TOGETHER, WE'RE SAVING LIVES

In 2023, we responded to 11,258 medical response calls. Our paramedics provided Advanced Life Support to 2,783 patients. Of the total patients treated, 98 were treated for cardiac arrest. 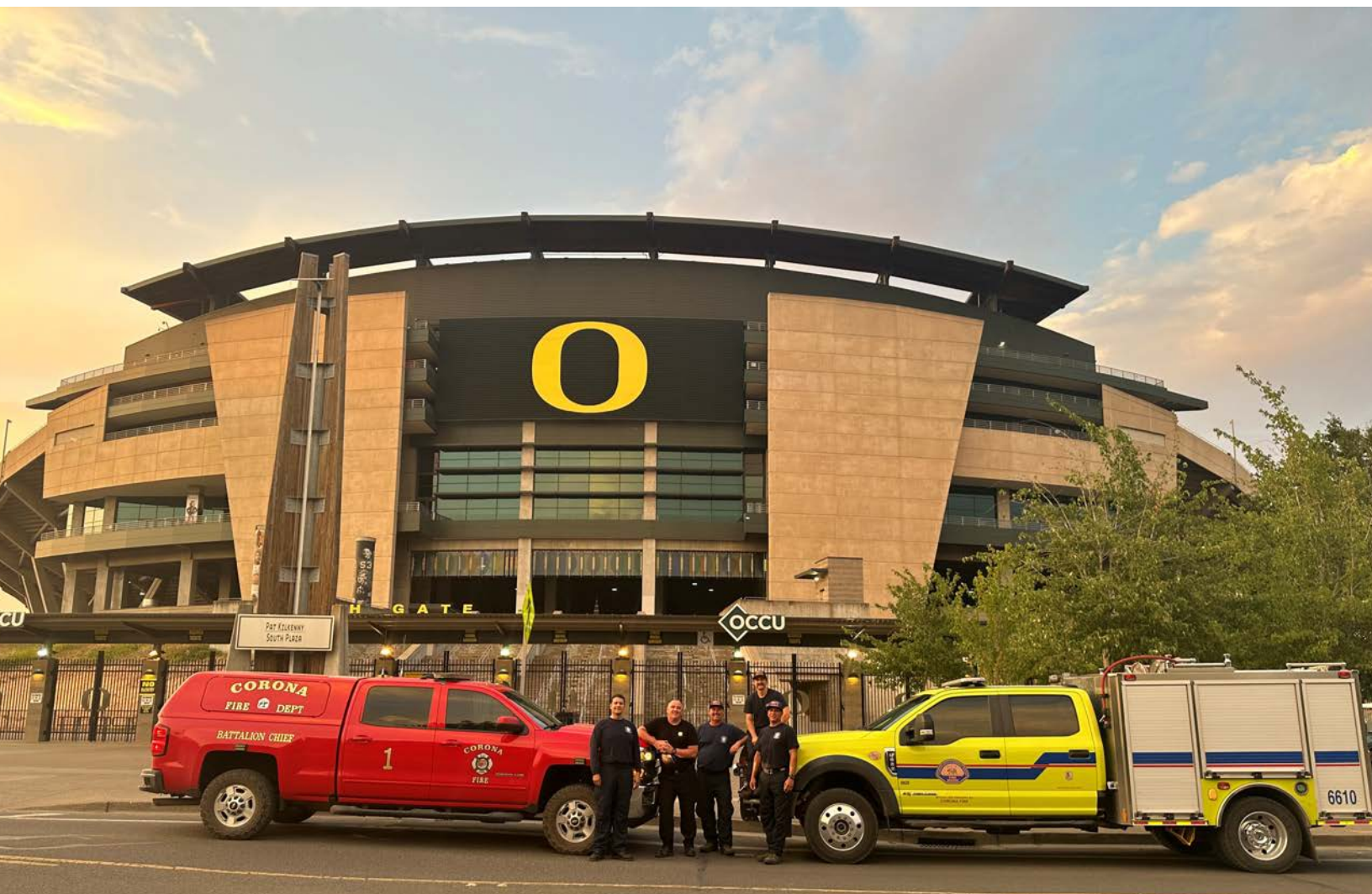
