he saw SU raise his gun and the officer moved away from the vehicle and into the lanes of travel to ensure that he did not shoot them (he and his wife). [REDACTED] said he saw the officer pointing his gun at SU as SU continued to walk

towards the officer. ██████ said he did not remember if either SU or the officer said anything. ██████ went on to say that his windows were up and the radio was on.

██████ said he thought the officer shot once. ██████ said SU shot at the officer multiple times. ██████ could not tell who shot first. ██████ estimated that SU was approximately 20-25 yards away from the officer when the shooting started. ██████ said the officer retreated to the front of the black SUV for cover. ██████ said SU continued to shoot at the officer. ██████ said the officer then moved to the passenger side of the SUV. ██████ said SU made it to the driver's door and entered the SUV. ██████ said the officer moved to the passenger rear quarter panel and to the back of the SUV. ██████ said he saw the officer shoot "a lot" into the back window of the SUV. ██████ said SU drove away west on the freeway.

██████ said the officer then ran towards them. ██████ said the officer checked on them. ██████ said the whole incident should be recorded via his Tesla. ██████ said his car has multiple cameras. ██████ said we could take the USB drive that contains the video from his car. ██████ signed the attached consent to search form.

At approximately 1920 hours, I brought ██████ to an interview room in the lobby. The following is a summary of ██████ statement which was recorded on my BWC.

██████ said she was riding in the front passenger seat of their Tesla while ██████ was driving. ██████ said they were driving west on the SR 91 freeway in the carpool lane when she saw a black SUV collide into the passenger side of their vehicle. ██████ said the collision caused their vehicle to collide with the wall of the center divider. ██████ said the black SUV's emergency red and blue lights turned on and pulled to the right shoulder. ██████ said she believed the SUV was a police car.

██████ said as they were still on the left side of the freeway lanes she saw (SU) an unknown race male who was approximately 5'10" tall with a stocky build, shaved head and blood running down his face wearing khaki pants running down the center of the freeway towards the police car. ██████ said SU was trying to hold up his pants as he ran. ██████ said they then pulled to the right shoulder and stopped approximately 50 yards behind the SUV.

██████ said she saw the police man who was wearing a uniform exit the SUV. ██████ said she saw the officer holding his gun, pointing it back in the direction of SU. ██████ said SU reached down, pulled up his right pant leg and retrieved a black semi-automatic pistol from his ankle. ██████ said the officer showed "great restraint". ██████ said she thinks SU shot at the officer first, but could not be sure. ██████ said it appeared SU was approximately 10 yards behind the SUV when the shooting started. ██████ said SU shot "a lot" at the officer, but did not know how many times. ██████ said as SU was shooting at the officer the officer moved to the front of the car. ██████ said the officer continued to shoot at SU as he moved to the passenger side. ██████ said SU moved out into the lanes, indicating to her that SU was still trying to shoot the officer and not just scare him away. SU moved towards the driver's door, continuing to shoot at the officer, opened the driver's door and entered the driver's seat. ██████ said the officer moved to the rear of the SUV and shot "a lot" into the car, but could not tell how many times exactly. ██████ said SU then drove away west.

██████ said she believed SU was trying to kill the officer. ██████ said SU had intent to go after the officer. ██████ said she did not hear the officer or SU say anything. ██████ said a small car stopped next to the officer then the officer came to check on them. ██████ said she might be able to identify the suspect if seen again. ██████ said she tried to record the incident on her phone, but did not.

Det. Palaoro provided me with a 6 photo line up. I provided ██████ the Corona Police photo line up admonishment, which she signed. I provided ██████ six separate pages, each with one photograph on them. ██████ reviewed all six photos and identified picture 3. ██████ said she

was 70% sure the person in picture 3 was SU. Picture 3 had the photo of Juan Perez 04-16-90.

I later logged the 6 photo line up and consent to search form into evidence. I also attached a scan of these documents to this report.

Evidence:

Refer to the attached property sheet labeled, "Property sheet-Larios". I logged in the listed evidence into the Corona Police Department digital on Q system. The evidence consists of one digital recording of the interview with WT [REDACTED] and myself that occurred on 010921 at about 1900 hours. The interview was conducted in the Corona Police Department's front lobby conference room.

Details:

On 010921 at about 1900 hours, I responded to the front counter of the Corona Police Department to assist with interviews on an officer involved shooting investigation. I spoke with WT [REDACTED] who was waiting at the front counter of the Corona Police Department. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] recorded statement: [REDACTED] was transported to the Corona Police Department by CHP (Officer Rolens #20220) due to his vehicle being parked in a crime scene where the OIS occurred. He told me that on 010921 at about 1400 hours, he was traveling westbound on the SR 91 freeway near Van Buren Blvd. in the City of Riverside, County of Riverside. He was driving his 2008, silver Chevy Impala, CA plate [REDACTED]. His mother [REDACTED] was seated in the front passenger seat and his little sister [REDACTED] was seated in the rear seat. (Their statements were obtained by other officers)

He was traveling in the #2 lane (lane next to the carpool lane) at about 65-70MPH. He saw a silver sedan, possibly a Honda traveling westbound in the carpool lane. He noticed the vehicle as it was approaching due to it traveling at such a high rate of speed. He said it caught his attention because the car was going so fast. He believes it was traveling at about 90 plus MPH. The silver sedan crossed in front of him and continued to recklessly change lanes.

As he continued to travel westbound, he saw traffic began to slow down. He looked ahead (westbound) and noticed smoke. He saw a red colored Subaru either fishtail or spin out. He believes the Subaru was initially in the #2 lane and that a traffic collision had just occurred. As he approached the area he saw the silver sedan that he had seen driving recklessly and the red Subaru at rest in the lanes near the shoulder. He saw both cars had collision damage and called 911 on his cell phone. Due to him being a physical therapist, he decided to pull over to the shoulder and assist anyone who was injured. As he parked, he saw there was a Tesla, a police vehicle and an unknown type white vehicle (in that order) along the shoulder about 100-200 yards west of him (ahead of him). I asked him how he knew it was a police vehicle and he said it had its emergency lights on. He saw a male walking on the shoulder and believes he was the same male who was driving the silver sedan. He described him as a bald male and he looked like a "Cholo". The male (SU01) looked dazed and confused.

[REDACTED] said after he pulled over, he was parked and looking down at his phone while he was calling 911. As his head was down he heard a loud noise and something hit his car. He looked up and saw his windshield had been broken. He looked up and saw the bald headed male (SU01) get into the driver side of the police vehicle. He saw a police officer shooting into the passenger side of the police vehicle. I asked him how he knew it was a police officer. He said he saw him wearing "gear" and he had a gun. As he saw the officer shooting, he yelled at his mom and sister to get down. They all ducked and he did not see anything else.

He was still on the phone with 911 and told the dispatcher, "shots fired". [REDACTED] said the sun was in his eyes and he could not identify the bald male (SU01) if he saw him again. [REDACTED] said his windows were up the whole time so he did not hear the officer or the male exchange words. He does not know how many rounds were fired. [REDACTED] did not see anyone else outside of their vehicles except for the bald male (SU01) and the officer.

[REDACTED] had no further details and the interview concluded.

DETAILS:

On 1/9/2021, at approximately 1415 hours, I responded to the Corona Police Department in regards to a Critical Incident Team activation. At about 1950 hours, I was tasked by Sgt. Dunnigan to obtain witness statement from a Spanish speaking witness that was waiting in the front lobby of the Corona Police Department.

At approximately 2001 hours, I contacted [REDACTED] at the front lobby of the Corona Police Department. The interview was conducted in Spanish because [REDACTED] only speaks Spanish. I speak Spanish fluently and I am a certified interpreter for the Corona Police Department. I interviewed [REDACTED] in the Personnel and Training conference room. The interview was recorded with my body worn camera. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement.

[REDACTED] lives in the City of Dunnigan, which is located north of Sacramento. [REDACTED] was visiting family in the City of Indio and was on her way to her son's [REDACTED] residence in the City of Santa Ana. [REDACTED] was in [REDACTED] vehicle, which is a 2008, gray Chevrolet Impala. [REDACTED] was driving the vehicle, [REDACTED] was in the front passenger seat, and her juvenile daughter, [REDACTED] was in the back seat.

[REDACTED] was traveling westbound on the 91 freeway in the #1 lane, next to the carpool lane. They were in the Riverside area, in between the Adams exit and Van Buren exit. [REDACTED] and her family saw a gray, unknown make or model, sedan drive past them in the carpool lane at a high rate of speed. [REDACTED] estimated that the vehicle was traveling over 90 miles per hour.

After the vehicle passed her, it began to make multiple lane changes in front of them. [REDACTED] lost sight of the vehicle and moments later, she saw a cloud of smoke, which she believed was from the gray vehicle colliding into another vehicle. As they continued on the freeway, [REDACTED] noticed that the gray vehicle had been involved in a collision, but she was not sure what vehicle it had collided into. [REDACTED] son, used his cellular phone to call "911" and he began to merge towards the right shoulder of the freeway. [REDACTED] stopped his vehicle on the shoulder, just past the bridge that is located on the 91 freeway, in between the Adams exit and Van Buren exit. In front of the vehicle that [REDACTED] was in, was a white Tesla also stopped, and ahead of the Tesla was a police vehicle. [REDACTED] described the police vehicle as black and she estimated that it was between 400 to 500 feet away from her. The Tesla and the police vehicle were also stopped on the shoulder.

