The Corona Historic Preservation Society (CHPS) was originally known as the Corona Historic Preservation Group (CHPG). The CHPG was founded on May 14, 1983, to address the preservation efforts in Corona. On April 21, 1984, CHPG officially became the Corona Historic Preservation Society. The original goal of the CHPS was to “help preserve the city’s historic heritage and to educate its citizens, particularly its school-aged population, about Corona’s past, its history, its heritage, its architecture, its people and how each has played a part in the overall development of the city” (Newsletter, November 1993). Since 1993, CHPS function has evolved to encompass three main functions: To educate the community on the meaning of preservation; to act as community leaders working through the political process to ensure preservation; and to promote preservation through educational and social interaction. (Newsletter, Summer, 2000). The mission statement for CHPS was formed in 2001: The Corona Historic Preservation Society (CHPS) is a nonprofit, tax exempt organization dedicated to preserving and revitalizing Corona’s historic buildings and resources through education, legislation, and organization (Newsletter, March-April 2001).

Key leaders of the CHPS were Vincent Bautista and Gloria Scott Freel. The first Board of Directors were: Vincent Bautista, president; Gloria Scott Freel, director; Donald Johnson, director; Cindy Johnson, secretary; Sandie Everson, director; Val Plumley, treasurer; and Richard Winn, vice president.

The collection contains newsletters from the first official newsletter published in February 1984 to present. Included in the newsletters are items of importance such as information of importance about the general meetings, activities, and information about what other historic preservation groups are doing. Documents related to establishing CHPS are in this collection along with membership lists and proxies from 1984-1987. Events sponsored by CHPS such as home tours, cemetery tours, historic landmark resolutions, and church tours are included. Bank statements and meeting agendas and minutes are part of the collection although they are not complete yearly collections. Items published with the backing of CHPS make up the artifacts of this collection.
