

## **Project Status / Overview**

The McKinley Street Grade Separation Project is set to change how you travel through McKinley Street. Recognizing the significant traffic congestion City of Corona residents and commuters face every day, the City is working to improve the crossing of the BNSF Railway and McKinley Street by building a suspension bridge to elevate McKinley Street over the BNSF railroad tracks and Arlington Channel. Construction will extend from the State Route 91 (SR-91) interchange on the north side to Magnolia Avenue on the south side and will also include connections to Sampson Avenue. New reconnector road facilities, street reconstruction and realigning and widening of SR-91 on-and off-ramps and utility relocation are also part of the construction. Once complete, the project will relieve traffic congestion, improve mobility and safety for both motorists and pedestrians, as well as improve emergency response times, air quality and noise. Construction activities began in Summer 2022.