[REDACTED] saw the driver (suspect) of the gray vehicle that collided running towards the direction of the police vehicle. Moments later, [REDACTED] heard an object hit the vehicle she was in and she thought it was maybe a rock. [REDACTED] son then said they were shooting and told her to get down. [REDACTED] looked in the direction of the police vehicle and saw the suspect getting into the driver's seat of the police vehicle. [REDACTED] saw the police officer, who she said was wearing a police uniform, standing on the passenger side of the police vehicle. The police officers hands were pointed towards the suspect. [REDACTED] heard 5 to 6 gunshots but she said she is not sure who was shooting. [REDACTED] did not see if the suspect or the Police Officer had a gun in their hands. [REDACTED] took cover behind the

dashboard of the vehicle she was in and did not see any further, until after the suspect fled in the officer's vehicle.

████████ described the suspect as a male, black shirt, unknown color shorts, brown skin, and unknown race. ██████████ said she did not see the suspect's face and she said she would not be able to identify him.

DETAILS:

On 1-9-21 at approximately 1430 hours, I was called in to assist on an Officer involved shooting case. I was briefed on the case and told the suspect, Juan Perez, was already in custody. I was told Juan had used a gun and the gun was still outstanding. Before Juan was taken into custody, he had stopped at the apartment of [REDACTED] located at 4655 Minnier Ave [REDACTED] in Riverside. [REDACTED] is a friend of Juan's ex-girlfriend [REDACTED] who lives at 4655 Minnier Ave [REDACTED] in Riverside.

On 1-9-21 Detective Mendenhall and Detective Kazsuk interviewed both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Through the interviews they found out the gun Juan had used in the shooting had been left at apartment [REDACTED] and moved by [REDACTED] to apartment [REDACTED]. This information was then relayed back to supervision and myself. Detective Mendenhall and Detective Kazsuk stated both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] signed consent to search forms and gave consent to search their apartments. I was then asked to respond to the apartment complex to assist in the searches.

On 1-9-21 at approximately 2100 hours, I responded to the apartment complex on 4655 Minnier Ave in Riverside. Upon arrival I contacted Sgt. Vega. He showed me photographs of the consent to search forms signed by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I was also told through assisting Detective interviews, it was learned the gun had been placed in a hamper in apartment [REDACTED]. I was instructed to try and locate the gun as well as light colored shorts and a black shirt possibly worn by the suspect.

I saw Sgt. Glenn and Detective D. Avila were already at the scene and had both apartments secure. We first went to apartment [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is an upstairs one-bedroom apartment with the numbers [REDACTED] on the front door. The front door was already open, and the living room television was on. We were told no one was supposed to be inside the apartment. Sgt. Glenn then knocked and announced our presence. When no one answered we made entry and confirmed the apartment was empty.

After we made sure the apartment was safe, we backed out of the apartment and had Forensic ID Technician Lyndsey Walker, take overall photographs of the apartment. Once the photographs were done, we started our search. In the bedroom we found a white hamper filled with clothes. I took the hamper and dumped out the clothes on the bed. When I dumped out the clothes, I saw a gun come out of the hamper. The gun was a loaded black Taurus, 9mm semi-automatic pistol with a serial number of TFP81992. The gun was reported stolen out of Las Vegas. Forensic ID Technician Walker photographed and recovered the gun for evidence. We also found articles of dominion which showed [REDACTED] lived at apartment [REDACTED]. These were also photographed by ID Technician Walker. We did not discover any of the outstanding clothing in the apartment. The apartment was then secured.

We then responded to apartment [REDACTED]. Apartment [REDACTED] is a downstairs one-bedroom apartment with the numbers [REDACTED] on the front door. The door was also already open for this apartment. I was again told no one was supposed to be in the apartment. We again conducted knock and notice before entering. Once inside we cleared the apartment and confirmed no one was inside. We then backed out and had Forensic ID Technician Walker take overall photographs. Articles of dominion showing [REDACTED] lived at the apartment were found and later photographed by ID Technician Walker. We did not find the outstanding clothing we were looking for. The apartment was then secured.

DETAILS: On 01/09/21 I was notified a Corona Police Officer was involved in a shooting which occurred in the Riverside area. I, along with other Corona Police personnel were requested to respond to assist with the investigation. Detective Kaszuk and I were assigned to assist Sergeant J Glenn (Corona Police Department) with collecting evidence in the area of La Sierra and Minnier St in Riverside.

We met up with Sergeant Glenn in an apartment complex located at 4655 Minnier St in Riverside. Sergeant Glenn told us the suspect in this case, Juan Perez had ran out of apartment [REDACTED] and had been taken into custody. He also stated the resident of apartment # [REDACTED] later identified as [REDACTED] had been taken to the Riverside Police Department along with another female who possibly lived in apartment [REDACTED] who was later identified as [REDACTED]. The front door of the apartment [REDACTED] had been secured with yellow police tape. Sergeant Glenn indicated the suspect's firearm that had been used in this incident was still outstanding and had not been recovered and could possibly be in apartment [REDACTED]. Sergeant Glenn was tasked with watching apartment [REDACTED] to make sure no one entered the apartment.

Sergeant Glenn mentioned apartment [REDACTED] possibly belonged to the other female that had been transported to Riverside Police Department. Detective Kaszuk, myself and Sergeant Glenn walked over to the apartment [REDACTED] and saw the front door open. There was a screen door and we were able to see into the apartment. The television was on and it looked like someone left in a hurry without securing the residence. We knocked, and identified ourselves as police officers and no one answered. Sergeant Glenn stated he would keep an eye on both apartments while we responded to Riverside Police Department to speak with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

Once we arrived at Riverside Police Department Detective Kaszuk and I sat down and spoke with [REDACTED]. We informed her she was a witness and not a suspect at the time we began the interview. The following is a summary of her statement. I asked [REDACTED] if she lived at 4655 Minnier St apartment [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me she did, and that she was the sole resident of the apartment and no one else lives with her and there should not be anyone inside her apartment. I asked [REDACTED] if Corona Police Officers could search her apartment and she

agreed and signed a consent form indicating she had given permission voluntarily for the search.

I forwarded a photograph of the consent form to Sergeant Vega and Detective Gonzalez who had arrived at the apartment complex to assist Sergeant Glenn. [REDACTED] began and stated she was getting ready to leave her apartment when "Juan" who she has known for the past year and a half as her friend and ex roommates [REDACTED] ex-boyfriend showed up at her apartment. Juan told her he wanted to speak with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] and told her Juan was at her apartment and wanted to speak with her. [REDACTED] told us [REDACTED] was at the store when she called her and responded to the apartment shortly after she spoke with her.

I asked [REDACTED] if anything seemed odd when Juan showed up at her apartment. She told me he seemed odd, that his forehead was bleeding and he really wanted to talk to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told me she did not ask Juan why his head was bleeding and did not know what had happened before Juan came over. [REDACTED] described Juan as a male, Hispanic medium build bleeding from the forehead and knows him through [REDACTED]

We asked [REDACTED] if Juan made any statements when he first entered the apartment and she said he said, "I fucked up". [REDACTED] asked him what was wrong and he said he just wanted to talk to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] thought perhaps he was in an accident but didn't think he had a car. [REDACTED] arrived at the apartment and was inside for a few minutes when [REDACTED] received a phone call from her brother "Kiki" Officer Jerry Rodriguez Riverside Police Department who asked her if she was okay and asked her to step out of the apartment. [REDACTED] told Juan and [REDACTED] she was stepping out of the apartment. Juan grabbed a knife from the kitchen and said he wasn't going outside and they would have to kill him. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] took the knife away from him and [REDACTED] placed it back in the kitchen. [REDACTED] stated Juan did not threaten her or [REDACTED] with the knife and they were not held against their will at anytime while they were in the apartment. We asked [REDACTED] if Juan had handed her anything when he first entered the apartment and she said he had not.

Detective Kaszuk asked [REDACTED] again if he had handed her anything like drugs or a firearm. [REDACTED] paused and looked down after Detective Kaszuk asked about the firearm. We asked her if Juan brought a gun into her apartment and she nodded her head to indicate yes. [REDACTED] told us the gun was no longer in her apartment and that she had taken it to [REDACTED] apartment (later determined to be [REDACTED] and placed it in the bedroom hamper.

[REDACTED] stated she took the gun by herself and placed it in [REDACTED] apartment [REDACTED] in the the hamper because she didn't want her brother, who was outside of her apartment to get hurt. [REDACTED] told me [REDACTED] didn't have anything to do with the firearm and wasn't sure if she knew about it. [REDACTED] told me she wasn't trying to protect Juan, she just didn't want the firearm in her apartment.

We next spoke with [REDACTED] in a separate room at the same station. The following is a summary of her statement. We informed her she was a witness and not a suspect in this case. I asked [REDACTED] where she lived and she immediately gave me her mother's address of [REDACTED] in Riverside. I asked her if she lived in the same apartment complex as [REDACTED] and she said she did but normally uses her mothers address. [REDACTED] told me she physically lives at 4655 Minnier St apartment [REDACTED] in Riverside and is the sole resident. I asked [REDACTED] if Corona Police personnel could search her apartment and she said yes. [REDACTED] signed a consent to search form for her apartment. I forwarded a picture of the form to Sergeant Vega and Detective Gonzalez who were outside in the apartment complex. I informed them [REDACTED] had told us she placed the firearm in a hamper located in or near [REDACTED] bedroom.

[REDACTED] stated she has been in a on and off again dating relationship with Juan (Juan Perez) for the past year and a half. [REDACTED] broke up with Juan back in September because of his drinking and drug use. Today she received a phone call from [REDACTED] informing her Juan was at her apartment and wanted to speak with her right away. [REDACTED] rushed out of her apartment,

and went to [REDACTED] apartment [REDACTED] and located Juan covered in blood and bleeding from the forehead. [REDACTED] said Juan told her he wanted to come say goodbye one last time. [REDACTED] repeatedly asked him what had happened but Juan would not tell her.

[REDACTED] told me Juan did not hold her against her will at any time while they were in [REDACTED] apartment. [REDACTED] did not see Juan hold a knife, make any suicidal statements or threaten anyone while they were inside the apartment. [REDACTED] told me she never saw Juan bring a gun into [REDACTED] apartment and was not aware of any firearm in her apartment. [REDACTED] stated she was not aware of Juan having any type of mental illness or aware of any involvement of any traumatic events he recently encountered. [REDACTED] told me she did not know what lead up to this incident and again stated Juan refused to speak about it when they were inside the apartment.

[REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] was the first person to leave the apartment after the police arrived. [REDACTED] said she left the apartment a few minutes later after [REDACTED] called her why she was inside with Juan. When she answered she said it was the police department and they asked her if she being held hostage and if she could come outside. [REDACTED] said she was not being held against her will and would come outside. [REDACTED] asked Juan to come out with her and surrender to the police and he refused. [REDACTED] went outside and was contacted by the police and did not see what had happened after she left the area.

DETAILS:

On January 12, 2021, I was tasked by Detective Larios to call potential witnesses who had called California Highway Patrol (CHP) during this incident. The following is a summary of their recorded statements.

On January 12, 2021, at about 0902 hrs., I spoke with Witness, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] advised she lives at [REDACTED]. This residence is located on the south side of the 91 freeway along the south side of the sound barrier wall. [REDACTED] advised that she heard a loud crash coming from the freeway area from her home. [REDACTED] said she then heard a vehicle horn followed by four loud bangs, which she believes were gunshots. [REDACTED] advised the four shots were consecutive.

[REDACTED] advised that she did not see the collision or where the gunshots were coming from due to the sound barrier wall.

On January 12, 2021, at about 0913 hrs., I spoke with Witness, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] thought she had recorded the incident on her phone; however, she later realized she forgot to activate the phone's record option.

[REDACTED] advised she was traveling westbound on the 91 freeway from the Grand Terrace area. [REDACTED] advised she was traveling about 80 MPH when she noticed a vehicle pass her at high speed. [REDACTED] advised the vehicle must have been going over 100 MPH to pass her in such a manner. The vehicle was also traveling westbound on the 91 freeway in the HOV (Carpool) lane. [REDACTED] estimated about 2 seconds after the vehicle passed her, she saw smoke in front of her, and it appeared that a traffic collision had just occurred.

[REDACTED] advised she recognized one of the vehicles involved in the collision was the one that had just passed in the HOV lane. The driver (Suspect) had exited the vehicle and was trying to open the door of another nearby vehicle but was unsuccessful. [REDACTED] does not recall what type or color of the vehicle the suspect was trying to enter.

[REDACTED] described the driver being about 5'5" tall, stalky build wearing beige pants, dark shirt, and white shoes. [REDACTED] advised she could not identify the male if seen again.

The driver proceeded to run towards a police car, which was stopped on the right shoulder ahead of the accident. As he was running, [REDACTED] noticed as the driver may have dropped something, so he stopped to pick it up. The item he picked up was black, and she can only assume it was a gun. The driver proceeds to run towards the police car, at which time she notices the police officer exit his unit and chase the driver around the police car. [REDACTED] noticed when the officer ran around to the police car's passenger side, the driver (Suspect) stopped at the driver's door, and she states, "and then we are at gunpoint." The suspect proceeds to enter the police car from the driver's door. The vehicle then left the scene westbound on the 91 freeway while the officer remained at the scene.

[REDACTED] did not see what the suspect did with the item in his hand. She further advised her vehicle windows were up, and she did not hear anything.

Based on [REDACTED] statement, it does not appear she was aware of any gunfire.

On January 12, 2021, at about 0937 hrs., I spoke with Witness [REDACTED] [REDACTED] advised she and her mother approached the incident as the collision occurred and was going to stop because her mother is a nurse. They then noticed a male wearing a black t-shirt and khaki pants with a bald head covered with blood. The male could barely walk and appeared to be disoriented. She also noticed an officer standing nearby with a gun in his hand. The disoriented male then walked towards the officer. [REDACTED] was unsure why the male with blood was walking towards the officer and assumed he was looking for help.

[REDACTED] advised they heard gunfire as they drove off but could not tell who was shooting. [REDACTED] further advised she only saw the officer with a gun as they passed by and left the scene.

On January 12, 2021, at about 0958 hrs., I spoke with Witness [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said she and her mother, [REDACTED] were together and traveling westbound on the 91 freeway. [REDACTED] said they were about to exit the freeway at Van Buren Blvd. They saw a traffic collision occur directly in front of them.

As they were stopped, [REDACTED] noticed one of the drivers involved in the traffic collision started to run towards a police officer that was stopped just ahead of the collision. [REDACTED] assumed the police car had pulled someone over; that is why he was stopped on the side of the road with another vehicle. [REDACTED] advised that just before the police car was stolen, she heard several gunshots, so they ducked down in the car. [REDACTED] advised she could not tell who was shooting and thought it was from the guy getting stopped by the police officer. That person then stole the officer's car. [REDACTED] added that she could not see who was firing the gun due to them ducting down in the vehicle. [REDACTED] added she heard about 5-6 total shots. [REDACTED] said they then left the area because she was on her way to work.

[REDACTED] did not provide me with a description of the male she saw running towards the police officer.

On January 12, 2021, at about 1007 hrs., I spoke with Witness [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised she and her daughter [REDACTED] were traveling westbound on the 91 freeway in the carpool lane just before Van Buren Blvd. [REDACTED] advised she merged over to exit the freeway at Van Buren Blvd. [REDACTED] said there was a traffic collision in the carpool area, and they tried to go around.

[REDACTED] said that is when they noticed a short Hispanic male with a bald head, wearing brown pants and a white shirt. The male ran from the scene towards Van Buren towards a police officer. [REDACTED] said she heard gunshots then noticed the police officer was running around the vehicle. She noticed the police officer unloading his weapon and then saw the officer standing there as the police car drove away. [REDACTED] advised she did not notice if the male was holding anything. [REDACTED] did state she noticed the male was possibly holding onto his belt as he ran towards the officer. As the male approached the vehicle, she thought he was trying to get help. [REDACTED] advised she heard two sets of guns fire. The second set of gunfire was noticeably louder than the first set of gunfire. [REDACTED] further noticed the first set of gunfire was not as rapid as the second set of gunfire. [REDACTED] said she witnessed this entire incident from about 200' or about half a football field. [REDACTED] recalls being stopped under the bridge when this incident occurred.

On January 12, 2021, at about 1005 hrs., I attempted to call Witness [REDACTED]. There was no answer, and a voicemail message was left. The message contained my name and phone number, along with a request for a return phone call.

On January 12, 2021, at about 1008 hrs., I attempted to call Witness [REDACTED]. There was no answer, and a voicemail message was left. The message contained my name and phone number, along with a request for a return phone call.

On January 12, 2021, at about 1011 hrs., I attempted to call Witness [REDACTED]. There was no answer, and a voicemail message was left. The message contained my name and phone number, along with a request for a return phone call.

On January 12, 2021, at about 1022 hrs., I spoke to Witness [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised she was westbound on the 91 freeway at Van Buren before Tyler St. [REDACTED] advised a traffic collision had just occurred. [REDACTED] said she was a few cars back from the actual collision and could not see who or what was happening near the collision. [REDACTED] further advised she did not hear anything after the collision. [REDACTED] advised she recalls seeing a car that resembled a police car, but it did not have any marking to identify if it was a police car. [REDACTED] told me her windows were up, and her music was on, so she did not hear anything going on outside her vehicle. [REDACTED] advised she was later told there was shooting at the scene, but she did not hear anything.

On January 12, 2021, at about 1034 hrs., I spoke with witness [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised he and his wife were traveling westbound on the 91 freeway in the carpool lane. [REDACTED] advised they were passing a major traffic collision when he noticed an individual run towards the police car, which was stopped on the freeway's right side. The male was about 5'7" tall with a medium build wearing a black shirt and khaki pants. As they approached the police car, he saw the officer and the unknown male in a close-quarter struggle at the police car's rear. [REDACTED] pulled up alongside the police car to assist when he heard several gunshots. Recognizing he was in a bad position, [REDACTED] immediately drove off westbound away from the scene.

After about 2-3 seconds, [REDACTED] noticed the police car drive past him at high speeds on the right shoulder. [REDACTED] noticed the rear window and side window had been shattered. [REDACTED] attempted to follow the police unit as it exited the freeway onto northbound La Sierra, where he lost sight. [REDACTED] proceeded northbound and subsequently noticed the police unit was parked at a liquor store near La Sierra Ave. and Minnier Ave. [REDACTED] noticed the same windows were shattered, the emergency lights were on, and the windshield wipers were also on. [REDACTED] said he told dispatch about the location just as two Riverside Police cars had arrived on the scene.

DETAILS:

On 01/09/21, I assisted in an investigation into an officer-involved shooting that occurred on this date on the SR 91 freeway near Van Buren Blvd. This incident appeared to have begun with a multi-vehicle collision on the west-bound lanes of the freeway.

I spoke with ██████████ a witness to the incident. She identified herself as the driver of a vehicle (2018 maroon Subaru Forester -door) involved in the collision on the freeway. I spoke with her in private at the Corona Police Department on 01/09/21 after she was transported from the scene by a member of the California Highway Patrol. The following is a summary of her recorded statement:

██████████ was driving her Subaru west-bound on the 91 freeway with the intention of exiting the Van Buren offramp. ██████████ said she was driving from Crestline with her son ██████████ and two other kids ██████████ and ██████████ in the backseat. She believes she was in the second lane from the far-right lane when the collision began. ██████████ said she was merging right into the next lane when she heard tires "screeching" and, within seconds, felt an impact into the back of her vehicle. ██████████ said her car began spinning and she blanked out as she had never been in a car accident before. ██████████ said her friend, ██████████ had been following behind her in a separate car and approached her after the accident. ██████████ told her it was okay and to calm down. ██████████ said she was upset and discovered her driver door stuck. ██████████ was able to get the door open and get the kids out of her car. A male bystander, later identified as ██████████ helped her get the kids out of her car. She remembered getting out and putting the kids in ██████████ car when she heard ██████████ say something about there being gunshots. ██████████ said it was "kind of a blur" but she does remember hearing

more than 5 gunshots. I asked if she knew where the gunshots were coming from and she said they were occurring between her location and the exit (Van Buren).

██████ recalls seeing a bald man walking away from a silver car, possibly a Honda sedan, that was involved in the collision. She said the male was walking at a normal pace straight towards the exit (Van Buren). She said he was pretty far away, walking away from her location, however she could not estimate his distance. She only remembered that he was bald and possibly Hispanic. She did not recall him carrying anything in his hands. She could not recall his clothing or any further description. She did clarify that the silver car was one that struck hers. I asked if she remembered seeing anyone inside the silver car, or associated with it, and she did not. She estimated that the silver car came to rest approximately 15 feet away from hers, closer to the Van Buren exit. ██████ left her vehicle at the scene as it came to rest after the collision. ██████ said her vehicle was not equipped with a dash camera and she did not have any recording of the incident.

Immediately after the collision, ██████ said the kids were crying and hysterical. She did not know if they heard the gunshots. ██████ fled with the kids in her car when the gunshots began. ██████ said ██████ vehicle did not get struck during the collision.

On 01/12/21, I spoke on the telephone with ██████ son, ██████. The following is a summary of his recorded statement:

Before asking him about the incident, I told ██████ to only tell me what he knew from his own experience. I told him if he was unsure of something, not to speculate, and he said he understood.

In describing the incident, ██████ said he remembered their car being hit and spinning. He said he blacked out but when he re-opened his eyes, their car was still spinning. ██████ said after the crash, they moved to their mom's friend's ██████ car. ██████ said he had been sitting in the rear passenger side seat during the collision. After the collision, ██████ saw the vehicle that hit them and only remembered that it was grey in color. He did not see who was driving it, but saw a man walking away from it. ██████ only saw the back of the man from far as he was walking away. He only remembered that the man was bald and had tattoos on him. ██████ said the man was near the freeway exit when he saw him. At that time, his aunt drove him away from the scene and off the freeway.

On 01/12/21, I spoke on the telephone with ██████ reference the incident. She was in the car following ██████ when the incident occurred. ██████ son ██████ was in the car with ██████ ██████ first allowed me to speak with ██████. The following is a summary of his recorded statement:

Before asking him about the incident, I told ██████ to tell me the truth and not guess about something he was not sure about. He said he remembered being in the car with ██████ and ██████ and they were all watching something on his phone. ██████ was sitting in the middle of the backseat. ██████ said they got into a crash and he grabbed ██████ and protected his head. They then went safely into his mother's vehicle and they began hearing gunshots. He was unsure of how many shots he heard, however it was more than one. He said a man told them to get down and began protecting them. He said the man was a retired police officer. ██████ did not see anyone involved with the gunshots. He said they then left the scene. ██████ complained of pain to his lower left back, hip, left shoulder, and a bruised knee. He also said the back of his head was tender and sore to the touch.

I then spoke with ██████ and the following is a summary of her statement:

██████ was driving her Pruis while following ██████ on the westbound 91 freeway. She heard the sound of a car crashing (two hits) near the carpool lane. She explained that the Honda, driven by a male subject which she described as a "gangster", hit another car (unknown) and lost control. Upon losing control, he hit ██████ car, causing her car to lose control and

spin approximately 3-4 times. [REDACTED] pulled up right next to [REDACTED] vehicle and told her it was ok. [REDACTED] was crying and said she was in a lot of pain and was having trouble opening her door. [REDACTED] said her initial reaction was to remove all of the kids from [REDACTED] car and put them in hers for their safety. [REDACTED] was afraid of other cars colliding into them since they were on the freeway. She said a gentleman who identified himself as a retired cop stopped to help them out. He started checking on people involved in the collision. A short time later, he returned and began saying "Get down! Get down!" saying that someone was shooting. [REDACTED] then heard several gunshots and she began yelling that someone was shooting. [REDACTED] said she heard about 20 shots. Meanwhile, [REDACTED] took cover behind [REDACTED] car. [REDACTED] decided she was going to leave and take the kids. [REDACTED] decided to stay with her vehicle at the scene.

As [REDACTED] was leaving, she saw the officer she believed was involved in the shooting running towards her on the freeway as she was pulling out. [REDACTED] said she stopped and told the officer she had to go. She said he did not acknowledge her and he seemed "all over the place". She said he was looking around and seemed preoccupied with other things. [REDACTED] expressed sympathy for the police officer as I spoke with her. [REDACTED] said she eventually left the freeway. She said she never saw the male from the Honda during the incident. Although she was not involved in the collision, [REDACTED] complained of pain to her neck and shoulder which she believes resulted from stopping so suddenly.

On 01/12/21, I spoke with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] via telephone with the consent of their parents, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement:

Prior to asking about the incident, I told [REDACTED] to only tell me things he remembered and not assume events as he may have heard from someone else. [REDACTED] started off by saying he saw a guy that was bald that had blood on his face. He said the male had a white shirt and yellowish shorts and Air Forces (shoes). He said the man was shooting, although he did not see him holding a gun. [REDACTED] explained that he heard the man shooting. [REDACTED] heard at least 20 shots and said the man was standing still. [REDACTED] said he saw this while sitting in [REDACTED] car after the crash. [REDACTED] did not remember seeing a police officer. [REDACTED] complained of pain to his head and said he had a bump on it. He said he went to see a doctor.

The following is a summary of [REDACTED] statement:

[REDACTED] told me she was in the backseat of [REDACTED] car during the incident. She saw a grey car (possibly a Honda) driving up fast and hit [REDACTED] car twice causing her to spin. After the cars stopped, a guy got out of the car and started shooting. She said the man first got the gun from his pocket but dropped it. He picked it up and started shooting in the air while walking. [REDACTED] said she saw the gun and it was black in color. She believes he shot about 20 times while walking away from where she was. She could not speculate his distance but described him as "kind of close". She remembered that he was bleeding from his face. She said he was bald and had tattoos on his face. He had a white shirt, white Air Forces (shoes) and light brown pants. [REDACTED] said they got scared that he would shoot at them because [REDACTED] was still standing outside of the car. [REDACTED] said one of the bullets went into a Tesla. [REDACTED] said they then left with [REDACTED]. I asked if they encountered anyone else as they were leaving, and she said no. [REDACTED] said the entire incident happened quickly.

On 01/14/2021, I spoke on the telephone with [REDACTED], who was identified via Facebook social media as a possible witness to the event. A video of the event was posted on Facebook by [REDACTED] cousin, [REDACTED]. I initially spoke with [REDACTED] and she clarified that she received the video from [REDACTED], who was the one at the incident. The following is a summary of her statement:

██████████ said she was in the vehicle (grey Chevrolet Traverse) where the Facebook video was captured, however she was not the one who recorded it and it was not on her phone. ██████████ said the video was captured by ██████████, who is a friend of her sons, ██████████ and ██████████, who were both also present in the vehicle.

██████████ said the four of them had just gotten onto the eastbound SR 91 freeway at La Sierra Ave when they neared the scene of the incident. While driving, ██████████ observed that the westbound lanes appeared shut down for an unknown reason. As she passed, she observed three vehicles pulled to the side, including a cop car. She observed a male subject she described as the "bald guy" near a stopped white van. She could not determine if he was getting into or exiting the van, but it appeared he had one foot in and one foot out. The van then "took off", leaving the subject behind, at which time he began walking towards the officer. As he walked, he began shooting at the officer. The officer began shooting back at the subject. ██████████ said, "Even when he got to the patrol car, he was shooting at the cop and, thank God that the cop wasn't shot at." The subject then got into the patrol car and took off. ██████████ does not remember exactly how many shots she heard, but she said it was multiple. Also, after the subject got into the cop car, another vehicle pulled next to him as if to prevent him from leaving. A moment later that vehicle left. ██████████ described the vehicle as a dark Scion, but longer. The patrol car then fled the scene.

██████████ described the subject as heavy/medium build wearing a white shirt and jeans. She remembers seeing blood on his head. When he was shooting, she believes he had the handgun in his right hand. She could not recall the color of the gun.

██████████ said the video seen circulating on social media showing as sourced from her cousin, ██████████, was actually captured by ██████████ and the original video should be on his cell phone. ██████████ did not have a telephone number for ██████████. She said she would contact his parents and have him call me. I told ██████████ the same video appeared to be posted on the social media platform Tik Tok by a user with the name ██████████. She did not know ██████████. She was familiar with the video on Tik Tok and believes he may have reposted it without permission after obtaining it from Facebook. I sent a message to the user ██████████ on Tik Tok and have not yet received a reply.

I reviewed footage of a video entered into evidence by Officer Kelly from One Stop Food Store in Riverside. The thumb drive containing the files was logged in as item JK1. The files were uploaded to DigitalOnQ as item JK2. In the file 20210109_14h04m_ch04_944x480x25.m4v, Corona PD unit 79263 is seen parking on the north side of the business. In the video, the unit approaching from left to right at the approximate time stamp of 2021/01/09 14:06:08. The unit appears to have its flashing lights activated, as well as the windshield wipers on. The passenger side rear window also appears to be shattered. The driver exits and walks away from the vehicle at approximately 14:06:28. The driver appears to be a male with a dark shirt and light pants. He walks away from the camera towards a nearby dumpster enclosure and appears to manipulate the area of his foot/ankle and waistband at approximately 14:06:33. He is observed walking around the dumpster enclosure, goes temporarily out of view, and appears to hop the wall into the Sierra Woods apartment complex at approximately 14:06:58.

On 01/11/21, I reviewed video obtained from the owner of the involved Tesla vehicle. The vehicle is equipped with recording cameras on all four sides. It appears recording data is only retained for one hour before being written over. The data contained video from approximately 1410 hours to 1509 hours on the day of the incident. The officer involved shooting occurred at approximately 1402 hours.

On 01/09/21 at approximately 1415 hours I was contacted by Sergeant D. Dunnigan and asked to respond to the Corona Police Department reference an officer involved shooting investigation.

At approximately 1740 hours I met with Officer S. Hungerford at the Corona Police Department Traffic Conference room and was told he would be conducting the firearm charting of the officer involved. With the assistance of Officer Hungerford, we first met with Officer E. Harryman where I took overall photos of him. The photos included his duty uniform, firearm, load bearing vest and equipment. (See Officer Hungerford's report for full details on the firearm charting for Officer Harryman).

At approximately 1940 hours I was asked to respond to the Corona Police Department Jail and meet with Officer Nabi to process Juan Daniel Perez. Processing Perez included overall photographs including injuries, gunshot residue collection kit from right and left hands and clothing collection. Officer Nabi stood by during the processing of Perez. Once complete Officer Nabi then provided me with a bag of items, he collected from Perez which included two sweatshirts, one pair of shoes, a pack of cigarettes and one pair of blue glasses. I took possession of those items and logged them in as items LW2 - LW6.

At approximately 2002 I then responded to 4585 La Sierra Ave., in the city of Riverside where I met with Sergeant Vega who was standing by with a Corona Police Department black Ford Interceptor (vehicle plate #1469081). Sergeant Vega stated that the vehicle was parked in a stall near "One Stop Food Store" and requested overview photographs of the vehicle and surrounding area. Vega and I also conducted a search of the surrounding area including dumpsters near the store. We did not locate or collect any evidence from this area.

At approximately 2115 hours Sergeant Vega instructed me to respond to 4655 Minnier Ave. also in the city of Riverside and meet with Detective Gonzalez at apartment [REDACTED]. Upon arrival I met with Detective Gonzalez who requested overall photographs of apartment [REDACTED]. Once overall photographs were complete Gonzalez searched the apartment and located a (Taurus 9mm handgun, Serial #TFP81992) inside a laundry basket in the bedroom (See Gonzalez' report for further details). He requested that I photograph and collect the handgun, which was labeled as item LW1. Gonzalez then requested that I respond with him to apartment [REDACTED] which was located in the same apartment complex. We arrived there at approximately 2140 hours. I took overall photographs of apartment [REDACTED]. Gonzalez did not locate or request the collection of any evidence inside apartment [REDACTED].

On 01/11/21 at approximately 0930 hours I took additional photographs of Daniel Perez' clothing in the Corona Police Department Forensic Lab. I also took additional photographs of item LW1 (Taurus 9mm handgun, Serial #TFP81992). After photographing the handgun, I collected a DNA swab from the grip and trigger and labeled it item LW1(B). I then visually inspected the firearm for latent fingerprints, however, was unable to locate any. I removed the magazine from the handgun and labeled it item LW1(A). I followed up with black powder processing of the handgun and magazine and was able to locate a small amount of ridge detail on the magazine which was collected onto a latent card and labeled item LW39. I also attempted to locate latent prints on the top slide area of the firearm where I placed black powder and then tape and attempted a lift. I did not locate latent prints on the tape, however when I placed the tape onto the latent card to inspect, I noticed two very small red stains under the tape. I took a sterile swab and swabbed a small area on the slide for

testing utilizing a Hemastix test strip and the presumptive indication was positive for blood. I then took a sterile swab and swabbed the top of the slide area for a sampling and labeled it item LW1(C). The swab and latent card with blood under the tape were photographed and logged together as item LW1(C). The latent card collected from the magazine, item LW39 will be sent to Cal-ID for processing.

On 01/12/21 at 0830 hours I was asked to meet with Detective G. Gottfried at the City of Corona Fleet Maintenance yard to process two vehicles. Upon arrival I met with Gottfried where she was standing by with two vehicles: (Corona Police Department black Ford Interceptor, plate #1469081) and a (Silver Honda Accord, plate #AC68K08). Gottfried requested that I take overall photographs of the Ford Interceptor. Once complete Gottfried began a thorough search of the vehicle starting with the rear trunk/cargo area. Items LW8 - LW17 were all located in the trunk/cargo area and labeled as bullet fragments and one police officer's jacket which had been pierced with a bullet fragment. Items LW18-LW19 were located in the rear driver's side seat and floorboard and labeled as bullet fragments. Item LW20 was located in the front driver's side floorboard and labeled as a bullet fragment.

Item LW21 was located on the exterior rear driver's side window frame and labeled as a bullet fragment. Item LW22 was located under the front driver's seat and labeled as a bullet fragment. Item LW23 was located on the front passenger side floorboard and labeled as a Sig Sauer magazine that held (17) Win 9mm Luger bullets. Items LW24-LW25 were located on the interior front passenger window, and top of MDC in console and labeled as blood samples.

Once those items were collected, I then began photographing bullet holes located on the exterior of the Ford Interceptor. I located three holes on the exterior rear driver's side door and labeled those holes A, B and C. I then located five additional holes on the exterior trunk/cargo door and labeled those holes D, E, F, G and H. Once the holes were labeled, I placed trajectory rods in each of the holes and photographed the rods in place. Neither hole A nor hole B perforated the door. It appears that Hole A penetrated the rear driver's side window frame and Hole B deflected off the interior door panel. Hole C perforated the door panel. I was able to push the trajectory rod through hole C and photograph the rod in place to show the path of the bullet. Hole D was a deflection mark from a bullet. Hole E penetrated the cargo door and fragmented. Hole F perforated the rear cargo door. I was able to push the trajectory rod through hole F and photograph the rod in place to show the path of the bullet. Holes G and H penetrated the rear cargo door and frame and fragmented. While examining the interior of the Ford Interceptor I located other damage from bullet deflection in the Metal drawer located in the trunk area, and both plexiglass panels in the front and rear of the vehicle. I was unable to place a trajectory rod in the plexiglass panels to see the path of the bullets.

Gottfried then requested that I photograph the (Silver Honda Accord, plate #AC68K08). She requested the collection of Item LW26 which was located under the front driver's seat and labeled as a .223 cartridge case. Other items collected from the Honda Accord were one key item LW27, a cell phone located in the center cup holder item LW28 and a vehicle tracker in the hood near the battery, labeled item LW35.

Detective Gottfried continued searching through the Officer's equipment that we had removed from the Ford Interceptor cargo area and located additional evidence to include items LW29-LW31 and LW33 which were labeled as bullet fragments. Gottfried also located item LW32 on the interior rear driver's side door panel and labeled it, a bullet fragment. Additionally, item LW34 was located on the interior of the cargo door panel and labeled as a bullet fragment.

On 01/14/21 Detective Neagu requested that I respond back to the Corona Fleet yard and meet with him near the Ford Interceptor as he had located additional evidence. One Blazer 9mm cartridge case had been located by Detective Neagu under the front driver's seat. I photographed and collected the cartridge case and labeled it item LW40.

A total of 701 photographs for this case were logged in to the Corona Police Department Property room along with all other evidence collected.
No further action taken by me on this case, at this time.

Details:

On 01-09-2021, I responded to Corona PD regarding an officer involved shooting. Around 1924 hours, I interviewed WT [REDACTED] at the station. The following is a summary of his recorded statement:

[REDACTED] I thanked [REDACTED] for remaining at the station to provide a statement. He replied, "After I saw what that officer go through, there's no question". After obtaining [REDACTED] identifying information, I asked him what happened today. [REDACTED] was traveling on the 91 westbound freeway, in one of the lanes closer to the right shoulder. [REDACTED] said he eventually saw an "unmarked patrol SUV" go by him. After passing him about 30' ahead, "A silver car went by me and hit him". [REDACTED] described the silver car hitting the right rear corner of the unmarked patrol unit. [REDACTED] said the collision caused the officer's car to go into the "fast lane".

I asked [REDACTED] to clarify the vehicles positions prior to the collision. [REDACTED] stated the unmarked patrol car passed him on his driver's side in the second lane over from him. I asked [REDACTED] if he knew the SUV was a police vehicle prior to the collision or not until after. [REDACTED] said he knew it was a police vehicle just by its appearance. I asked [REDACTED] to describe what the police unit's driving behavior looked like. [REDACTED] said his first impression was, "Wow, he is going after someone". [REDACTED] said he was traveling 60 miles per hour and he thinks the police unit passed him 5 to 10 miles faster than him. [REDACTED] said the officer's speed did not appear excessive, but in relation to the flow of traffic at the time, [REDACTED] described "He was going somewhere with intent".

[REDACTED] described the silver vehicle had erratically drove in front of his vehicle from the passenger side lanes and directly struck the unmarked unit. [REDACTED] stated, "If he didn't 'hit that officer on purpose, he was going to hit someone. He was out of control". [REDACTED] said this occurred as they passed the Adams Street on ramp.

After being struck by the silver vehicle, [REDACTED] said the unmarked unit went into the carpool lane and struck another vehicle. [REDACTED] said the silver vehicle spun after hitting the unmarked unit and then struck "the lady next to me". [REDACTED] said a female was driving in the next lane over on his driver's side in a maroon Forester.

[REDACTED] said he had started to slow his vehicle down after seeing the unmarked unit getting struck. After seeing the silver vehicle colliding with the maroon Forester, [REDACTED] noticed the unmarked unit traveling across the lanes towards the right shoulder of the freeway. [REDACTED] said he stopped, and the maroon Forester was in front of him and the silver vehicle was to its right. [REDACTED] was going to help the maroon Forester first because the female driver had children in the vehicle.

[REDACTED] got out of his vehicle and realized the female driver had a friend in another vehicle following her. That vehicle stopped in the right should near them. [REDACTED] said he tried to stop traffic behind them as the friend got the children from the Forester into their vehicle.

█████ told the female to stay near the wall on the right shoulder of the freeway. He was then going to help the driver of the silver vehicle. █████ saw a male get out of the silver Honda and walk towards the officer. The male then reached down towards his right ankle and grabbed a gun. █████ said the male was wearing shorts, white socks, and a blue striped shirt.

█████ then clarified that he did not see the gun as the male reached down towards his leg because of the distance between them. █████ said the male had reached down towards his ankle. █████ turned towards his truck and approximately 5 seconds later he heard gun shots. Once he heard the gunshots, █████ grabbed the female and put her behind his truck. █████ then went into his truck to retrieve a pistol he kept in the back seat. █████ said his fear was the male was going to come back towards them and take his truck because "he was obviously trying to get away". █████ said he and the female then stayed behind his truck near the tailgate.

█████ said he then later saw the officer walking briskly towards them. █████ looked down the freeway and noticed the unmarked vehicle was gone. █████ asked the officer if he was "ok" and the officer replied yes. █████ asked the officer if he was hit and the officer replied no. █████ said other officers arrived on scene shortly after.

█████ said he felt they were in "very imminent danger" and that it was "very bad". █████ said he was willing to use his pistol on the male because, "It was either him or me and I was not going to let him take this girl out". █████ said if he were in better condition, he would have gone down to help the officer. █████ said about the officer, "That poor guy. It puts me to tears to know what he went through". █████ further stated about the officer, "What a brave son of a gun. He could not have gone home to his family".

I then asked about the other vehicle that helped get the children from the maroon Forester. █████ said he believes it was a family member and they were in a black sedan. As the children were being helped by that vehicle, his next instinct was to help whoever was in the silver Honda. I asked █████ for the distance between him and the male driver of the silver vehicle when he saw him reach down his leg, and █████ said it was about 50 feet. █████ said the male was walking away from his direction, which he thought the male was going in that direction to help the officer. █████ said he thought that because if he had hit an officer, his instinct would be to go make sure the officer was ok.

█████ said even though he did not see a gun, he knows two different firearms were being fired because "there were different sounds of rounds". █████ said he did not see any of the shooting because as soon as he heard the first shot, he was getting the "girls" behind his truck. █████ said he was upset because he was not able to help the officer, so he did the next best thing and got the females into a position of cover behind his truck. Since he was trying to stop traffic initially, █████ said he was standing more towards the rear of his truck when he heard the shots.

█████ said he heard a total of 14-16 shots between the two different shots he heard. █████ assumed one of the shots heard was from a 9mm, which he believed was from the officer. He said he heard at least 9 shots coming from the same firearm, which he assumed was the officer. █████ said he believed 4 to 5 shots came from one handgun and all the shots heard at the end came from another. █████ said it just sound like someone was unloading a "clip in a gun". █████ then described the series of shots as, "Bang bang. Bang bang. Bang bang," Then a final series of shots followed, about 8 to 9 rounds.

█████ said he was hiding behind the truck with the female. █████ had his side door open in case he had to retrieve his pistol. After hearing the last gunshot, █████ said approximately 30 seconds later he saw the officer jogging towards them. █████ said he looked down the freeway and only saw debris. He wondered where the unmarked unit had gone, and the officer told him the male took it.

When officers arrived on scene, █████ advised a Riverside police officer he had his registered pistol in a case on the backseat. He said the officer that drove him to the station was the

same one he told. [REDACTED] said he always keeps the "clips" separate from the gun, which the gun was in a "satchel". He said during the incident, [REDACTED] had to pull the back seat down to retrieve a clip because he kept it separate from his pistol. He retrieved the clip and placed it into his pistol and chambered a round. [REDACTED] put his pistol back in the satchel and had it on the back seat in case he needed it. [REDACTED] said the pistol should still be in the backseat. He was unable to secure it because he was not allowed back into the crime scene. [REDACTED] said he drove a white 2004 Toyota Tundra.

I asked [REDACTED] if he saw the suspect's face in which he could identify him if seen again and he replied, "I believe so". I asked [REDACTED] if he recalled seeing the front of the male. [REDACTED] said he recalled seeing the male's back clearly. I asked if he recalled seeing his face. [REDACTED] said if he did see the male's face, it could have been when the male's car was spinning around. I asked if he felt he saw enough of the male that he would want to view a photo lineup and [REDACTED] replied, "I have no problem".

Sgt. M. Samano had given me a 6-pack photo lineup prior to my interview with [REDACTED]. When I interviewed [REDACTED] I did not know yet who the suspect was or what he looked like. Prior to showing the photo lineup to [REDACTED] I read him a photo lineup admonishment. [REDACTED] said he understood the admonishment and he did not have any questions prior to looking at the photos. I then handed him 6 individual photos.

I observed [REDACTED] study all 6 photos. After looking at all the photos, he replied "I'm not going to be able to". I told him that was fine and that it was better than trying to guess. He then removed photo # 6 and said, "That's the closest to him, that I saw from the side and the back". [REDACTED] proceeded to say, "I can't say for sure that was him". I confirmed with [REDACTED] that the photo he selected (#6), he could not say for that was the male suspect. [REDACTED] stated, "I cannot say for sure. That wouldn't be fair".

I asked [REDACTED] if there was anything else he would like to add to his statement and he stated no. I then ended my questions regarding the incident. I provided him with my business card which contained all my contact information.

[REDACTED] Riverside- Welfare Check:

A computer check indicated [REDACTED]. On 01-09-21 around 2130 hours, Corporal B. Palaoro, Officer S. Hungerford, Officer M. Tarrant, Sr DA Investigator A. De Haro, and I responded to the location to conduct a welfare check. Upon arrival, we contacted OT [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he mainly spoke Spanish and SR DA Inv. De Haro said he could assist with translation.

I asked if Juan lived at this residence and he replied yes. [REDACTED] said Juan is his nephew and has been living there for the past six months. [REDACTED] said currently he was the only one inside the house and said we could go into the residence. I asked [REDACTED] if the other officers could check to ensure no one else was in the residence and he gave us permission to look. The assisting officers checked the residence. They indicated no one else was in the residence and there were no indications of any foul play.

[REDACTED] said Juan had been living at the residence for about six months and prior to that Juan was living with a girlfriend. [REDACTED] said Juan shares a bedroom in the residence with a cousin. I asked when the last time was he saw Juan and [REDACTED] said it was around 3pm today, but he was not exactly sure of the time.

I asked how Juan seemed prior to leaving the residence or if there were any problems. [REDACTED] stated Juan appeared fine, he had not been drinking and there were no indications of drug use. Sr DA Inv De Haro said [REDACTED] described Juan as, "seemed normal". [REDACTED] said Juan had left in a silver Honda. [REDACTED] did not indicate a model for the vehicle, but said it was the car Juan normally drives. I asked if [REDACTED] knew where Juan was going, and he did not know.

At this time while we were speaking with [REDACTED], [REDACTED] niece OT [REDACTED], called his cell phone. [REDACTED] provided the phone to Sr DA Inv De Haro to speak with her. [REDACTED]

indicated she was the homeowner and saw that we were at the residence via Ring cameras. She said she was currently in Mexico and wanted to know if everything was fine. Sr DA Inv De Haro explained to her we were following up on an investigation regarding Juan. He explained that we were just going to speak with [REDACTED] for a bit and then we would leave. It appeared [REDACTED] did not express any concerns and the phone conversation between them ended.

Sr DA Inv De Haro said [REDACTED] just wanted to make sure everything was ok and that she has been out of the country since mid-December. She explained to him that all of Juan's stuff is on the living room sofa and he stays there "off and on". She provided no further information regarding Juan.

Prior to leaving the residence, [REDACTED] said Juan had been there all morning. [REDACTED] indicated they were the only ones at the residence. Sr DA Inv De Haro asked [REDACTED] if he saw Juan with a gun and he replied he did not remember. I asked if he has ever seen Juan with a weapon or if Juan is known to own any. [REDACTED] replied he has never seen Juan with any.

I asked [REDACTED] if he knows Juan having any physical or mental problems and he replied no. [REDACTED] mentioned that he thinks Juan got out of prison a year or two ago. I asked [REDACTED] if he was aware of any medications that Juan took, and he replied no.

I asked if [REDACTED] had a room in the residence. Sr DA Inv De Haro stated according to [REDACTED] Juan does not have a room in the residence, but he had been sleeping in one of the rooms since she has been in Mexico, which has been since December 20th. I asked who all normally lives at the residence. [REDACTED] said him, Juan, [REDACTED] and her three children (17 yrs, 18 yrs, 21 yrs).

I asked if Juan had a job and what was his occupation. [REDACTED] said Juan does drywall and works somewhere in Corona, unknown exactly where or the name of the employer. I asked [REDACTED] when the last time Juan had gone to work, and he replied two weeks. I asked [REDACTED] if he knew why it has been two weeks since Juan had gone to work, and he did not know why.

I asked if Juan has a girlfriend and [REDACTED] mentioned the one that he lived with prior to this residence. [REDACTED] said she lived somewhere in Riverside (CA). [REDACTED] mentioned she never came to their residence. I asked if Juan and his girlfriend had any problems and he replied, probably since he (Juan) moved out. I asked if Juan has expressed any problems he had been having, and [REDACTED] replied no. Sr DA Inv De Haro said he also asked [REDACTED] if Juan ever expressed that he wanted to kill a police officer and [REDACTED] replied no.

[REDACTED] provided no other information regarding Juan. I asked [REDACTED] if he had any questions for me and he did not. Sr DA Inv De Haro told me [REDACTED] advised Juan was last seen wearing a black sweatshirt and unknown-colored pants. [REDACTED] allowed Sr DA Inv De Haro to look at his phone. He did not see any texts from Juan. [REDACTED] was asked if he knew Juan had any social media accounts and he did not. We then ended our conversation and left the residence.

[REDACTED]:

Det. L. Larios asked if I could do a follow-up to WT [REDACTED] vehicle (Silver Chevy Impala) to see if any other evidence or damage related to the shooting was located. On 01-13-2021 around 2130 hours, I met with [REDACTED] at his residence [REDACTED]. He let me look at his vehicle and he also opened the hood of his car. I only noticed the damage to his windshield and on top of the hood of his vehicle. I did not locate any other damage or evidence.

Details:

On 01-20-2021, Sr Det G. Gottfried advised me that a receipt for a stereo shop in Riverside, Ca (Auto Stereo of Riverside, 6664 Magnolia Ave, Riverside) was located in SU01 Juan Perez's vehicle. Per the receipt, it appeared Perez did a purchase with them on 01-08-2021 around 1709 hours. The sales person listed on the receipt was [REDACTED]. It lists "Juan Perez" as being the customer and the vehicle being a silver 2007 Honda Accord. Sr Det G. Gottfried asked if I could follow up with the business to see if they had any problems with Juan Perez.

On 01-20-2021 around 1415 hours, I arrived at the aforementioned stereo shop. I spoke with a male behind the customer service desk, who appeared to be the owner. I identified myself as a Corona PD detective and I explained I was there to follow up on an assault investigation. I showed the male the receipt and asked if there were any concerns or problems with the customer listed on the receipt. He did not recall the business or his employees having any problems that day. The male then called over the employee [REDACTED].

The male explained to [REDACTED] who I was and what I was there for. [REDACTED] appeared concerned to why I was there and asked to see my credentials prior to speaking with me. I showed him my police identification card and badge. [REDACTED] said he recalled that day and conducting the sale. [REDACTED] said he made the sale with the male that brought in the silver Honda. [REDACTED] said the male left the location while the equipment was being installed and the male later returned when the installation was completed. [REDACTED] said he did not have any problems with the customer and he did not notice any unusual behavior. [REDACTED] provided no further details.

A recording of my contact at the business was later logged into DigitalOnQ.

NOTE: Any reference to blood or bloodstains in this report is visually apparent blood unless otherwise stated. Prior to evidence items PD1-PD30 being collected, a number placard was placed next to the item and photographed. Placard numbers 4-30 were placed facing north/south parallel with the freeway so they would not be knocked over or move due to the wind. This incident occurred on westbound State Route 91 freeway near the Jackson Street overpass in Riverside, CA. There were large retaining walls on each side of the freeway. The wind was blowing consistently throughout the night and wind gust felt very strong at times. According to historic weather records, the wind speed in Riverside, CA between 1800-2400 hours was around 10 mph and wind direction was from east northeast. (See photographs for further.)

DETAILS: On Saturday 01-09-2021 at around 1600 hours, I was contacted by Sergeant D. Dunnigan by phone and advised to respond to Corona Police Department reference an officer involved shooting. I arrived at the Corona Police Department on 01-09-2021 at around 1730 hours and contacted Sergeant Dunnigan. Sergeant Dunnigan advised me to respond to westbound state route 91 freeway west of Adams Street in Riverside, CA. and contact Detective D. Sailer. I arrived on scene on 01-09-2021 at around 1845 hours and contacted Detective Sailer and Officer R. Romans.

Upon arrival it was windy and dark. Detective Sailer advised there were five vehicles in the westbound lanes involved in this incident and several items of evidence. Due to the dark lighting conditions, Officer Romans setup portable lighting along the westbound lanes to assist with the scene search and evidence processing. Officer Romans also began diagramming the scene using the FARO scanner. Placards were placed next to evidence items as a visual aide in the scans and photos due to the overall size of the scene.

Detective Sailer requested overview photographs of the scene showing lanes of traffic for westbound SR 91, west of Adams Street towards Van Buren Boulevard; five vehicles located in the westbound lanes; markings in the roadway, a possible bullet defect along the north retaining wall, and evidence located on the freeway. Per Detective Sailer's requests, I photographed the westbound lanes of traffic beginning west of Adams Street and east of the Jackson Street overpass and photographed the scene moving westbound towards Van Buren Boulevard. The following is a list of the vehicles I photographed:

1. 2004, white, four-door, Toyota, Tundra, California license plate [REDACTED].
2. 2018, maroon, four-door, Subaru, Forester, California license plate [REDACTED].
3. 2007, silver, four-door, Honda, Accord, California temporary license plate (AC68K08).
4. 2008, gray, four-door, Chevrolet, Impala, California license plate [REDACTED].

5. 2020, white, four-door, Tesla, California license plate [REDACTED].

Detective Sailer requested I collect a belt buckle frame and brown leather belt from the westbound lanes of SR 91 freeway. I collected the belt buckle frame as item PD1 and the brown leather belt as item PD2. Detective Sailer then gave me a silver colored, Samsung flash drive from the listed Tesla. I collected the flash drive as evidence item PD3.

Detective Sailer requested I photograph a possible bullet defect located on the north retaining wall of westbound SR 91, west of the Jackson Street overpass. I labeled the defect with placard "A" as a visual aide. The defect is around 42" high from the roadway and around 66" in length (see photos CPD_0362 - CPD_0388).

Detective Sailer then requested twenty-seven additional evidence items collected from the scene including: (1) Blazer, 9mm luger, cartridge; (2) FC, 9mm luger, cartridge casings; (2) deformed projectiles; (18) Winchester, 9mm luger cartridge casings; (1) black, Sig Sauer, 9mm, 17 round capacity handgun magazine; (1) Blazer, 9mm luger, cartridge case; and black colored glass fragments. I listed the evidence items as PD4-PD29.

After collecting the evidence item PD29, Detective Sailer located a red stain along the shoulder of westbound SR 91, west of the Jackson Street overpass. I conducted a presumptive blood test using a Hemastix test strip which gave a positive indication for the presence of blood. I swabbed the red stain and listed the swabs as evidence item PD30.

After processing the scene, I transported items PD1-PD30 to the Corona Police Department for further processing. On Monday 01-11-2021, I gave item PD3 (Samsung flash drive) to Detective D. Avila for computer forensic analysis. Detective Avila returned item PD3 the same day. On Thursday 01-14-2021, I took close-up photos of items PD4-PD20 and items PD22-PD29 in the Corona Police Department Forensic Laboratory. I took a total of 629 photographs and uploaded the photos into Digital On Q as evidence item PD31. I logged items PD1-PD30 with the Corona Police Department Property Section. I uploaded my property report into Spillman as (De La Hoya Property Report_1) as an attachment to this supplemental report. Refer to Officer Roman's supplemental report for a diagram of the scene and Detective Sailer's supplemental report for further details of this scene.

Scene:

This incident occurred on the westbound lanes of SR-91, between Adams St and Van Buren Blvd, Riverside, CA, which is approximately 1.5 miles. The westbound lanes contain an HOV lane, three lanes of travel, an auxiliary lane (exit lane to Van Buren Blvd) and the shoulder.

Officers R. Romans and D. Dopson responded to document the scene and location of the evidence using the FARO system. Based on the size of the scene and darkness setting in, they set up portable lights.

There were five non-police vehicles parked within the crime scene. These vehicles are described as follows:

- #1: 2004 Toyota Tundra, white (Ca. [REDACTED])
located facing w/b in the #3 lane, no apparent damage (witness vehicle)
- #2: 2018 Subaru Forrester, maroon (Ca. [REDACTED])
located facing e/b in the #3 lane, major damage to left and rear of vehicle (vehicle towed)
- #3: 2007 Honda Accord, silver (Ca. AC68K08)
located facing w/b in the #3 lane, major frontend damage and driver-side scrapes (suspect vehicle, towed)
- #4: 2008 Chevrolet Impala, gray (Ca. [REDACTED])
located facing w/b in shoulder, damage to hood and windshield cracked
- #5: 2020 Tesla, white (Ca. [REDACTED])
located facing w/b in shoulder, damage to driver-side rims and tires and passenger door dented

Details:

On Saturday, January 9, 2021, at about 1416 hours, I received a CPD message reference an OIS and to respond to the station to assist. At the station, I met with Sgt. D. Dunnigan who initially assigned me to assist with witness interviews, however, later assigned me to document the crime scene on SR-91.

Upon arrival, CHP had the scene secured and the westbound lanes shut down at Adams St. I entered the crime scene at about 1730 hours. I met with Officers R. Romans and D. Dopson and discussed setting up the FARO system to scan the scene. I also met with Commander L. Bailey (Riverside DA's office) and we did an initial walk of the scene to locate items of evidence.

Most of the evidence items were located in the auxiliary lane and (north) shoulder. We located an area with broken glass and several cartridge casings several yards west from the suspect vehicle which I believed it to be where the officer's patrol vehicle was parked during the incident.

Officers R. Romans and D. Dopson conducted a FARO scan while Forensic Tech P. De La Hoya took overall photos of the scene. Based on the lighting conditions, the size of the area to be scanned and the small evidence items to be collected, I placed the evidence placards on the items so they would be easily identifiable in the photos and FARO scans.

While at the scene, I was contacted by Det. L. Larios reference the Tesla having a thumb drive inside with possible footage of the incident. I spoke with the owner ([REDACTED]) who gave me permission to enter his vehicle and collect the thumb drive. He remotely opened the vehicle and told me the thumb drive was in the compartment underneath the front dash screen. I retrieved the thumb drive and gave it to Forensic Tech P. De La Hoya as evidence (evidence item# PD3).

The scene was processed from east (Adams St) to west (Van Buren Blvd). As we progressed past each of the listed vehicles, Sgt. J. Waldon assisted in removing the vehicles out of the crime scene and returning them to their owners. (Note: Vehicle #3 was the suspect vehicle and was stored by me as evidence after the scene was processed, see CHP 180 form. Vehicle #2 was disabled from the collision and was also towed afterward.)

The crime scene was taken down at 0010 hours on 1/10/21. I collected the crime scene log from CHP Sgt. P. Rogers and logged it in as evidence (evidence item# DS1).

I followed Specialty Tow back to CPD where I secured the suspect vehicle.

DETAILS:

On 01-09-21 at approximately 1500 hours, I responded to the Corona Police Department reference a Critical Incident Team Activation. I was later tasked with charting Officer Harryman and his equipment. Officer Tarrant assisted me by acting as my scribe. Forensic Technician Walker assisted by taking photographs. Senior Investigator Quilantan observed the charting.

I met Officer Harryman in the traffic conference room. I conducted a visual inspection of Officer Harryman for any evidence. Forensic Technician Walker took photos of Officer Harryman, his uniform, load bearing vest, duty belt, pistol and other equipment.

I saw Officer Harryman was wearing a Corona Police Department approved uniform consisting of a black external load bearing vest (LBV) marked with a Corona Police badge on the upper left chest, "POLICE" under his name plate on the upper right chest and "POLICE" on the back. Officer Harryman was wearing a black T-shirt with Corona Police Department patches silk screened on both sleeves, navy blue cargo pants, black boots and duty belt.

Officer Harryman had his Sig Sauer P320 (SN: 58B128772) holstered in a drop holster which was secured to the belt and his thigh. The holster was a Safariland level III holster with all levels of retention engaged. The pistol had one 9mm cartridge in the chamber and a magazine seated. The magazine from the pistol had sixteen 9mm cartridges loaded into it but had a 17-cartridge capacity. All cartridges in the pistol were department issued 9mm Luger Winchester Ranger SXT hollow points. Officer Harryman's pistol was equipped with a functional Streamlight TLR 1HL weapon light. The pistol was equipped with what appeared to be factory fixed night sights. Officer Harryman also had his department issued Taser X26P (SN: X12000FO) holstered on the left side of his duty belt. The Taser had a 25-yard cartridge (SN: C410SXMH3) loaded into it. The Taser appeared to be in good working order and when turned on both the light and laser activated.

Officer Harryman's LBV had two magazine pouches on the front lower left portion and both were empty. The LBV has a loop to attach a body worn camera (BWC) on the left chest area. Officer Harryman told me his BWC was attached to his vest at the time of the incident, however it was currently downloading. Officer Harryman's issued baton (RCB) was in its pouch on the left side of his LBV with the snap secured. Officer Harryman's issued Sabre Red Crossfire (MK3-1.8 oz) OC spray was secured in a pouch on the right side of his LBV. Officer Harryman had a functional Streamlight flashlight in a pouch on the front center of his LBV. Officer Harryman had one pair of handcuffs in a pouch on the front of his LBV. Officer Harryman had a general-purpose pouch on the front of his LBV which contained two cell phones, a folding pocketknife in the closed position, and note pad. Officer Harryman's LBV had another general-purpose pouch on the right side which contained a Dodge key fob and business cards. Officer Harryman's LBV also had two empty handcuff pouches on the back.

I packaged Officer Harryman's pistol, magazine and remaining ammunition and placed them into the secured OIS cabinet in the Patrol Armory.

DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE:

On 01-11-21 at approximately 1200 hours, I removed the pistol, magazine and ammunition from the OIS cabinet and transported them to CA DOJ Riverside location. At approximately 1300 hours, I logged the items into their property room for a post shooting inspection. The items were logged in under their case number, RI-21-34, see the attached property receipt. On 01-20-21 at approximately 1045 hours, Forensic Technician De La Hoya received the items from DOJ and brought them back to the Corona Police Station. 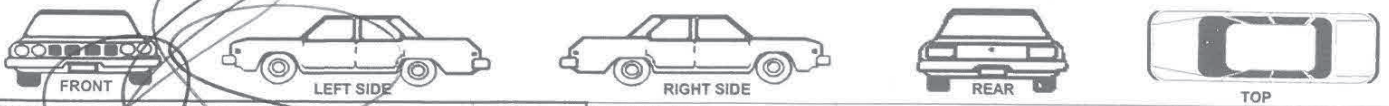

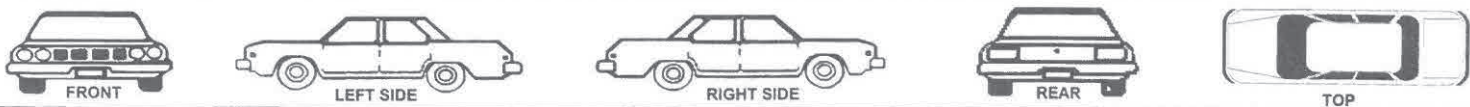
